1. Attached is a petition from the Nippon Typewriter K.K., Kema Plant, Code No. 32-62, in which the applicant has requested the release of all the land and buildings not necessary for maintenance and custody of reparations machines.
2. An investigation by this team revealed that all the machines are stored in one large building which is completely enclosed by a two meter fence. A special gate has been constructed for entrance into this area. No reparations machinery is located within any of the buildings included in this petition.
3. It is recommended that the attached petition be granted.

1. Reference is made to the petition submitted by the Nippon Typewriter Co., Kema Plant, 838 Kema-cho, Miyakojima-ku, Osaka, Munitions Plant Code No. 32-62 requesting removal from reparations listing. (REF: SCAPIN 1258).

2. This plant was physically inspected by this office 24 Oct 46 and directors of the firm interviewed.

3. Machinery and equipment in this plant was formerly located at the Mikuni Plant of Nippon Typewriter. Sixty-eight (68) of these machines formerly comprised the munitions section of the Mikuni Plant which had been engaged in production of 75 mm shells and artillery parts since 1938. In December 1944 these machines, with an additional sixty-one (61) from the printing press works and ten (10) newly purchased machines were transferred to the Kema Plant for the purpose of munitions production. This plant was never operated until after the cessation of hostilities at which time they commenced making food crushing machines and typewriter and printing press parts.

4. In view of the fact that this factory (formerly a power substation) was rented and machinery installed therein for the purpose of making munitions, it is recommended that this petition be denied.

1. The Kema Plant of the Nippon Typewriter Company is listed as Plant No. 62, Osaka Prefecture, on the list of munition plants subject to reparations. The Kema Factory was established in 1944, as a branch plant of the Nakajima Kizai K.K., which is likewise designated for reparations (32-135). Sixty-eight machines which had been engaged in the production of shell parts were removed from the Nakajima Kizai K.K. to the new factory, as well as a total of seventy-one other machines which had not been so engaged. The company has requested that the seventy-one machines which had no part in the production of war material but were used for the manufacture of printing machines be exempt from reparations. The Kema Factory did not get into operation before the end of the war. MG

2. It is the opinion of this headquarters, based on available information, that the Nakajima Kizai K.K. is properly listed for reparations, and removal of the parent plant from the list of reparations plants is not recommended. The disposition of the machines in the Kema Plant is directly dependent on their former use in the Nakajima Factory. The machines which the Nippon Typewriter Company has requested exempt from reparations were not used for the production of war material, and it is believed, do not come within the intent of Operational Directive No. 5.

3. Favorable consideration of the application of the Nippon Typewriter Company is recommended.


