- 3. The Rescue Control Officer of the reporting organization checked with Moncton and Gander controls; and Goose Bay and Harmon operations. These agencies reported that no aircraft was cleared to fly in the area, at that time and that no aircraft was known to be overdue or missing. In addition, a check was made with the Transportation Officer of Ernest Harmon Air Force Base, Bowaters Company and the Royal Canadian Mounted Police Detachment who reported that no surface vessels or aircraft were known to be in the Campbell's Creek area. A Royal Canadian Mounted Policeman stated that the houses in the Campbell's Creek area are so situated that road traffic noise could be distinguished from other noises.
