TREASURY WARRANT, DATED SEPTEMBER 22, 1930, UNDER SECTION 11 (2) OF THE GOVERNMENT ANNUITIES ACT, 1929 (19 & 20 Geo. 5. c. 29) SPECIFYING THE PERSONS AUTHORISED TO GIVE CERTIFICATES OF DEATH OR BURIAL.

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury by virtue of the power conferred on them by subsection (2) of Section 11 of the Government Annuities Act, 1929, hereby authorise the acceptance of the following certificates for the purposes of the said Section 11, that is to say:—

Where the death occurs in the United Kingdom, the Channel Islands or the Isle of Man

A Certificate of Death granted by the Official Registrar of Deaths.

A Certificate of Death or Burial granted by the Minister of the Parish in which the nominee was residing at the time of his death.

A Certificate of Death or Burial granted by a Justice of the Peace of the County, City, or Town where the nominee was residing at the time of his death.

II

Where the death occurs elsewhere than in the United Kingdom, the Channel Islands or the Isle of Man

A Certificate of Death granted by some person having power, according to the law of the country where the nominee was residing at the time of his death, to grant a Certificate of Death ir respect of a person dying in the place where the nominee was so residing.
