SATURN will be the *Morning Star* until April 1; after that date it will be the *Evening Star* until Nov. 8; afterwards the *Morning Star*.

When the Sun or Moon is, either in whole or in part, obscured by a shadow which gradually comes over their discs, and then glides off, this phenomenon is called an eclipse. The shadow of the moon falling upon any part of the earth produces an eclipse of the Sun, and the shadow of the earth falling upon the moon causes an eclipse of the moon. An eclipse of the moon can only take place at *full moon*, when the earth is between the sun and the moon.

Eclipses are either of the Moon or of the Sun. The duration of a lunar eclipse lasts all the time the Moon is passing through the earth's shadow; and the shadow being considerably broader than the Moon's diameter, a lunar eclipse sometimes lasts 3 or 4 hours. An eclipse of the Moon is visible to the whole hemisphere of the earth to which the Moon is visible. It begins on her eastern side, and goes off at her western side. When totally eclipsed, the Moon is not invisible if she be above the horizon and the atmosphere clear, but appears generally of a dusky colour. When the Moon is centrally eclipsed (that is, when she passes through the centre of the earth's shadow), and when she is at her greatest from the earth, the duration of the eclipse is 3 hours, 37 minutes, 24 seconds.

An eclipse of the Sun is produced by the Moon passing between the earth and the Sun, and intercepting a part or the whole of his disk from our view. An eclipse of the Sun can only happen when the Moon is in conjunction with the Sun, that is, at the time of *new Moon*. The eclipse is said to be *partial* when only a part of his surface is obscured; *total*, when the whole of the Sun's disk is obscured; and *annular*, when the Moon cuts off a circle in the middle of the Sun, leaving a ring of light all round the dark figure in the middle, which forms a very beautiful phenomenon. An eclipse of the Sun begins on the western side of the disk and ends on the eastern.

It has been found that in 23 mean lunations, after the Sun, Moon, and nodes have been once in a line of conjunction, they return nearly to the same state again; and, therefore, in that time there will be a regular period of eclipses for many ages. In this period there are 18 Julian years, 11 days, 7 hours, 43 minutes, 31 seconds, when the last day of February in leap years is four times included. Consequently, if to the mean time of any eclipse, either of the Sun or Moon, we add the above period, we shall have the mean time of the return of the same eclipse. And by going back 18,36,54, or 72 years, and searching in old almanacs for the particulars connected with any eclipse, and applying the above period, we may ascertain the period and circumstances which accompany any eclipse which may soon happen.

The number of eclipses in any year cannot be less than two, and those both of the Sun, nor can there be ever more than seven, in which case there will be five of the Sun and two of the Moon, and the Moon's eclipses will be total. The usual number is four in a year, two at each node, and nearly half a year intervenes between the two sets of eclipses. The Sun is seldom *totally* eclipsed for a period longer than 4 minutes; but the Moon may be totally eclipsed for about 1 hour and 48 minutes.

LEFT HAND PAGE.

Column.

- 1 and 2—Days of the Month and of the Week.
 3 " 4—The rising and setting in *mean time* of the highest point, or of the *upper limb* of the Sun, corrected for refraction.
 5—The Sun's declination for the same as the Equation, 6th column.
 6—Equation of time, (or quantity by which the Sun is *slow or fast* of the clock at noon, apparent, not mean, time at Greenwich.) Equation of time is the difference between *mean* and *apparent* time. There are only four periods of the year when this difference is nothing, namely,—about April 15, June 15, September 1, and December 24, as may be seen by referring to this column.
 7—Length of days in hours and minutes.
 8—The rising of the Moon.
 9—The setting of the Moon.
 10—The time of the Moon's southing, or passing the meridian. This column also gives the time of high water at Parrsboro', Horton, Cornwallis, Hantsport, Windsor, Newport, Truro, &c.
 11—The Moon's place in the Signs or Constellations of the Zodiac.

The top of the columns of each month gives the Moon's Phases, or times of New and Full Moon, and of the First and Last Quarters or quadratures of the Sun.

The FARMER'S CALENDAR is placed at the foot of the columns of each month.

- 1—The days of the Month.
 2—Sundays, Weather, Anniversaries, &c.
 3—The time of High Water at Halifax, N. S.

B., and Portland, 11h. 14m.; at Pictou and Cape Tormentine, 10h.; and at St. John's, Newfoundland, 6h. 30m.

All the calculations are made to mean *solar* time.

The top of the columns of each month contains notices of the Distance and magnitude of the Sun, Moon, and principal planets.

This mark * opposite every alternate Thursday, commencing January 4, denotes the days on which the mails close for the U. Kingdom.



DISTANCE AND MAGNITUDE OF THE SUN AND MOON. To find the exact distance of the Sun from the Earth is an object which has much interested and engaged astronomers for a century past. Halley in 1716 suggested what he considered would be a satisfactory method of solution of the difficulty and pointed out the possibility of seeing the transits of Venus across the Sun's disk which were to occur in 1761 and 1769. In 1761 a transit of Venus did occur, which was visible in many parts of Europe; and in 1769 another transit of Venus occurred, which was visible in the North of Lapland, but in no other parts of Europe. (No other transit of Venus will occur till the year 1874, and will be followed by one in 1882, after which there will be none for more than a century.) From these two transits but

Horses and cattle like early cut hay better than that which is cut late. They can be fattened on it by giving them what they will eat, while they will barely subsist on that which gets dead ripe before it is cut. Cows who go to pasture early in the spring will make yellow butter, and so they will in winter if fed on early cut hay, if it be well cured. Land lying long in grass needs repeated dressings of manure. There is no occasion for ploughing up our grass lands as frequently, if we would only give them some fertilizer, like composted barn manure, ashes, bone dust, guano, &c., every two or three years. Cultivation and manure work wonders in the improvement of the grass crop—a rich, deep soil, and such alone can produce a large growth of hay or pasture. On a rich, deep and porous soil, drought has very little effect—on a poor, shallow and hard one, the grass or other crop always suffers severely from any lack of rain. A well-drained soil is as much better for growing grass, as it is for any other crop—however well the land may be seeded in the first place, if water remains on the surface late in the spring, the cultivated grasses soon give place to coarser and nearly worthless herbage, or linger with a sickly and stunted growth of very little value for feeding purposes.

especially from that in 1769, the Sun's distance from the Earth was ascertained with great accuracy from the calculations founded upon the observations made on these transits, it was found that the distance is about ninety-five millions of miles. This distance is thirty-one thousand six hundred times the space that intervenes between Great Britain and America; and were a locomotive to travel this space at the rate of 1,000 miles every day, it would require 260 years before the journey could be accomplished. The magnitude of this vast luminary is an object which overpowers the imagination. Its diameter is 880,000 miles; its circumference, 2,764,600 miles; its surface contains 2,432,800,000,000 of square miles, which is 12,850 times the area of the terraqueous globe, and nearly 50,000 times the extent of all the habitable parts of the Earth. Were a person to travel along the surface of the Sun, so as to pass along every square mile on its surface, at the rate of thirty miles every day, it would re-

SALT in a regular or frequent supply is a necessity in the animal economy, in order to healthy growth and development. The blood contains a considerable per centage of this ingredient, hence to some extent the desire manifested for it by all grazing animals, as their food contains it in almost inappreciable amount. Horses and sheep should frequently be supplied with salt in summer, and the wants of swine should also receive attention. In winter, the first named animals, if not fed with hay which was salted in the mow, should have an occasional feed brined especially for them, in the warm days of winter. Calves should receive the same attention. Swine require salt when penned in order to health, and when fattening, the proper digestion and assimilation of their food cannot go on perfectly and economically without it. In other words, they will fatten faster on the same food salted than if fed to them fresh, and will eat more and grow more rapidly because of the better health and appetite.

ONE of the earliest tasks that claims the farmer's attention is repairing fences. The importance of good fences is well understood by those who have observed the difference between crops safe from all intruders, and those occasionally trodden down and ruined; between moving on with the work without interruption, and the frequent annoyance of stopping important operations, to run after intruding cattle, colts and pigs. Sometimes during this month the weather is so favorable that the farmers are able to plough and sow their spring grain; and some seasons the spring is so unfavorable—with so much wet and cold weather—that April glides away before a handful of grain can be put in the soil. As soon as the meadows are dry enough to bear feet without injury to the turf, they should be carefully picked of all loose and projecting stones, which might injure a mowing machine, and then well rolled so as to make the surface as smooth and perfect as possible. Stumps should be dug or pulled out, rubbish removed, and small hillocks levelled.



Time culture of white beans as a field crop is of importance. As to varieties, the "medium white bean" stands in good repute, ripens early and evenly, and eunes well. A new kind, somewhat resembling it, called the "mountain cranberry," is very early, yields well, and is in good demand both for seed and culinary purposes. Beans may be planted later in the season than almost any other spring crop—they fill up very conveniently the few days between spring seeding and the hoeing which follows. The middle of June is full late for planting most varieties, for it is essential that the crop ripens before the frost comes. The soil most suitable is a warm, light loam, not too rich, and yet of medium fertility. On rich soils the growth runs mostly to vines; on wet soils they incline to rust. Probably the best soil is a sandy loam well swarded, which is turned over immediately before planting, harrowed down, and the beans then drilled in. Beans demand clean culture, but the time when they need hoeing most is generally in the hurry of haying and harvest.

To cut a potatoe to advantage for planting requires a little practice. Hold the potatoe in the left hand; cut the root end completely off, as the eye by the root should never be planted; it only produces small and watery potatoes. The next eye cut something like a half moon, observing not to cut through another eye; then turn the potatoe, and the next eye will be angular, the next half moon, and the next angular, and so on. Then the top of the potatoe (where there are a cluster of eyes) will in general be flat, when properly cut; those are to be cut in single eyes—be careful and keep these separate from the other cuts, as they should be planted by themselves, as they will ripen their tubers from a week to a fortnight earlier than the rest. Have two sets of hands to cut—one to cut off the tops and throw them by themselves, and the other to cut from that to the root end, reserving the top to be cut carefully for early use. This to any one who wants early potatoes will be an advantage. To raise potatoes to a profit, it is important to avoid much hand hoeing.



The Moon is the nearest to the Earth of all the celestial bodies, and is a constant attendant upon it at all seasons. Her distance from the centre of the Earth has been found with great accuracy, to be in round numbers, 240,000 miles, or about, 30 times the breadth of the Earth, and a little more than the fourth part of the diameter of the Sun. Small as this distance is compared with that of the other planets, it would require 16½ months for a railway carriage to move over the interval which separates us from the lunar orb, although it were moving day and night at the rate of 20 miles per hour, or at the rate of 1000 miles a day it would take 8 months to reach it. In the motion of the Moon round the Earth every month, she pursues her course at the rate of 2300 miles an hour. But she is carried at

The principal characteristic of the flower garden should be neatness. No matter how much may be expended on new and beautiful plants or how great the number of flowers, yet if neatness be neglected the effect of the whole is spoiled in the eyes of all persons who have been accustomed to see well kept gardens. A beautiful flowering plant may have all its loveliness destroyed by the remains of dead flowers or decaying leaves, or a fine specimen may be devoid of attraction for want of a little care and attention in tying up or training. So too rambling, straggling shrubs, climbers with no provision of strings or trellis, walks filled with weeds, borders foul with grass and noxious plants, are all unsightly to a person with a true perception of the proper keeping of a garden. All flowers and leaves which have begun to decay should be immediately removed, unless seeds are wanted, in which case only the dying petals of the flowers should be taken away.

the same time, along with the Earth, round the Sun every year, so that her real motion in space is much more rapid than what has now been stated. For while she accompanies the Earth in its motion round the Sun—which is at the rate of 68,000 miles an hour—she also moves thirteen times round the Earth, during the same period, which is equal to a course of nearly twenty millions of miles. The Moon is at different distances from the Earth in different parts of her orbit. When at the greatest distance from the Earth, she is said to be in her *apogee*; when at the least distance, in her *perigee*. The nearer the Moon is to the periods of full or change, the greater is her velocity; and the nearer to the quadratures, or the periods of

A good draught of *good* water is, probably as refreshing to beasts as it is to people; but in this month nearly all domestic animals suffer far more than we imagine, for want of good water. Sheep will thrive far better if they can have access to pure water. Teams will endure the heat far better if they can have a plenty of clean pure water; and if milch cows must drink stagnant water wherever they can find it, how is it possible for them to give their usual flow of *good* milk? Some people allow water to stand in troughs, day after day, many times, and compel their animals to drink it all up. Did such people ever drink water from an old dirty slop pail, after it had been allowed to stand in the sunshine for two or three days? Milch cows require a vast quantity of pure water in hot weather, in order to produce their usual flow of *good* milk.



half-moon the slower she moves. When the Earth is in its perihelion, or nearest the Sun, the periodical time of the Moon is greatest. The Earth is at its perihelion in winter, and consequently, at that time the Moon will describe the largest circle about the Earth, and her periodical time will be the longest. But when the Earth is in its aphelion, farthest from the Sun, which happens in summer, she will describe a smaller circle, and her periodical time will be the least: All which circumstances are found to agree with observation. The irregularities of the Moon's motion have frequently puzzled astronomers, and mathematicians, and they render the calculations of eclipses and of her true place in the heavens a work of considerable labour. No less than 30 equations require to be applied to the *mean*

FARMERS at the present understand much better than formerly, the importance of good cultivation to newly transplanted orchards. Many of them have learned that fine, costly, valuable trees from the nursery, might as well be thrown into the brush heap for fire, as left, in total neglect, to take care of themselves, after being transplanted. In an article communicated to the *Abbele Pomologique* by Professor Henry, he states that for 15 years he remarked that apple trees, the lower part of whose stem was covered with older pressings made double and treble the growth of trees that were not so treated. In applying it he removes the soil from around the trees to the distance of a radius of 21 inches, and as deep as the principal upper roots, and to each tree he puts 3 or 4 forkfuls of the mare or elder pressings, pressing it down with the foot, and covering it slightly with a portion of the removed soil. It is strongly recommended as a manure for fruit trees—thus turning to account a substance heretofore allowed to go to waste.



longitude in order to obtain the *true*, and about 24 equations for her latitude and parallax. But to enter minutely into such particulars would afford little satisfaction to the general reader. It is found that the real diameter of the Moon is 2180 miles, which is little more than the one fourth of the diameter of the Earth. The real magnitude of the Moon, therefore, is only about one forty-ninth part of that of the Earth. Although the apparent size of the Moon appears equal to that of the Sun, yet the difference of their real bulk is very great, for it would require more than *sixty-three millions* of globes of the size of the Moon to form a globe equal in magnitude to that of the Sun. Its surface, notwithstanding, contains a very considerable area, comprising nearly 15 millions of square miles, or about one third of the habitable parts of our globe; and were it as densely peo-

ON all parts of the Farmer's premises weeds are now beginning to ripen their myriad seeds, very few can say they have none. The following is the result of an examination of the number of seeds which some of the more common annual weeds ripen on a single plant. The green Fox-tail grass varies from 3,000 to 4,000 seeds; the brown Foxtail 1,000 to 2,000; the Rag-weed, or Ambrosia, often 15,000; the Pig-weed or Amaranthus, 5,000; and the Lamb's quarters, also called Pig-weed, often at least 20,000. Some of the latter attain a height of 7 feet and upwards, and the number of seeds which each would produce would be from 50,000 to 100,000. A single plant would seed 10 acres! Many farmers wonder where all the weeds come from—they cannot conceive how so many should have become mixed through the soil, and some therefore insist that they grow without seed, spontaneously. Every farmer who passes by a single weed should know what figures say of the increase it may occasion.



pled as England, it would contain a population amounting to *four thousand two hundred millions*, which is more than five times the population of the Earth; so that the Moon although it ranks among the smallest of the celestial bodies, may contain a population of intelligent beings far more numerous, and perhaps far more elevated in the scale of intellect, than the inhabitants of our globe.

The planets known to the ancients were MERCURY, VENUS, MARS, JUPITER and SATURN—to these the moderns have added URANUS and NEPTUNE. MERCURY is nearest to the Sun of any that have yet been discovered, although a space of no less than 37 millions of miles intervenes between it and the central luminary. Its diameter is estimated at 8200 miles and its surface contains 32,000,000 of square miles.

The first requisite in the application of manure is its thorough pulverization. It is impossible if in lumps or masses to intermix it properly with the soil, and unless intermixed it cannot be of much value. Any one may perceive what would be the difference in the effect of two loads of manure on land, one as fine as saw-dust and diffused through the soil, and the other in lumps as large as one's head. One reason that the sediment deposited by irrigation is so beneficial, is the fineness of the matter; and the efficiency of liquid manuring is owing to the fine diffusion of the fertilizing materials through the soil. Manuring in autumn by spreading on the surface operates in the same way—the soluble parts being washed out and finely intermingled with the soil. In addition to the pulverization effected by harrowing, it would probably be an economical operation to fork over all manure, especially if long or fibrous, before drawing out and spreading, shaking all parts well to pieces, as in preparing it for a hot-bed.



Of all the luminaries of heaven, the sun and moon excepted, this planet is the most conspicuous and splendid. MARS is ascertained to be about 145 millions of miles from the sun, when at its greatest distance it is 240 millions of miles from the earth, and when nearest the earth it is only 50 millions of miles distant. It is estimated to be about 4200 miles in diameter, and contains more than 88 thousand millions of square miles. JUPITER, when nearest the earth is the most splendid of all the nocturnal orbs, except Venus and the Moon. Its distance from the sun is 495 millions of miles, and the circumference of its orbit 3,110,000,000 miles. When nearest the earth, at the time of its opposition to the sun, it is about 400 millions of miles distant from us. The planet SATURN may be

THE labours of the season having been devoted to the raising of crops, the period for their consumption has now arrived. As it is important, on the score of economy, to raise heavy crops, so it is equally important now to study the most economical means of feeding. The first point is to prevent loss by good and comfortable shelter. Exposure to freezing winds not only injures the growth and thrift of animals, but requires a greater amount of food to maintain animal heat. Sometimes the loss of animals, by death alone, towards spring, is greater than the cost of ample shelter. Feed regularly, that no loss of flesh may be occasioned by impatient fretting. Straw should be ground whenever practicable, for animals of whatever kind. Straw should be carefully saved, as it has so many uses. It may be employed largely in feeding animals, if a little grain or meal is fed to them at the same time. Be careful to keep cattle and other animals from meadows and pastures when the ground is soft, that they may not spoil the turf.

Its distance from the sun is 1,800,000,000 millions of miles, which is double the distance of Saturn. The discovery of the planet Neptune forms a remarkable era in the history of astronomy. Its distance from the sun is reckoned about thirty times that of the earth, or 2,850,000,000, and more than a thousand millions of miles beyond the orbit of Uranus. Its diameter is 50,000 miles, 250 times larger than the earth, and three times larger than Uranus, and above a hundred times larger than the earth and Moon, Mars, Venus, Mercury, Ceres, Pallas, Juno and Vesta together.

W. point of the Island, at the entrance of the Eastern Passage to Halifax Harbour. *A fixed red light, on the seaward sides to distinguish it from Sambro and Meagher's Beach lights, elevated 45ft. and visible 8 miles. Octagonal Tower painted dark brown, with a white belt between the Balcony and Lantern, to distinguish it in day time.*

SAMBRO ISLAND LIGHT—In the S. W. side of the entrance to Halifax Harbour. *A fixed white light*, elevated 115ft. above the sea, and visible in clear weather from 20 to 25 miles. Building Octagon painted white, Lat. 44° 26' N. Long. 63° 35' W. Guns are fired in answer on the approach of vessels in foggy weather and contribute much to the mariner's safety, by warning him off the adjacent breakers.

In standing in for the land off Halifax harbour, you may know on which side of the harbour you are, by a remarkable difference that takes place immediately from its mouths, in the colour of the shores; for if it should be red you are to the eastward of it, and if white, you will be to the westward of it.

West from Halifax.

CROSS ISLAND LIGHT—Upon the S. E. point of the Island. *Two lights placed vertically, 31ft. apart, the lower light is fixed; the upper one flashing at intervals of a minute*, visible 14 miles. Building painted red, Lanterna painted black. Lat. 44° 19' N. Long. 64° 9' W.

BATTERY POINT LIGHT—At the entrance to Lunenburg harbour. *A fixed white light*, visible 12 miles seaward. Building square, painted white, Lunenburg harbour is easy of access, spar buoys have been placed in the bay and entrance to the harbour on the sculpin rock, hard-lock shoal, Battery point shoal and head shoal. In approaching the harbour from seaward the buoy on sculpin rock painted red and black in horizontal stripes may be left on either hand, giving it a berth of two cable's length. The other buoys are painted black and must be left on the port hand going in.

IRON-BOUND ISLAND LIGHT—Off the entrance to LaHave River. *A bright flash light*, of 20 seconds duration, followed by eclipses of 80 seconds. The lantern is placed on a square wooden tower, painted white on the southern side of the Island, elevated 70ft. above sea level, and visible from all points of approach.

PORT MEDWAY HARBOUR LIGHT—On Admiralty Head, west side of the entrance to the port. Building square, painted white, with a black square in the centre of the seaward sides. *A fixed white light*, elevated 44ft. above sea level, and visible 10 miles. Spar buoys have been placed in the channel to Port Medway harbour as follows:—On the breaking ledges, Nautilus rock, corner ground, and edge of flats off Bangs point. In approaching the Channel from seaward red buoys must be left on the starboard hand and black buoys on the port hand passing in.

LIVERPOOL LIGHT—South end of Coffin's Island. *A revolving light*, appearing full at intervals of two minutes, elevated 80ft. above sea level. Building octagon, painted in red and white horizontal stripes, visible 16 miles.

FORT POINT LIGHT—At the entrance to the inner harbour of Liverpool. *A white fixed light*, visible from all points of approach, and must be left on the larboard hand when entering the harbour.

LITTLE HOPE ISLAND LIGHT—Off Liverpool.

Note.—This Light is in course of erection. Notice will be given in the newspapers when it will come into operation.

GULL ROCK LIGHT—Off the entrance to Ragged Island harbour. *A white fixed light*, elevated 51ft. above sea level. Building square, painted white, Lat. 43° 29' N. Long. 64° 66' W.

SUNBURNE LIGHT—On the S. E. point of McNutt's Island, at the entrance of the harbour. *Two fixed white lights vertical*—the upper light is 100ft. above sea level and visible 18 miles; the lower light is 38ft. below the lantern at the top of the building and visible ten miles. Building painted black and white in vertical stripes.

BARRINGTON LIGHT—On Baccaro Point east side of the entrance to the harbour. *A revolving light*, bright 15 seconds and dark 25 seconds, elevated 49ft. visible 12 miles. Building square, painted white, with a black ball on the seaward side.

CAPE SABLE ISLAND LIGHT.—*A red fixed light*. Building octagon, painted white. Lat. 43° 27' N. Long. 65° 36' W. It is high water at Cape Sable, full and change, at 7½ o'clock, and the spring tides rise 12ft., neaps 6ft.

SEAL ISLAND LIGHT—The first light on approaching the Bay of Fundy is on the S. point of Seal Island. *A fixed white light*, elevated 98ft. above high water, and may be seen, when approaching, from every point of the compass, at the distance of 18 or 20 miles. Building octagon, painted white.

PANNUCO HARBOUR LIGHT—On the S. E. side of the entrance to the harbour, about 13 miles northerly of Cape Sable. *A fixed white light*, elevated 28ft. above high water level, (rise and fall 12ft.) Building square, painted white, and stands 58 fathoms from low water mark.

FISH ISLAND LIGHT—On Big Fish Island, east side of the entrance to Tusket River. *Two fixed horizontal, white lights* visible at a distance of 12 miles.

YARMOUTH LIGHT—On the Island of Cape Forehu, western side of the entrance to the harbour. *A bright revolving light*, 145ft. above sea level, visible 4 minute and invisible half a minute, and may be seen in clear weather 18 or 20 miles. Building painted red and white in vertical stripes. Lat. 43° 48' N. Long. 66° 09' W.

BRIER ISLAND LIGHT—Situated on the western side. *A white fixed light*, elevated 92ft. above sea level, and visible 15 miles. Building octagon, painted white.

WESTPORT LIGHT—On Peter's Island, at the S. entrance of the E. side of the Bay of Fundy. *Two white fixed lights*, placed horizontally, to distinguish it from Brier Island light, elevated 40ft. above high water mark, and visible 10 miles, and is intended to lead vessels into Westport, or through Grand Passage. Building square, painted white.

BOAR'S HEAD LIGHT—N. entrance Petite Passage, Bay of Fundy. *Alternate flashes red and white*, at intervals of 60 seconds. Building square, painted white.

DIGBY GUT LIGHT—On Point Prim at the entrance of the Gut. *A fixed white light*, elevated 76ft. above high water, and visible 13 miles. Building square, painted red and white vertically.

PORT WILLIAMS (late Marshall's Cove) LIGHT—*Two fixed white lights*, 20ft. apart perpendicularly, and visible from all points of approach. Building square, painted white. Port Williams is distant from Digby Gut Light E. 25 miles; and from Black Rock W. 28 miles.

MARGARETVILLE LIGHT.—*A red fixed light*, visible 10 miles from all points of approach. Building square, painted white and black in horizontal stripes. Margaretville is distant E. 37 miles from Digby Gut light; and W. 15 miles from Black Rock light.

BLACK ROCK LIGHT—A white fixed light, elevated 55ft. above the level of high water, and visible 12 miles. Building square, white.

SPENCER'S POINT—A white fixed light is placed on the top of a building at this point, on the northern shore of Colequid Bay, near the head of Minas Basin.

PARRSBORO' LIGHT—On the W. side of the entrance to Parrsboro' River. A white fixed light, elevated 30ft. above high water, and visible 9 miles. Tower octagon, painted white, and stands close to high water mark on the beach.

HONTS BLUFF LIGHT—A white fixed light, 95ft. above the level of high water (rise and fall 40 to 45ft.), and visible in clear weather over the greater part of the Basin of Minas (after passing Cape Blomidon) and above the Five Islands and up Windsor River, until intersected by the continuation of the Bluff to the southward of it. Building square, painted white, standing 66ft. from the Bluff.

BENXT COAT HEAD LIGHT—The lantern is erected on a square tower attached to the main building. A white fixed light, elevated 75ft. above high water level, and visible from all points of approach.

GANNET ROCK LIGHT—The Gannet rock is 40ft. above high water, and has a light house upon it, painted black and white, in vertical stripes. A white flash light, 20 seconds dark and 40 seconds light in each minute. A gun is fired to answer signals during a fog. This light is intended to warn vessels of their approach to a very dangerous range of shoals and ledges, which extend from the old Proprietor to the seal Islands off Machias, a distance of about 20 miles. Between the northernmost and southernmost of the *Murr Ledges*, there is a range of dangerous rocks and shoals, many of them above water, and which extend westward from the light house about 4 miles. From this range, farther westerly, about 8 miles, lies a dangerous breaker, called the Bull. This may be avoided by keeping three remarkable headlands, near the S. W. end of Grand Manan, open.

MACHIAS SEAL ISLAND LIGHTS—Two white fixed lights, elevated about 48ft. above high water, and bear from each other E. S. E. and W. N. W. distant about 200ft., by which circumstance (the two light houses at the same station) they will be immediately distinguished from all others upon the coast. Both buildings painted white. Vessels standing to the northward between these lights and the Gannet rock, should tack or haul off the moment they bring these lights in one, as they will then not be more than $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile from the *Murr Ledges*, if more than 5 miles to the east of the lights.

GRAND MANAN ISLAND LIGHT—On Swallow Tail point, N. E. side of the Island. A white fixed light, elevated 130ft. above high water, and visible 17 miles. Building white, Lat. $44^{\circ} 45' 22''$ N. Long. $66^{\circ} 44' 4''$ W. This is a conspicuous mark in the South Channel between Brier Island and Grand Manan.

LITTLE RIVER LIGHT—On an Island at the entrance of the River. A white fixed light, elevated 40ft. and visible 11 miles.

WEST QUODDY LIGHT—This is an American light, at the western entrance to Passamaquoddy Bay. A plain white light.

CAMPO BELLO LIGHT—On N. E. extremity of the Island. A white fixed light, 64ft. above the sea. Building white with a red cross. This light enables vessels to enter Heyl Harbour at all times. It is also a guide to vessels entering the main channel, to West Isles, Moose Island, and the inner Bay to Passamaquoddy.

POINT LE PRAU LIGHTS—A light house has been erected upon this projecting headland, on which *two fixed white lights*, are exhibited, one above the other, distant 28ft. The lower lantern is fixed to the outside of the building, and throws its light quite inshore, both to the eastward and westward into Maces Bay. The highest light is elevated 81ft. and visible 15 miles. Building painted red and white in horizontal stripes, 5ft. broad, and bears from the eastermost Wolves E. by N., 11 miles.

ST. JOHN, N. B. HARBOUR LIGHT—On Partridge Island at the entrance of the River and Harbour. *A white fixed light*, 120ft. from high water mark, and visible 20 miles. Building painted red and white in vertical stripes, and is furnished with a Bell, to be tolled invariably in thick weather. **THE BEACON LIGHT** within Partridgo Island exhibits *a white fixed light*, 35ft. from high water, and visible 10 miles. Building painted white and black in vertical stripes.

QUACO HEAD LIGHT—A light house is erected on a small rock lying off Quaco Head. *A revolving white light*, elevated 70ft. above high water mark, showing twice full and twice dark in a minute, and visible 15 miles. Building painted in red and white horizontal stripes.

CAPE ENRAGE LIGHT—On the point of that name in Westmorland, N. B., nearly opposite to Apple River light in Cumberland, N. S. *A brilliant fixed light*, 151ft. above the sea, and visible 15 miles. Building square, painted white.

GRINDSTONE ISLAND LIGHT—On Grindstone Island, Chignecto Bay, Lat. 45° 43' 13" N., Long. 64° 37' 25" W., 60 feet above the level of high water. Octagonal tower, painted white.

APPLE RIVER LIGHT—On Hetty Point, N. side of the entrance to the River, and three leagues to the eastward of Cape Chignecto. *Two fixed horizontal lights*, elevated 40ft above high water level, and visible about 10 miles. Building square, painted white.

EGG ISLAND LIGHT—Off Jeddore.

Note.—This light is in course of erection. Notice will be given in the newspapers when it will come into operation.

OUTER BEAVER OR WILLIAM'S ISLAND LIGHT—*A revolving white flash light*, elevated 70ft. above the sea level, and visible 12 miles. Building square, painted white, with two black balls painted on its seaward side. A reef extends eastward from Beaver Island a considerable distance. Lat. 44° 49' N. Long. 62° 21' W.

WHITE HEAD ISLAND LIGHT—On the S. W. point of the Island. *A bright flash light* of 10 seconds duration followed by eclipses of 19 seconds, displaying alternately 3 flashes and 3 eclipses in a minute. Tower square, painted white, standing 75 fathoms from the water's edge, with an octagonal Iron lantern, 60ft. above the sea level.

CRANBERRY ISLAND LIGHT—(Cape Canso) *Two white fixed lights* placed vertically 12 yards apart, the upper 75ft., the lower 45ft., above high water mark, visible 15 and 9 miles respectively. Tower striped white and red horizontally. Lat. 45° 13' 49" N. Long. 60° 55' 29" W.

GUYSBOROUGH HARBOUR LIGHT—On the W. side of the entrance to the harbour, head of Chedabucto Bay. *A fixed white light*, elevated 30ft. and visible 8 miles. Lat. 45° 22' 47" N. Long. 61° 29' 11" W.

EDDY, or SAND POINT LIGHT—(Gut of Canso.) On the W. side of the S. entrance to the Strait of Canso. *Two horizontal fixed white lights*, 24ft. apart, elevated 25ft. each, and visible 8 miles. Building square, painted white with a black diamond on the seaward side.

PICTOU ISLAND LIGHT—On the S. E. point of the Island. *A white fixed light*, 52ft. above sea level, and visible 12 miles. Building square, painted white.

PICROU HARBOUR LIGHT—On the S. point of the entrance to the harbour. *A white fixed light* 65ft. above sea level, and visible 12 miles. *A small red fixed light* is shown below the lantern. Building octagon, painted in red and white stripes vertically.

ARICHAT LIGHT—On Marache point, S. side of the entrance to the harbour. *A white fixed light*, elevated 34ft., and visible 8 miles. Building square, painted white.

GREEN ISLAND LIGHT—Off Arichat.

Note.—This light is in course of erection. Notice will be given in the newspapers when it will come into operation.

LOUISBURG LIGHT—On light house point, N. side of the entrance of the harbour. *A white fixed light*, elevated 85ft. and visible 16 miles. Building square, painted white, with vertical black stripes.

SCATTARI ISLAND LIGHT—On the N. E. point of the Island. *A revolving light*, visible 60 seconds and invisible 30 seconds, elevated 90ft., and visible 15 miles. Building white, Lat. 40° 2' 13" N., Long. 59° 40' 18" W. The light should never be brought to bear to the eastward of N. N. E., or to the southward of S. S. W., nor approached nearer than $\frac{1}{2}$ miles. Gun fired as signal, and a boat for assistance.

FLINT ISLAND LIGHT—On Flint Island, E. coast of Cape Breton, between Cape Granby and Point Gage, entrance to Cow Bay. Lat. 40° 11' 5" N., Long. 59° 45 to 50 W. *A bright flash light*, every 15 seconds visible from all points of the compass, 65ft. above sea level, and can be seen 12 miles. Building octagon, painted white.

LOW POINT LIGHT—On the eastern side of the entrance to Sydney, C. B. harbour. *A white fixed light*, elevated 70ft. above sea level, and visible 14 miles. Building painted red and white vertically.

OUTER BIRD ISLAND LIGHT—Between the entrance of the Great Bras d'Or and St. Ann's, (E. coast of Cape Breton). *Alternate flashes of red and white at intervals of 60 seconds*, elevated 77ft., and visible 14 miles. Building octagon, painted white. Lat. 46° 25' N., Long. 60° 25' 30" W.

ST. PAUL'S ISLAND LIGHTS—On the S. point of this Island, Lat. 47° 11' 20", Long. 60° 9' 36" is an octagon light house exhibiting *a revolving white light every minute*, elevated 140ft., and visible 20 miles on all bearings, except between S. S. E. southward to W. On a rock, 26ft. from the end of the Island, in Lat. 47° 13' 59", Long. 60° 8' 20" is another similar building of the same height showing *a white fixed light*, visible 20 miles, between N. by E. + E. northward to E. N. E. A bell is sounded during a fog, and a gun fired every 4 hours.

MARGARIE, OR SEA WOLF ISLAND LIGHT—On the N. W. side of Cape Breton, nearly midway between Mabou and Cheticamp harbours, and distant $\frac{2}{3}$ miles from the mainland. *A white fixed light*, near the centre and summit of the Island, elevated 2,08ft. above high water mark, and visible 21 miles from all points of approach. Square white building.

To vessels in dangerous proximity to the Island, the light may become obscured by the abrupt cliffs on the sides of the Island.

PORT HOOD LIGHT—*A fixed light*, shows red on the N. side; and white to the southward, elevated 54ft. above the sea, and visible 10 miles. Square white tower. Lat. 46° N. Long. 61° 31' 40" W.

CAPE RACE, N. F. L. LIGHT—*A revolving white light*, attaining its greatest brilliancy every half minute, elevated 180 ft., and visible 17 miles. The S. E. face of the building is striped red and white vertically. Lat. 46° 39' 44" N., Long. 53° 7' 00" W.

BELLE-ISLE LIGHT—On an Island at E. entrance of the Strait of Belle-Isle, separating Labrador from Newfoundland, situated at the extreme S. W. point of the Island. *A fixed white light*, elevated 470ft. Building circular, faced with fire bricks of a light colour, visible 28½ nautical or 32½ statute miles. Lat. 51° 53' N. Long. 55° 26' W.

POINT AMOUR LIGHT—Labrador coast, Strait of Belle-Isle, at the S. E. point of Forteau Bay. *A fixed white light*, visible 18½ nautical or 21½ statute miles. Building circular, faced with fire brick of a light colour. Lat. 51° 27½' N. Long. 56° 51' W.

ANTICOSTI—There are three excellent lights on the Island of Anticosti:—THE SOUTH WEST POINT LIGHT is on the extremity of the point—the tower is of a conical form, 75ft. high—the light is bright, and revolves every minute, and can be seen from N. N. W. to about S. S. E. The lantern is elevated about 100ft. above the sea at high water, and can be seen 15 miles. HEATH POINT LIGHT is of the same form, dimensions and colour as the one above, showing a bright fixed light from W. N. W. to N. E. by N.—the lantern is elevated 110ft. above the sea—and is visible 15 or 18 miles in clear weather—lighted from April to Decr. 15. The light house must always be kept open southward of Cormorant point. WEST POINT LIGHT shows a fixed light, elevated 112ft. and is visible 15 miles. Tower circular, stone faced with white fire brick.

CAPE ROZIER LIGHT—E. coast of Gaspe, at the extreme point of the Cape. *A fixed white light*, elevated 136ft. and visible 16½ nautical or 19½ statute miles. Building circular, faced with fire brick of a light colour.

An air or fog whistle is sounded at short intervals during foggy weather and snow storms, or by a gun, fired every hour, in case the whistle is out of order, at the above four lighthouses.

On letters to CANADA and NEW BRUNSWICK the rate is 5 cents—*prepayment optional*. Letters to PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND must be prepaid; if posted wholly or in part unpaid, they will be forwarded and charged 5 cents in addition to the postage. On letters to the UNITED STATES (except to Oregon and California) 10 cents; to Oregon and California, 15 cents—*must be prepaid*.

Official letters addressed to the Provincial and Military Departments, are exempt from prepayment.

Registered letters for the Provincial Public Departments and the Military Departments, addressed to Halifax, can be sent without prepayment of postage or registry fee.

~~✓~~ Masters of vessels arriving in the Province are entitled to receive for each letter they may deliver at the first Office they touch or arrive at, or with which they may communicate, when inward bound, 2½ cents.

Every master of a vessel inward bound, shall at the port or place of arrival, sign a declaration, in the presence of the person authorized to take the same, that he has to the best of his knowledge and belief, delivered every letter, package or parcel of letters that was on board his vessel, except such as are exempted. And no officer of the Colonial Revenue shall permit such vessel to enter or report until such declaration has been made and produced, nor permit to break bulk or make entry, until all letters shall be delivered at the Post Office.

Letters for registry must be posted *half an hour* previous to the closing of the particular Mail by which they are to be sent, and the postage as well as the Registration fee must be prepaid. The registration of a letter addressed to any place in Nova Scotia or British North America and the United States is 10 cents; to the United Kingdom, 12½ cents; to Australia and all other places, when passing through the United Kingdom, 25 cents. No registered letters will be forwarded between two Way offices.

Letters posted in any city or town in the Province for delivery in the same city or town, are charged 2 cents; if unpaid they are taxed 4 cents.

Letters *prepaid* by stamp dropped into the box during the night and up to 4.30 A. M. will be forwarded by the Mails despatched the same morning.

Semi-daily Mail to and from Dartmouth, postage 2 cents. If unpaid 4 cents.

All letters are charged by weight, and a uniform rate of postage has been established throughout British North America. A single letter must not exceed $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. The rates of postage mentioned all refer to a *single letter*. If a letter exceeds the $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. it is charged double and so on according to weight.

PRINTED BOOKS transmitted through the Province are charged at the rate of one cent per oz. up to 48 ozs., PRINTED Books, Magazines, Reviews or Pamphlets, binding rollers for prints or maps not exceeding *two feet* in length, markers, and every thing appertaining to such publications, are sent between Nova Scotia and the United Kingdom, and also between Nova Scotia, Bermuda, Newfoundland, and the British West Indies, at the following rates:—for a single volume not exceeding 4 ozs. 3*l.* sterling; above 4 ozs. and not exceeding 8 ozs. 6*l.* sterling; above 8 ozs. and not exceeding one pound 1*s.* sterling; and so on, adding 1*s.* for every additional pound or fraction of a pound. *Must be prepaid*.

PERIODICALS, BRITISH or FOREIGN, posted *within* the Province for delivery *within* or *without* the Province, are charged *two cents each number*, to be pre-paid by stamp.—Those published in the Province, and all Agricultural reports, whether published in the Province, or elsewhere, *go free*.

BRITISH AND COLONIAL NEWSPAPERS, and small religious periodicals, such as the British Workman, Penny Post, Child's paper, Play Hour, Sabbath School Visitor, and others of a like description, whether British or Foreign, pass through the Nova Scotia Post Office, whether posted *within* or *without* the Province, *free*. All other Newspapers are charged *one cent each*, if mailed *within* the Province; if mailed *without*, for delivery *within* the Province, the postage is collected on delivery. One Copy called an exchange copy, of any Newspaper, if addressed to a Newspaper Publisher in Nova Scotia, passes *free*.

Handbills, Lithographed Letters, Circulars and other printed matter of a like description, posted *within* the Province and addressed to any place *within* or *without* the same, are charged *one cent per oz. must be prepaid*.

All papers printed by order of either House of the Imperial Parliament, or by her Majesty's command, or by the Legislative Council or House of Assembly of this Province, or by virtue of an address of the Council or Assembly, are transmitted by post, *within* the Province *free*.

No printed paper, whether Newspaper, book, pamphlet, or other paper, shall be transmitted either *free* or at a reduced rate of postage, unless it is sent, 1, Without a cover, or in a cover open at the sides or ends. 2. There shall be no words or communication printed on the paper after its publication, or upon the cover thereof, nor any writing or marks upon it, or upon the cover of it, except the name and address of the sender, and of the person to whom it is sent. 3. There shall be no paper or thing enclosed in it, or with any such paper or publication, and in any case where these conditions are not fulfilled the whole of every such paper will be charged letter postage, and every such printed paper going out of the Province may either be detained by the Postmaster General, or forwarded charged with letter postage.

[¶] The word "Newspaper" means any publication issued not less frequently than once a week, and containing notices of passing events—and the word "Periodical" means any publication issued at regular intervals, but less frequently than once a week.

PARCEL POST.—Parcels closed at the ends or sides are sent by post in Nova Scotia at the following rates, which must be pre-paid by stamp:—If under 8 ounces, $1\frac{1}{4}$ cents; above 8 ozs. but less than a pound, 25 cents; above 1 pound and not exceeding 2 pounds, 50 cents; above 2 pounds, but not exceeding 3 pounds, 75 cents; beyond this weight no parcel can be forwarded, and the size of the parcel is not to exceed 1 foot in length or breadth, and six inches in thickness.

PATTERN POST.—Patterns of Merchandise can be sent by post between Nova Scotia and England at the following rates:—for a packet not exceeding 4 oz. 7 cents; under $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. $1\frac{1}{4}$ cents; not exceeding 1 lb. 25 cents; above 1 and not $1\frac{1}{2}$ lbs. $3\frac{1}{4}$ cents; above $1\frac{1}{2}$ and not 2 lbs. 50 cents; every additional $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. $1\frac{1}{4}$ cents; no parcel to exceed 2 feet in length, breadth or depth. The regulations in all other respects are the same as those relating to the Book post.

Made on the Ship Staff at Citadel Hill, when Vessels are seen from the Citadel or reported from an outpost.

For 1 square rigged vessel, 2 balls close up, one on the outer halliard and one on the inner halliard.

" 2 Do. 1 ball hoisted on the outer halliard, and one close up on the inner halliard.

" 3 Do. 2 balls close up, 1 out and one in.

" 4 Do. 2 balls separate, and one close up on the inner halliard.

" 5 Do. a pendant of any colour on the outer halliard and one ball close up inside.

" 6 Do. a pendant under a ball close up on the outer halliard, and a ball at the inner halliard close up.

For 7 Do. a pendant over a ball close up on the outer halliard, and a ball close up on the inner halliard.

" 8 Do. a pendant under 2 balls close on the outer halliard, with a ball close up on the inner halliard.

" 10 Do. a flag of any colour close up on the outer halliard with a ball close up on the inner halliard.

The above balls, &c., are hoisted at the east or west yard arm, according to the quarter the vessel first appears in.

When sailing vessels are reported from an outpost the following signals are made on the lower yard, now used exclusively for sailing vessels, as repeats:—

Two or more do., a cross half hoisted.

A topsail Schooner, a cross close up at the inner halliard.

The upper yard of the Ship Staff, is used solely to designate Steam Vessels, thus:—

Two large balls close up, one at the outer and one at the inner halliard, E. or W., a Steamer reported in that quarter.

A small ball at the outer, and a large one at the inner halliard. a second class Packet or Merchant Steamer.

A large ball at the outer, and a small one at the inner halliard, a Man-of-War Steamer, or Royal Mail Steamer, or large Merchant Steamer.

Two lanterns—one red and the other white are hoisted at night to denote a Steamer reported.

The red lantern is always shewn at the end of the yard arm, and the white one at the inner halliard, E. or W., according to quarter the Steamer is reported in.

Numbers are indicated the same as on the lower yard.

When the description of vessel is ascertained, the following descriptive colours will be hoisted at the mast head:

A Union Jack—a Flag Ship.

Man-of-war Screw Steamer, a white pendant with a blue ball in the centre, over the Union Jack.
