Appendix No. 1 - Plan for Carrying out Medical Relief:

(Kanagawa Branch of the Japan Red Cross Society)

A. Medical relief:

The activities of the medical relief shall begin, commanded by the Chief of General Affairs in the respective Local Headquarters and in accordance with the Organization Table of the First Medical Relief Team, as soon as the Headquarters of the Disaster Relief Corps in Kanagawa Prefecture (Article 32 of Disaster Relief Law) instruct us or the President of the Society or the Chief of Branch Office of the Society order us.

Against any further development of the circumstances, and for the purpose of shifting, reserved members shall be prepared.

The dispatch of the Medical Relief Team shall be promptly done, according to the following three grades.

THE THREE GRADES

EMERGENCY OF THE FIRST GRADE - Should it happen, all the teams mentioned in the appending table shall be dispatched; moreover, the Headquarters of the Local Disaster Relief Corps (Japan Red Cross's) shall exert on the largest scale possible, and, at the same time, shall ask the co-operation of both the Headquarters of the Central Disaster Relief Corps (Japan Red Cross's) and the neighboring branch Office.

EMERGENCY OF THE SECOND GRADE - Should it happen, 5 ever-ready relief teams mentioned in the appending list shall be dispatched.

The development of the circumstances shall sometimes require the preparation of reserved members.

EMERGENCY OF THE THIRD GRADE - Should it happen, one Relief Team or two shall be promptly dispatched.

1. In time of emergency of the first grade or the second grade, or when necessary, judging from the circumstances (Article 21 Disaster Relief Law), the support of some doctors of the Doctor's Union or the prefecture shall be asked.

Moreover, if necessary, the Medical Relief Team shall be asked to be dispatched. To prepare for the measures, the Kanagawa Branch Office of the Society shall be in close contact with the City or District-branch of the Union to have general Emergency Relief Teams consisting of doctors, pharmacists, dentists, midwives, health-advising nurses, common nurses and others experienced in sanitary affairs, organized.

2. Many members of the Relief Teams belonging to the Kanagawa Branch of the Society have changed their places of residence owing to the damages caused by air-raids; so the investigation-cards, mentioned in the appending list, shall be sent every member in order to ascertain their present addresses and other items.

3. Required members in their homes shall be called out by telegram or other speedy means. (Notification No. 43 issued on March 3, 1943)

4. Medical tools, Medicines and other sanitary materials:

Medicines and other sanitary materials, (mentioned in the appending Table No. 3) shall be always prepared in the ruck-sacks and other receptacles. It goes without saying that medicines and other sanitary materials shall be ready in the office of the Kanagawa Branch.

Tools, medicines and other sanitary materials shall, for the time being, be prepared enough to be used by 10 teams: they shall be taken charge of by the following institutions:

5. Source of drafting the members:

(Appending Form No. 1)

Organization of the 1st Relief Team

Ever-ready Team - (1 - Doctor; 1 - clerk; 5 - nurses) There will be 5 teams, to which a servant shall be added, if necessary.

Reserve team - (1 - Doctor; 1 - clerk; 5 nurses) There will be 5 teams.

Remarks:

1. Doctors shall be selected from among the doctors attached either to the Yokohama Red Cross Hospital or to the Hatano Dispensary. If necessary, some doctors in medical practice shall be selected.
2. Clerks shall be selected from among the chief clerks or assistant engineers attached to the Yokohama Branch of the Japan Red Cross Society. If necessary, however, some chief nurses shall do the part of a clerk concurrently.
3. Nurses shall be selected from among the nurses attached either to the Yokohama Red Cross Hospital or to the Hatano dispensary. If necessary, some nurses who are at home shall be selected.
4. The members of the Ever-ready Team shall consist of those who are attached either to the Yokohama Red Cross Hospital or to the Hatano Dispensary and of those nurses who live either in the city of Yokohama or in the neighborhood from where the headquarters can be reached in less than 2 hours.
5. The members of the reserve teams shall consist of those who are attached to the State Hospitals or nurses at home.

Team # 1 - (1 Doctor, 1 Clerk, 5 Nurses, Total of 7 persons) The doctor and nurses are to be supplied from among the personnel of the Yokohama Red Cross Hospital, the clerk being supplied from among the personnel of the Kanagawa Branch of the Japan Red Cross Society.

Team # 2 - (1 Doctor, 1 Clerk, 5 Nurses, Total of 7 persons) The doctor and the clerk shall be supplied from among the personnel of the Hatano Dispensary, while 2 of the 5 nurses shall be drafted from among those who are in their homes.

Team # 3 - (1 Doctor, 1 Clerk, 5 Nurses, Total of 7 persons) All the members shall be supplied from among the personnel of the Yokohama Red Cross Hospital.

Team # 4, # 5, # 6, # 7, # 8, # 9, and # 10 - (1 Doctor each, 1 Clerk each, and 5 Nurses each, each team with a total of 7 persons) The doctors shall be supplied by those who are given charge of medical aid by the Kanagawa Doctors' Union, the clerks shall be supplied by the chief of clerks of the Kanagawa Branch of the Japan Red Cross Society. The Nurses shall be drafted from among those who are in their homes.

REMARKS: (1) Other members than those mentioned in the chart shall be notified in accordance with the development of the circumstances, to be ready.
(2) The members shall be shifted, after several days work (Usually after 5 days work)

6. Transportation of personnel & materials: Needless to say, railway trains and street cars shall be utilized. To make a more speedy movement, however, a motor truck of the Occupational Forces shall always be ready at the Yokohama Red Cross Hospital.

Close relationship shall be kept between us and the station masters (Especially of Yokohama Central Station and Sakuragicho Station)

As a further step, automobiles shall be lent from Transportation Section of the Kanagawa Prefectural Government.

7. Food and clothing for the members:

(1) Special ration of food (the first ration being for about 40 persons consisting of 5 bodies for the maintenance of a period of a week) shall be granted by Welfare Section, Public Welfare Department of the Kanagawa Prefectural Government.

(2) The clothing shall be prepared in the Branch for 50 persons, as inventoried in the following table,

Badges on the left upper part of European-style coats shall be worn by male members.

Arm bands of the Japan Red Cross Society shall be worn by all the members including female members.

Appendix No 2 - How to deliver food, fuel and timber in an emergency:

Besides carrying out the emergency delivery of food, fuel and timber according to Notification No. 29 of the Kanagawa Prefectural Government issued on January 29, 1943, the following methods shall be pursued:

I. Delivery Centers:

1. Staple Food The Kanagawa Branch of the Public Corporation of Rationing Staple Food.
2. Milk-products The Commercial Co-operative Society of Nursing food in Kanagawa Prefecture.
3. Bean Paste The Bean-paste Department of the Kanagawa Branch of the Public Corporation of Rationing Food Stuffs.
4. Soy The Soy Department of the same.
5. Pickled Vegetables The Industrial Co-operative Society of Pickled Vegetables in Kanagawa Prefecture (always in reserved stock against an emergency).
6. Food Boiled Down in Soy The Industrial Co-operative Society of Boiled-down Food in Kanagawa Prefecture.
7. Dried Fish Distribution agencies shall be nominated at every delivery.
8. Fuel The Forestry Society of Distributing Fuel in Kanagawa Prefecture.

II. Food

1. Those who shall receive delivery:
 - a. Those sufferers who have evacuated to a certain point or those sufferers who are in obvious need.
 - b. Those who participate in relief endeavors and acknowledged to be deserving delivery in a body by the mayor or village-head. (Police-chief also may acknowledge them.) Police-men, fire-men and officials who participated in relief-endeavors.
 - c. Those who are engaged in emergency work for the reconstruction of damaged electric, water, gas, traffic, and communication facilities and have been approved by the mayor or village head. (Police chiefs also may approve them)
 - d. Milk-food stuffs shall be rationed to the sucklings who need nourishment by milk and to the sick and wounded who need milk-foodstuffs. They must be the victims of the mayor or village-head. (Police chiefs also may approve them.)
 - e. Those who are specially recognized by the Chief of the town to deserve the ration.
2. The Quantity and Duration of the ration:
 - a. The quantity of the ration shall be as follows:
 - (1) Staple food - 2 "go" and 5 "shaku" per head per day.
 - (2) Milk-foodstuff - 1/8 pound per head per day.
 - (3) Seasoning materials:
 - bean-paste - 3 "momme" per head per day.
 - Soy - 0.9 "Shaku" per head per day.
 - (4) Pickled vegetables, and pickled dried plums - 5 "momme" per head per day.
 - (5) Salted or dried fish - 10 "momme" per head per meal
 - (6) Food boiled down in soy - 5 "momme" per head per meal.
 - b. The duration of the ration shall be settled in consideration of the extent of the calamity, but the longest duration shall, in most cases, be 6 days.
3. How to ration the foods
 - a. In view of the present food conditions, the ration shall be handled by the Kanagawa Prefectural Government.
 - b. In case the emergency is so pressing that the connection the Prefectural Government cannot be had, the mayor or village-head (or sometimes the police chief) shall negotiate with the organs of rationing to carry out the speedy ration. In this case, the report stating the following details shall be later sent to the head of the Emergency Relief Corps.

- (1) The date and location of the calamity
 - (2) The number of persons, quantity, and articles rationed.
 - (3) The name of the person responsible for the receipt of the articles.
- c. The kinds of food (except staple ones) to be rationed to the crowd of victims assemble at a certain place shall be strictly restricted for the purpose of avoiding trouble and disorder in rationing.
4. Remarks:
- a. The special ration of food and fuel to the sufferers other than those who need rationing in a body shall be done in an ordinary way. However, only when the Chief of the Emergency Aid Corps deems it necessary, he shall discharge the ration in the following ways:
 - (1) When necessary, the quantity of the articles to be rationed shall be changed temporarily.
 - (2) Special ration shall be made to the consumers in a definite area where the ordinary ration has been stopped as a consequence or because of the disaster.
 - (3) Special ration of food and fuel shall be done to those who evacuated to their relatives' or friends' houses after checking the certificates issued by the mayor or village-head. In this case, however, the longest duration of the special ration shall be 5 days and the special ration shall be followed by the ordinary ration.

III. Fuel:

1. Those who are to be given the ration.
 - a. Those victims who evacuated in a body, to a definite place in a calamity mentioned in the Emergency Relief Law.
 - b. Those who participate in the relief when they need cooking, warming themselves, and the like. They must be approved by the mayor or the village-head. (Police chiefs also may approve them).
 - c. Those who are engaged in emergency electric, water, gas, traffic, and communication facilities, when they need cooking, warming themselves and the like. They must be approved by the mayor or the village-head. (Police chiefs may also approve them).
 - d. Those who are specially recognized by the Chief of the Emergency Aid Corps to deserve the ration.
2. The quantity and duration of ration.
 - a. The standard quality of ration shall be as follows:
 - (1) Fire wood - one faggot for one "to" of rice (for cooking)
 - (2) Charcoal - 60 "momme" per 5 persons per 2 hours (for heating)
 - (3) Briquette - one block (whose height is 4 "sun") per 5 persons per 4 hours (for special ration, only when it is deemed necessary).
 - b. The duration of the ration shall be settled in consideration of the extent of the calamity, but the longest duration shall in most cases, be 6 days.
3. How to ration:
 - a. In view of the present fuel situation, the ration shall be handled by the Kanagawa Prefectural Government.
 - b. In case the emergency is so pressing that the connection with the Prefectural Government cannot be had, the mayor or village-head (or sometimes the police chief.) shall negotiate with the organ of rationing (the Branch of the Fuel Forestry Union) to carry out the speedy ration. In this case, the report stating the following details shall be made to the head of the Emergency Aid Corps:
 - (1) The number of persons, quantity, and articles rationed.
 - (2) The name of the person responsible for the receipt of the articles.
 - (3) And others.
4. Remarks: In a calamity not mentioned in the Emergency Relief Law, the special ration shall be done in accordance with the Regulation on Specially Rationing Fire-wood.

IV. LUMBER:

1. Those who are to be rationed:
 - a. Corporations or individuals planning to set up buildings.

- b. The ultimate consumer in the case of lumber to be used other than for construction purposes such as for packing supplies.
2. The limitation of the quantity:
 - a. For construction purposes - 3 "koku" per "tsubo".
 - b. For packing Purposes - 5 "to" per head.
 - c. For other purposes - To be settled by the officials concerned.
3. How to rations:
 - a. Those who are desirous of receiving a special ration shall tender applications stating the purpose, quantity and place of consumption, to the Chief of the Emergency Aid Corps, after receiving the certificate by the officials concerned.
 - b. The Chief of the Emergency Aid, when he affirms the validity of the contents of the application, shall direct the persons concerned to carry out the ration.
 - c. The persons thus directed shall, in their turn, direct the lumber dealers to sell the lumber suitable to the respective purpose.
 - d. The Chief of the Emergency Aid Corps shall ask the Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry to fill up the consumed quantity.

Appendix No. 3

The Regulations of the Local Calamity
Relief Committee

Article 1. This committee shall be called The Local Calamity Relief Committee in Kanagawa Prefecture and its office shall be set up in the Kanagawa Branch of the Japan Red Cross Society.

Article 3. The purpose of this committee is to express their opinions on the matters of calamity relief in response to the President of the Kanagawa Local Calamity Relief Head-office of the Japan Red Cross Society. (This Head-office shall be abbreviated as "the Local Head-office" in the following articles.)

Article 3. The officers of this committee shall be as follows:-

The chairman	
Members of the Committee	some persons
Managers	some persons

The chairman shall be the President of the Local Head-office himself.
The members of the Committee shall be appointed by the President of the Local Head-office.
The managers shall be nominated by the President of the Local Head-office to carry out the office work of the Committee.

Article 4. The meeting of the Committee shall be convened by the President of the Local Head-office for the purpose of setting up a definite plan for relief activities, whenever the President deems it necessary to do so.

Article 5. The speaker of the meeting of the Committee shall be the Chairman, the President of the Local Head-office. The member who is the Vice-President of the Local Head-office shall take the place of the President of the Local-Head-office, when unavoidable circumstances should prevent the Speaker from discharging his duties.

Article 6. The Regulations shall come into effect on July 1, 1948.

To: Mayors and Chiefs of the Local Branch Offices.

From: Chief of Public Welfare Department.

Subject: Formation of Relief Corps for Disasters.

Complying with the Notice, 22 Ko No. 619 issued by the Chief of Public Welfare Department, dated January 13, you are striving for the subject mentioned above. However, as we have to change the disaster relief system following the change of police and fire-fighting set-up and instructions from competent authorities, we ask you to take the following steps:

I. Local Branch Offices and Cities Disaster Relief Corps shall be branch Corps of the Disaster Relief Corps of the Prefecture and be named as Branch Corps of a certain Gun, Disaster Relief Corps, Kanagawa Prefecture or Branch Corps of a certain city.

- (1) Chief of Branch Corps will be appointed to the Chief of Local Branch Offices and Mayors and they are under the instructions of the chief of the Disaster Relief Corps of Prefecture.
- (2) In the City Branch Corps Public Safety Department and Fire-fighting Department will be set up beside existing Departments. In the Gun, branch corps will be as before.
 - a. Chief of Public Safety Department will be entrusted to the chief of the city police of that city.
 - b. Chief of Public Safety Department keeps in close touch with the Chief of the Corps and shares the business of the Department.
 - c. Public Safety Department will be in charge of the following business:
 - (1) Matters concerning police information in areas under the jurisdiction of the city police.
 - (2) Matters concerning police affairs in areas under the jurisdiction of the city police.
 - (3) Matters concerning to keep in touch with the national local police.
 - d. Chief of the Fire-Fighting Department will be appointed to the Chief Fire Brigades of the city.
 - e. Chief of the fire-fighting Department will be under the instructions of the Chief of Corps and shares the business of the Department.
 - f. Fire-fighting Department will be in charge of the following business:
 - (1) Matters concerning fire fighting.

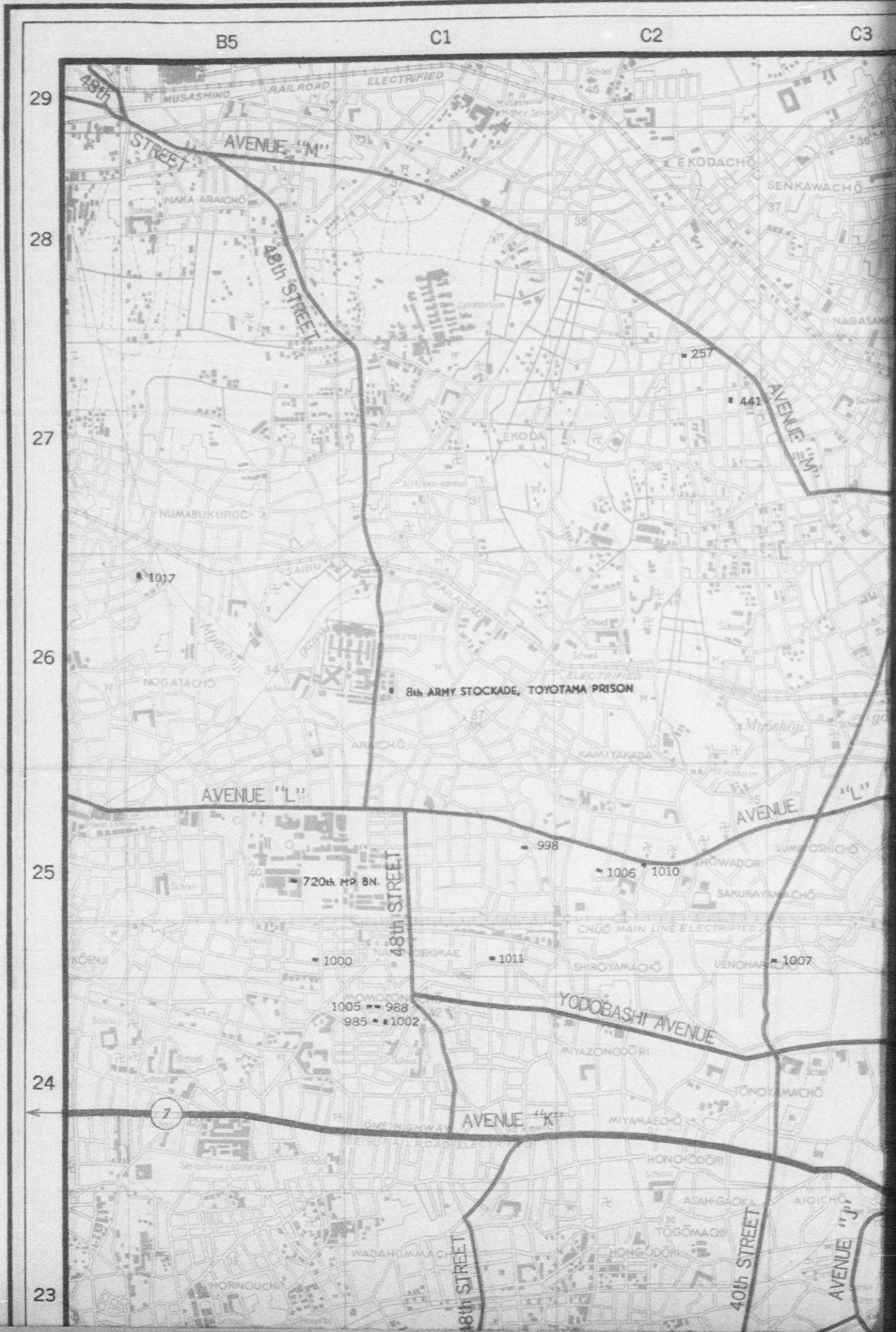
II. A squad shall be set up in each town and village under the Gun branch Corps and be named as a certain town squad or village squad of disaster relief corps, Kanagawa prefecture.

Enclosure No. 3

(Formation of Relief Corps for Disasters, Cont'd):

- (1) Squad Chief will be appointed to the town master or village master and shall be under the instruction of the Chief of Disaster Relief Corps, Kanagawa Prefecture and Chief of the Gun Branch Corps.
- (2) Gun shall be appointed to corresponding departments in the city branch corps, but not in a village which does not have an autonomous police public safety department. In this case, decision on the set-up shall be made within the prefecture.

III. Under the arrangement concerning disaster prevention, measure is needed in case of emergency under paragraph 2, Article 24 of the Fire-Fighting Formation Law. This relief set-up will be applied.



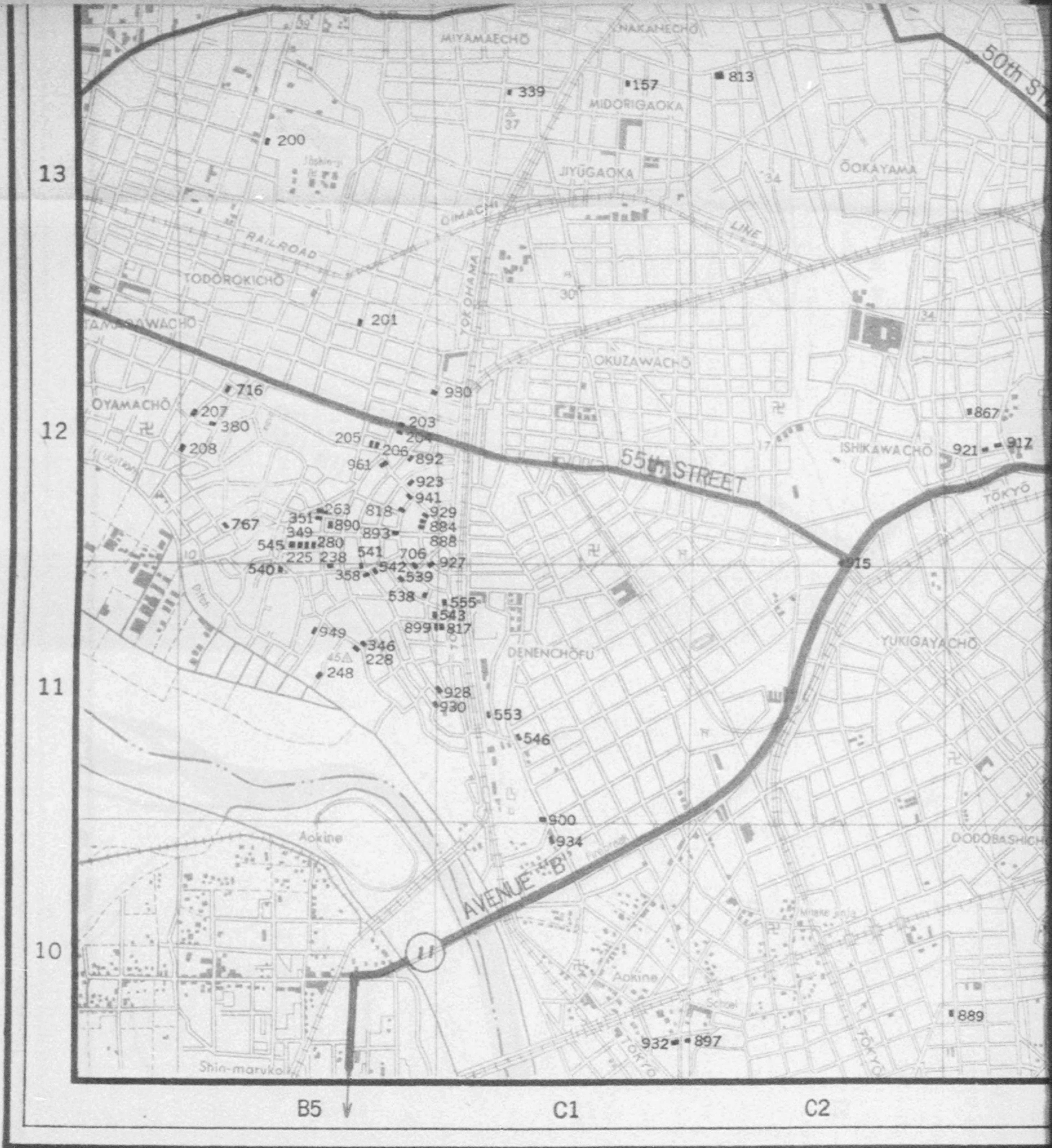

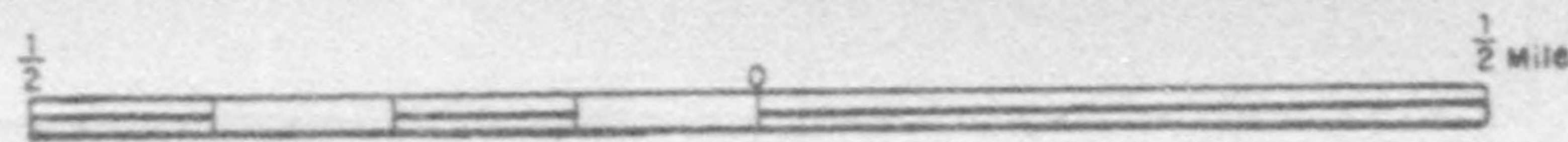
