1. It is directed that the Ministry of Finance be instructed to prepare and submit to this Headquarters immediately a report which will show with respect to each of the institutions closed pursuant to Memorandum of this Headquarters to the Imperial Japanese Government AG 091.3 (30 Sept 1945), or subsidiary of any such institution, the following information:


a. Name and address of any eleemosynary, beneficial or philanthropic organizations established by or for officers and employees, or in which officers and employees hold membership, and to which the institution has made contributions of total value exceeding 25,000 yen since 1 January 1945.

b. The nature, purpose and scope of operations of such organizations.

c. Names and addresses of all officers, directors, trustees or other persons who have held any control over disbursement of funds of such societies and organizations since 1 January 1945.

d. Amounts and dates of all contributions to such society or organization of cash or other assets made by the closed institution since 1 January 1945.

MEMORANDUM FOR: IMPERIAL JAPANESE GOVERNMENT.

THROUGH : Central Liaison Office, Tokyo.

SUBJECT : Prevention and Control of Typhus Fever in Japan.

1. In addition to the measures outlined in memorandum of 21 November 1945 for the Imperial Japanese Government, Subject: "Prevention and Control of Typhus Fever in Japan" (Reference: AG 710 (21 Nov 45)PH), it is desired that the responsible Japanese agency immediately institute further measures for the control of typhus fever as follows:

a. Disinfestation by use of Insecticide, spray, DDT, residual effect at thirty (30) day intervals of the following:

- (1) All railway cars assigned for use of Allied military personnel.
- (2) All ferries operating between Aomori and Hakodate.
- (3) Such other public conveyances that may be assigned for use of Allied military personnel.

b. After each disinfestation all conveyances will be plainly and uniformly marked as directed by the military command concerned to show date and place of treatment.

2. Military commands have been authorized to make Insecticide spray and equipment available as required for disinfestation.

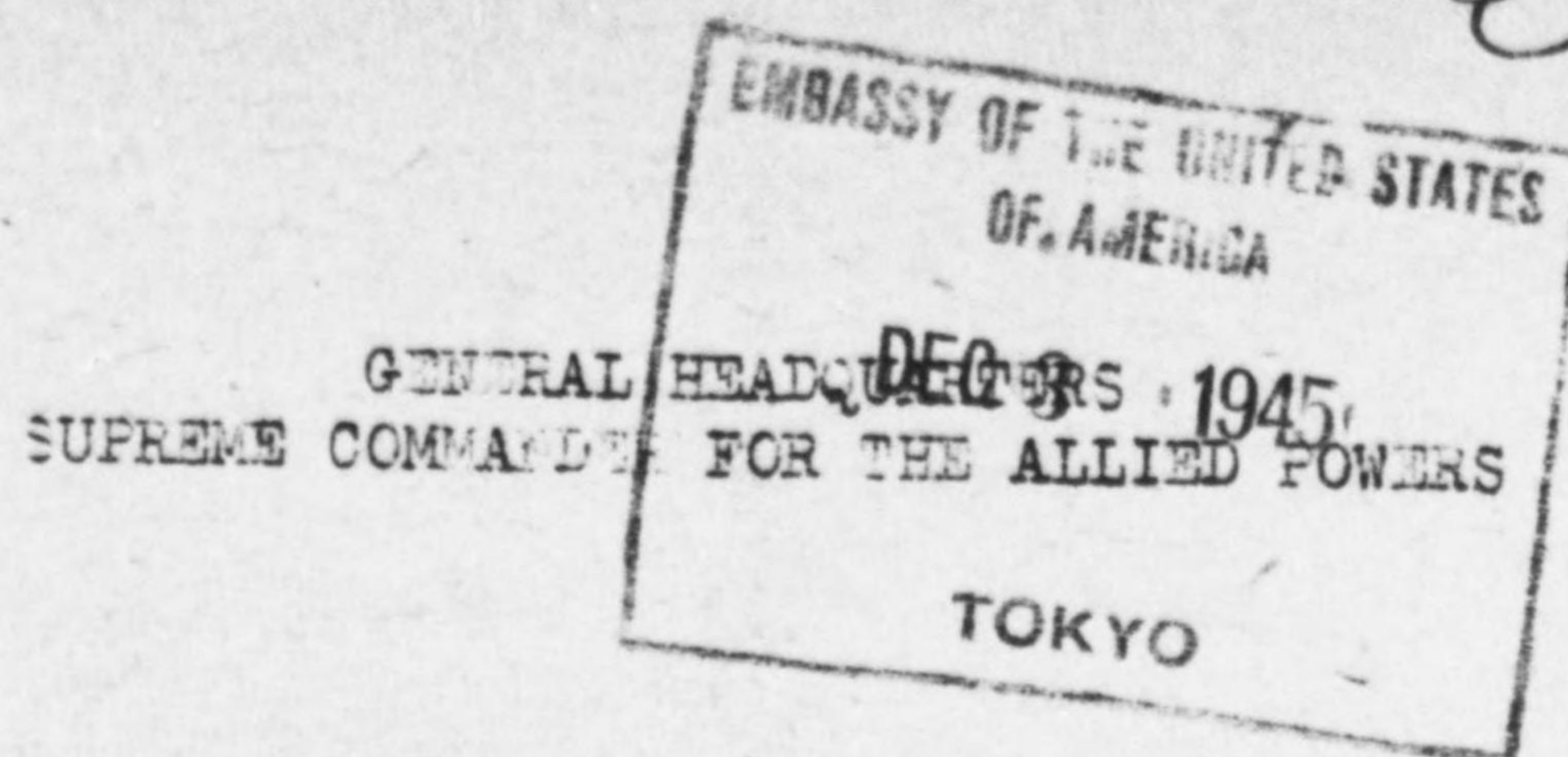
3. Japanese civilian personnel will be provided by the Japanese agency concerned to carry out required disinfestation procedures.

4. United States military personnel will be available only for instruction and supervision of Japanese civilian personnel required to carry out the provisions of this memorandum.

SUBJECT : Safekeeping of Valuable Properties of Organizations Closed Pursuant to Memorandum of this Headquarters to the Imperial Japanese Government AG 091.3 (30 Sept 45).

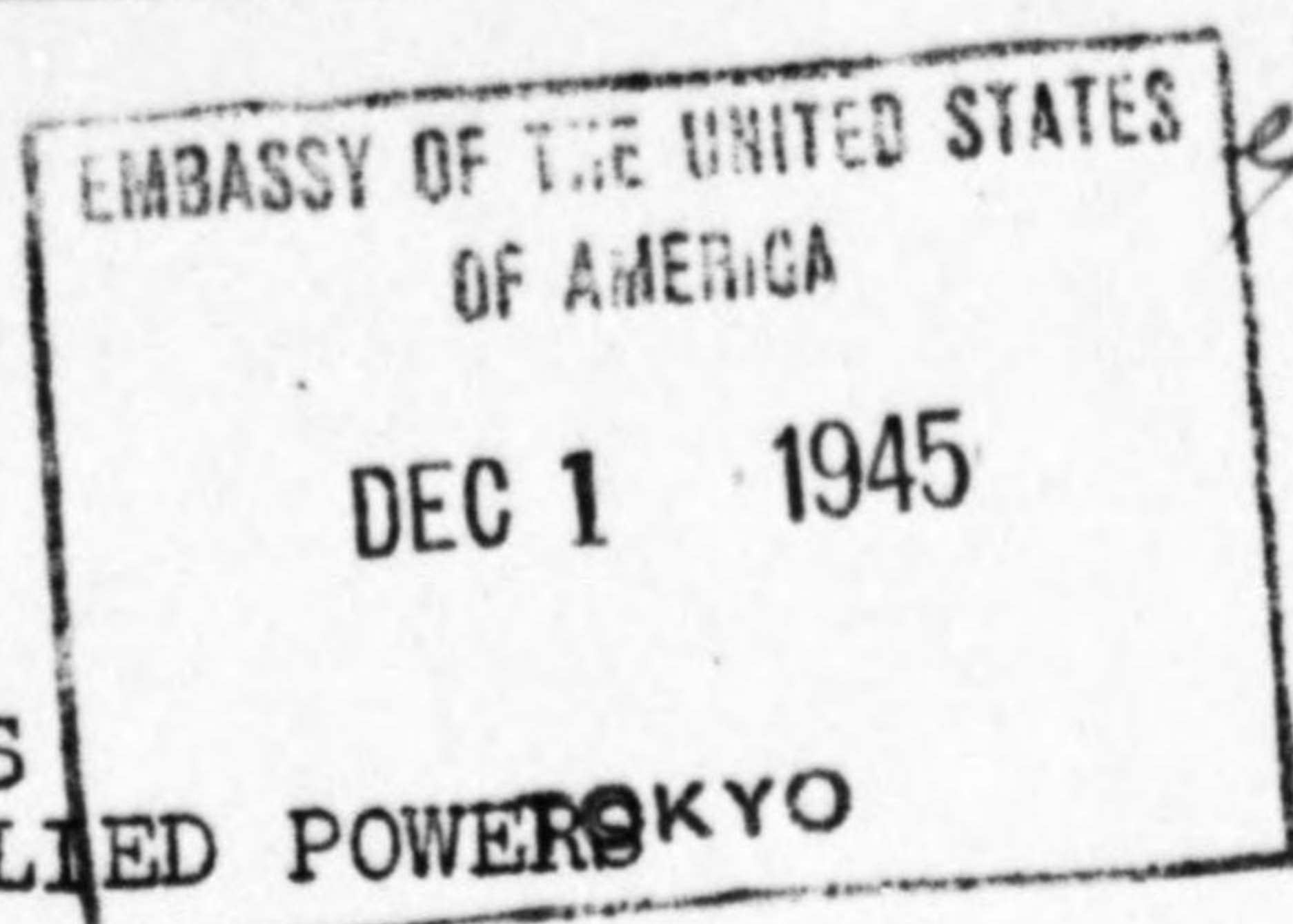
1. It is directed that the Imperial Japanese Government instruct the Bank of Japan to transfer all cash, negotiable securities, other negotiable financial paper and other readily transportable property of high value, now in Japan, and belonging to subject organizations, to the vaults of the Bank of Japan for safekeeping.

2. For each branch of the closed organizations an accurate inventory will be prepared at time of removal of the property, and the property of each such branch will be carefully segregated from property of other organizations, and earmarked. The preparation of inventories, transfer and placing in storage will be conducted in the presence of representatives of this Headquarters. Three copies, in English, of such inventories with a report of the action taken and location of vaults of storage will be furnished to this Headquarters and two copies to the Ministry of Finance.

SUBJECT : Provision of Coal at Kyushu Ports for
British Government.

1. Reference is made to your letter dated 25 November 1945, file C. I. O. No. 702 (2.2) subject as above and memorandum this Headquarters dated 19 November 1945, subject as above.

2. Port Miike, Kyushu, as the point of loading future shipments of coal for the British Government at Hong Kong is approved.

3. The vessel nominated to carry the fourth shipment of 8,000 tons of coal will arrive at Kyushu about 18 December 1945 instead of about 30 November 1945 as originally scheduled. The fifth lifting will be made about 25 December 1945. Vessels nominated for these liftings are the S. S. FORT BUFFALO and S. S. SAVANAH, respectively. If either or both of these vessels cannot be loaded with coal at Port Miike on or about the dates indicated, this Headquarters will be notified by you to that effect, and at the same time you will designate another loading port.

4. You are directed to make necessary arrangements to supply and load each of the above named vessels with 8,000 tons of regular grade coal on the dates of their arrival at Miike. It is further directed that your agent at Miike handling this matter communicate with Sixth Army authorities at that port who will be notified of the action to be taken by you.

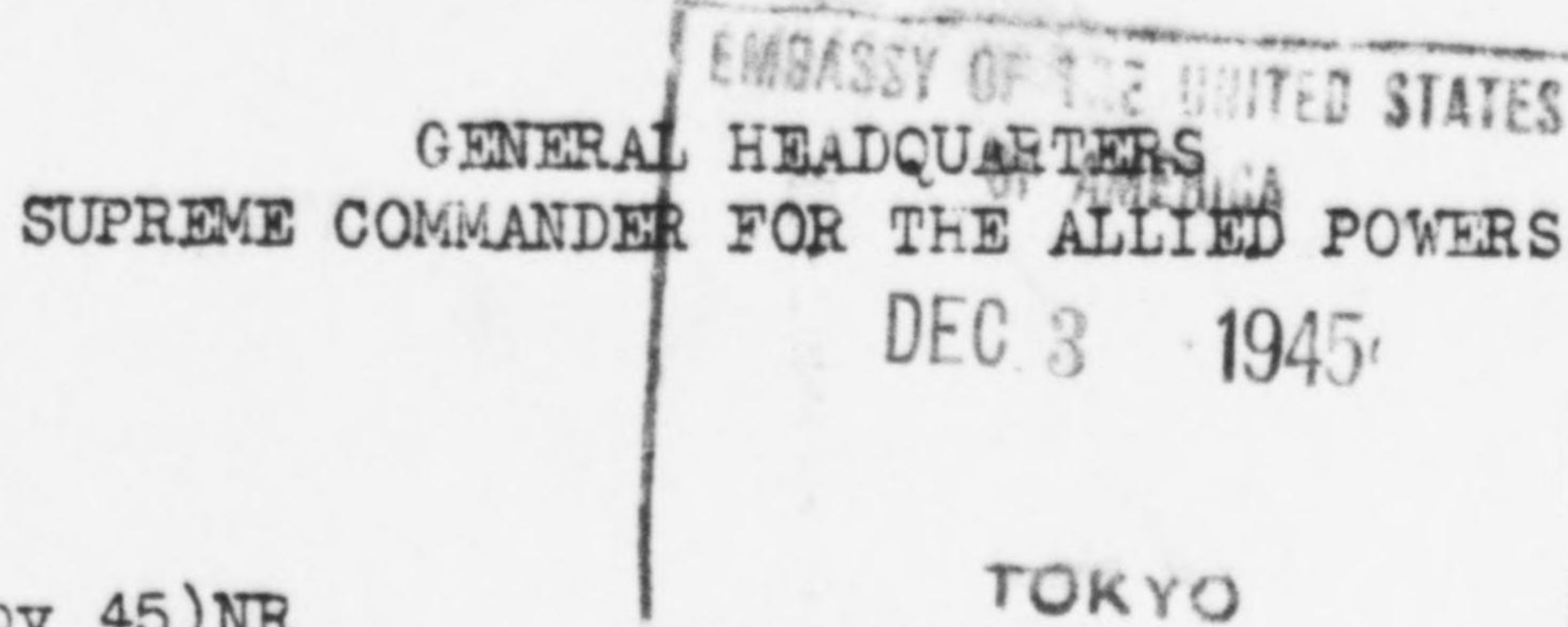
2. Persons entitled to such payments are those employees who have registered and the families of employees who have not returned from military service, provided a member of the family has registered. No payments will be made to officials discharged pursuant to the said memorandum or to those employees dismissed by the Bank of Japan as liquidator of certain closed banks or to those employees who, since the closing of their institutions, have found employment elsewhere.

3. The Ministries are authorized to certify such payments at a later date to the liquidator or agent appointed or to be appointed to take charge of the affairs of each closed institution, and then make claim for reimbursement.

SUBJECT : Whaling Operations Around Bonin (Ogasawara) and Kazan Islands.

1. Reference is made to memorandum from the Imperial Japanese Government (Department of Agriculture and Forestry) dated 8 November 1945, file s 314, to the Administrator, Naval Shipping Control Authority for Japanese Merchant Marine, (SCAJAP).

2. Japanese whaling operations will be permitted in the area around the Bonin (Ogasawara) and Kazan Islands, between N. Lat. 24° and 27°30' and between E. Long. 140°50' and 143°50' during the period 1 December 1945 to 31 March 1946, both dates inclusive. This authorization does not establish any precedent for extension of whaling or fishing privileges in any other areas outside of those authorized in references (a), (b), and (c) above, or for any subsequent period of time.

3. Japanese whaling vessels shall not anchor or use any harbor on any of the Bonin (Ogasawara) or Kazan Islands and no personnel from such vessels shall land or have any contact with the above mentioned Islands. Land bases for the whaling operations in the Bonin (Ogasawara) and Kazan Islands area may be established only within the area previously authorized in references (a), (b), and (c) above.

4. The following vessels are permitted to operate in the area outlined in paragraph 2 above.

MEMORANDUM FOR: IMPERIAL JAPANESE GOVERNMENT

THROUGH : Central Liaison Office, Tokyo.

SUBJECT : Additional Requirements to Expedite Coal Production.

1. The action taken by the Imperial Japanese Government to implement paragraph 3 of the directive of this headquarters, subject, "Production of Coal", AG 463.3 (6 Dec 45)GD is considered to be inadequate and unsatisfactory.

2. The representatives which the Japanese Government sent to this headquarters at the end of the 48 hour period were not qualified to discuss the overall aspects of the coal production problem. Neither were they in any official position to give authoritative guarantees that positive and aggressive action had been or will be taken by the Japanese Government to insure the coordination of all agencies which the solution of this problem requires.

3. Rather than a summary of positive action taken by the Japanese Government in compliance with the directive AG 463.3 (6 Dec 45)GD, the report submitted by the representatives of the Japanese Government was a lengthy narrative of programs and interim measures taken or proposed during the past three months. All information contained in this report was already well known to this headquarters. The issuance of the directive AG 463.3 (6 Dec 45) clearly indicates the position of this headquarters as regards the inadequacy and the unsatisfactory state of current plans and action.

4. As a case in point, the attention of the Japanese representatives was called to the current strike in Hokkaido. They were reminded that on 5 November, the Minister of Welfare issued an order requiring all Prefectural Governors to appoint mediation boards to settle labor disputes. The representatives stated the current strike had not been referred to such a board and that as far as was known no such board existed in the prefectures of this current strike. You are directed to inform this headquarters without delay why such a board was not appointed, why steps were not taken to mediate this strike and what measures have now been taken toward its solution.


5. By separate memorandum, the Imperial Japanese Government is being directed to submit periodic reports on coal production. The first report, covering the first ten days of December is to be received at this headquarters not later than noon of the 15th day of December. You are directed to have this first report delivered to this headquarters by an official of the Japanese Government of sufficient stature to enable him to discuss the overall aspects of the coal production problem and to give to the officials of this headquarters definite, authoritative guarantees of positive action on the part of the Imperial Japanese Government to insure the required coordination between the various Ministries.



SUBJECT : Relief and Welfare Plans.


1. Imperial Japanese Government will submit to this headquarters, by 31 December 1945, a detailed and comprehensive plan for providing food, clothing, housing, medical care, financial assistance, and welfare services to unemployed and other needy persons in Japan during the period January-June 1946.
2. The plan will include:
 - a. A statement of the basis used in calculating requirements;
 - b. A list, by prefecture, of the estimated number of persons who will monthly require direct assistance because of unemployment, physical incapacity, or other cause of dependency;
 - c. A description of the local administrative machinery to be used for investigating and meeting relief needs, including a statement of personnel policy;
 - d. The method of securing supplies, materials, and shelter from the overall sources available to the economy of Japan;
 - e. Estimated monthly cost of relief by prefecture.
3. It is the intention of this directive to require the development of adequate measures for the care of persons whose financial and/or other resources are inadequate to maintain minimum living standards during the period indicated. The Imperial Japanese Government will inaugurate immediately necessary measures to prevent any person or group of persons in Japan from being discriminated against in the distribution of available supplies because of inability to work, inability to obtain remunerative employment, or for political, religious or economic beliefs.
4. In the event that current relief legislation, appropriations and/or administrative facilities are believed to be inadequate to prevent discrimination against unemployed and other needy persons in the distribution of available supplies, the reply to this memorandum will set forth proposed new legislation, appropriations and/or improved relief administrative facilities which will be developed, with the anticipated date of their inauguration. If the Imperial Japanese Government considers current legislation, appropriations and relief administration adequate to meet probable relief needs during the period stated, the reply will make positive affirmation of this judgment and will cite appropriate references to current legislation, relief regulations and related material.


SUBJECT : Report on Allied Prisoners of War Moved from Rabaul.

1. Information has been provided by recovered Allied Prisoners of War indicating certain Prisoners of War were removed from Rabaul, New Britain, but additional information concerning this personnel since this movement was completed is not available.

- a. 400866 P/Lt Vincent and 400662 P/O O'Loughlin left Rabaul on 13 Jan 44 together with 16 unidentified American airmen PW.
- b. 404757 P/O Vincent and 4240 W/O Bailey, J. P. left Rabaul in late November or early December 1943, together with 13 unidentified American airmen PW.
- c. 401489 Sgt Brown, D. S. left Rabaul Camp in late May or early June 1942 with 2 American airmen PW, Sgt Lutz and Cpl Reid, both of whom have since confirmed that Brown was separated from them on the wharf at Rabaul, and they do not know whether he travelled by the same vessel or remained at Rabaul.

2. A report will be furnished this Headquarters concerning the movement of the Prisoners of War listed above, and any additional Allied Prisoners of War who were removed from Rabaul during 1942, 1943, or 1944, by sea or air, with subsequent disposition of these individuals.

1. The Imperial Japanese Government will insure that no discrimination will be exercised or permitted for or against any worker either in private or government work, in wages, hours or working conditions by reason of nationality, creed or social status.
2. Koreans, Formosans and Chinese nationals who elect to remain in Japan rather than to accept repatriation will be guaranteed the same rights, privileges and opportunities in employment as are extended to Japanese nationals in comparable circumstances.
3. Koreans, Formosans and Chinese nationals awaiting repatriation will be furnished opportunities to work for the occupation forces without discrimination. All such workers will be paid by the Imperial Japanese Government at the same rates as Japanese workers and will be extended all benefits granted Japanese nationals working for the occupation forces.
4. The Imperial Japanese Government is directed to revoke, rescind and abrogate all laws, ordinances, rules, regulations and enactments of any kind or character which provide preferential employment and educational opportunities for demobilized military personnel solely on the basis of military service.
5. Acknowledgment of receipt of this memorandum and reports of action taken hereunder are directed.

1. At dates to be set by this headquarters certain Japanese military medicinal narcotic stocks, in amounts determined by this headquarters, will be released by United States Forces into the custody of approved pharmaceutical wholesale houses.

2. You are directed to submit to this headquarters not later than 22 December 1945 a list of pharmaceutical wholesale houses who will receive and have custody of such military narcotic stocks, subject to the approval of this headquarters.

3. The list of pharmaceutical wholesale houses submitted for approval will consist of one firm in Hokkaido and three firms in the Eighth Army area of Honshu; and four firms in the Sixth Army area including one in Shikoku and one in Kyushu. The following information will be furnished with the list submitted:

- a. Name and complete address of firm.
- b. Name and position of responsible members of firm.
- c. Facilities for securely storing narcotics.

4. After Japanese military medical stocks are released to the custody of these approved wholesale drug firms a report will be rendered by each such firm so as to reach this headquarters within ten days after the last day of each month. This monthly report will be certified to by a responsible official of the firm and will contain the following information regarding Japanese military narcotics stocks:


- a. Inventory of stocks on hand on the first day of each month or in the first instance when custody of stocks is assumed.
- b. Quantity of stocks disposed of during the month, showing in each instance the date and to whom released and authorization for release.
- c. Inventory of stocks on hand on the last day of each month.

5. Approved firms will be held accountable for such Japanese military stocks as are given into their custody and will not release such stocks except as authorized by this headquarters. 2. It is not desired to provide masters of Japanese repatriation ships with foreign currency for the purchase of supplies locally in foreign ports.
3. Arrangements are being made with the authorities who control ports outside of Japan to accept receipts for necessary supplies issued to Japanese ships servicing those ports.
4. Masters of Japanese vessels engaged in repatriation will be instructed to furnish quantitative receipts for supplies obtained outside of Japan. Receipts will specify amount and kind of supplies and whether supplies will be used for Japanese troops or civilians.
5. The Japanese Government will provide fuel, fresh water and victuals for all vessels engaged in repatriation to the maximum extent practicable. Accordingly Japanese vessels will obtain supplies at overseas ports in minimum amounts necessary to complete their scheduled voyages.

Memorandum this headquarters dated 21 November 1945, subject: "Regulations governing Communication over International, Foreign and External Telegraph, Telephone and Wireless Facilities," and any subsequent memoranda governing censorship will apply to this service, except that sender composition messages shall be in clear English text and contain no code.

4. There is no objection to the rates which you propose for the transmission of prepaid sender composition messages from Tokyo to the United States. These rates are to be as follows:

5. Every effort will be made to apportion evenly the total volume of sender composition message traffic to the United States among the various American international telegraph companies.

6. The initial stations for the acceptance of sender composition messages in the Tokyo area shall be established by the Imperial Japanese Government at American Red Cross, Bankers Club, Marunouchi, Kojimachi Ward, Tokyo and the American Red Cross Club, Finance Building, Kasumigaseki, Kojimachi Ward, Tokyo. Other stations will be established as rapidly as possible as they are required. In this connection, this headquarters has under contemplation permitting the opening of a radio circuit to the United States from Osaka. In such event, sender composition message service in the Osaka area will be provided. It is understood that in the event of the establishment of sender composition message service from regions more than 50 miles from Tokyo (and more than 50 miles from Osaka, in the event the Osaka-United States circuit is opened), an additional 30 sen per word will be charged, to cover land haul. No objection to this land haul service charge is made by this headquarters at this time.

7. The sender of a message will be required to state on the message the following information: If military personnel his name, rank, serial number, unit or organization and APO number; if a civilian, his name, address in Japan, and military unit to which accredited.

8. Copies of all messages sent or received will be kept on file for a minimum period of one (1) year.

9. All messages received from the United States addressed to personnel in Japan will be forwarded by the Japanese Government to the Postal Officer, United States Army, APO 181, Tokyo.

2. Within one week from the date of this directive a detailed financial statement of this account as of November 30, 1945, together with a list of all securities and other assets in the account shall be delivered to this Headquarters.
3. Such action as is required shall be taken to prevent and prohibit, without prior permission of this Headquarters, any transaction involving the assets of this account.
4. A report will immediately be made to this Headquarters as to the action taken to comply with this directive.
5. An acknowledgment of this memorandum is directed.


1. Reference is made to letter of the Imperial Japanese Government N.D. 151 dated 15 October 1945 and to Memorandum from this headquarters, AG 388.3 (7 Nov 45)GD.

2. Recent review of ship repair requirements reveals the necessity for establishing additional repair facilities. Accordingly the Imperial Japanese Government is directed to place in operation those facilities at the Maizuru and Ominato Navy Yards which can be used for the repair of Japanese merchant shipping and vessels engaged in minesweeping. Facilities which do not contribute to such repair will not be reactivated.

3. The Commanding General 6th US Army has an operational requirement for about 50% of the shops at Maizuru Navy Yard until 1 February 1946. This requirement has first priority and will be coordinated with repair reactivation measures undertaken in accordance with this directive.

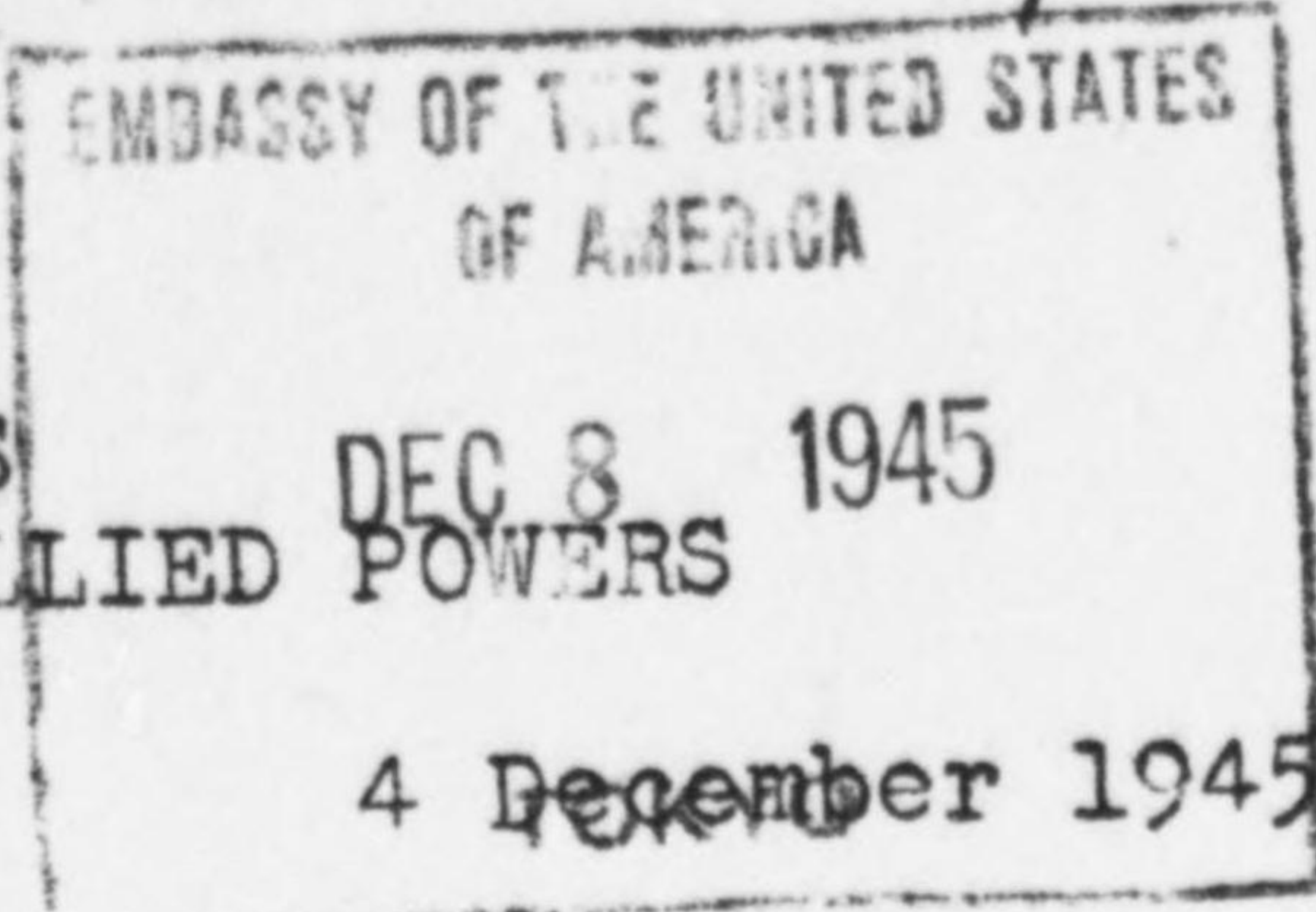
4. This directive does not authorize deferment of demobilization of Naval personnel currently employed at these or other Navy Yards. It is contemplated that personnel requirements to place Maizuru and Ominato Navy Yards in operation will be met entirely from civilian sources.

1. The Lighthouse Bureau, Ministry of Transportation, will restore and operate for civilian use as soon as possible the radio beacon and direction finding stations listed in Appendix I of this memorandum.

2. In the restoration, use may be made of similar existing equipment formerly operated by the Japanese Navy provided that the Home Ministry and the Board of Communications allocates such equipment to the Lighthouse Bureau. In case it should prove expedient to take over and operate Japanese Navy navigational aid stations at locations other than those given in Appendix I such action shall be taken only after receiving the permission of this headquarters.

3. All stations will operate in accordance with pre-war standards and recognized International procedures and only on frequencies that have been cleared through the Board of Communications and this headquarters.

4. These stations are authorized to transmit only messages and signals that are necessary in carrying out their function as navigational aids.

5. A complete report giving call sign, frequency, exact location, power, and a description of equipment and procedure for each station will be submitted to this headquarters prior to placing it in operation.

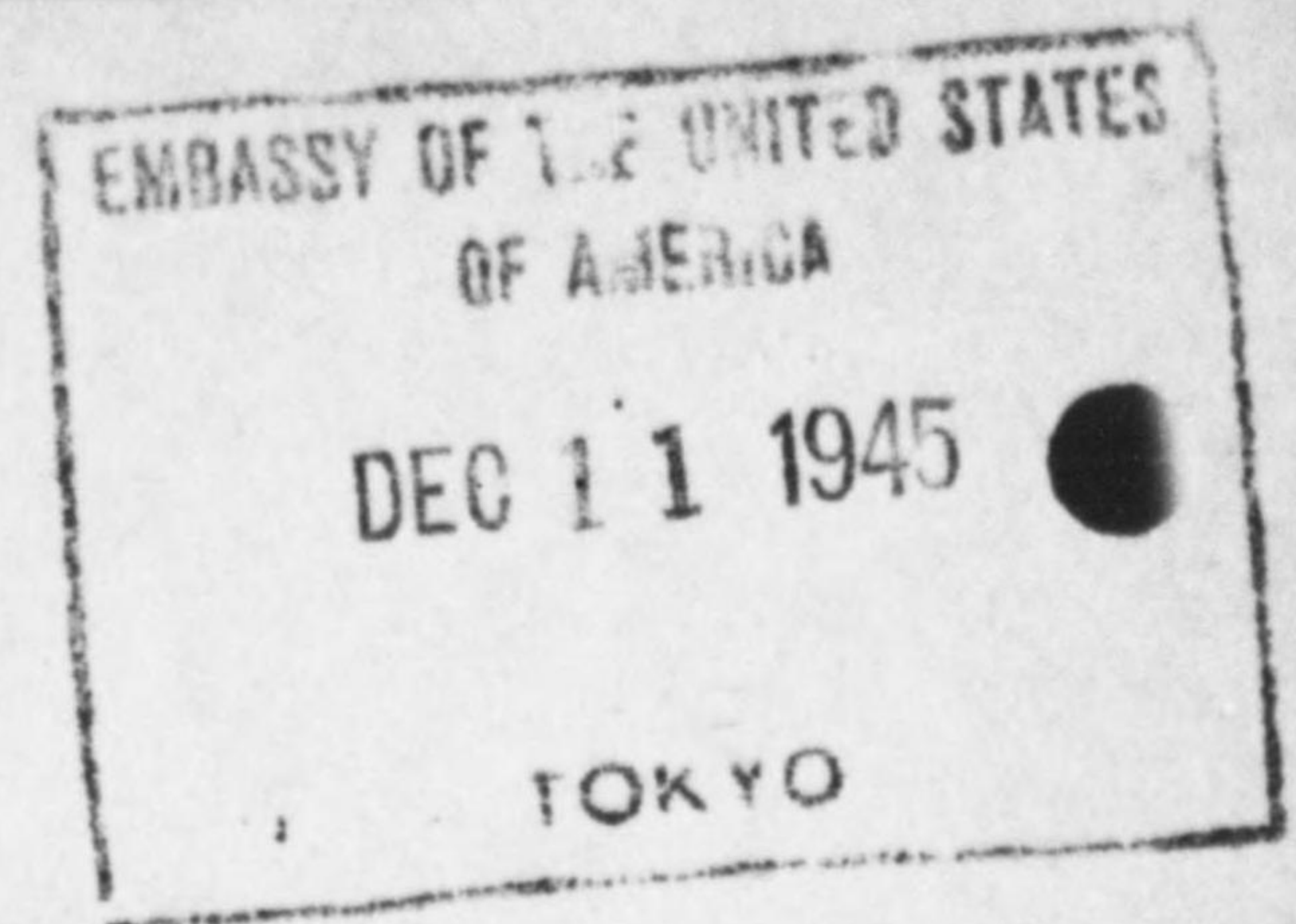

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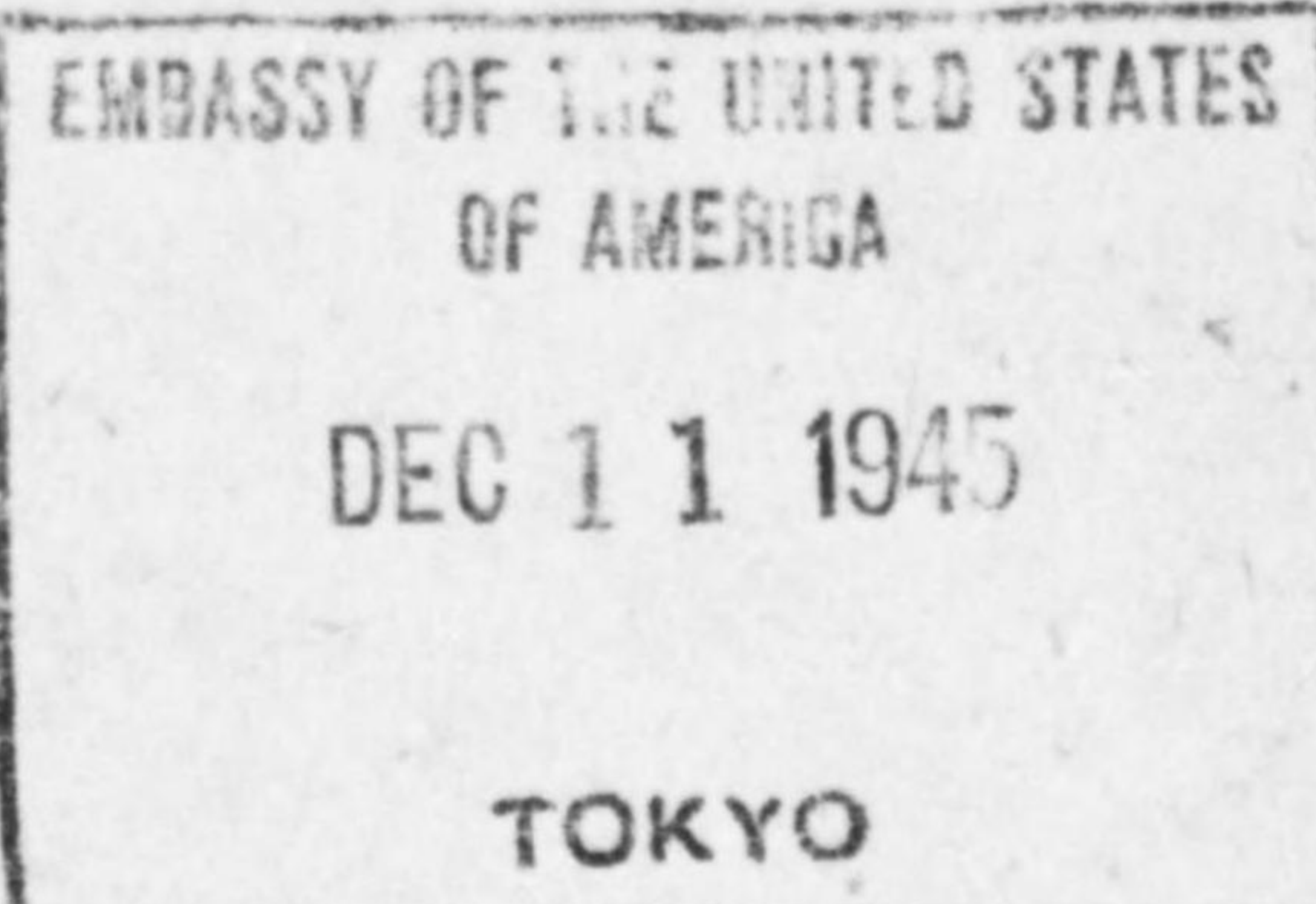

1. In order that the Imperial Japanese Government shall remove economic obstacles to the revival and strengthening of democratic tendencies, establish respect for the dignity of man, and destroy the economic bondage which has enslaved the Japanese farmer to centuries of feudal oppression, the Japanese Imperial Government is directed to take measures to insure that those who till the soil of Japan shall have a more equal opportunity to enjoy the fruits of their labor.

2. The purpose of this order is to exterminate those pernicious ills which have long blighted the agrarian structure of a land where almost half the total population is engaged in husbandry. The more malevolent of these ills include:

a. Intense overcrowding of land.

Almost half the farm households in Japan till less than one and one half acres each.

b. Widespread tenancy under conditions highly unfavorable to tenants.

More than three-fourths of the farmers in Japan are either partially or totally tenants, paying rentals amounting to half or more of their annual crops.

c. A heavy burden of farm indebtedness combined with high rates of interest on farm loans.

Farm indebtedness persists so that less than half the total farm households are able to support themselves on their agriculture income.

d. Government fiscal policies which discriminate against agriculture in favor of industry and trade.

subject: "Rural Land Reform".

Interest rates and direct taxes on agriculture are more oppressive than those in commerce and industry.

- e. Authoritative government control over farmers and farm organizations without regard for farmer interests.

Arbitrary crop quotas established by disinterested control associations often restrict the farmer in the cultivation of crops for his own needs or economic advancement.

Emancipation of the Japanese farmer cannot begin until such basic farm evils are uprooted and destroyed.


3. The Japanese Imperial Government is therefore ordered to submit to this Headquarters on or before 15 March 1946 a program of rural land reform. This program shall contain plans for:

- a. Transfer of land ownership from absentee land owners to land operators.
- b. Provisions for purchase of farm lands from non-operating owners at equitable rates.
- c. Provisions for tenant purchase of land at annual installments commensurate with tenant income.
- d. Provisions for reasonable protection of former tenants against reversion to tenancy status. Such necessary safeguards should include:
 - (1) Access to long and short term farm credit at reasonable interest rates.
 - (2) Measures to protect the farmer against exploitation by processors and distributors.
 - (3) Measures to stabilize prices of agricultural produce.
 - (4) Plans for the diffusion of technical and other information of assistance to the agrarian population.
 - (5) A program to foster and encourage an agricultural co-operative movement free of domination by non-agrarian interests and dedicated to the economic and cultural advancement of the Japanese farmer.
- e. The Japanese Imperial Government is requested to submit in

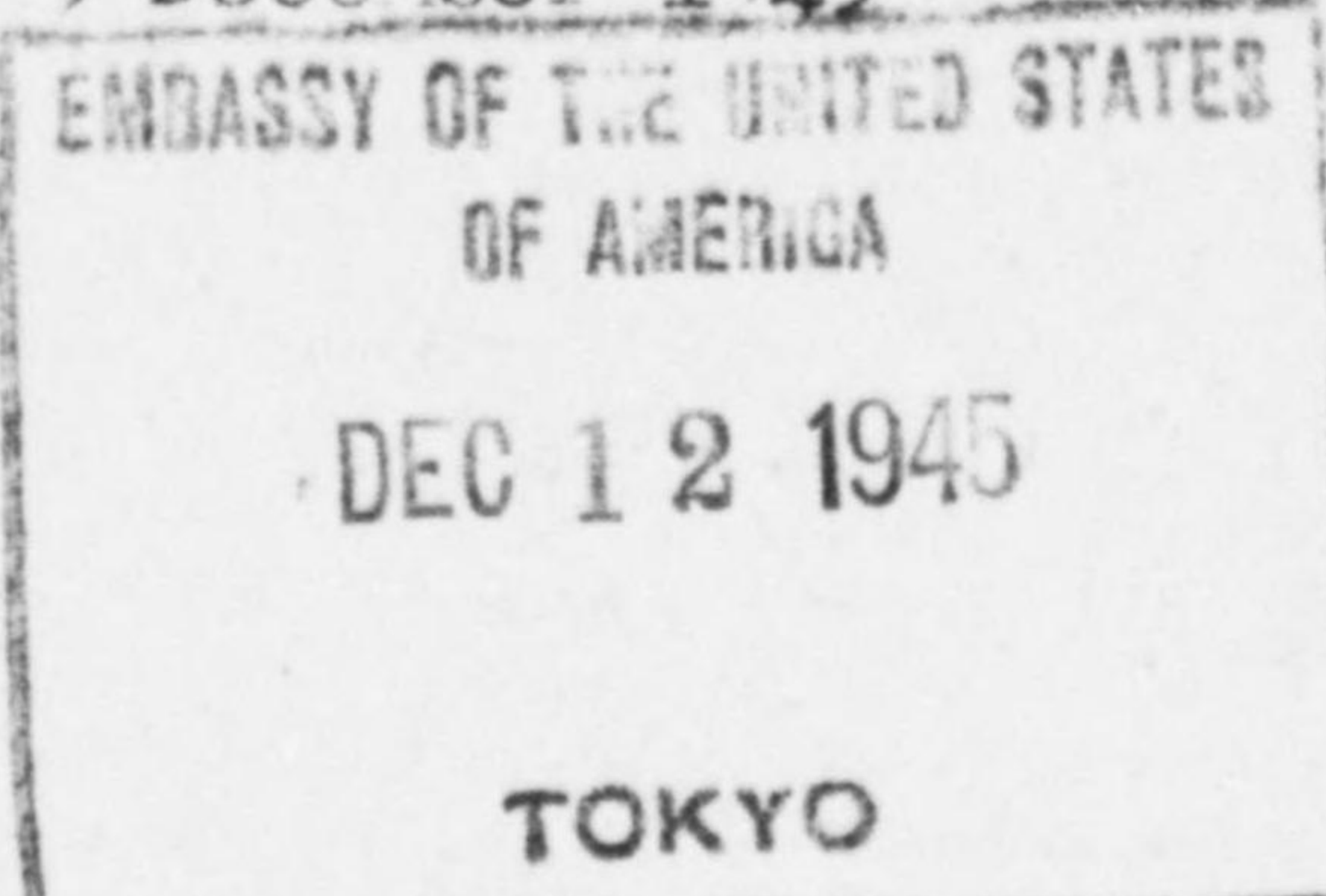

"4. Supplies and equipment which are obtainable in whole or in part from an area outside that in which the need arises will be processed through the General Procurement Agent, Tokyo, and then referred to you for such action as will most practicably and expeditiously enable delivery".

2. As an example, when supplies or equipment which are called for on a Procurement Demand cannot be supplied in the Tokyo area, the U. S. Army office in Tokyo who presented the Demand should be notified, and a recommendation as to possible sources of supply from another area should accompany the notification.

3. This same procedure will apply to Procurement Demands presented in other areas where Branch Offices of the Central Liaison Offices are established.

4. It is directed that all Branch Offices of the Central Liaison Office be notified of this procedure.

1. Reference is made to Memorandum this Headquarters AG 004 (8 Dec 45)ESS, subject: Establishment of a Schedule of Restricted Concerns.

2. The Imperial Japanese Government will take immediate action to assure that except as otherwise authorized or directed by this Headquarters each concern listed on the "Schedule of Restricted Concerns" will comply with the following directions:

a. All cash on hand other than that customarily required for payroll and petty cash expenditures will be promptly deposited in the accounts of such concerns with banks in Japan.

b. The proceeds of all sales and loans and all other receipts and income from every source will be promptly deposited upon receipt in the bank accounts of such concerns.

c. No payment, transfer, or withdrawal from any account will be made which is not incidental to the normal course of business of the concern.

d. No sale, transfer, or other disposition of any capital assets including lands, buildings, major items of equipment and securities will be made.

e. No other property will be sold, conveyed, distributed or otherwise disposed of except in the normal course of business and for adequate consideration, and no act will be performed for the purpose of or which has the effect of dissipating assets.

f. No new stock or other participating share interest, however described, will be authorized or issued, and the rights and privileges of any existing stock or other participating share interests will not be reduced or added to or otherwise modified.

g. No bonded indebtedness will be authorized or created and no loans of any other character will be obtained, except in the normal course of business.



4. Request for approval of any transaction covered by paragraph 2 of this memorandum will be accompanied by the written recommendations of the Minister of Finance, and by such additional data as may be necessary for a thorough understanding of the transaction concerned.

1. Formosa has been opened for repatriation. There follows a schedule of vessels assigned to shuttle between Formosa and Japan.

a. D.D. Natsuzuki, capacity 600 repatriates, sails Kagoshima 17 December, arrives Kiirun 20 December, arrives Kagoshima 24 December.

b. Escort 44, capacity 250 repatriates, departs Kagoshima 20 December, arrives Kiirun 23 December, arrives Kagoshima 27 December.

c. Choun Maru, capacity 2000 repatriates, departs Uraga 16 December, arrives Kiirun 22 December, arrives Kagoshima 28 December.

d. Additional schedules will be furnished as they are established.

2. Present directives will govern repatriation. It will be noted that Uraga has not been previously authorized as a reception center for outgoing repatriates. Authority for its use in this case is hereby granted.

3. The Imperial Japanese Government will:

a. Prepare plans for evacuation of former residents of Formosa in Japan who are desirous of repatriation. Capacity loads for the Natsuzuki, Escort 44 and Choun Maru will be prepared for embarkation, ready at appropriate ports of departure at the proper time as indicated in paragraph 1 above.

b. Be prepared for reception of capacity loads of Japanese returning to Kagoshima from Kiirun on dates indicated in paragraph 1 above.

2. a. Commencing on 14 December 1945 and on alternate days thereafter Landing Ships, Tank will discharge at Kagoshima 2400 Japanese repatriates from North China. The vessels will return to China empty until further orders.

b. It has come to the attention of this headquarters that reception center facilities at Kagoshima are being used to permanently house Ryukyans. The repatriation of Ryukyans has not been authorized and the Japanese Government has been so informed on numerous occasions.

c. In accordance with provisions of memorandum mentioned in paragraph 1 above, the reception center at Kagoshima was established to process 3000 incoming repatriates and a like number of outgoing repatriates daily.

3. In view of the above the Japanese Government will:

a. Take immediate steps to clear the reception center at Kagoshima of all Ryukyans and care for them elsewhere.

b. Be prepared to receive, process and evacuate the repatriates arriving from China commencing on 14 December.

- (1) Establish and maintain them at suitable places. Places selected will be reported to this headquarters.
- (2) Supply them with food and daily necessities, on the standard ration system.
- (3) Restrict them to the immediate area in which they are quartered, unless otherwise authorized by the local Counter Intelligence Corps Detachment. Until established as directed in paragraph (1), persons will be restricted to area of present abode and supplied as directed above by Japanese Government.
- (4) Continue to treat them in accordance with international usage of diplomatic personnel, pending determination of their official status by this headquarters.

b. In regard to all other nationals of countries with which the United Nations were at war:

- (1) Restrict them, unless otherwise authorized by the local Counter Intelligence Corps Detachment, to the prefecture in which they are now living.



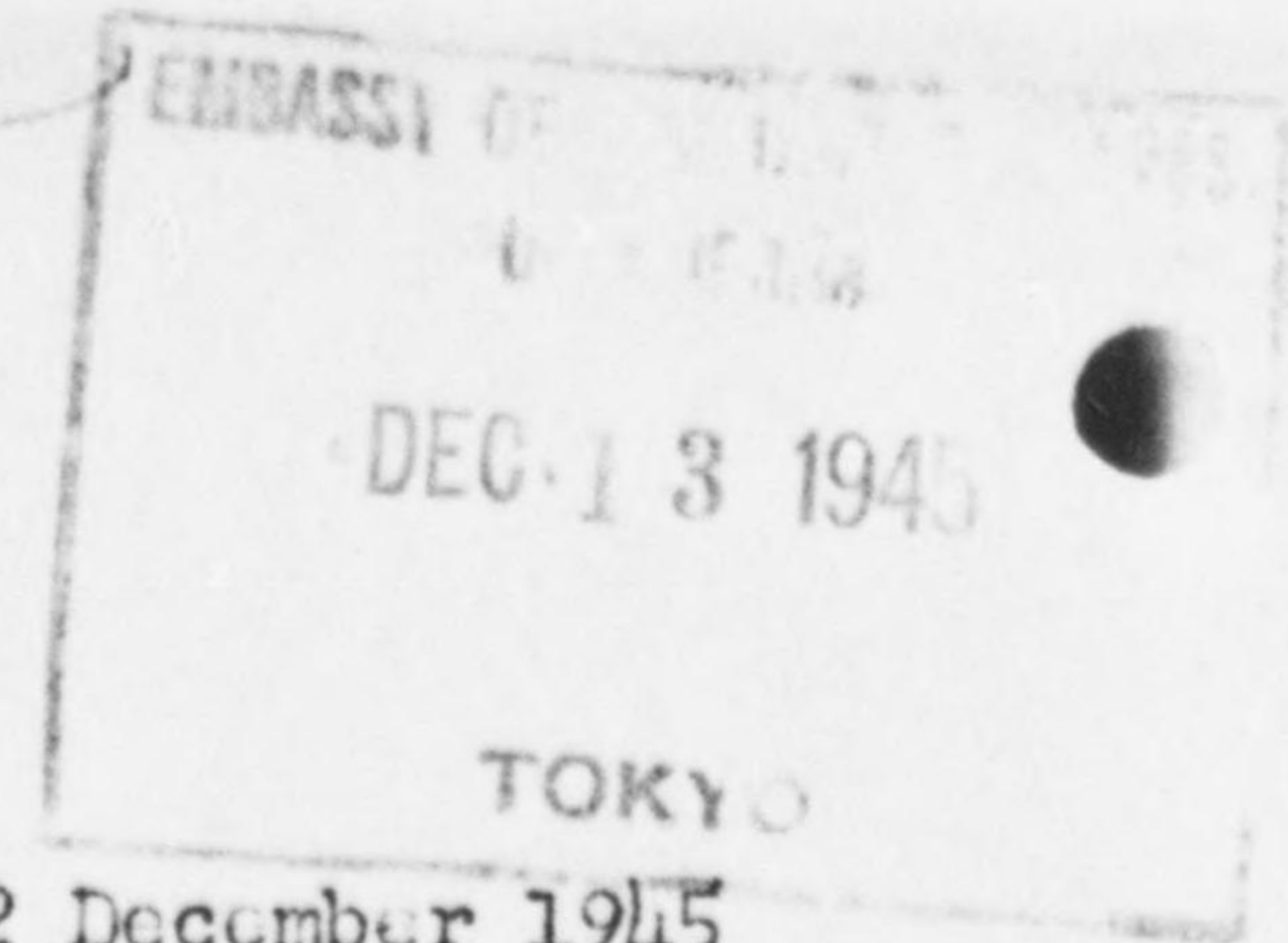



1. The Supreme Commander desires factual information on the nutritional health and actual food consumption and food requirements in Japan.
2. The Japanese Government is directed to establish study groups of properly qualified physicians and nutritionists who will conduct nutrition surveys among the civilian population. These groups will gather factual data on the physical status and the food consumption of individuals, using statistical sampling methods and areas approved by this headquarters. Urban areas are of primary concern and initial surveys will include the largest cities.
3. The methods to be employed by these survey groups and their work in the field will be standardized, coordinated and directed by a control agency in the Japanese Government in accordance with plans submitted to and approved in advance by this Headquarters.
4. A complete operational plan for this work will be submitted to this Headquarters for approval not later than 20 December 1945.
5. The operational plan will be put into effect immediately upon approval. English translations of survey data received from the field will be submitted to this Headquarters each week. Final compilations and analysis of the data will be submitted not later than one week after any one survey is completed.

- (f) Interest or discount rates charged; maximum, minimum and average rate.
- (g) Rate of interest on deposits classified by type of deposit.
- (h) Last dividend declared on capital stock; date of dividend and rate.

b. Part II - Agricultural Credit Cooperatives, Urban Credit Cooperatives and Mutual Loan Companies:

- (1) A consolidated statement of assets and liabilities similar to Par 2a (1) above but with the itemization of loan accounts changed to conform with the nature of the operations conducted by credit cooperatives and mutual loan companies. The consolidated statement will contain the following separate columns: Agricultural Credit Cooperatives, Urban Credit Cooperatives, Mutual Loan Companies, Total and Change Compared with Last Month. The number of institutions reporting will be shown at the top of each column.
- (2) A supplemental statistics section similar to Par 2a (2) but with the second sub-paragraph thereunder changed to read as follows:

"Number and amount of new loans granted during the month classified as to whether they are loans on real estate, loans for purchase of equipment, loans for production purposes, loans for repayment of debts, and loans for consumption purposes."

5. All reports except those of the Bank of Japan will be dated as of the close of business on the last day of each month. The Bank of Japan's report will be dated as of the close of business on the tenth, twentieth and the last day of each month. All time limits are calculated from the date of each report.

6. The regular ten-day report of the Bank of Japan will be prepared in accordance with the form now in use. The special ten-day report of the Bank of Japan will be prepared in the same form as the daily statement of assets and liabilities now employed by the Bank of Japan. The monthly report of the Deposit Funds Management Bureau will be in the same form as the present quarterly report issued by that Bureau. The individual monthly reports of the special banks and certain private financial institutions will be in the form of a statement of assets and liabilities and a supplemental statistical section as prescribed in par. 2 (a) above.

7. In the compilation of all reports required by Paragraph #1, the Imperial Japanese Government will direct all institutions to exclude from their reports, all assets and all liabilities of branches outside of Japan. The net amounts due from or payable to such branches shall be reported under assets and liabilities, respectively, opposite the heading: Inter-Office Accounts - Foreign Branches.

8. Within ten days this Headquarters will be furnished with copies of the forms of report to be submitted in compliance with this memorandum. The requirements with respect to the ten day report of the Bank of Japan become effective immediately. All other reports will be submitted for the first time as of the close of business 30 November 1945. All reports will be prepared in English and submitted in twelve (12) copies.

9. For purposes of this memorandum the following definitions will apply:

a. "External Assets": defined in memorandum from this Headquarters, dated 22 September 1945, file AG 130 (22 Sept 1945), subject: "Control of Financial Transactions".

BASIC: Memorandum, GHQ, SCAP, file AG 319.1 (11 Dec 45) ESS/PI, dtd 11 December 1945, subject: "Periodic Reports on Banking Institutions", to Imperial Japanese Government.

b. "Foreign Securities": securities issued by juridical persons incorporated under the laws of, or having more than 25% of their total assets invested in, a country other than Japan.


c. "Foreign Loans": loans extended to natural persons residing outside of Japan or to juridical persons incorporated under the laws of, or having more than 25% of their total assets, invested in a country other than Japan.

d. "Restricted Deposits": deposits and trust accounts subject to the blocking provisions of memorandum from this Headquarters, dated 24 Nov 1945, file AG 121.7 (24 Nov 1945) ESS/PI, subject: "Elimination of War Profits and Reorganization of National Finances".

e. "Blocked accounts of non-residents": deposit accounts of any person residing outside of Japan, regardless of nationality, and regardless of whether such accounts were blocked prior to or subsequent to 15 August 1945.
