

REGAL LILIES

No flower garden is complete without its quota of Regal Lilies. We think this is the best thing in the way of flowers ever brought to this country. It is perfectly hardy, a consistent bloomer and grows rapidly. The lilies in bloom are wonderful. They throw off a very heavy and delightfully sweet-scented odor. The color is a pinkish white with a canary-colored throat. The flowers are very large and are borne in numbers on very stiff, wiry stems. The first year bulbs are not likely to bloom the next season; but the second year bulbs should blos-som nicely. The young bulbs may bear but one or two flowers the first season; but, if well cared for, the number of blossoms should increase each season and the stem grow taller until the bulb is bearing a dozen or more blooms. This lily seems to thrive best in full sun and deep, ricb soil. Plant Regal Lilies any month in the year that the ground is not frozen. Of course, the sooner they are planted the sooner one has blooming size bulbs. The blooming season is June and early July. 20 first year bulbs \$1.00; 12 second year bulbs \$1.00; Seed 250 for \$0.25. 8 bulbs each 1 inch in diam-eter \$1.00; 4 bulbs each 1½ in. diameter \$1.00. The larger bulbs should produce 2, 3 or 4 blossoms the next summer.
