FARM AND HOME.
Sweet Herbs.
 A well regulated garden cannot be considered complete unless it contains a selection of some of the principal varieties of sweet, aromatic herbs for soups and other dishes. In most gardens the herbs are found to occupy some part of the way situated in jars or bottles with weeds and grass, and it is very fortunate if a variety or so can be found when wanted for use.

Uttling Herbs.
 Not many years ago the bones of animals had no money value and were considered useless rubbish. Later they came into use for making buttons, knife handles, common piano keys, etc., to supply phosphorus for friction matches and other purposes, the demand for them increasing very rapidly.
