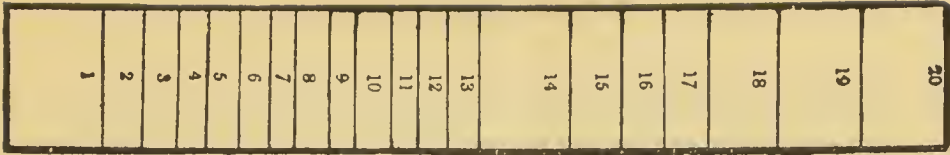
CONDITIONS OF SALE.


