SUBJECT: Nomination and Appointment of Labor Relations Committee Members.

TO: Military Government Team Labor Officers

1. Technical Letter 004.06(5 Feb 48)ESS, Subject, Election Procedures for members of prefectural Labor Relations Committees is herewith recinded.

2. The Japanese Government has revised Art. 37 of the Cabinet Enforcement Ordinance of the Trade Union Law governing the nomination and appointment of members of Prefectural and Central Labor Relations Committees. In addition to changes in the ordinance, the Labor Ministry has advised prefectural governors and local officials concerned to submit to it for examination the names and qualifications of all prospective candidates.

3. It is the intention of ESS to supplement present surveillance exercised by MG teams over the appointment of labor relations committee members, by means of liaison with the Labor Ministry in order that prefectural and national authorities may be persuaded to appoint those persons having the highest qualifications and so that domination of committees by members known to advocate opposition to or subversion of occupation objectives and the economic recovery of Japan will be avoided.

4. It should be noted, however, that under present law the Labor Ministry has no legal authority to compel prefectural cooperation with the Ministry in the accomplishment of this program and it is therefore possible for various groups to influence prefectural appointing authorities into overlooking the desired procedures and objectives. In addition, prefectural governors may continue past practices of making appointments as a result of political deals without regard to the over-all purpose of establishing labor relations committees capable of rendering the community beneficial service. These factors are of especial interest to MG teams in the carrying out of their surveillance of procedures leading to appointments to the labor relations committees.

5. It is the purpose of the new Art. 37 and policies above mentioned governing nominations and appointments to allow the governors of the prefectures the widest latitude of authority in requesting nominations of candidates from labor and management groups and to make final appointments, subject, of course, to the basic objectives inherent in the idea of a tripartite committee empowered to make decisions affecting the interests not only of labor and management but also the general public.

6. Previous methods of obtaining nominations which have become formalized and frozen as the result of custom and acquiescence by government officials, are not binding in any way upon the appointing authority. Therefore, it should be clearly understood that governors are under no obligation to follow past practices, such as; (a) considering themselves bound by the results of intra-union elections of nominees; (b) appointing from any particular list submitted by any union or group of unions or employer organizations; (c) appointing in accordance with the number of votes received; or (d) appointing in any specified order in accordance with a particular listing of candidates.



7. In a recent directive of the Central Committee of the Japan Communist Party, dated Dec. 30, 1948, and sent to prefectural and regional and national committees concerning the Labor Minister's appointment of members of the Central Labor Relations Committee under the new policy, it was stated "what attracts our keenest attention is the fact that even if each union recommended candidates and elected them, the Labor Minister, according to the present revision, could appoint labor members, whoever they may be, upon his own responsibility We must lead every conference of workers toward such decision (to oppose) for if the Labor Minister enforced his authoritative appointment of Central Labor Relations Committee members, we would absolutely not admit and would oppose that appointment resorting to our actual force and would disclose this decision in the face of each governor and Labor Minister."

8. The foregoing is an indication of the attitude certain elements in the community may take toward the new procedure which, it should be noted, is in strict conformance with Art. 26 of the Trade Union Law in spite of what may have been the interpretation of the article and the procedures required thereunder heretofore.

9. The only obligation imposed on the governors is to request local labor and management organizations in general, within the community, to submit nominations of possible candidates for membership on local Labor Relations Committees and to submit to the representatives of such organizations their own list of possible candidates for neutral membership on the committees. It is of course definitely desirable to obtain, as far as possible, recommendation and approval of candidates who are able and willing to attend all the meetings of the committees, from the largest number of organizations having the greatest membership. But the governor is under no obligation to accede to the demands of any organization, regardless of its size or number of members, to make appointments of particular persons.

10. It is not the purpose of the new ordinance and implementing procedure to exclude any group from obtaining appointment of its own candidate. The specific purpose is to obtain well-constituted, equitably apportioned committees which actually represent the opinions, economic, social, political and otherwise, of the largest number of persons within the community. It is intended to avoid the domination and control of a committee by any particular person, group or organization representing only a minority viewpoint within the community.

Submitted herewith on your request is the present state of the structure of the Committee a proposed renovation of which is pending.

I. STRUCTURE AND MEMBERS OF THE TOKYO-TO LOCAL LABOR RELATIONS BOARD SECRETARIAT. (As of Sept. 1, 1948)

1. Structure and names of divisions, sections, sub-sections, names of chiefs and staffs, and details of their functions.

Executive Director, Hisashi Kawada. (? Communist)

The function.

The executive director represents the Business Affairs Bureau of the Labor Relations Board and undertakes, under the direction of the President, the supervision of the office staffs (secretaries 9, clerks 25, employees 18) in their execution of the business affairs of the Board.

A. General Affairs Division.

Chief, Teruyuki Tomimori.

The function.

The chief of the General Affairs Division performs the function of direction and supervision of the office staffs (full strength; at present 23) in their work on the committee's budget estimates, accounts, office supplies, documents, personal affairs, clerical work, conferences, secretariat's business affairs, liaison affairs with other agencies, and other affairs that are not handled in other divisions.

In case of absence of the executive director, the chief of the division performs the function in his capacity.

The chief of the division also, as a conciliator as well as secretary, takes charge of the business of adjusting labor disputes.

(1) General Affairs Section.

Chief, Eiichi Yamauchi.

The function.

The chief of the section assists the chief of the division in the function of direction and supervision of the office staffs (full strength; at present 23) in their work on the committee's accounts,

office supplies, documents, clerical work, conferences, business affairs, liaison affairs, with other agencies, and other affairs that are not handled in other divisions.

The chief of the section also, as a conciliator as well as secretary, takes charge of the business in adjusting labor disputes.

a) Business Affairs.

Staff, secretary Shigeo Natori

The function.

The staff in charge of business affairs undertakes, under the direction of the chiefs of General Affairs Division and Section, the supervision of the office staffs (full strength.....; at present 9) in their work on documents, personnel affairs, clerical work, liaison affairs with other agencies, and other affairs that are not handled in other sub-sections.

b) Accountant.

Staff, secretary Kikutaro Fukuda.

The function.

The staff in charge of Accountant undertakes, under the direction of the chiefs of General Affairs Division and Section, the supervision of the office staffs (full strength.....; at present 4) in their work on the committee's budget estimates, accounts, and office supplies.

c) Conference 'Arrangement & Recording'

Staff, secretary Osamu Tanaka.

The function.

The Staff in charge of conference undertakes, under the direction of chiefs of General Affairs Division and Section, the supervision of the office staffs (full strength; at present 6) in their work on the business relating to general committee meeting as well as sub-committee meeting.

B. Investigation & Research Division.

Chief, Fujio Yokoyama. - Communist

The function.

The chief of this division directs and supervises the office staffs (full strength.....; at present 9) in their work on the compilation of statistics in respect of labor disputes, investigation into labor situations, consultation regarding labor problems, examination of the qualification of labor unions, the affairs of making propositions to government offices on labor education, and various survey for the speed and reasonable settlement on each labor disputes.

d) Investigation.

Staff, secretary Shuzo Terashima.

The function.

The Staff in charge of Investigation Affairs undertakes, in cooperation with office staffs (full strength.....; at present 3) the investigation into labor situations on concrete subjects and compilation and collection of statistics or data thereof.

e) Consultation

Staff, secretary Yoshiharu Kai.

The function.

The staff in charge of Consultation Affairs undertakes, in cooperation with office staffs (full strength; at present 2), the business of consultation in respect of labor problems.

f) Examination

Staff, secretary Kasunasa Suzuki.

The staff in charge of Examination Affairs undertakes, in cooperation with office staffs (full strength; at present 1), the examination of the qualification of labor unions, and setting up of their standard as well as its application.

C. 1st Adjustment Division.

Chief, Yasunasa Morita.

D. 2nd Adjustment Division.

Chief, Yomohiko Yamashita.

E. 3rd Adjustment Division.

Chief, (vacant)

The function.

II. DIVISION OF OFFICES BETWEEN THE TOKYO-TO LOCAL LABOR RELATIONS BOARD AND THE TOKYO-TO LABOR ADMINISTRATION SECTION IN RESPECT OF LABOR ADMINISTRATION.

Pursuant to the proposal made by the director of the Tokyo-To Labor Bureau (Roro No. 272, issued July 8, 1947) which copy inclosed herewith, the work in respect of labor relations has been smoothly carried on between the Tokyo-to Labor Relations Board and the Labor Administration Section, the relation between the two being established in complete harmony.

(Copy)

On the re-adjustment of the business of investigation relation.

You have effected renovation in your traditional way of business operation by newly setting up an investigation division within the Secretariat. However, in relation to the execution of the business of said division, a notice is hereby served wishing that you would take into consideration the request from the Labor Administration Section of the Welfare Ministry, as is given in the separate sheet, so that redundancy or unnecessary competition with the Labor Administration Section may be avoided.

(Separate Sheet)

Excerpt from "On the operation of the business of labor administration", a discussion at the conference of block labor administration officials held on May 30 and 31, 1947.

2. Problems in relation to the Labor Relations Board.

Needless to say while there should exist smooth operation of business in the matter of labor administration between the Labor Relations Board and its Secretariat and Local Labor Administration Section and its Labor Administration Office, both such offices should by all means endeavor to avoid causes liable to competition as well as redundancy of the business execution. It is therefore considered proper that their sphere of operation and the relation of the operations should be performed in accordance with the following standard.

(1) Both personnel affairs relating to labor administration and matters relating to budget estimates are the responsibility of the labor administration Section. However, in respect of the personnel affairs and budget estimates relating to the Board Secretariat, the intentions of the Secretariat should be fully respected whilst being mindful that the matter of execution of details shall in future be left in the hand of the Secretariat as it becomes replete in strength

(2) The Labor Administration shall undertake the work or collection of general investigation data and compilation of statistics in respect of labor situation the result of which is to be presented to the Board.

(3) However, in accordance with No. 1, Para. 1 Art. 27 of the Labor Union Law, readjustment of labor disputes stipulated in Art. 6, 8, 11, 15, 24, Para. 2 of Art. 27, and Art. 32 of the Labor Union Law, and Art. 40 of the Labor Adjustment Law, and the work of collection of data for investigation directly necessary to the execution of the duty of the Labor Relations Board stipulated in other ordinances are the responsibility of the Board and the Secretariat.

In these cases, when request were made by the Board, the Labor Administration Section shall be ready to render its cooperation to the fullest extent.

(4) The work of enlightenment propogand in respect of labor and matters in respect of education are the responsibility of the Labor Administration Section.

However, as regards the concrete methods of execution, while being taken charge of by TO, DO, FU, KEN, it may also be done in the most effective manner best suited to the existing circumstances under the name of the Labor Relations Board or by any of its outer block organizations.

I. STRUCTURE AND MEMBERS OF THE TOKYO-TO LOCAL LABOR RELATIONS BOARD SECRETARIAT. (As of Sept. 1, 1948)

1. Structure and names of divisions, sections, sub-sections, names of chiefs and staffs, and details of their functions.

Executive Director, Hisashi Kawada. (*? Comment*)

The function.

The executive director represents the Business Affairs Bureau of the Labor Relations Board and undertakes, under the direction of the President, the supervision of the office staffs (secretaries 9, clerks 25, employes 18) in their execution of the business affairs of the Board.

A. General Affairs Division.

Chief, Teruyuki Tomimori.

The function.

The chief of the General Affairs Division performs the function of direction and supervision of the office staffs (full strength; at present 23) in their work on the committee's budget estimates, accounts, office supplies, documents, personnel affairs, clerical work, conferences, secretariat's business affairs, liaison affairs with other agencies, and other affairs that are not handled in other divisions.

In case of absence of the executive director, the chief of the division performs the function in his capacity.

The chief of the division also, as a conciliator as well as secretary, takes charge of the business of adjusting labor disputes.

c) Conference 'Arrangement & Recording'

The function.

The Staff in charge of Conference undertakes, under the direction of chiefs of General Affairs Division and Section, the supervision of the office staffs (full strength ; at present 6) in their work on the business relating to general committee meeting as well as sub-committee meeting.

The function.

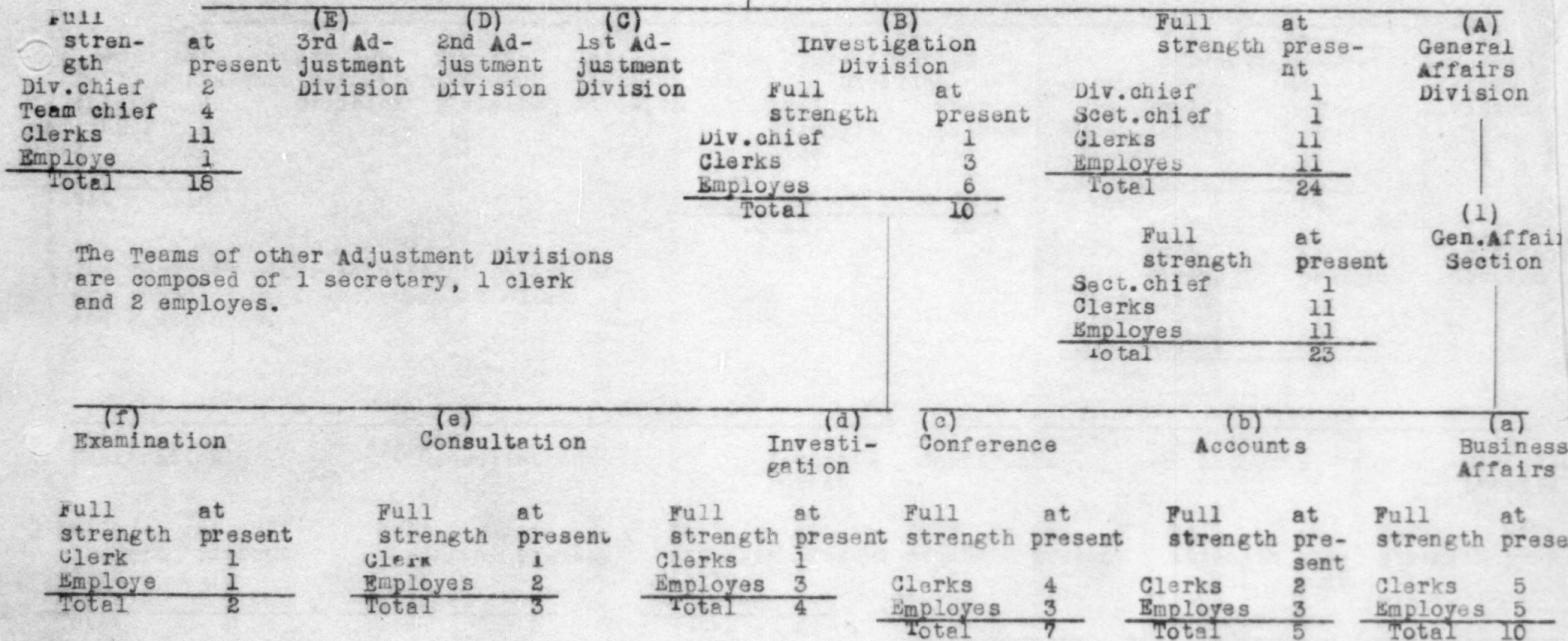

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II. DIVISION OF OFFICES BETWEEN THE TOKYO-TO LOCAL LABOR RELATIONS BOARD AND THE TOKYO-TO LABOR ADMINISTRATION SECTION IN RESPECT OF LABOR ADMINISTRATION.

Pursuant to the proposal made by the director of the Tokyo-to Labor Bureau (Roro No. 272, issued July 8, 1947) which copy inclosed herewith, the work in respect of labor relations has been smoothly carried on between the Tokyo-to Labor Relations Board and the Labor Administration Section, the relation between the two being established in complete harmony.

(Copy)

On the re-adjustment of the business of investigation relation.

You have effected renovation in your traditional way of business operation by newly setting up an investigation division within the Secretariat. However, in relation to the execution of the business of said division, a notice is hereby served wishing that you would take into consideration the request from the Labor Administration Section of the Welfare Ministry, as is given in the separate sheet, so that redundancy or unnecessary competition with the Labor Administration Section may be avoided.

(Separate sheet)

Excerpt from "On the operation of the business of labor administration", a discussion at the conference of block labor administration officials held on May 30 and 31, 1947.

2. Problems in relation to the Labor Relations Board.

Needless to say while there should exist smooth operation of business in the matter of labor administration between the Labor Relations Board and its Secretariat and Local Labor Administration Section and its Labor Administration Office, both such offices should by all means endeavor to avoid causes liable to competition as well as redundancy or the business execution. It is therefore considered proper that their sphere of operation and the relation of the operations should be performed in accordance with the following standard.

(1) Both personnel affairs relating to labor administration and matters relating to budget estimates are the responsibility of the labor administration Section. However, in respect of the personnel affairs and budget estimates relating to the Board Secretariat, the intentions of the Secretariat should be fully respected whilst being mindful that the matter of execution of details shall in future be left in the hand of the Secretariat as it becomes replete in strength

(2) The Labor Administration shall undertake the work of collection of general investigation data and compilation of statistics in respect of labor situation the result of which is to be presented to the Board.

(3) However, in accordance with No. 1, Para. 1 Art. 27 of the Labor Union Law, readjustment of labor disputes stipulated in Art. 6, 8, 11, 15, 24, Para. 2 of Art. 27, and Art. 32 of the Labor Union Law, and Art. 40 of the Labor Adjustment Law, and the work of collection of data for investigation directly necessary to the execution of the duty of the Labor Relations Board stipulated in other ordinances are the responsibility of the Board and the Secretariat.

In these cases, when request were made by the Board, the Labor Administration Section shall be ready to render its cooperation to the fullest extent.

(4) The work of enlightenment propogand in respect of labor and matters in respect of education are the responsibility of the Labor Administration Section.

However, as regards the concrete methods of execution, while being taken charge of by TO, DO, FU, KEN, it may also be done in the most effective manner best suited to the existing circumstances under the name of the Labor Relations Board or by any of its outer block organizations.
