More than 60 years ago Mr. E.A. Riehl began growing nut trees in an experimental way. Whenever he heard of a nut of superior size and quality, he procured nuts or scions to carry on his work of improving the nuts of our northern states and testing the hardiness and productiveness of the trees. Since that time many others have become interested in the work. There can be no finer avocation for a professional or business man than a grove of hardy nut trees; and every farm would be enhanced in value by a few nut trees grouped near the buildings or growing in fence corners or other little unused plots of ground. We have found our nut trees so interesting as well as profitable, that we decided to help others to do likewise. We have established a small nursery entirely devoted to the propagation of nut trees. Every year we graft a few trees of each of the most promising of the new varieties discovered by the U.S. Department of Agriculture and the Northern Nut Growers' Association. We send herewith a list of the available trees in the nursery this season. They vary in size from one year whips that were grafted last April to three year old, branched trees. Because there are so many varieties and so few of each kind, we find it more convenient to price all sizes alike. Purchasers are asked to state their preference, and orders will be filled with trees nearest the size wanted.
