The designated area was thoroughly saturated by six hits, two 500# and four 100# bombs. Six separate and distinct fires were started, one of which gave forth a considerable amount of white smoke which rose several hundred feet. Whatever troops or installations were underneath the foliage which covered the area were seriously damaged.

The second target was a long, two-story, "V" shaped building in Naha city. It was thought to have been used formerly as a prison. Many hits were scored directly on the building and in the grounds immediately around the building, and was seriously damaged although it did not catch fire and no explosions other than the bombs and rockets were noted.

The strafing by the FM's, which preceded the bombing by the TM's from other carriers, succeeded in setting on fire five of the houses in the town. The fires were still burning when the pilots left.
