

GENERAL HEADQUARTERS SUPREME COMMANDER FOR THE ALLIED POWERS Government Section Public Administration Division 12 August 1949 MEMORANDUM FOR MAJOR NAPIER Imperial Household Property, -- Kamakura Villa 1. The Central Liaison Office submitted a list of palaces, villas, and residences belonging to the Japanese Imperial family on 12 September 1945 (Memorandum C. L. O. No. 58) and expressed the desire that special consideration might be given for their protection by the Office of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. That list included Kamakura Villa, Kurayashiki, Kamakura, Kanagawa Prefecture. 2. On 2 June 1949, the Imperial Household Office submitted a list of former Imperial Household properties. This list did not include Kamakura Villa. 3. Following up approved recommendation 2, informal staff study, subject: Extent of Imperial Household Property, 27 June 1949, that an investigation be made to determine the actual status and ownership of Kamakura Villa (and other properties), the Civil Affairs Bureau of the Attorney General's Office was requested to make an inquiry and report (1) the registered owner of Kamakura Villa as of 15 August 1945; and (2) the registered owner of Kamakura Villa as of 1 June 1949. The Civil Affairs Bureau reported that "corresponding property not in existence." 4. Following up approved recommendation 1, informal Staff study, subject: Disposition of Former Imperial Household Property, 11 July 1949, that a further, more detailed investigation be made, the Civil Affairs Bureau was requested to make another inquiry into the property known as Kamakura Villa. 5. On 10 August 1949, the Civil Affairs Bureau submitted the following report: Property: Kamakura Villa Address: Kurayashiki, Kamakura City, Kanagawa Prefecture Ownership as of 15 August 1945: Property of Imperial Household Ministry Ownership as of 1 June 1949: 1.
