Why should we even care?

“Statistics Canada identified that **over half (55%)** of the 400,000 businesses registered by the CRA in 2008 did not have a sufficient business description to allow for the assignment of a NAICS code. Statistics Canada further identified that of the 5 million businesses registered with the CRA, **13.2% had an incorrect NAICS code.**”

Industry classifications

Standard industry classifications groups organizations/businesses according to their primary economic activity.

**Tell me what you produce,
I'll tell you your industry classification.**

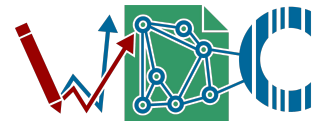

Intended use in property proposal	<p>“Prospectively, Property:P452 could be restricted to values, that have such property. Probably, this property could be directly assigned to domain of organization (Q43229) (primarily for company (Q783794)) and used as standardized alternative of industry (P452).”</p>	<p>“Planned use: Add the economic activity codes to various institutes that are used as affiliations of people.” Further comments suggest the property was meant to be used on individual organization items</p>	<p>“Planned use: associating journal articles with industrial sectors where such data exists” “I would like to create items around those codes and then use main subject (P921) to say that those articles are about those industry sectors. In theory, items about individual businesses could use this property, but I don't think it should work like that—rather, the code should be applied to the item about the sector, and then the item about the sector used to describe the item about the business.”</p>

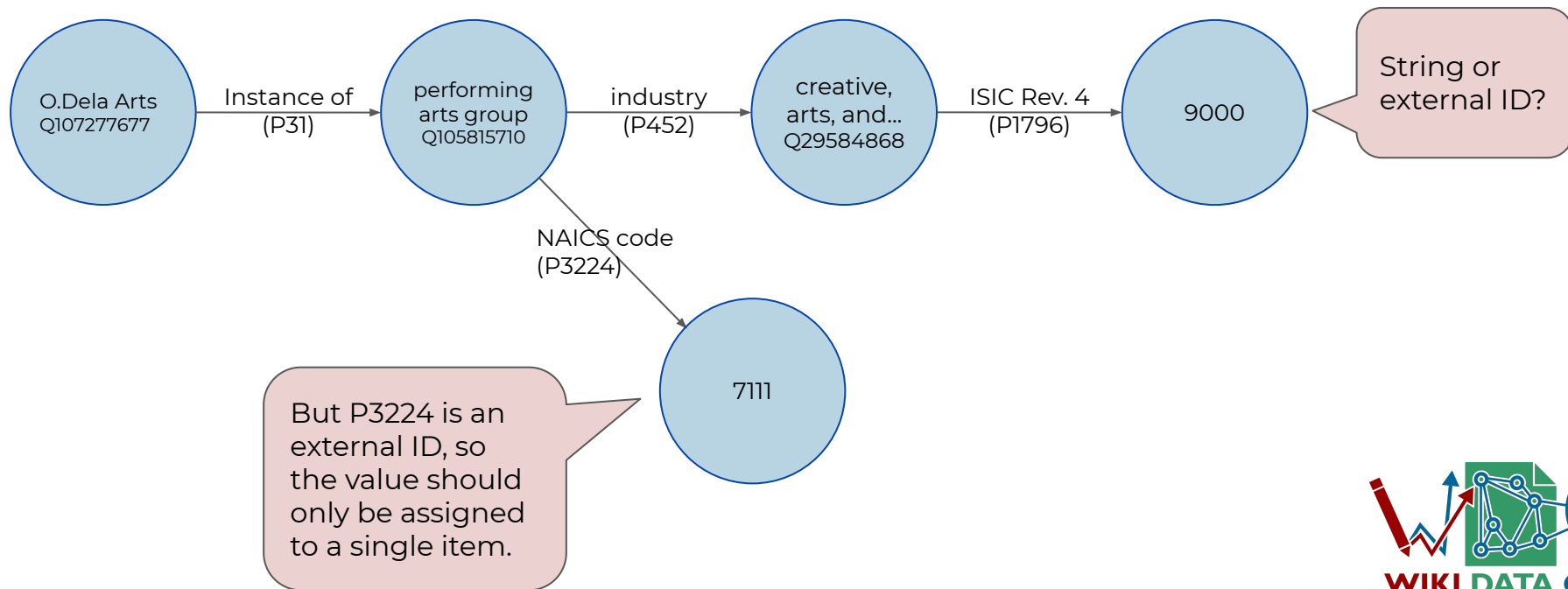
ISIC, NACE and NAICS

	ISIC rev. 4 (P1796)	NACE code (P4496)	NAICS code (P3224)
Actual use	Some classes such as automotive industry (Q190117) are implemented, attributed an ISIC code are stated as industry (P452) in organization items.	Same as ISIC	Classes are not implemented, and the property is often used on individual organization items. This is highly problematic since this is an external ID property.
