"Calcutta: Past and Present" by Kathleen Blechynden, published in 1905, lays before the reader a vivid picture in lucid style of the colonial Calcutta, then capital of British India, from its initial days at the time of Job Charnock till the time of Warren Hastings, the first governor-general of India. Adorned with rare engravings and photographs, this work was written by a British lady from a somewhat unusual perspective. In the author's own words, "My aim has not been to give any account of the great deeds by which the men of old Calcutta laid the foundations of the British Empire in the East, but rather to try and depict the lives they led, their daily cares and amusements, the wives and daughters who lightened their exile, the houses in which they dwelt, the servants who waited on them, the food they ate, the wines they drank, the scenes amid which they moved, the graves in which they laid their loved ones





— for the sweetness of her disposition, the unfailing accuracy of her judgment, and the purity of her life. was told she must preach or be silent on her own responsibility; but she was not afraid to assume, stand alone, and make her beliefs known. Without regard to sex, she preached whenever and wherever a place offered, but not always did she do this under favorable circumstances. Obstacles melted away under the powerful personality of such a speaker as Antoinette Brown, and, in spite of the opposition of the people, she at length she finally became the ordained pastor, in 1852, of a Congregational church in South Butler, Wayne county, N. Y. In 1853 she was ordained by the council called by the church. After preaching for the lay ministry, she began to have distressing doubts concerning certain theological tenets, and on that account she resigned her charge in 1854. She was married to Samuel C. Blackwell, a brother of Dr. Elizabeth Blackwell, 24th January, 1856. She began the study of some of the great questions concerning women, and organized and published the result under the title of "Shadows of Our Social System." Her life as a preacher, lecturer and writer has been a very useful one. In the latter direction she has done work which reflects great credit upon her sex, having received much praise for her logical manner of thought. "Advances in General Science" (New York, 1870), "A Market Woman" (New York, 1870), "The Island Neighbors" (New York, 1871), "The Sexes Throughout Nature" (New York, 1872), and "The Physical Basis of Interest" (New York, 1876), are some of her various works. The most prominent fact to be recorded in the history of Mrs. Blackwell's life, and the one which speaks loudly for her present honorable place among the eminent women of our country, is her love of effort; only



Getting Started

1. Create a username and password in the National Archives Catalog.
2. Login from any transcription page or on the login page.
3. Start a Transcription Mission, check out More Records, or create your own mission by doing a keyword search for your favorite topics.
4. Select the "View/Add Contributions" button located below all images in the catalog.
5. Select the "Transcribe" tab for the page of the record you would like to transcribe.
6. Select the "Edit" button and remember to save your work frequently.
