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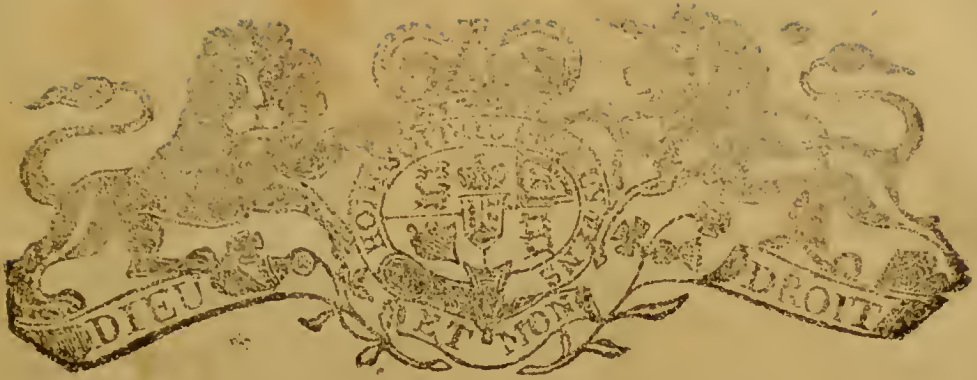



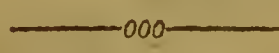

No. 2. All Coolies travelling to receive One and a half Pence per day during the time they are detained at any place on the Road

No. 3. No Cooly is obliged to carry more than 40 lbs. to any distance further than 2 English Miles.

No. 4. All Coolies who work at day labour are to begin the work at seven in the morning leave off at half past 5, two hours to be allowed them for their dinner.

No. 5. Two places will be fixed, one in the Fort and another in the Pettah where Coolies are to be found at all hours.

No. 6. At the Fish bazar will be a servant of the Police to procure Carts at all hours.

No. 7. Every Cart to be numbered.

No. 8. Those who hire a Cart to pay the taxes for the Cart. No Cart can be obliged to carry more than 10 sacks of Rice or 1500 lbs.

No. 9. The Carts will be permitted to pass in the Main-street of the Pettah for the benefit of the Merchants and the Proprietors of Carts.

No. 10. When this Regulation shall be published every Cooly or person letting Carts shall be liable to punishment on any ground of complaint or it being proved that he asked more than the stipulated prices.

ABSTRACT of the Regulation of Government No. 9, 1825 consolidating and amending the former Regulations respecting the Collection of Sea Customs in Ceylon.



THE Duties on Goods imported and exported are in general levied according to rates stated in certain Tables herewith published.

In the instances of articles not enumerated in the Tables, the Importer shall produce his Invoice, and shall be charged duty on the value at the rate of 5 per Cent on Goods the produce of Europe imported in British Vessels, and at the rate of 10 per Cent on other goods likewise imported in British Vessels; and $7\frac{1}{2}$ per Cent on goods the produce of Europe imported in foreign Vessels and 15 per Cent on other goods in like manner imported in foreign Vessels.

Where no Invoice exists, or that produced is suspected, the Collector shall appraise the goods at his discretion.—(V. C. 4.)

If the owner be dissatisfied, three appraisers, one to be appointed by the Collector, another by the owner, and they two to choose a third, are to value the goods, and the decision of two of them is final.—(Vide Clause 4.)

Cotton Cloths the duty levied upon which, as specified in Tables No. 1 and 2 depends upon the Assortment of the Cloth, as assorted by the importer, and if the Custom House Officers are not satisfied with the assortment, it is referred to three arbitrators, one named by the Collector, the second by the Importer, and they two to choose the third, and their decision is final. If the Importer has put more than a third of any particular portion of his Cloth into an inferior class, he shall be liable to pay double duty.—(V. C. 5.—)

Such Cloth as is to pay advalorem, is to be appraised by the Government appraiser at its price in this market, subject to reference to appraisers chosen as above mentioned.—(V. C. 6.)

Where duty is ascertained from Tables, or by assessment on appraised value, if the goods are imported in Foreign Vessels, one half more is to be added to the rate excepting it shall be made appear by the Master &c. of such foreign vessel that at the Ports of the Country to which such Vessel belongs, similar articles if exported to this Island in British vessels are only liable the same rates of duty as if exported in vessels belonging to the said Country.—(V. C. 8.)

Goods exported in Foreign vessels liable to a duty of eight per Cent advalorem over and above the duties on such goods when exported in British Vessels; unless it shall be proved that no higher duty is levied in the Ports of the Country to which such Foreign vessel belongs on such articles, when imported in a British vessel, than when imported in the Vessels of that Country itself, and that such articles when so imported in British vessels are entitled to the same privileges and advantages with respect to Warehousing, and internal consumption, or otherwise, as when imported in vessels belonging to such foreign State.—(V. C. 9.)

Neither British nor Foreign vessels may bring from any foreign Country, articles composed of Cotton, Steel, Iron, or Wool of foreign manufacture.—(V. C. 7.)

Spirits may be warehoused without payment of warehouse duty as long as convenient.—(V. C. 29.)

And be re-exported on payment of one tenth of the import duty.—(V. C. 29.)

No spirits can be removed for island consumption, or exported out in the same Packages as imported; and remain at the risk of the importer while in the Custom House.—(V. C. 29.)

In case of goods alleged to be damaged during the voyage and after shipment at the port of Export, the Collector of Customs being first satisfied that the damage did so occur, is to view the same, or on the request of the importer to cause the same to be inspected by two indifferent persons, whom the Collector may select; and on such view or inspection to frame a report of the quantum of damage, on which, the same being approved by the Commissioner of Revenue, a proportionate abatement of duties may take place.—(V. C. 10.)

No goods shall be landed until the Ship's paper and a full Manifest of Goods on board are lodged at the Custom House.—(V. C. 41.)

But the Certificate of Registry or Sea Pass of Vessels of or exceeding 150 Tons burthen, need not be lodged at the Custom House; but must be exhibited to and examined by the Collector of Customs previous to landing Goods therefrom, unless such vessel have transactions with Government, or shall have brought troops to this Island, and the Master of such Vessel must, previous to any goods being landed for Trade, enter into bond to the King, in a sum not exceeding Three Hundred Pounds, for the due observance of the Regulations for the Customs and the duties of the Port, in respect to the Vessel and all goods therein imported or to be exported in her. The bond to be cancelled on the Port Clearance being taken out previous to the vessel quitting the Port. No such Bond however required if the Master refer lodging his Register as before enacted.—(V. C. 42.)

No Goods may be exported from the Island for Trade on vessels not regularly entered at the Port of Export.—(V. C. 45.)

Goods exported or attempted to be exported contrary to this rule are to be confiscated and owner liable to a fine of double the value.—(V. C. 45.)

If it shall appear, that any goods have been on board, not mentioned in the manifest, either by search (which Custom House Officers are authorized to make) or otherwise, the Commander or principal person on board who gave in the manifest, shall be liable to a penalty equal to the value of such goods, to be ascertained by appraisement; and the goods if landed are liable to double duty.—(V. C. 41.)

* All Square rigged or other coasting vessels belonging to Ceylon, are to be registered in the Custom House of the District to which they belong.—(V. C. 37.)

* The Registry to be kept agreeable to forms furnished by Government.—(V. C. 37.)

† The owner of every such vessel to provide himself with a Certificate of Registry, to be kept on board the vessel always, except when she is in port. at which time it is to be lodged in the Custom House.—(V. C. 37.)

* The Certificate to be on a stamp of One Shilling and Six Pence, or One Rix Dollar when the burthen of the vessel does not exceed Five Candies, and Three Shillings or Two Rix Dollars if above.—(V. C. 37.)

The Registry to be renewed on any change of property if the person to whom the vessel is transferred be a resident in the Island. The new Registry to be made within one month after the Vessel comes to the Port nearest the new owners residence. The Collector of Customs previous to allowing the new registry is to satisfy himself of the correctness of the Transfer.—(V. C. 39.)

No other document in the nature of a Sea Pass is necessary besides the Certificate of Registry for any square rigged vessel Sloop, Schooner, or Dhonies belonging to this Island.—(V. C. 39.)

† Any such vessel navigating without a Certificate on board confiscated with all Cargo on board, excepting such as navigate under

* By the Regulation No. 2 of 1826, the Provisions herein laid down are so far altered that they only apply to vessels &c. &c. under the burthen of 15 tons navigating on the Coasts of Ceylon and its dependencies. All vessels &c. &c. above the burthen of 15 tons of whatever description must be registered under the Provisions of the Act of Parliament 6 of GEO. IV. Cap. 110 by the Custom Master at the principal Port of the District to which they belong as well as all Vessels &c. &c. under the burthen of 15 tons that navigate otherwise than on the Coasts of Ceylon and its dependencies. Vide Regulation of Government No. 2 of 1826, & the Act of Parliament 6 Geo. IV. Cap. 110 therewith published.

† This only applies to vessels registering under the Regulation No. 9 of 1825. All vessels registered under the Act of Parliament 6 Geo. IV. Cap. 110 must at all times have their Certificates of Registry on board or ready to produce.

Such vessels, having on board Permits from a Collector of Customs or Assistant Custom Master, may proceed to any part of the Coast of the same District, and take in goods of the description stated in the Permit and bring the same to the Port of Clearance for inspection and clearance: and with similar Permit, may convey goods duly imported, from a Port of Entry and Export, to other ports in the same District; but during such voyage, within the limits of Districts, the Certificates of Registry are to remain the Custom House from which the Permit is issued.—(V. C. 37.)

When Europeans command vessels a note of contents is to be sent with each boat load of goods sent on shore addressed to the Collector.—V. C. 54.)

The penalty of disobeying this injunction is, fine not exceeding ten Pounds, and imprisonment till paid.—(V. C. 54.)

And if such notes state falsely, the goods are liable to double duty.—(V. C. 55.)

No article to pass the Custom House until duties are paid, or Security given by deposit or otherwise, but no deposit can be received except when the amount of duties exceeds the Sum of forty Pounds.—(V. C. 11.)

Deposits unredeemed are to be sold in six months, the amount of duties deducted, and the balance paid to the owners.—(V. C. 11.)

Interest to be charged on duties not paid within two months, the rate of Nine per Cent per annum.—(V. C. 11.)

Goods left in the Custom House above 18 months, without payment of duty, unless by special permission of Government, to be sold by auction after Advertisement.—(V. C. 30.)

Proceeds to answer duty and Warehouse rent and surplus paid to owner but who shall have no further claim: perishable goods may be sold at an earlier period if deemed necessary.—(V. C. 30.)

If Goods lodged in any Custom House are destroyed by fire or stolen, the owner is not to have any claim against Government.—(V. C. 31.)

Officers employed in the Custom House embezzling Goods or through negligence allowing them to be stolen liable to make good double the value; action for the same to be brought in one year.—(V. C. 31.)

A Drawback is allowed on the re-exportation of all articles except Grain, equal to nine-tenths of the Import duties if the goods are exported within two years; but the Drawback does not extend to any additional duties imposed as penalties for breaches of the regulation.—(V. C. 12. 22.)

Applications for drawback to be made in writing, at Colombo to the Commissioner of Revenue, if he be present, otherwise at other Ports to the Collector of Customs. Where the

Exporter is not the original Importer a Certificate from such Importer of the import of the goods and at what date, and when and how duty was paid, must be produced, and in all cases an Affidavit according to one of the Forms in Table No. 4. Any person signing a false Certificate of the above description or using one for the purpose of obtaining a drawback intended to be obtained, and no drawback is allowed on articles of which the Packages are broken, or where goods are in the whole of less value than Forty Pounds.—(V. C. 18. 13.)

The Proprietor of any Goods imported into Colombo, Galle or Trincomale, may enter the same with the exception of Grain, Sirits, Cinnamon, Cassia or Cassia Buds, or any portion thereof, provided the total value of the goods to be entered is not under One Hundred and Fifty Pounds for re-exportation, and may on paying a duty of One per Cent on the invoiced value of the goods, store the same in any Warehouse to be approved of by the Collector of Customs, under the joint keys of the Collector and the Proprietor, there to remain, at the risk of the Proprietor, until re-exported.—(V. C. 23.)

Iron, Lead, Sugar and Saltpetre the latter being imported by the previous license of Government are exempted from the above warehousing duty of one per cent.—(V. C. 24.)

If any of the goods are taken out for sale or consumption in the Island the full Import duty to be paid in addition. (V. C. 23.)

The Warehouses where any such goods are, to be liable to visitation by Custom House Officers, on notice to the Proprietor or his Agent, and the goods are to be arranged so as to be easy of access.—(V. C. 23.)

When the goods are to be re-exported, they are to be re-examined by the Custom House Officers and duty paid on any deficiency.—(V. C. 26.)

Any Warehoused goods, embezzled or fraudulently and clandestinely removed, or hid, shall with the Packages be forfeited and may be seized by any Officer of the Customs, and the person hiding or removing, aiding, or assisting, or knowingly receiving the same is subjected to the same penalty as if the goods had been fraudulently landed or removed without payment of duty.—(V. C. 27.)

No Goods are to be delivered out of the Warehouse except in the packages they were imported, or in one entire quantity equal thereto, nor for exportation under Forty Pounds invoice value at each delivery.—(V. C. 25.)

Goods Warehoused if not re-exported within 18 months, are liable to the full import duty, and in default of duty being paid the goods will be publicly exposed for sale, and if the amount of duty is not procurable at the sale, goods are to be des-

oyed and the Proprietor has no claim for any loss in consequence.—(V. C. 28.)

The surplus amount of any sale after the duty is paid, to be paid to the Proprietor.—(V. C. 28.)

No goods subject to Duty to be landed or shipped but between six in the morning and six in the evening except personal Baggage of two Trunks and two Parcels for each person.—(V. C. 44.)

No vessel is to land or ship cargo except at regular ports, where there is a Custom House, and at places duly assigned within the same.—(V. C. 43.)

Ships & Vessels of all kinds may land or take on board cargo on their own boats, or; (except at Colombo, Trincomalee and Galle where square-rigged vessels Sloops and Schooners must employ a licensed boat of the Port,) any other Boats.—(V. C. 47.)

No Dhoney required to hire a licensed boat.—(V. C. 48.)

Boats are licensed at Colombo, Trincomalee and Galle by the Collector of Customs and the licenses registered by the Master Attendant and Sitting Magistrate of the Port.—(V. C. 47.)

Applications for licensed boats are to be made to the Master Attendant but the Hire is to be paid to the Tindals agreeable to such rates as shall be fixed from time to time by the Governor or in his absence by the Lieutenant Governor of this Island, and publicly notified by advertisement—If the Tindal claim more than Two Pounds and is liable on conviction before any Justice of the Peace to a fine of Two Pounds and in default of payment imprisonment at hard labour for a month unless the fine be sooner paid.—(V. C. 50.)

The rates of pilotage into the several Ports of Colombo, Trincomalee and Galle as specified in the Schedule No. 7, are to be paid to the Master Attendant for the use of the Pilots employed.—(V. C. 68.)

If a Tindal of a licensed boat on being ordered to land or ship cargo by the Master Attendant refuse to do so or shall have less than Three-fourths of the number of Seamen which his license requires on board he shall on conviction before any Justice of the Peace be liable to a fine not exceeding Ten Pounds, to be levied by the sale of his property and in default of his having property to be employed at hard labour for three months unless the fine be sooner paid.—(V. C. 51.)

Tindals of licensed boats may have their crews registered by appearing with them and the Seamen acknowledging their engagement for a specified time before the Sitting Magistrate.—(V. C. 52.)

Registered Seamen may on complaint of Tindal of any disobedience or neglect on proof before the Sitting Magistrate be sentenced to imprisonment at hard labour for any time not ex-

ceeding one month or to receive corporal punishment not exceeding Twenty-five Lashes.—(V. C. 52.)

Goods landed at Colombo, Trincomalee and Galle from any square rigged vessel sloop or schooner in unlicensed boats, except in the vessels own boats to be confiscated as also the boat—Half the value to Informer.—(V. C. 53.)

Goods landed at improper places confiscated, as likewise the boat employed in landing goods or Passengers at places not fixed by the Regulation.—(V. C. 49.)

The Rates of hire of Coolies and Artificers at the Ports of Colombo, Trincomalee & Galle to be such as shall be fixed from time to time by the Governor of this Island or in his absence the Lieutenant Governor and publicly notified by Advertisement.—(V. C. 69.)

No Ballast is to be thrown overboard from any vessel on pain of a fine of not exceeding Twenty-five Pounds on the Master or Mate in charge and imprisonment till the fine be paid.—(V. C. 70.)

Goods not in deposit to be removed in seven days, or charged with Warehouse rent,—(V. C. 32.)

Wearing apparel, brought for the use of the Owners and their families is free of duty, but a declaration on oath that the apparel is for private use, may be demanded.—(V. C. 33.)

Public property is free of duty when certified to be so by the proper public Officer.—(V. C. 34.)

Every ship, vessel or doney sailing out of a Port of this Island, *excepting Ships of War and Cruizers belonging to the Honble Company's Marine Establishment*, shall take out a Port Clearance The Port Clearance is to contain a full and specific description of the cargo on board, and whether it has paid, or is liable to duty, or not, and is to be signed in Duplicate by Master of the vessel.—Every Ship Dhoney &c. going from one port to another of this Island to have on board Port Clearance or Permit from the Port she last quitted—And in default the Master or principal Person in charge shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding £ 3. 15 and imprisonment for two months or until fine be paid.—(V. C. 56.)

Any goods which may be on board after such Port Clearance is signed, not inserted therein, shall be confiscated—also any goods discovered to be on board before the Port Clearance is issued if shipped without payment of duties.—(V. C. 57 58.)

The Fees on Port Clearances to be paid by Ships & Vessels required to take out the same, save and except Chartered Transports & Vessels belonging to this Government anchoring in any ports of this Island, to be levied according to Schedule No, 6—But no Fee payable unless such Ships or Vessel shall have remained at Anchor 24 hours, or shall have discharged any Goods

· taken any Goods on Board—The Baggage of Passengers exempted.—(V. C. 56 59)

Goods transhipped without permission or shipped on a different vessel from that for which they are passed, are to be confiscated, well as the vessel, or at the discretion of Government the Goods shall be liable to treble duties.—(V. C. 61.)

Cinnamon in any quantity above ten lbs. for the use of the Ship cannot be exported without special License, under the penalty of confiscation of such Cinnamon and a fine of Twenty Pounds for every lb. attempted to be exported.—(V. C. 36.)

Arms and Ammunition cannot be imported without special license, under penalty of confiscation and Fine in addition to any other penalties enacted by the Regulation against the fraudulent transportation of Goods, of Two Pounds for every Pound weight of Sulphur, Saltpetre, Gunpowder or other ammunition, & Ten Pounds for every Cannon, mortar, or other description of Fire arm, and imprisonment till such fine be paid.—(V. C. 35.)

All articles landed or attempted to be landed at unlicensed places, or hours, or if for trade, before the Ship or vessel is lawfully entered, or removed without payment of duties, shall be confiscated.—(V. C. 60.)

All Goods whether chargeable with duty or exempted, must be sent to the Custom House for examination previous to exportation, or after being landed, or the goods will be confiscated.—(V. C. 46.)

Commanders of Ships privy to importing or exporting goods liable to confiscation, subject to pay a fine equal to the value; as also the Owners or consignees of such goods.—(V. C. 62.)

Revenue Officers to have free access to vessels.—(V. C. 63.)

Persons concerned in shipping or landing goods prohibited, or without payment of duties, or impeding or molesting Revenue Officers, or offering to bribe or giving or offering any present, or gratuity to a Custom House Officer, liable to One Hundred Pounds fine and imprisonment till paid; the goods above-mentioned to be confiscated.—(V. C. 63.)

Revenue Officers receiving presents to be liable to pay a fine of One Hundred Pounds and to imprisonment with or without hard labour not exceeding six months.—(V. C. 63.)

Informers entitled to one-third of property confiscated.—(V. C. 64.)

Excepting the Sitting Magistrate or Custom Master.—(V. C. 46.)

Confiscated Goods above Five Pounds value not to be sold without sanction of the Commissioner of Revenue.—(V. C. 67.)

No person is allowed to land from any Ship or square-rigged vessel anchoring in Colombo, Galle or Trincomale, till the vessel is visited by the Master Attendant or his Deputy; and Certificate delivered by the Master, that none on board have Small-Pox or

other contagious disease, of which a counter certificate is to be delivered by the Master Attendant to the Master.—(V. C. 71.)

No person is to land from a Doney in Colombo, Galle or Trincomale, or from any vessel in other Ports, till a similar report is made to the Custom Master.—(V. C. 71.)

Penalty for breaches of this Law, or a false report, fine of Fifty Pounds.—(V. C. 71.)

If any contagious disease should be on board, Custom Master to report at Colombo to the Chief Secretary; at outstations to the Collector of the District and the Collector will take measures in concert with the principal Medical Officer to prevent communication; or remove infected persons; reporting the same to Government.—(V. C. 71.)

The above abstract being published by the sanction of Government a Copy is to be sent on board every Square-rigged vessel by the Master Attendants or other Report boat; and Translations in Cingalese and Tamul are to be hung up in the most conspicuous parts of the Custom Houses and Master Attendant's Office throughout the Island.

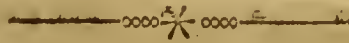
