

Daily Occupation Report No. 1, closing 1200, 4 October 1945.

1. The following report is submitted on the occupation of targets as indicated:

a. 0-1 - 3d AA Div Hq located at $34^{\circ} 38' 45''$ N - $135^{\circ} 30' 50''$ E, Seimi Tono Estate, Osaka. Japanese military personnel present at the above location totalled 25 Officers and 30 Enlisted Men of the regular Japanese Army. Commanding Officer in charge of the above unit Major General Kawai Kiyoshi, residence at Nashinomia. Senior Officer present at Seimi Tono Estate, Major Yamamoto. Weapons and organizational equipment located at Nagai Park, Osaka. Clothing, munitions and organizational papers located at warehouse, present location unknown. Occupation and inventory of Nagai Park and warehouse at unknown location to begin on morning of 5 October 1945. No arms, munitions or other military material or papers were found at Seimi Tono Estate. Japanese Army intentions are to use the above estate for billets during the month of October 1945.

b. 0-2 - 11th Ind Machine Cannon Bn (including 47th Ind Machine Cannon Co and 50th Ind Machine Cannon Co) located at $34^{\circ} 39' 40''$ N - $135^{\circ} 30' 35''$ E under command of Major Toshis Mayeda. Japanese military personnel present composed of 7 Officers and 44 Enlisted Men of which 5 Officers and 11 Enlisted Men are billeted on the 7th floor of the Matuzayaka Department Store located 2 blocks NE of the above coordinates. Materiel at installation consists of 32 AA guns, 50,000 rounds of ammunition, 2000 uniforms and miscellaneous other material. Inventory of military equipment and occupation of the installation will be completed by 1800, 4 October 1945.

c. 0-3 - 10th Engr Unit Hq located at $34^{\circ} 40' 10''$ N - $135^{\circ} 30' 25''$ E - See Annex 2 to this report.

d. 0-4 - 22d Force composed of 734th Ind Inf Bn, Osaka Div 1st Repl Unit, Osaka Div Sig Unit, located at (1052.6-1293.3). Occupied and under control of I Corps Troops.

e. 0-5 - 23d Force composed of 735 II Bn, 736 II Bn located at (1052.3-1293.3). Occupied and under control of I Corps Troops.

f. 0-6 - Osaka Div Dist 2d Repl Unit located at (1052.3-1294.1). Occupied and under control of I Corps Troops.

g. 0-7 - Imperial Hq Sig Unit located at (1052.9-1294.3). Occupied and under control of I Corps Troops.

h. 0-8 - Central Army Hq located at (1052.9-1294.3). Occupied and under control of I Corps Troops.

i. 0-9 - Osaka War Prisoner Camp located at (1052.25-1294.05). Several Japanese in the Osaka Prefecture Hldg were questioned as to the location of the above camp and they stated that to the best of their knowledge no PW Camp was located in this vicinity but that one year ago a PW Camp Office was located in a building next to the Prefecture Hldg and which was now used as a school. No trace of any PW office could be found within the above school. PW Camp could not be located at or in the vicinity of the above coordinates.

j. 0-10 - 122nd AA Regt (57th AA Btry, 47th Ind Machine Cannon Co) located at (1056.2-1300.6) under command of Col Itsune. Occupation of the above target is progressing satisfactorily with excellent cooperation by the Japanese military personnel. Installation includes approximately 40 buildings of various sizes. Materiel in inventory includes 36 - 8mm guns, 40 - 7mm guns, radar equipment, 25,000 blankets, 8000 pairs shoes, 25000 uniforms of all types, 12,000,000 kilograms of coal, 20 trucks and miscellaneous other items. Inventory has not been completed.

k. 11th AA Unit and 58th Ind AA Unit located at (1038.1-1295.8) - See Annex 1 to this report.

l. Depot #1 located at (43.0 - 91.0) rear of Sakawajima Station near Pier One, Osaka. Area and depot flooded and inspection of contents of warehouse, if any, impossible without the use of boats.

m. Depot #2 located at (45.0-91.3) known as Yawayacho Depot. Depot located in razed area South of Municipal Athletic Field consisting of 5 buildings, all severely damaged. A Japanese 2d Lt, name unknown and with no identification papers stated all Japanese soldiers left area 20 days ago. There was a quantity of munitions (type unknown) left which was removed by American forces (unit unknown) 3 days ago. As near as can be determined there are no supplies or equipment of any type remaining in the area. A Japanese Captain, name unknown, address 923 Yen Bldg was reported to be responsible for the area. Further reconnaissance will be made of the area and efforts made to locate Japanese Captain referred to above.

n. Depot #3 (46.0-87.3). No Japanese supply depot could be located in this vicinity or on Osaka Airport. Japanese civilians contacted in the area stated that Osaka Airport has been abandoned for 10 years and that no supply depots were ever located in that vicinity.

o. Depot #4 (50.2-86.3). At 1300, 4 Oct 1945 the Osaka District Regt'l Hq was taken over by a detachment of men from Co H, 391st Inf. The Japanese Officer in charge is Major General Shoji Koike. There are 46 Japanese Officers and NCOs on duty at the installation. There is stored at this installation the following equipment:

Clothing, blankets, gas masks for approximately 600 men.		

Inventory of this depot has not been completed as of this date.

p. Depot #5 (46.0- 84.8. Depot has large quantity of HE and shell powder. Inventory of this installation progressing satisfactorily. Depot under guard by troops of 2d Bn, 391st Inf.

q. Depot #6 (44.6-76.5). No depot has been located in this area.

r. Depot #7 (48.4 - 75.7). Consists of one concrete bldg, 2 concrete caves, 5 frame bldgs well dug in, under guard of 6 Japanese privates. No person of Japanese army could be located who was in charge. Dump includes large quantity of mortar, rifle and machine gun ammunition. Installation now under guard by Co L, 391st Inf. Inventory has been instituted but not completed.

s. Depot #8 (39.5 - 72.0). Installation consists of 50 buildings under supervision of Lt. Hakuhiro Tani, Hq AA Sen 29615. Material includes 10 bldgs of Arty and mortar ammunition, 15 AA Guns, 2 coastal guns, 10 75mm Guns, 4 warehouses of oil in 5 and 55 gal drums, miscellaneous items. Inventory instituted but not completed. Installation under guard of 391st Inf.
