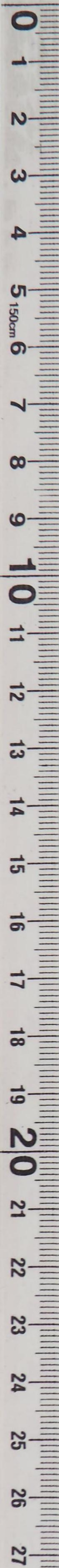

Estimated 1950 crop production and revised 1949 production, in thousand metric tons: rice 9431 and 9381, wheat 1333 and 1297, covered barley 896 and 951, naked barley 1062 and 1047, sweet potatoes 5852 and 5913, spring white potatoes 2363 and 2316, oats 135 and 87, rye 10 and 8, buckwheat 45 and 40, corn 84 and 71, sorghum 6 and 6, foxtail millet 74 and 60, barnyard millet 29 and 27, proso millet 26 and 21, soybeans 342 and 243, adzuki beans 55 and 41, kidney beans 39 and 22, broad beans 27 and 19, peas 12 and 5, peanuts in shell 12 and 9, cowpeas 1 and 4.
2. Estimated harvested area 1950 crops and revised harvested area 1949 crops, in thousand hectares: rice 2994 and 2968, wheat 762 and 755, covered barley 428 and 436, naked barley 589 and 562, sweet potatoes 397 and 437, spring white potatoes 188 and 221, oats 86 and 76, rye 6 and 6. 3. These estimates, released by the Japanese Crop Reporting Office on 25 Oct 50, are preliminary for fall crops and final for spring and summer crops.

4. Total 1950 production of six staple food crops (rice, wheat, barley, naked barley, sweet potatoes, and white potatoes) was third highest on record. 1950 total, in thousand metric tons brown rice equivalents, was 14,594 compared with 14,667 in 1948 and 14,615 in 1939. For staple crops plus minor cereals and pulses 1950 production is postwar high at 15,481 thousand metric tons brown rice equivalents.

5. Rice production considered average to better than average. Anticipated sizeable decrease in sweet potato production because of decontrol not realized as higher yields largely offset reduced acreage. Final estimate for white potatoes indicates all-time high production.

Little work or seeding was possible before Apr 1. However,  
a few warm sunshiny days in early Apr will do much to rectify  
the general situation because more than the usual plowing was done  
last Fall and mechanization will enable farmers to make rapid  
progress once they get started. Fall sown grains growing  
slowly. Chief problem area is in Central and Southern Great  
Plains and Southwest where soil moisture is inadequate.

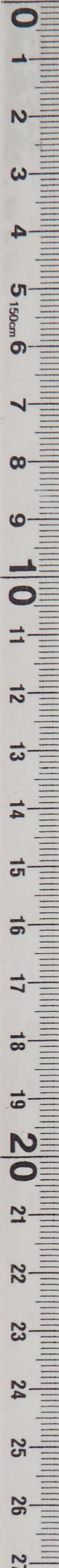

1. Reference your informal memorandum dated 27 May 49 "See my redraft which precludes discussion that might be hard to prove. Also what does it cost Yokosuka to do this type of job?", Lt. J. M. Lewis, USN, Ships Store Officer at Yokosuka, advised that fresh eggs from their chicken farm were sold at \$1.00 per dozen. This price included all operation costs for a flock of 2,000 and a small profit to amortize the initial debt and to establish a small facility fund. Lt. Lewis estimated that the cost of operation, reflected in the price per dozen, was approximately 80¢ to 85¢.

2. All grain feeds (starter, growing, laying mash) come from the ZI on US Navy supply vessels. The Navy Dept does not charge for shipment of these grains. In addition, the Navy at Yokosuka grows its own greens for chicken feed and obtains oyster shells, which are powdered, from Japanese beaches. Chicken Farm, Yokosuka, obtains powdered milk from Navy commissary facilities.

3. Recommend that the 1st Indorsement, prepared by Chief of Staff, be returned to Special Service Section through G-1 for necessary action.
