MEMORANDUM TO: Mr. R. Maher, Philippine Division
SUBJECT : Philippines Documents Assigned Numbers
by your Division

1. At your request, a block of numbers from 2855 to 2886 was set aside for your division, with the understanding that you would assign the numbers as needed to documents used in the Philippines phase, keeping a record of same. We are happy to note that a complete list of documents covering the above numbers was received by this division yesterday.

2. However, there is one detail which might be overlooked. That is the fact that all of the above are treated as if they had been signed out to you personally from the vault, since we never received them for "analysis", or recording. While it is understood that documents which are processed and introduced into court will not thereafter be returned to the vault, there may be some which have been cancelled, or, will not be used as evidence. These should be returned to the vault as soon as convenient, to clear the records there.
