Led by St. Col Gould, six planes took off at 1500 on another span smashing attempt at Kimidan Bridge. New Ireland. This pin point target is located seven miles south-east of Pinikindu point on the Northeast coast of New Ireland.

In javelin down formation, the flight headed for the target on a bearing of 120 Deg Nag. north east of Kavieng, New Ireland, it was obvious that bad weather would prevent a strike at the primary target. Accordingly, the squadron turned, circled around the west coast of New Hanover and flew to a point west of Djaul Island.

The secondary target selected was a suspected bivewas area 500 yds north of Egut Bay. A clearing nearby was used as the siming point.

Geing into a bombing rum at 5000° and 165 knots i.a. s. on a bearing of 045 Deg Nag., bombs were away at 1623.

6 E 2000# GP'S Fuzed Inst., were dropped and the target bracketed. Poor visibility prevented damage assessment.

The flight back to base was routine, packed time
