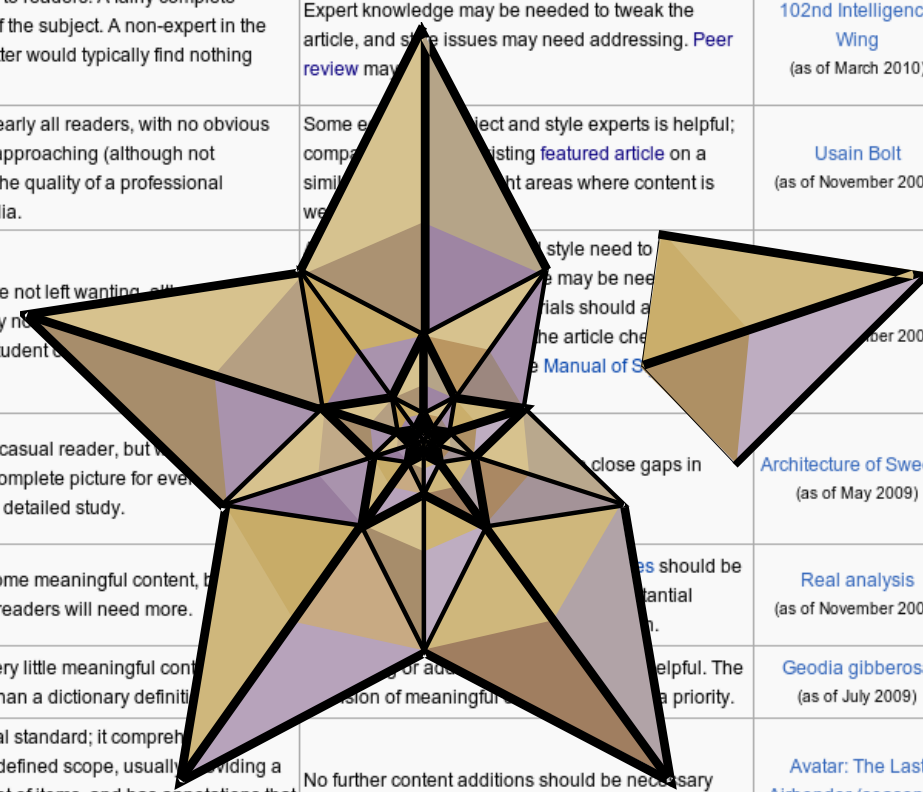

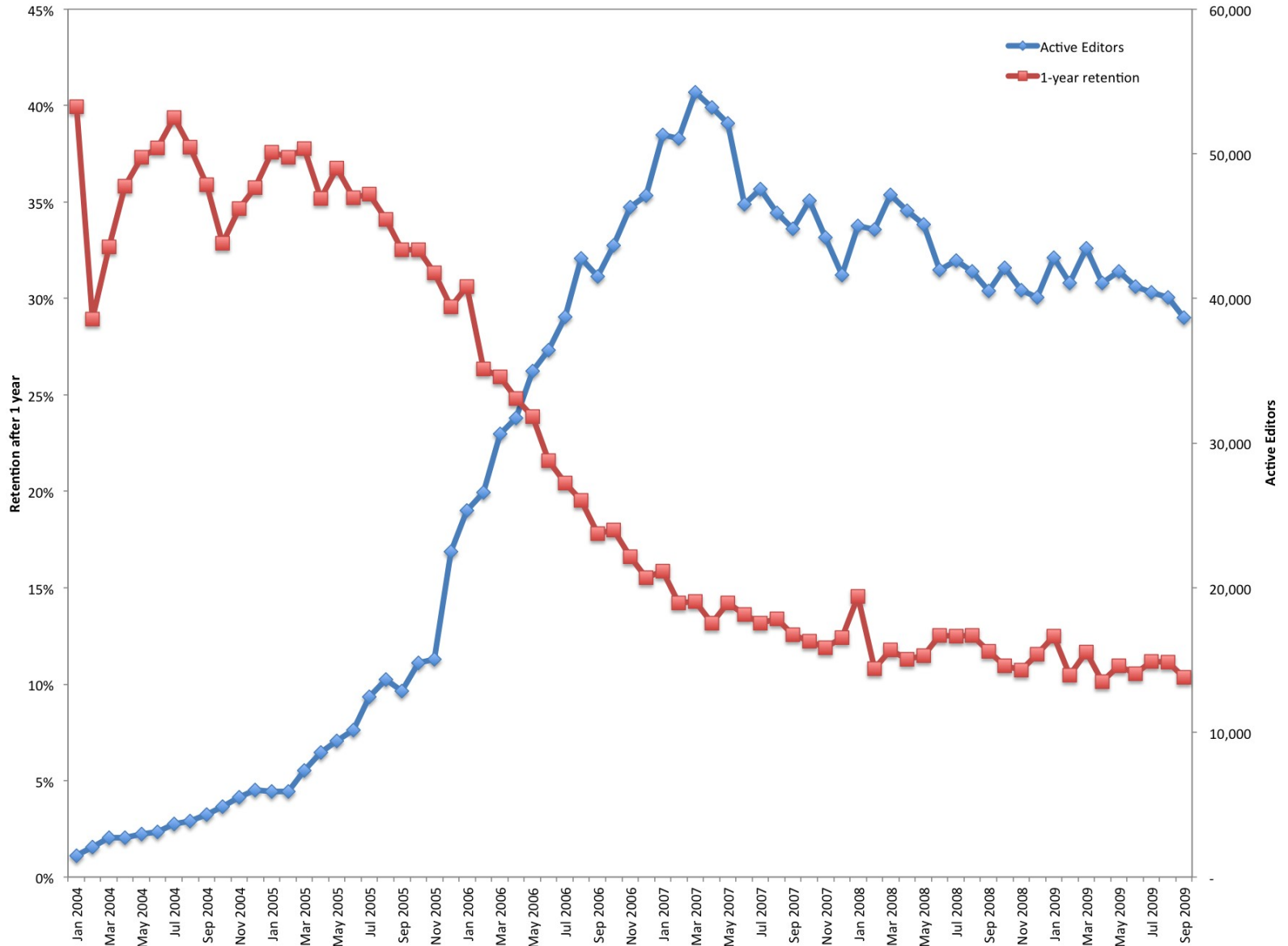

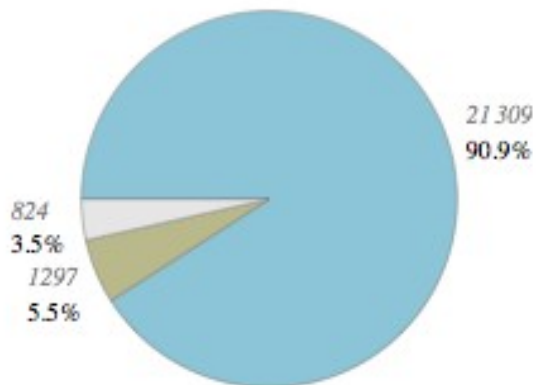


CTA click-through, completion and conversion rates (v.4)

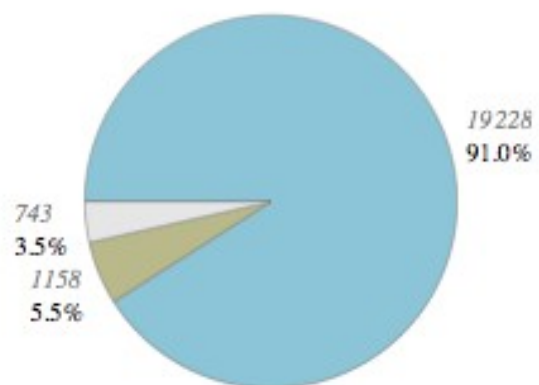

THE OPPORTUNITY



Article tends to heavily focus on the critiques of Reaganomics from arguably biased sources such as the (notedly liberal) Center on Budget and Policy Priorities, Paul Krugman (a democratic hack regardless of Nobel honors) and other Keynesian economists. The result being a generally condemning article of Supply-Side economics with the last word arguing that it's successes stemmed only from cyclical recovery. The question of Reagan's personal grasp of economics does nothing but to imply that he had none, which creates a biased presentation of his economic method.

The article fails to make clear that the conclusion that the arsenic is in the microbe's dna is only hypothesis at this stage, and that a lot of further research by independent scientists is needed before the hypothesis can be accepted. People might read this article and accept it as proven that cellular genetics and biochemistry can be based entirely on arsenic without any phosphorus, whereas it is only hypothesis supported by initial research at this stage.



If supported, the hypothesis has far more implications than the one listed. There seems to be an unhealthy overemphasis on astrobiology. This is probably due to the funding source. What are the implications for evolution, genetic research, industrial use of the bacteria, how are the processes of dna replication and transcription affected by the arsenic.

I am not an expert, but having read the text of the bills in question, this article responds in the typical talking points of supporters of these bills. It does not bring support of specific sections of the bills in question, and leaves out specific loopholes in the bill. It flat out lies in places. (The Curent Bill DOES allow Federally Insured Student Loans and Work Study specifically in the language of the Bill; it also allows some more obscure forms of Aid that few would qualify for. Yet this article says that they would get NO Federal Finacial Aid, and that is very wrong.) It leaves out the execeptions clauses that allow just about anyone to skip any requirement with a wink and a nod, depending upon who is in office and wants to give them that wink and nod. In fact, one clause would actually empower the office of Janet Napalitano the power to dispense with *all* requirements of the Law and Declaring universal immigrant status to even those not applying, simply by stating it was "in the public interest" which is too much power in the hands of one person.



The article mentions that 28 retired general and admirals signed a statement calling for the repeal of the homosexual exclusion policy in December of 2007; and another 104 called for a repeal on November 17, 2008. Nowhere does the article record the fact that 1,150 retired flag officers signed a statement petitioning Congress on March 31, 2009 to retain the policy. To me, this is very one-sided reporting. Also, the article talks about how much money the government could have saved if thousands of homosexuals were not discharged. This is based upon the false assumption that their discharges did not involve misbehavior. The real reason the 1,050 flag officers supported retaining the exclusion policy was they knew the argument about gays in the military were grounded in a lie that their discharge was due to their being homosexuals. Every case I investigated and others that I became aware of involved gays who attempted to proposition (or in some cases abuse) heterosexuals or gay military personnel who were caught involved in homosexual activity on military installations. Up until I read this article, I thought that Wikipedia was an excellent OBJECTIVE and ACCURATE source of information.



You need to modify the following statement to show this section does NOT cover military children!

"Dependents (children) will be permitted to remain on their parents' insurance plan until their 26th birthday,[66] and regulations implemented under the Act include dependents that no longer live with their parents, are not a dependent on a parent's tax return, are no longer a student, or are married.[67][68]"

Military insurance, TriCare, is specifically excluded! I have requested this outrageous oversight(?) be fixed for over a year to my senator and NOTHING has been done to cover military children.

The great weakness of polling readers in this instance is that there is no adjustment for the quality of the judgments. The article should have mentioned that Gaines took Permian to the State title game in 1989 and won it with an undefeated season. In 1988, they didn't even make the title game, having lost to the eventual state champion in the semifinals. I should also note that the team that won the title in 1988 lost the title by forfeit due to playing ineligible players.



I appear to be the first to rate the page (and it's the first page I've rated though I'm a frequent Wikipedia user). I've visited the park region once and will imminently visit again. I've attended presentations and researched it by word of mouth and online. The information provided matches everything I'm aware of and is a very good and useful overview, though I cannot confirm specific numbers presented. I might have rated it even higher except for my own limited knowledge and the fact that I'm sure there is much more to tell. It seems about right though and offers some helpful external links.

Although the information on this page seems to be correct (to my understanding), it did not contain the information that I was looking for. More detail should be added to the actual mechanisms of the operon, including regulation (particularly the autoregulation by *araC*).

The amp that was marked 300B 70 watts/ch was a hybrid amp, and should point that out. 300B's can only output 12 watts. A 70 watt/channel tube amp would be very expensive. The amp shown is a hybrid amp which is cheaper to make, its just a modern solid state amp using a tube for the preamp. This is cheaper and less desirable than a tube amp.
