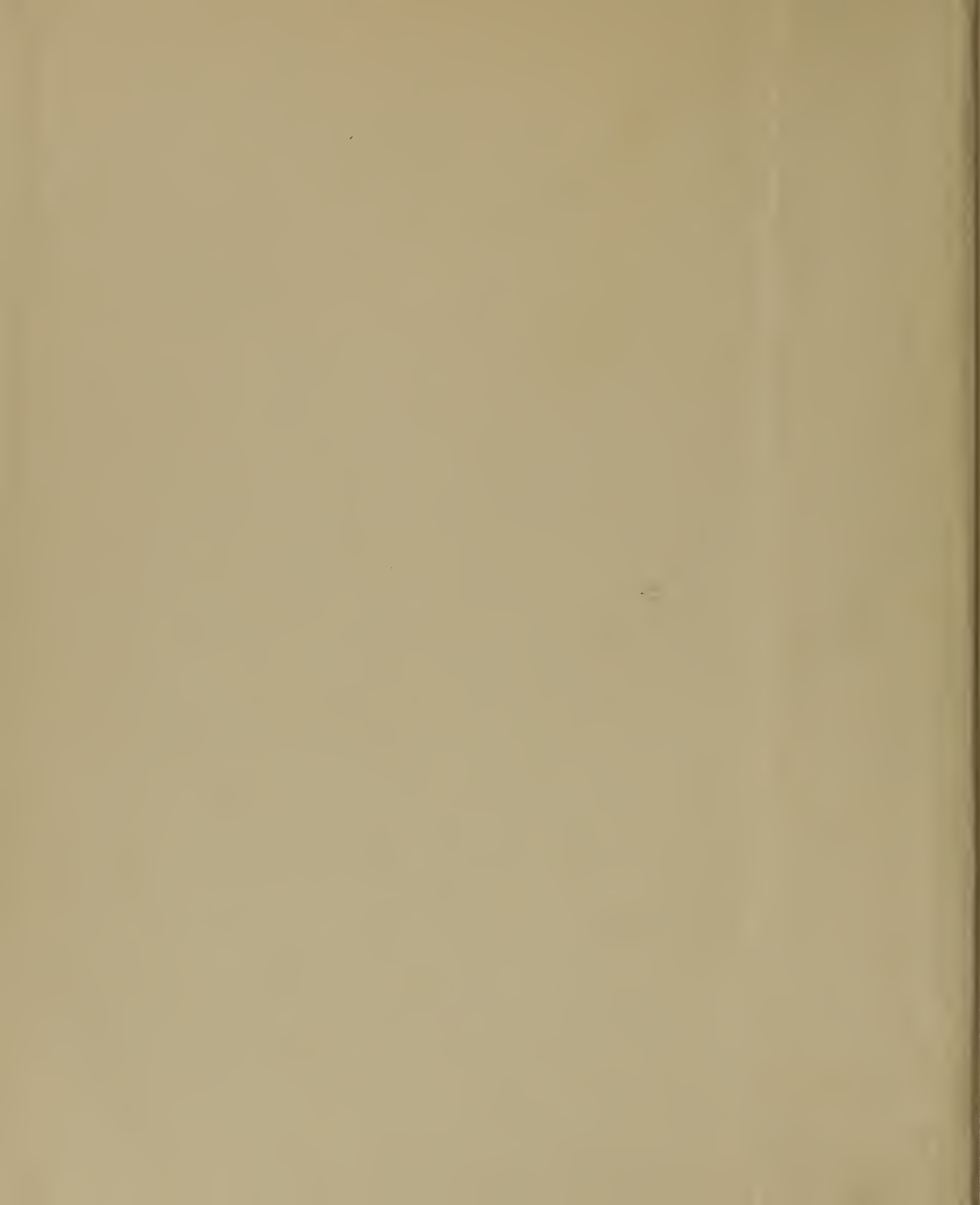

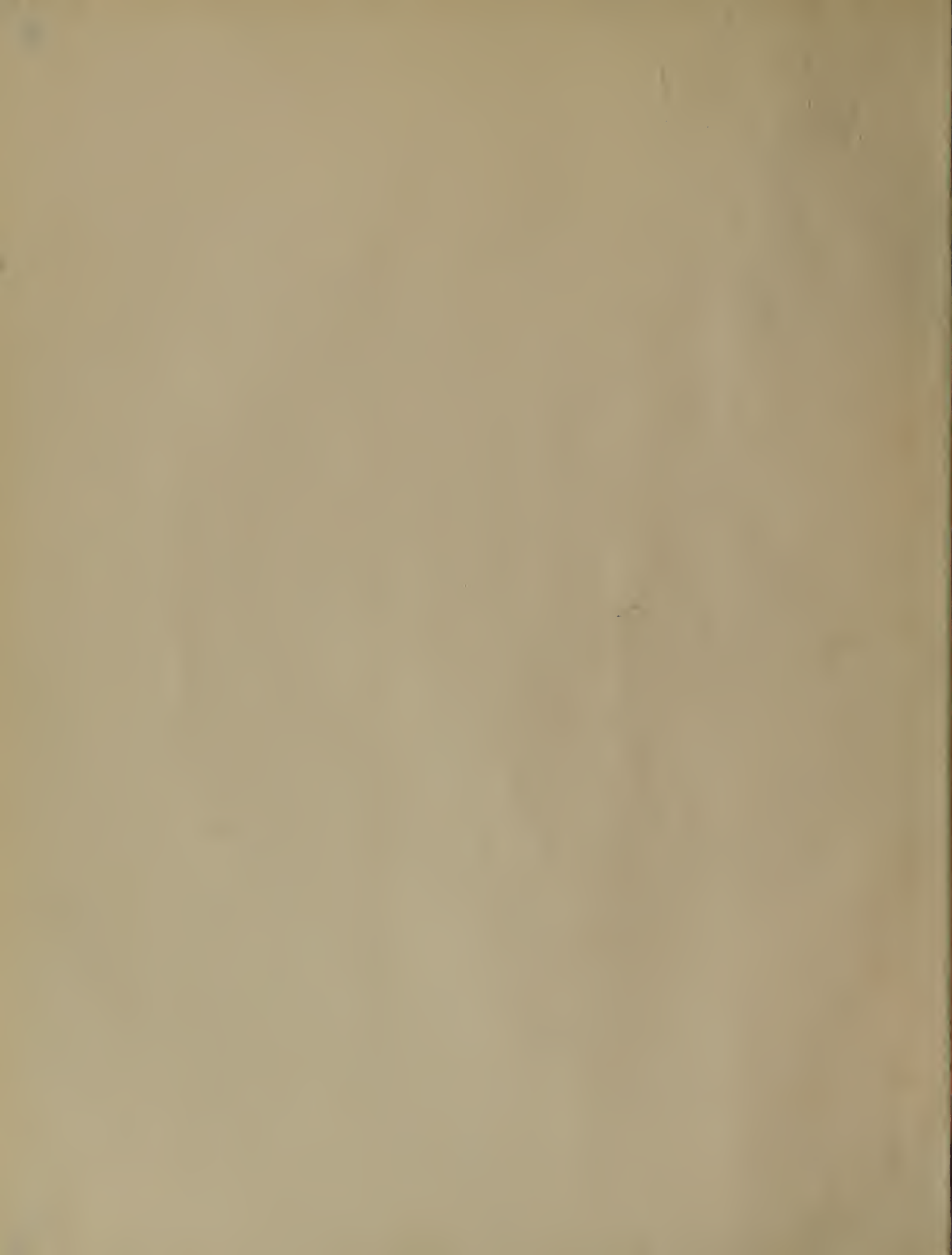

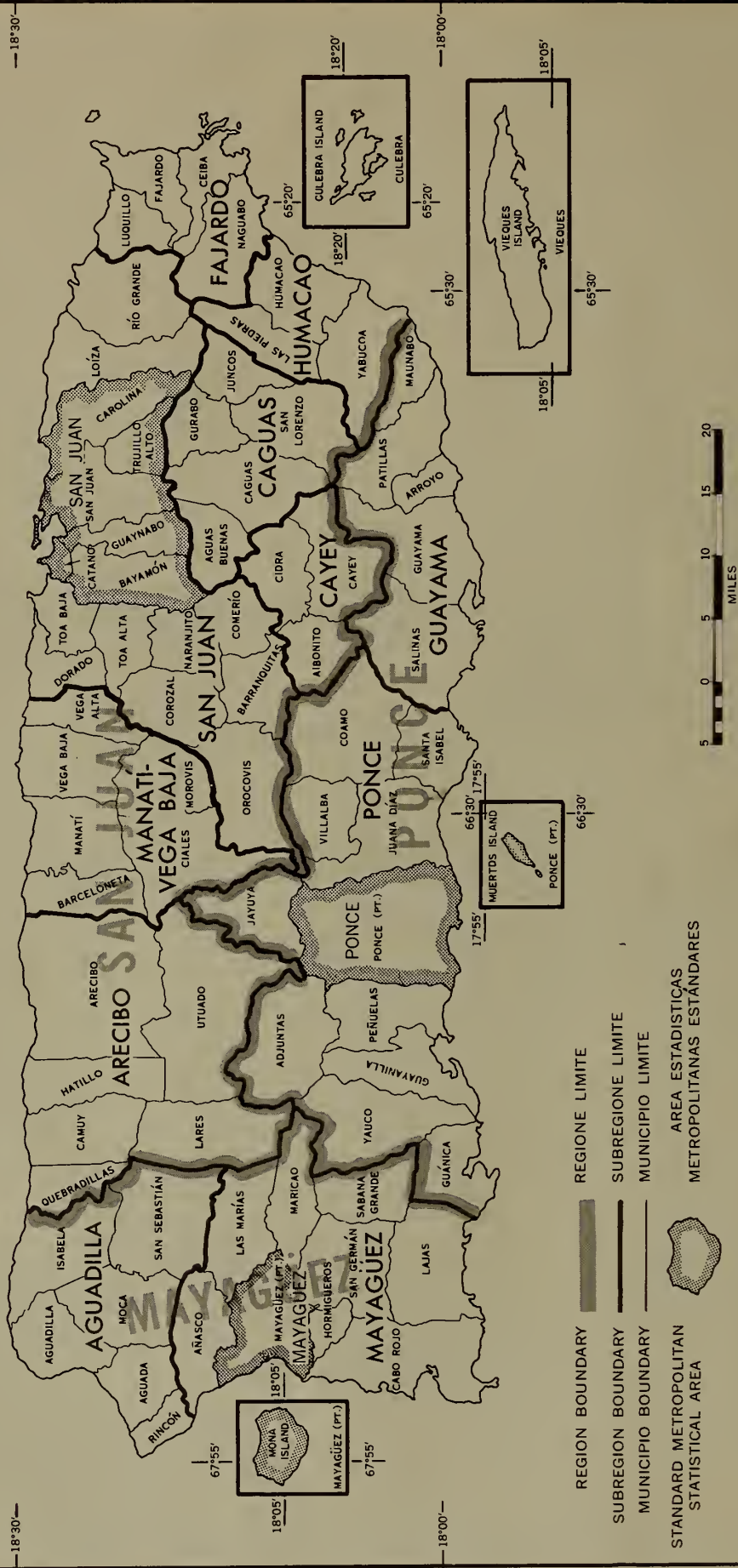

# Introducción

**ANTECEDENTES**—El Censo de Manufacturas de Puerto Rico para 1963, es la novena encuesta general de actividades manufactureras en la Isla durante este siglo. El primer censo cubrió el año 1909 y, a partir de esa fecha, se tomaron censos cada 10 años hasta el 1949, con excepción del año 1929. Sin embargo, debido al rápido desenvolvimiento de las actividades manufactureras en Puerto Rico se hizo imperativo que tanto el gobierno como el sector industrial tuviesen información continua sobre la actividad industrial en la Isla. Al presente, una ley de la Legislatura del Estado Libre Asociado de Puerto Rico (Ley Núm 11 del 27 de marzo de 1950) autoriza al Gobernador a levantar censos de negocios y manufacturas cuando lo estime prudente. Por consiguiente, el Gobierno del Estado Libre Asociado de Puerto Rico levantó censos de manufactura de amplitud más limitada para los años 1952 y 1956. Los censos de 1954 y 1958 fueron resultado de la actividad conjunta entre la Junta de Planificación del Gobierno del Estado Libre Asociado de Puerto Rico y el Negociado del Censo del Departamento de Comercio de los Estados Unidos (13 CEU 131, 191 y 224) y por la Ley de la Legislatura del Estado Libre Asociado mencionada anteriormente. (Véase el apéndice B.) El Censo de Manufacturas de 1963 se levantó simultáneamente con el Censo de Comercio. Este representa, una vez más, un proyecto conjunto de la Junta de Planificación y el Negociado del Censo.

**EL CENSO DE 1963**—Los resultados del Censo de Manufacturas de 1963 se presentan en forma tabular, según se describe continuación.

El Capítulo I, Estadísticas Generales muestra, sobre bases comparativas, datos estadísticos sobre la actividad manufacturera durante el año 1963 y años anteriores. Los datos se presentan clasificados por áreas estadísticas metropolitanas estándares y por regiones; por tamaño de empleo; por tamaño de valor agregado; por grupos industriales principales; y por tipo de organización jurídica. Una tabla muestra estadísticas generales seleccionadas clasificadas según la condición contributiva del establecimiento. Las estadísticas generales constituyen las medidas de mayor importancia de la actividad industrial: Número de empleados y otras personas ocupadas; remuneraciones; valor de los productos vendidos (expedidos); y valor agregado por la manufactura.

El Capítulo II, Estadísticas Industriales, presenta estadísticas generales seleccionadas clasificadas por industrias y grupos industriales principales, y datos sobre productos

# Introduction

**BACKGROUND**—The 1963 Puerto Rico Census of Manufactures is the ninth such canvass of the Island's manufacturing activities during this century. The first census covered 1909 and, excepting 1929, a census was taken at 10-year intervals through 1949. However, the rapid development of manufacturing in Puerto Rico made it imperative that both government and manufacturers have current information on industrial activity in the Island. An Act of the Legislature of the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico (Act No. 11 of March 27, 1950) now authorizes the Governor to conduct censuses of business and manufactures whenever deemed advisable. Accordingly, in 1952 and 1956, censuses of manufactures with more limited coverage were conducted by the Commonwealth government. For 1954 and 1958, these censuses were conducted jointly by the Puerto Rico Planning Board, Government of the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, and the Bureau of the Census, U.S. Department of Commerce. The 1963 census was authorized by the Congress of the United States (13 U.S.C. 131, 191, and 224) as well as by the above-mentioned Act of the Commonwealth Legislature. (See appendix B.) The 1963 Census of Manufactures was conducted concurrently with the Census of Business. It again represented a joint project of the Planning Board and the Bureau of the Census.

**ARRANGEMENT OF 1963 CENSUS DATA**—Results of the 1963 Census of Manufactures are arranged in tabular form, in the chapters indicated below.

Chapter I, General Statistics, shows manufacturing statistics for 1963 and earlier years on a comparative basis. The data are by standard metropolitan statistical area and by region; by employment size; by value-added size; by major industry group classification; and by legal form of organization. One table shows selected general statistics by tax status of the establishment. General statistics are the more important measures of industrial activity: Number of employees and other persons engaged; payrolls; value of shipments; and value added by manufacture.

Chapter II, Industry Statistics, presents selected general statistics for important indus-

manufacturados o servicios manufactureros rendidos a otros establecimientos. Las tablas también muestran el valor de los inventarios y las inversiones en planta y equipo para grupos industriales e industrias seleccionadas; ubicación de los establecimientos manufactureros por municipio según tamaño de empleo.

El Capítulo III, Estadísticas por Areas, contiene datos de 1963 por áreas estadísticas metropolitanas estándares, regiones, subregiones y municipios.

El Capítulo IV, Industrias con Exención Contributiva, muestra estadísticas sobre establecimientos manufactureros en términos de la ayuda o promoción resultado de las actividades de la Administración de Fomento Económico (AFE) en Puerto Rico.

El Capítulo V, Establecimientos Locales y No Locales, presenta estadísticas sobre establecimientos manufactureros, distinguiendo entre aquéllos que pertenecen principalmente a personas residentes de Puerto Rico y los que pertenecen principalmente a personas no residentes.

**DEFINICIÓN DE ESTABLECIMIENTO**—El Censo de Manufacturas se toma usando como base el establecimiento, término que simboliza a la fábrica o molino individual en el cual se llevan a cabo operaciones manufactureras. Es requisito que una compañía que opera establecimientos en más de una ubicación someterá un cuestionario para cada ubicación. En igual forma, una compañía dedicada a líneas de actividad claramente distintas en una misma ubicación tendrá que rendir informes separados si los registros del establecimiento lo permiten y si la actividades son cuantiosas. Por lo tanto, los resultados de tabulaciones censales de informes de establecimientos difieren sustancialmente de los resultados de aquellas tabulaciones en las cuales se usa la compañía como base. Los informes consolidados de las compañías pueden combinar las actividades manufactureras en las diversas ubicaciones (eliminando así las transferencias entre plantas) e incluir las actividades no manufactureras de compañías que se dedican principalmente a la manufactura.

Se estableció un límite mínimo para la inclusión de establecimientos en el Censo de 1963. Se obtuvieron informes de todos aquellos establecimientos manufactureros que emplearon por lo menos una persona en cualquier momento durante el año censal. Esta misma limitación se ha venido aplicando desde el 1949.

Un establecimiento que cambió de dueños durante el 1963 se contó como un solo establecimiento siempre que continuara operando en la misma línea de actividad. Los informes de ambos dueños se combinaron en uno solo de suerte que el informe consolidado reflejase la actividad "anual" del establecimiento.

**CLASIFICACIÓN INDUSTRIAL**—Cada establecimiento incluido en el censo se clasifica en una de aproximadamente 430 industrias manufactureras, de acuerdo con las definiciones contenidas en el Manual de Clasificación Industrial

tries and industry groups, and on products manufactured or manufacturing services performed for other establishments. Tables also show value of inventories and expenditures for plant and equipment for industry groups and selected industries; location of manufacturing plants within municipios by employment size.

Chapter III, Area Statistics, contains 1963 figures for standard metropolitan statistical areas, regions, subregions, and municipios.

Chapter IV, Tax Exempt Industries, shows general and other statistics for manufacturing establishments in terms of assistance or promotion by the Economic Development Administration (EDA) in Puerto Rico.

Chapter V, Locally and Nonlocally Owned Establishments, presents statistics for manufacturing establishments, distinguishing between those primarily owned by residents of Puerto Rico and those primarily owned by nonresidents.

**DEFINITION OF ESTABLISHMENT**—The census of manufactures is conducted on an establishment basis, the term "establishment" denoting a single plant or factory in which manufacturing operations are performed. A company operating establishments at more than one location is required to submit a report for each location. A company engaged in distinctly different lines of activity at one location must submit separate reports if plant records permit and if the activities are substantial. Census tabulations of establishment reports, therefore, differ substantially from those prepared on a company basis. Consolidated company reports may combine activities at different locations (thereby eliminating interplant transfers) and include the nonmanufacturing activities of companies primarily engaged in manufacturing.

A minimum size limit was set for including establishments in the 1963 census. Reports were required from all manufacturing establishments employing at least one person at any time during the census year. The same size limitation has applied since 1949.

An establishment that changed ownership during 1963 was counted as a single establishment, provided that it continued to operate in the same line of activity. The reports received from both owners were consolidated into a single report to reflect total "annual" activity.

**INDUSTRY CLASSIFICATION**—Each establishment covered in the census is classified in one of approximately 430 manufacturing industries, in accordance with the industry definitions in

Uniforme<sup>1</sup> (CIU). Bajo este sistema de clasificación, se define generalmente una industria como un grupo de establecimientos que manufacturan un mismo producto, o un grupo de productos más o menos análogos. Las agrupaciones de productos de las cuales se derivan las clasificaciones industriales tienen como base consideraciones que indican si los productos son típicamente producidos por un mismo establecimiento; similitud de los procesos manufactureros empleados; tipos de materiales usados; tipos de clientes; y otras por el estilo. El grupo de productos que se asigna a una industria se cataloga como el grupo de productos "primarios" de la industria.

Por consiguiente, un establecimiento se clasifica dentro de una industria en particular si el valor de los productos primarios vendidos (expedidos) correspondientes a esa industria exceden en valor los productos primarios vendidos correspondientes a cualquiera otra industria. En algunos casos se determina también la clasificación industrial basándose en el proceso utilizado en la elaboración de tales productos o en los materiales utilizados en su producción.

Aunque algunos establecimientos producen solamente los productos primarios de la industria en la cual están clasificados, es muy raro que todos los establecimientos en una industria estén especializados hasta tal grado. Por lo tanto, las estadísticas generales que se muestran para una industria (empleo, valor agregado por la manufactura, inversiones de capital, etc.), reflejan no solamente las actividades primarias de los establecimientos que componen dicha industria, sino también sus actividades de naturaleza secundaria. Por tal razón se debe ejercer precaución al relacionar las estadísticas generales de una industria y las estadísticas por productos que muestran las ventas realizadas por todas las industrias de los productos primarios de la industria en particular.

Las tablas que muestran el "valor de los productos vendidos (expedidos)" (por ejemplo, el capítulo II, tabla 5) presentan información clasificada sobre las bases de los productos manufacturados y vendidos, sin importar la clasificación industrial del establecimiento que los manufacturó.

La clasificación industrial uniforme utilizada en el censo combina los cientos de industrias individuales para formar un número menor de grupos industriales que, a su vez, se combinan en 20 grupos industriales principales. Cada industria individual está designada por un código numérico de 4 dígitos, cada grupo de industrias por un código de 3 dígitos que son idénticos a los primeros tres dígitos de las industrias individuales que lo componen, y cada grupo industrial principal por un código de 2 dígitos idénticos a los primeros 2 dígitos de los grupos industriales que lo componen.

En las tablas en que aparecen los datos clasificados por industria, se muestran, siempre que ha sido posible, subtotales por grupos industriales y grupos principales,

the Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) Manual.<sup>1</sup> Under this classification system, an industry is generally defined as a group of establishments producing a single product or a more or less closely related group of products. The product groupings from which industry classifications are derived are based on such considerations as whether they are typically produced by the same establishment; similarity of manufacturing processes; types of material used; types of customers; and the like. The group of products assigned to an industry is said to be "primary" to that industry.

Accordingly, an establishment is classified in a particular industry if its shipments of the primary products of that industry exceed in value its shipments of products of any other industry. In some instances, the industry classification is determined also by the processes employed in making those products or on the basis of the materials used in their production.

While some establishments produce only the primary products of the industry in which they are classified, it is rare for all the establishments in an industry to specialize to this extent. The general statistics shown for an industry (employment, value added by manufacture, capital expenditures, etc.), therefore, reflect not only the primary activities of the establishments in that industry but also their activities of a secondary nature. For this reason, care should be exercised in relating the general statistics for an industry to the product statistics showing shipments of its primary products by all industries.

The tables showing "value of products shipped" (for example, chapter II, table 5) present information classified on the basis of the products manufactured and shipped, regardless of the industry classification of the establishment which manufactured them.

The standard industrial classification used in the census combines the hundreds of individual industries into a smaller number of industry groups which are, in turn, combined into 20 major industry groups. Each individual industry is designated by a 4-digit code, each industry group by a 3-digit code identical with the first three digits of its component industries, and each major industry group by a 2-digit code identical with the first two digits of its component industry groups.

In the industry tables, subtotals for industry groups and major groups are shown where possible, and codes for each industry level are

con los códigos para cada nivel industrial impresos a la izquierda del nombre de la industria. En casos en que un grupo industrial a 3 dígitos comprende solo una industria a 4 dígitos, se muestra únicamente el nombre y el código de la industria a 4 dígitos. Para ahorrar espacio en estas tablas, muchos de los títulos que aparecen en el Manual de CIU han sido acortados.

**AREAS GEOGRÁFICAS**—Los datos del Censo de Manufacturas de 1963 han sido tabulados por regiones, subregiones, áreas de planificación, y áreas estadísticas metropolitanas estándares (AEMEs), así como también por las unidades políticas legalmente constituídas (municipios) en que Puerto Rico está dividido.

Las regiones, subregiones, y áreas de planificación, según han sido delineadas por la Junta de Planificación de Puerto Rico, son agrupaciones de municipios contiguos que son relativamente homogéneos con respecto a características tales como distribución poblacional, fuente del abastecimiento de agua, fuente de suministro de electricidad, comercio y comunicaciones con ciudades principales, y disponibilidad de facilidades hospitalarias. (En el apéndice C se muestra una lista de las varias áreas de planificación y sus municipios integrantes.)

En el 1958 la Isla estaba dividida en 12 regiones con límites distintos a los límites de las divisiones regionales actuales. Sin embargo, para propósitos de este informe, las estadísticas generales de 1958 se han retabulado con el fin de presentar totales para las regiones, subregiones, y áreas de planificación.

Un área estadística metropolitana estándar es una entidad social y económicamente integrada, con un gran volumen de tránsito e intercomunicación diaria entre la ciudad central y las zonas o pueblos adyacentes que componen el área. Cada área estadística metropolitana estándar se identifica por el nombre del municipio principal en el área. Las tres áreas estadísticas metropolitanas estándares y sus componentes son:

1. Mayaguez—Municipio de Mayaguez
2. Ponce—Municipio de Ponce
3. San Juan—Municipios de Bayamón, Carolina, Cataño, Guaynabo, San Juan y Trujillo Alto.

Desde 1958 a esta parte, la demarcación del AEME de San Juan ha sufrido un cambio. Se añadieron los municipios de Carolina y Trujillo Alto, haciendo así este AEME coextensivo con la antigua Región Metropolitana de San Juan. Además, el municipio de San Juan se anexó el municipio de Río Piedras en el 1951. Para propósitos de comparabilidad se publicaron cifras separadas para estos dos municipios en los censos del 1954 y el 1958. Siempre que resultó posible, se retabularon los datos de 1958 para reflejar comparabilidad con los datos de 1963.

Ya sea para formar una región, subregión, área de planificación o área estadística metropolitana estándar, siempre se incluye un municipio en su totalidad. No se

shown at the left of the industry name. Where a 3-digit industry group comprises only one 4-digit industry, only the 4-digit industry name and code are shown. To save space in these tables, shorter titles have been substituted for many of the titles shown in the SIC Manual.

**GEOGRAPHIC AREAS**—Data from the 1963 Census of Manufactures have been tabulated for regions, subregions, planning areas, and standard metropolitan statistical areas (SMSA's), as well as for the legally constituted units (municipios) into which Puerto Rico is divided.

The regions, subregions, and planning areas, as developed by the Puerto Rico Planning Board, are groupings of adjoining municipios which are relatively homogeneous with respect to such characteristics as population distribution, source of water, supply of electricity, commerce and communications with major cities, and availability of hospital facilities. (The various planning areas and their component municipios are listed in appendix C.)

In 1958, the Island was divided into 12 regions having different boundaries from the present regional divisions. However, for this report, the 1958 general statistics have been retabulated to provide totals for the present regions, subregions, and planning areas.

A standard metropolitan statistical area is an integrated economic and social entity with a large volume of daily travel and communication between the central city and the outlying parts of the area. Each standard metropolitan statistical area is identified by the name of the principal municipio in the area. The three standard metropolitan statistical areas and their constituent parts are as follows:

1. Mayaguez—Mayaguez Municipio
2. Ponce—Ponce Municipio
3. San Juan—Municipios of Bayamon, Carolina, Catano, Guaynabo, San Juan, and Trujillo Alto.

Since 1958, the delineation of the San Juan SMSA has been changed. The municipios of Carolina and Trujillo Alto have been included, making this SMSA coextensive with the former Metropolitan San Juan Region. In addition, the municipio of San Juan annexed the municipio of Río Piedras in 1951. These were shown as separate municipios in 1954 and 1958 for purposes of comparability. Wherever applicable, the 1958 data have been retabulated to reflect comparability with 1963.

Whether for a region, subregion, planning area, or standard metropolitan statistical area, a municipio is included in entirety. Municipios

**CUESTIONARIOS**—Se utilizaron dos tipos de cuestionarios para establecimientos manufactureros: Forma EC-PR-5 (formulario largo) para establecimientos con 10 o más empleados; Forma EC-PR-6 (formulario corto) para establecimientos con menos de 10 empleados. Ambos cuestionarios fueron impresos, separadamente, en inglés y español. El diligenciamiento de estos cuestionarios era mandatorio, según lo requiere la ley.

En los cuestionarios se solicitó información sobre la ubicación física, organización jurídica y cambio de propietarios del establecimiento. Los entrevistados suministraron datos sobre empleo, remuneraciones, costos de materiales, valor de los inventarios, clase y valor de los productos vendidos (expedidos) y/o trabajo hecho por contrato, y lugar a que fueron hechas las ventas. Además, el formulario largo contenía preguntas sobre el número de trabajadores de producción, remuneraciones a los trabajadores de producción, horas trabajadas por los trabajadores de producción, valor de los inventarios por etapa de elaboración, inversiones de capital y ventas dentro de Puerto Rico por clase de cliente.

En el apéndice D se muestran versiones en inglés y en español de los cuestionarios utilizados e instrucciones suplementarias para su diligenciamiento.

**ENVÍO DE LOS CUESTIONARIOS**—Todos los cuestionarios del Censo de Manufacturas fueron distribuidos y devueltos por correo. La lista de envío postal utilizada en 1963 se basó inicialmente en un tarjetero maestro o directorio de establecimientos manufactureros obtenido del Censo de 1958. Este directorio se actualizó con información del Departamento del Trabajo, de la Administración de Fomento Económico, de la Administración de Seguro Social (Departamento de salud, Instrucción y Bienestar), y otras fuentes. Se eliminaron aquellos establecimientos cuyas actividades no estaban dentro del alcance de la manufactura; así también se excluyeron establecimientos que no tuvieron empleados remunerados durante el año.

La Oficina del Censo de Puerto Rico fué responsable del envío por correo de todos los cuestionarios e instrucciones para su diligenciamiento. También esta Oficina fue responsable de mantenerse en contacto con los establecimientos para obtener cuestionarios retrasados y para resolver dificultades surgidas durante la revisión de los cuestionarios devueltos. La elaboración de los cuestionarios diligenciados, incluyendo la revisión analítica final del cuestionario en su totalidad, revisión final de los productos informados, la preparación de especificaciones y procedimientos para la elaboración mecánica de los datos y la preparación de las tablas finales fué responsabilidad del Negociado del Censo, Washington, D.C.

**COBERTURA**—Toda vez que se consideró completo el directorio de establecimientos, no se realizó un cotejo de la cobertura en el campo. Sin embargo, durante varias etapas en la elaboración de los cuestionarios se realizaron

**REPORT FORMS**—Two types of reporting forms were used for manufacturing establishments: Form EC-PR-5 (long form) for establishments with 10 or more employees; Form EC-PR-6 (short form) for establishments with fewer than 10 employees. Separate printings of both forms were made in Spanish and English. Reporting was mandatory, as required by law.

Information was requested on report forms about physical location, legal form of organization, and changes in ownership. Respondents furnished data on employment, payrolls, materials costs, value of inventories, kind and value of products shipped and/or work done, and destination of shipments. In addition, long forms had inquiries about production workers, production worker wages, man-hours, value of inventories by stage of fabrication, capital expenditures, and shipments within Puerto Rico by class of customer.

Copies of the report forms, English and Spanish versions, are shown in appendix D.

**MAILING OF REPORT FORMS**—All Census of Manufactures report forms were distributed and returned by mail. The 1963 mailing list was initially based on a master file of manufacturing establishments gained from the 1958 census. This file was updated with information from the Commonwealth Department of Labor, the Economic Development Administration, the Social Security Administration (U.S. Department of Health, Education, and Welfare), and other sources. Establishments with activities not within the scope of manufacturing were deleted; establishments with no paid employees were also excluded from the census.

Forms for reporting in this census, and reporting instructions, were mailed to respondents from the Office of the Census in Puerto Rico. Further contact with respondents about overdue report forms and for resolving difficulties encountered in review of the returned forms was likewise initiated by the Puerto Rico Office. Processing of the report forms, including further analytical review of the report as a whole, final product review, preparation of specifications and procedures for mechanical data processing, and preparation of final tables were undertaken at the Bureau of the Census, Washington, D.C.

**COVERAGE**—Since the mailing list was considered complete, no field coverage check was conducted. However, at various stages of processing the reports, coverage checks were con-

**AREA Y PERÍODO CUBIERTO**—El censo de 1963 cubre actividades durante el año 1963 en los 76 municipios de Puerto Rico. Se solicitó de los establecimientos que informaran sus actividades a base del año calendario. No obstante, si la obtención de los datos a base de año calendario significaba gran dificultad, se aceptaban cifras para el año económico del establecimiento siempre que estas incluyeran por lo menos 9 meses correspondientes al año calendario de 1963. Sin embargo, todas las cifras de empleo, horas trabajadas por trabajadores de producción y remuneraciones tenían que suministrarse a base de año calendario. Este procedimiento de informar no debe afectar significativamente la comparabilidad entre los datos que se refieren al empleo y los que se refieren al valor de los productos vendidos (expedidos) y costos de materiales.

**COMPARABILIDAD CON CENSOS ANTERIORES**—Siempre que ha resultado posible, se presentan en este informe estadísticas generales para ambos años 1963 y 1958. Los datos de 1958 han sido retabulados basándose en la última revisión de la CIU para hacerlos directamente comparables.

Las estadísticas censales de 1958 y 1963 incluyen datos para establecimientos clasificados en la Industria 3273, Concreto Mixto, y establecimientos clasificados en la Industria 3599, Maquinarias Misceláneas, los cuales están casi exclusivamente dedicados a la reparación de maquinaria. Tales establecimientos fueron excluidos de las estadísticas de manufactura durante el período comprendido entre 1939 y 1956, aunque estuvieron incluidos en el período comprendido entre 1909 y 1919. Comenzando con el año 1954, se incluyen los establecimientos dedicados principalmente a pasteurizar y embotellar leche (Industria 2026, Leche Líquida). Estos establecimientos no están incluidos en las estadísticas para año censales anteriores.

En los censos de 1939 y años anteriores, se clasificaron como no manufactura la Industria 2095, Café Tostado, y la Industria 2141, Despalillado y Secado de Tabaco. Sin embargo, debido a la importancia de estas industrias en la economía de la isla, principalmente en años anteriores, se presentan también estadísticas históricas para los años 1949 a 1963 (capítulo I, tabla 1) de las cuales se excluyen estas industrias.

ducted for determining whether establishments on the original mailing list were represented in the processing stage under review. Estimates are included in the tables for a few establishments (usually of small size) whose reports were not received by the time of the tabulation. These estimates were based on current employment data from other sources with other items estimated on the basis of the establishment's 1958 report, or on typical industry ratios.

**AREA AND PERIOD COVERED**—The 1963 census covers activities during calendar year 1963 in the 76 municipios of Puerto Rico. Establishments were asked to report on a calendar year basis. However, if reporting on a calendar year basis involved significant difficulty for the respondent, reports for a fiscal year were accepted if the fiscal year included at least 9 months of calendar year 1963. However, employment, man-hours, and payroll data were in all cases to be reported on a calendar year basis. This reporting procedure should not significantly affect the comparability between data relating to employment and data relating to value of shipments and cost of materials.

**COMPARABILITY WITH EARLIER CENSUSES**—Wherever possible, general statistics are shown in this report for both 1963 and 1958. Statistics for 1958 have been retabulated on the basis of the latest revision to the SIC to gain direct comparability.

The 1958 and 1963 census statistics include data for establishments classified in Industry 3273, Ready-Mixed Concrete, and establishments classified in Industry 3599, Miscellaneous Machinery, that are engaged almost exclusively in machine shop repair work. Such establishments were excluded from manufacturing statistics for the period 1939 through 1956, although included for 1909 and 1919. Beginning with 1954, establishments engaged in milk processing and distribution (present Industry 2026, Fluid Milk) are included. These establishments are not included in the statistics for earlier census years.

In the 1939 and earlier censuses, Industry 2095, Roasted Coffee, and Industry 2141, Tobacco Stemming and Redrying, were classified as nonmanufacturing. However, because of the importance of these industries to the Island's economy, particularly in earlier years, the historical statistics for the years 1949 through 1963 are also shown (chapter I, table 1) with these industries excluded.

Beginning with the 1954 census, home-worker wages were considered a payroll item

**CONFIDENCIALIDAD DE LOS DATOS**—Les está prohibido por ley al Gobierno de Puerto Rico y al Negociado del Censo de los Estados Unidos publicar datos que revelen información referente a firmas individuales. Se considera que las situaciones a continuación no constituyen una violación a las “reglas de divulgación”:

1. Se puede mostrar el número de establecimientos en términos de ubicación, clasificación industrial, y tamaño aproximado.
2. Se pueden mostrar cifras de empleo para una industria o lugar si en tales cifras están representadas tres o más compañías.
3. Se pueden mostrar valores para una industria, lugar, o producto si en tales cifras están representadas tres o más compañías, siempre y cuando una o dos compañías no sean responsables de una gran proporción de la producción combinada.

Se toman precauciones para evitar la divulgación de datos por resta. Si por ejemplo, los datos para un municipio se restasen de los datos correspondientes a la subregión en que está ubicado y como resultado de tal resta se aislara un grupo de establecimientos que no satisface las reglas indicadas en los numerales 1 y 2 arriba, se omiten los datos para el municipio en cuestión.

En el censo de 1963, igual que en censos anteriores, se emplea un sistema de preferencias al aplicar las reglas de divulgación. Se le da preferencia a las regiones sobre las subregiones que la componen, a las subregiones sobre las áreas individuales de planificación, y a estas últimas sobre los municipios. Se le da preferencia a las áreas estadísticas metropolitanas estándares sobre los municipios individuales. En el caso de datos clasificados por industria se le da preferencia a las categorías más amplias, esto es, los grupos principales a 2 dígitos tienen preferencia sobre grupos a 3 dígitos, y grupos a 3 dígitos sobre industrias a 4 dígitos.

and not a contract cost as in previous censuses, and thus were reflected in value added by manufacture.

**CONFIDENTIALITY OF DATA**—The Government of Puerto Rico and the U.S. Bureau of the Census are prohibited by law from publishing statistics disclosing information for individual companies. The following situations are not considered to be violations of the “disclosure rule”:

1. The number of establishments may be presented in terms of locality, industry classification, and approximate size.
2. Employment figures may be shown for any industry or locality represented by three or more companies.
3. Value figures may be shown for any industry, locality, or product represented by three or more companies, provided that one or two companies do not produce a very large proportion of the combined output.

Care is taken to prevent disclosure by subtraction. If, for example, the statistics for a municipio were subtracted from those for the subregion in which it is located, and this subtraction would isolate a group of establishments not meeting the rules indicated in 2 and 3 above, data for the municipio would be withheld.

In the 1963 census, as in earlier ones, a system of preferences is used in applying disclosure rules. Regions are given preference over the subregions of which they are composed, subregions over individual planning areas, and planning areas over municipios. Standard metropolitan statistical areas are given preference over the individual municipios. For industry statistics, the broader categories are given preference, that is, 2-digit major groups over 3-digit groups, and 3-digit groups over 4-digit industries.

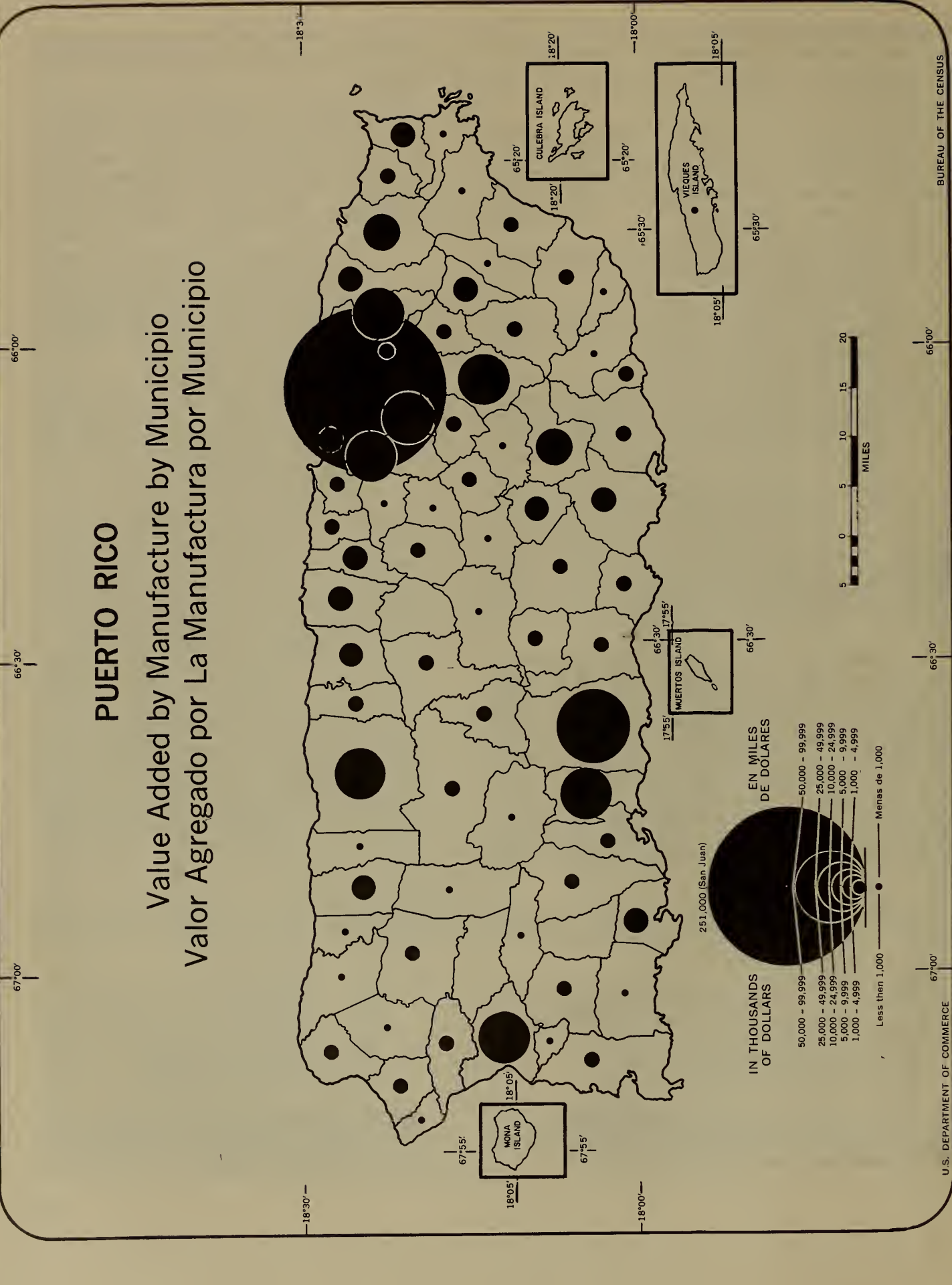
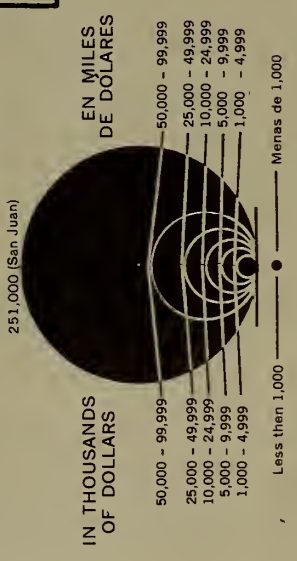

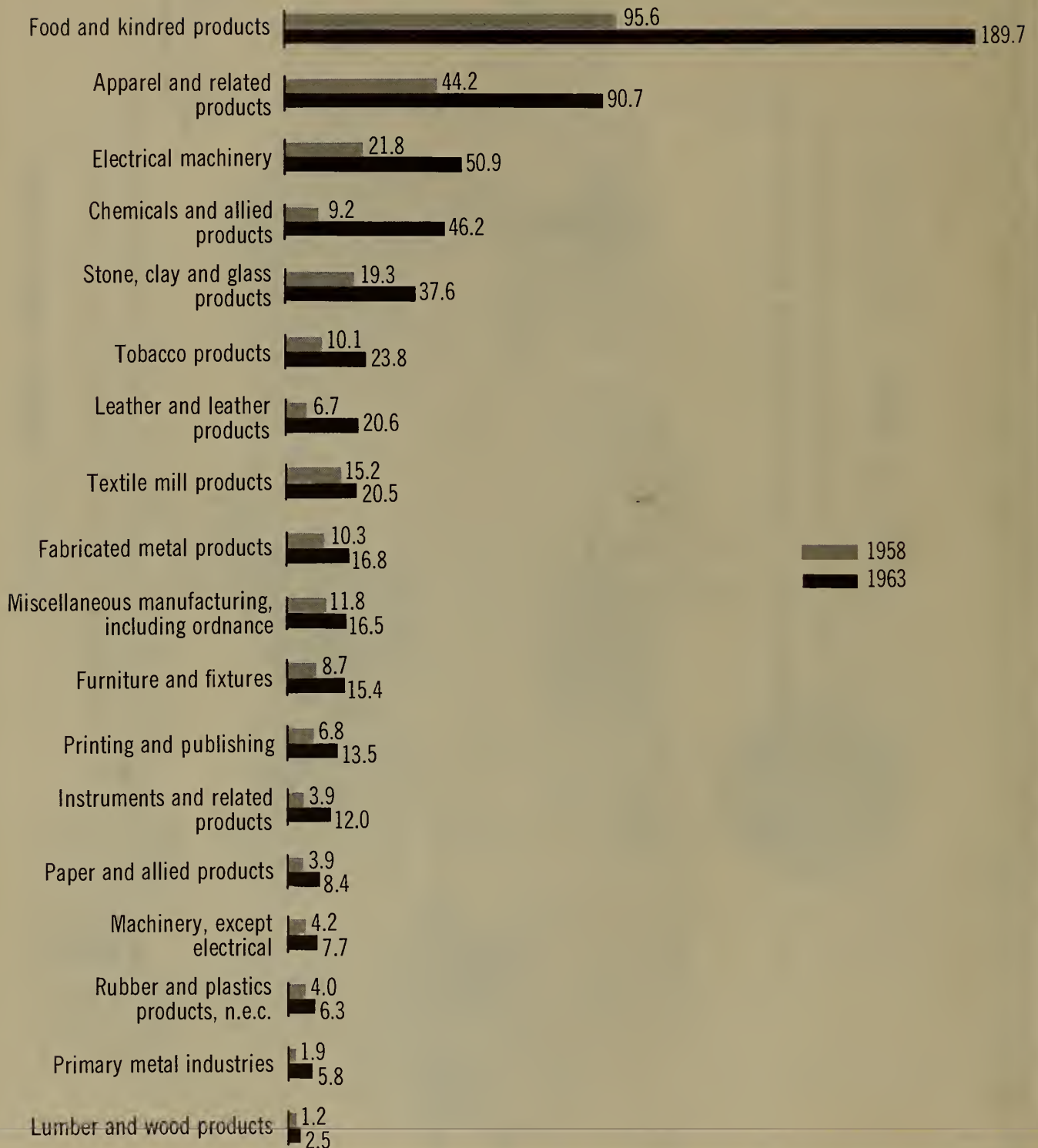

## Apéndice A

### EXPLICACION DE TERMINOS

**Definición de industrias manufactureras**—El Censo de Manufacturas de 1963 cubre todos aquellos establecimientos dedicados principalmente a la manufactura, tal y como se describe en la revisión de 1957 del Manual de Clasificación Industrial Uniforme (CIU), y sus enmiendas hasta el 31 de diciembre de 1963. Este manual representa, en gran parte, una codificación y actualización de los sistemas de clasificación utilizados en censos anteriores al 1939. Durante la década del 40, se adoptaron revisiones sustanciales en la clasificación tanto de industrias manufactureras como de industrias no manufactureras. Durante el Censo de Manufacturas de 1954 se adoptaron revisiones adicionales a la CIU pero no se emitió una edición nueva del manual en esa fecha. La mayoría de las revisiones que se adoptaron en el censo de 1954 se incorporaron posteriormente en una edición revisada que se publicó en el 1957.

La Clasificación Industrial Uniforme se aplica a la economía en su totalidad. Esta divide las actividades en divisiones industriales amplias tales como agricultura, manufactura, minería, comercio por mayor, y comercio por menor. Cada división está subdividida en grupos principales de industria (2 dígitos), luego en grupos industriales (3 dígitos), y finalmente en industrias (4 dígitos). (Vea el apéndice E para una lista de las industrias manufactureras incluidas en este censo, acompañadas de sus respectivos códigos de 4 dígitos.) El sistema de numeración o codificación provee flexibilidad, permitiendo el uso de clasificaciones a varios niveles de detalle, de acuerdo con las necesidades específicas y los usos que se deseen.

El Manual de CIU define la manufactura como la transformación mecánica o química de materias inorgánicas u orgánicas en productos nuevos. El montaje de partes o productos componentes también se considera manufactura si el producto resultante no es una estructura ni otra mejora permanente. Estas actividades por lo general se efectúan en plantas, fábricas, o molinos que utilizan maquinarias propulsadas por energía, y equipo para manipular los materiales.

La producción manufacturera generalmente se destina al comercio mayorista, a otras plantas de la misma compañía, o para llenar pedidos de otras industrias o instituciones y no para la venta directa al consumidor doméstico. Algunos fabricantes venden principalmente al por menor, a consumidores domésticos, utilizando el correo, rutas de casa en casa, or por medio de vendedores.

## Appendix A

### EXPLANATION OF TERMS

**Definition of manufacturing industries**—The 1963 Census of Manufactures covers all establishments primarily engaged in manufacturing, as defined in the 1957 revision of the Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) Manual, as amended through December 31, 1963. This manual represents in large part a codification and updating of the classification systems used in censuses before 1939. During the 1940's substantial revisions in the classification of both manufacturing and nonmanufacturing industries were issued. Further SIC revisions were adopted in the 1954 Census of Manufactures but the SIC Manual was not reissued at that time. Most of the SIC revisions used in the 1954 census were subsequently incorporated into a revised edition issued for 1957.

The Standard Industrial Classification applies to the total economy. It divides activities into broad industrial divisions such as agriculture, manufacturing, mining, wholesale trade, and retail trade. Each division is subdivided into major industry groups (2 digits), then into industry groups (3 digits), and finally into industries (4 digits). (Appendix E shows the Spanish listing of the manufacturing industries covered in this census together with their 4-digit codes.) The numbering or coding system provides flexibility, permitting use of classification at various levels of detail according to the specific needs and uses desired.

The SIC Manual defines manufacturing as the mechanical or chemical transformation of inorganic or organic substances into new products. Assembly of component parts or products is also considered to be manufacturing if the resulting product is neither a structure nor other fixed improvement. These activities are usually carried on in plants, factories, or mills which use power-driven machines and materials-handling equipment.

Manufacturing typically is carried on for the wholesale market, for other plants of the same company, or to the order of industrial or institutional users rather than for direct sale to the household consumer. Some manufacturers sell chiefly at retail to household consumers by mail, through house-to-house routes, or through salesmen.

Services or contract activities performed for others on their materials (enameling, engraving,



grabado, costura de prendas de vestir por contrato, etc.) se incluyen en manufactura cuando las mismas se llevan a cabo para el negocio. Tales actividades se consideran no manufactura cuando se llevan a cabo principalmente para llenar pedidos de consumidores domésticos.

Los siguientes tipos de actividad, a pesar de que poseen muchas de las características asociadas con la manufactura, se definen como no manufactura en la CIU y son, por lo tanto, excluidas del censo de manufacturas.

1. Elaboración de productos en la finca, si la materia prima es producida en la misma finca y las actividades manufactureras son en pequeña escala y sin hacer uso extenso de mano de obra remunerada. En la industria de despalillado y secado de tabaco en Puerto Rico, se sigue la práctica de permitir a los productores individuales elaborar su propio tabaco en los almacenes de las grandes compañías tabacaleras. Durante la elaboración del producto de un agricultor en particular, los jornales de los trabajadores ocupados en la operación son pagados por el propio agricultor, y mientras tanto el producto sigue siendo de su propiedad. El valor de dichos productos y el empleo se excluyen del Censo de Manufacturas.
2. La molienda de granos a la orden y otras actividades similares.
3. Actividades manufactureras de ciertos establecimientos que venden la mayoría de sus productos a consumidores finales en el mismo local; por ejemplo, panaderías o reposterías que consisten de una sola unidad.
4. Actividades manufactureras efectuadas por contratistas en el mismo lugar de las obras.
5. Producción por las compañías de servicio público.
6. Trabajos hechos para llenar pedidos de consumidores domésticos, tales como labores de sastrería, costura, o trabajos de ebanistería.
7. Reparaciones y otros servicios (excepto servicios efectuados "para el negocio").
8. Actividades manufactureras de organizaciones de enseñanza y de caridad, si los productos no son para la venta.

Las siguientes actividades, aunque no se consideran universalmente como manufactura, se clasifican como tal en la Clasificación Industrial Uniforme y, por consiguiente, se incluyen en el censo de manufacturas en Puerto Rico.

1. Fabricación de pan y bizcochos (excepto en aquellos establecimientos que son más bien tiendas al detal).
2. Producción de impresos y publicaciones (artes gráficas y relacionadas).
3. Elaboración por contrato de prendas de vestir.
4. Galvanizado, enchape y pulido de metales.
5. Estampado, fundición y corte de metales.
6. Trabajo lapidario.
7. Construcción y reparación de barcos.

contract apparel sewing, etc.) are included in manufacturing when they are performed primarily for the trade. Such activities are considered nonmanufacturing when performed primarily to the order of the household consumer.

The following types of activity, while having many of the characteristics associated with manufacturing, are defined as nonmanufacturing by the SIC and are, therefore, excluded from the census of manufactures.

1. Processing on farms if the raw materials are grown on the farms and if the manufacturing activities are on a small scale without extensive use of paid labor. In the tobacco stemming and redrying industry in Puerto Rico, each individual grower processes his own tobacco in the warehouses of the larger tobacco companies. During the processing of a particular grower's crop, the wages of the warehouse laborers involved are paid by the grower and the product remains the property of the grower. Such value of products and employment are excluded from the census.
2. Custom milling and similar activities.
3. Manufacturing activities of certain establishments which sell most of their products at retail on the premises; for example, single-shop retail bakeries.
4. Fabricating operations performed at the site of construction by contractors.
5. Production by public utilities.
6. Custom work to the individual order of domestic consumers, such as custom tailoring or woodworking.
7. Repair and other service activities (except services performed "for the trade").
8. Manufacturing activities of educational and charitable organizations if products are not sold.

The following activities, although not universally considered to be manufacturing, are so classified in the Standard Industrial Classification and are, therefore, included in the census of manufactures for Puerto Rico.

1. Bakeries (except single-shop retail bakeries).
2. Printing and publishing.
3. Apparel jobbing.
4. Electroplating, plating, and metal polishing.
5. Job stamping, casting, and machine shops.
6. Lapidary work.
7. Boat building and repairing.

Frecuentemente se encuentran establecimientos manufactureros que se dedican a actividades no manufactureras tales como trabajo de reparación o reventa de mercaderías no manufacturadas en el establecimiento. Tales establecimientos se catalogan como manufactura o como negocio dependiendo de cuál actividad se estima sea responsable de la mayor proporción del "valor agregado." Un volumen dado de ingresos por concepto de servicios de reparación refleja un insumo mayor de mano de obra y capital que el mismo volumen de ingresos obtenido de la venta de productos manufacturados. En forma similar, cierto volumen de ingresos por concepto de la venta de productos manufacturados requiere mayor insumo de mano de obra y capital que un volumen igual de ingresos obtenido de la compra y reventa de artículos no manufacturados en el establecimiento. Por consiguiente, los ingresos de cada establecimiento con actividades múltiples se ajustaron aplicando un factor de ponderación de "4" por ingresos obtenidos de reparaciones, de "3" por ingresos obtenidos de la manufactura, y de "1" por ingresos obtenidos de reventas. El valor "ajustado" más alto determina la clasificación. Para todos aquellos establecimientos que resulten clasificados como principalmente dedicados a actividades manufactureras, se incluye, como parte del valor total de sus ventas e ingresos las cantidades recibidas por concepto de operaciones no manufactureras (reparaciones, ventas de desperdicios y rezagos, reventas).

**Propietarios y socios activos**—Propietarios o condueños (al 15 de marzo de 1963) de establecimientos manufactureros no incorporados que estaban efectivamente ocupados en las operaciones de la empresa, fuesen o no trabajadores de producción. Propietarios individuales y socios activos no son considerados empleados del establecimiento, pero sí se pueden añadir a las cifras de empleo para derivar datos que indiquen el total de personas ocupadas en actividades manufactureras.

**Salarios y jornales**—Volumen bruto de las remuneraciones pagadas durante el año calendario 1963 a todos los empleados en la nómina de establecimientos manufactureros que operaron en el año. Esta cifra incluye salarios, jornales, comisiones, pagos por destitución, bonos, pagos por vacaciones y licencia por enfermedad, y compensaciones en especie, antes de deducciones tales como las contribuciones del empleado al Seguro Social, contribución sobre ingresos, seguro colectivo, cuotas a sindicatos, etc. Se incluyen los pagos a oficiales de corporaciones, pero no se incluyen los pagos a propietarios o socios de establecimientos manufactureros no incorporados. Se excluyen también los pagos a los miembros de las fuerzas armadas y a personas pensionadas que se mantienen como activas en la nómina del establecimiento. Los pagos hechos a trabajadores a domicilio se excluyen de los salarios y jornales, pero se tabulan separadamente como "pagos a trabajadores a domicilio."

Además de informar el total de salarios y jornales, se solicitó de los establecimiento con 10 empleados o más que informaran aquellas cantidades pagadas a los trabajadores de producción separadamente de las remune-

Manufacturing establishments frequently engage in nonmanufacturing activities such as repair work or merchandising of products without further processing. Such establishments are assigned either to the manufacturing or trade industries, depending on which activity is estimated to account for the larger share of "value added." A given amount of receipts from repair services reflects a greater labor and capital input than an equal value of shipments of manufactured products. Similarly, a certain value of shipments of manufactured products requires more labor and capital input than equal receipts obtained from purchasing and reselling goods without further manufacture. Consequently, weighting factors of "4" for repair receipts, "3" for manufacturing receipts, and "1" for resales were applied to the various types of receipts earned by a multiactivity establishment. The largest "adjusted" value determined its classification. For establishments classified as primarily engaged in manufacturing activity, receipts for nonmanufacturing operations (repair, sales of scrap, resales) are included in the totals for value of shipments and receipts.

**Proprietors and working partners**—Owners or part-owners (on March 15, 1963) of unincorporated manufacturing establishments who were actually engaged in plant operations as production or nonproduction personnel. Individual proprietors and working partners are not considered employees of the establishment, but they may be added to the figures for employment to derive a figure for total persons engaged in manufacturing.

**Salaries and wages**—Gross earnings paid in calendar year 1963 to all employees on the payroll of operating manufacturing establishments. This figure includes salaries, wages, commissions, dismissal pay, bonuses, vacation and sick leave pay, and compensation in kind, prior to such deductions as employee's Social Security contributions, income tax, group insurance, union dues, etc. Payments to officers of corporations are included, but payments to the proprietors or partners of unincorporated manufacturing establishments are excluded. Payments to members of the armed forces and pensioners carried on the active payroll are also excluded. Payments to homeworkers are excluded from salaries and wages, but are tabulated separately as "homeworker wages."

Establishments with 10 employees or more, in addition to reporting total salaries and wages, were requested to report separately, payments to production workers and payments to all other

raciones correspondientes a todos los otros empleados. Los pagos a los trabajadores de producción se tabulan como jornales. Los establecimientos con menos de 10 empleados tenían la obligación de informar solamente el total de salarios y jornales. En estos últimos casos los datos totales sobre remuneraciones se tabulan como jornales.

**Total de empleados [en la Manufactura]**—Todos los empleados de jornada completa o parcial incluidos en la nómina y que trabajaron o recibieron remuneraciones por cualquier parte de los períodos de pago especificados en el cuestionario. Incluidas están todas las personas que recibieron remuneraciones durante estos períodos de pago aunque efectivamente se encontraban en licencia por enfermedad o disfrutando de días feriados y vacaciones remuneradas. Se excluyen los miembros de las fuerzas armadas y personas pensionadas que se mantienen como activas en la nómina pero que no trabajaron durante el período, y también los trabajadores a domicilio. Se incluyen como empleados los oficiales de las corporaciones; se excluyen los propietarios y socios activos de firmas no incorporadas.

**Trabajadores de producción**—Empleados (incluyendo hasta el nivel de capataz) dedicados a la fabricación, elaboración, montaje, inspección, recibo, almacenaje, manipulación, empaque, embarque (pero no entrega), mantenimiento, reparación, servicios de celadores y conserjes, desarrollo de productos, operación de unidades accesorias para uso de la fábricas (por ejemplo, planta de energía), contabilidad y otros servicios estrechamente asociados con las operaciones de producción del establecimiento. Quedan excluidos los empleados sobre el nivel de capataz. Para aquellos establecimientos con menos de 10 empleados se solicitaron cifras del empleo total solamente, sin hacer diferenciación entre trabajadores de producción y todos los otros empleados. Los datos sobre empleo en establecimientos con menos de 10 empleados están incluidos en los totales de trabajadores de producción. En tales establecimientos el número de empleados que normalmente no pertenece a la categoría de empleados de producción es relativamente insignificante.

**Otros empleados**—Personal empleado en operaciones que no son de producción en establecimientos con 10 empleados o más, incluyendo personas dedicadas a las siguientes actividades: Supervisión en la fábrica sobre el nivel de capataz, ventas (incluyendo el chófer-vendedor), entrega (chóferes de camión y sus ayudantes), publicidad, crédito, cobros, instalación y reparación de productos manufacturados por el establecimiento, funciones rutinarias de oficina, funciones ejecutivas, de ventas, financieras y legales, funciones del personal de servicio (tales como actividades en la cafetería, actividades médicas, etc.), funciones profesionales y técnicas. También se incluyen aquellos empleados en la nómina de un establecimiento manufacturero que se ocupan en la construcción de mejoras o alteraciones a la planta física y que se emplean como un grupo separado de mano de obra.

employees. Payments to production workers are tabulated as wages. Establishments with fewer than 10 employees were required to report only total salaries and wages. In the latter cases, payroll data are tabulated entirely as wages.

**All manufacturing employees**—All full-time and part-time employees on the payrolls who worked or received pay for any part of the pay periods specified on the report form. Included are all persons on paid sick leave, paid holidays, and paid vacations during these pay periods. Members of the armed forces, pensioners carried on the active rolls but not working during the period, and homeworkers are excluded. Officers of corporations are included as employees; proprietors and partners of unincorporated firms are excluded.

**Production workers**—Employees (up through the working foreman level) engaged in fabricating, processing, assembling, inspecting, receiving, storing, handling, packing, warehousing, shipping (but not delivering), maintenance, repair, janitorial and watchman services, product development, auxiliary production for plant's own use (for example, power plant), record keeping, and other services closely associated with production operations at the establishment.

Supervisory employees above the working foreman level are excluded. For establishments with fewer than 10 employees, figures were requested for total employment only, without differentiation between production workers and all other employees. Employment data for the establishments with fewer than 10 employees are included in the tabulated totals for production workers. For these establishments, the number of employees not actually in the production worker category is relatively insignificant.

**All other employees**—Nonproduction personnel of establishments with 10 or more employees, including those engaged in the following activities: Factory supervision above the working foreman level, sales (including driver salesmen), sales delivery (highway truck drivers and their helpers), advertising, credit, collection, installation and servicing of own products, clerical and routine office functions, executive, purchasing, financing, legal, service personnel (such as cafeteria, medical, etc.), professional, and technical. Also included are employees on the payroll of the manufacturing establishment engaged in construction of major additions or alterations to the plant and who are used as a separate work force.

**Empleo promedio**—Empleo promedio anual de todos los empleados en establecimientos con menos de 10 empleados, más el número promedio de trabajadores de producción durante el año y el número de todos los otros empleados al 15 de marzo en establecimientos con 10 empleados o más. En el caso de las fábricas con menos de 10 empleados se solicitaron cifras de empleo total durante los períodos de pago que terminaron más cerca del 15 de marzo, mayo, agosto y noviembre. Las cifras suministradas fueron sumadas y divididas por 4 para obtener un promedio. De los establecimientos con 10 empleados o más se solicitaron cifras del número de trabajadores de producción empleados durante los períodos de pago mencionados anteriormente. Las cifras suministradas se promediaron según se describe arriba y el promedio se sumó a la cifra correspondiente a “otros empleados” al 15 de marzo.

**Pagos a trabajadores a domicilio**—Pagos hechos directamente a trabajadores a domicilio quienes trabajan fuera de la fábrica utilizando materiales proporcionados por el fabricante. Estos pagos están excluidos de la nómina de la planta. Los manufactureros no informaron dichos pagos cuando se hicieron a través de contratistas o subcontratistas; éstos últimos, sin embargo, fueron los que informaron tales pagos a los trabajadores a domicilio.

**Horas trabajadas por trabajadores de producción**—Total de horas trabajadas por los trabajadores de producción en establecimientos con 10 empleados o más. (A los establecimientos con menos de 10 empleados no se les pidió informaran horas trabajadas.) Se solicitó de los informantes que incluyesen el número real de horas extra trabajadas y no su equivalente en horas regulares. En el caso de empleados pagados a base de trabajo realizado (por tarea) se pidió al establecimiento que preparara una estimación de las horas representadas por tal trabajo. Se excluyen de las cifras de horas trabajadas horas pagadas por concepto de vacaciones, días feriados (a menos que realmente se trabajaran), o licencia por enfermedad y las horas trabajadas en la casa por los trabajadores a domicilio.

**Costo de materiales y labor por contrato**—Costo de materias primas, efectos, partes componentes, productos semi-elaborados, combustibles, y energía eléctrica efectivamente consumidos o incorporados a la producción durante el año; el costo de artículos comprados y vendidos sin elaboración adicional, manufactura o montaje; y el costo de labor por contrato realizada por otros establecimientos. Costo se refiere a los cargos directos realmente pagados o por pagarse por concepto de materiales y efectos consumidos, incorporados a la producción, o revendidos durante el año, después de deducir los descuentos, e incluyendo fletes y otros gastos directos incurridos en la adquisición de dichos materiales. Se incluyen en este renglón productos adquiridos por compra, por retiros de los inventarios o por transferencias de otros estableci-

**Average employment**—Annual average of all employees in establishments with fewer than 10 employees, plus the average number of production workers for the year and the number of all other employees on March 15 in establishments with 10 employees or more. For plants with fewer than 10 employees, figures were requested for total employment during the pay periods ended nearest the 15th of March, May, August, and November. Reported figures were added and divided by 4 to get an average. For establishments with 10 employees or more, figures were requested for production workers employed during the four previously mentioned pay periods. Reported figures were averaged as described above and added to the figure for “all other employees” on March 15.

**Homeworker wages**—Payments made directly to homeworkers working outside the factory on materials supplied by the manufacturer. These payments are excluded from plant payrolls. Manufacturers did not report payments to homeworkers if made through contractors or subcontractors; the latter, however, were requested to report such payments.

**Production worker man-hours**—Total hours worked by production workers in establishments with 10 employees or more. (Establishments with fewer than 10 employees were not required to report man-hours information.) Respondents were requested to include actual hours worked on overtime, not straight time equivalent hours. Where employees were paid by the piece, the establishment was asked to estimate the hours represented by such piece work. Hours paid for vacations, holidays (unless actually worked), or sick leave and hours worked at home by homeworkers were excluded from man-hour figures.

**Cost of materials and contract work**—Cost of raw materials, supplies, components, semi-finished goods, fuels, and electric energy actually consumed or put into production during the year; the cost of goods sold without further manufacture, processing, or assembly; and the cost of contract work performed by other establishments. Cost refers to direct charges actually paid or payable for materials and supplies consumed, put into production, or resold during the year, after discounts, and includes freight and other direct charges incurred in acquiring these materials. Purchases, withdrawals from inventory, and transfers from other establishments of the same company are included in this item. The

mientos de la misma compañía. Los siguientes costos quedan excluidos: (1) Costo de servicios, tales como publicidad, seguros, teléfono, consultas, investigaciones y fomento de productos; (2) costos generales, tales como depreciación, renta, derechos o participaciones, intereses, etc.; y (3) materiales, maquinaria, y equipo usado en la expansión de la planta física o mejoras capitalizadas que se cargan a cuentas de activos fijos.

El costo de labor por contrato es el costo del trabajo hecho por otros establecimientos manufactureros con materiales y partes suministradas por el establecimiento informante. No incluye los pagos hechos directamente a los trabajadores a domicilio, los cuales se tabularon separadamente bajo "pagos a trabajadores a domicilio."

Cuando los datos sobre costo de materiales de industrias individuales se engloban para obtener totales por grupos industriales, se incurre en una duplicación significativa debido a la suma de costos informados por industrias relacionadas que se dedican a etapas sucesivas en la fabricación de un producto final. Por tal razón, las cifras de costo de materiales por grupos industriales (4 dígitos) y grupos principales (2 dígitos) deben interpretarse con precaución. Con algunas excepciones, esta clase de duplicación no es significativa dentro de industrias individuales.

**Valor de las ventas**—Valor neto de los productos vendidos (expedidos) de las plantas manufactureras durante el 1963, f. o. b. en la planta, después de deducir los descuentos o concesiones, y de excluir cargos por flete y arbitrios. Cuando la distribución de los productos de una industria se realiza utilizando empleados del establecimiento manufacturero (productos de panadería, leche líquida, bebidas gaseosas), en muchos casos el valor de las ventas probablemente esté basado en el precio de entrega y no en el valor f. o. b. en la planta. El valor de las ventas de establecimientos clasificados en determinada industria incluye no solo el valor de los productos primarios de esa industria sino también el valor de los productos secundarios de esa industria, es decir, que son primarios a otras industrias manufactureras.

Para obtener las ventas se solicitó de los manufactureros que incluyeran todos los productos físicamente expedidos de la planta, ya fuesen estos vendidos, transferidos a otras plantas de la misma compañía, o enviados a consignación. También se incluyeron en el valor de las ventas los ingresos por concepto de servicios prestados durante el año en virtud de contratos con terceros utilizando materiales suministrados por ellos. También se incluyeron los ingresos producto de actividades no manufactureras tales como la venta de desperdicios y rezagos, trabajo de instalación de productos manufacturados por la planta utilizando empleados del establecimiento, trabajo de reparación y reventa de productos comprados y vendidos sin elaboración adicional (compraventa). Los ingresos de actividades no manufactureras se informaron separadamente de los productos individuales manufacturados o de los servicios manufactureros prestados a otros establecimientos.

following costs are excluded: (1) Cost of services, such as advertising, insurance, telephone, consulting, and research and development; (2) overhead costs, such as depreciation, rent, royalties, interest, etc; and (3) materials, machinery, and equipment used in plant expansion or capitalized repairs which are chargeable to fixed asset accounts.

Cost of contract work is cost of work done by other manufacturing plants on materials and parts furnished by the reporting establishment. It does not include direct payments to homeworkers, which are tabulated separately under "homeworker wages."

Summation of cost of materials data for individual industries to industry group totals often results in significant duplication because of the addition of costs reported by related industries engaged in successive fabrication stages of the final product. For this reason, cost of materials figures for industry (3-digit) and major industry (2-digit) groups should be interpreted with care. With some exceptions, this kind of duplication is not significant within individual industries.

**Value of shipments**—Net value of products shipped from manufacturing plants in 1963, f.o.b. plant, after discounts and allowances, but excluding freight charges and excise taxes. Where the products of an industry are customarily delivered by employees of the manufacturing establishment (bakery products, fluid milk, soft drinks), the value of shipments is probably based in many instances on the delivered price rather than the f.o.b. plant value. For establishments classified in a given industry, the value of shipments includes not only the value of products primary to the industry but also the value of those secondary to that industry, that is, primary to other manufacturing industries.

For shipments, manufacturers were asked to include all items physically shipped from the plant, whether sold, transferred to other plants of the same company, or shipped on consignment. Also included in the value of shipments were receipts for contract services performed during the year for others on materials supplied by them. Receipts for nonmanufacturing activities such as sale of scrap and refuse, installation work by plant employees on products manufactured by the plant, and repair work, were likewise included as was the value of products bought and resold without further processing (merchandising). These receipts for nonmanufacturing activities were reported separately from individual products manufactured or manufacturing services performed for other establishments.

Se solicitó de aquellos establecimientos manufactureros que producen artículos para transferirlos a otras plantas de la misma compañía que informaran el valor comercial más cercano, f. o. b. en la planta y no el costo de producción.

Igual que sucede con el costo de materiales, cuando los datos sobre valor de las ventas de industrias individuales se engloban para obtener totales por grupos industriales se incurre, en algunos casos, en una gran cantidad de duplicación porque los productos de algunas industrias constituyen la materia prima de otras. Por tal razón, se deben interpretar con precaución las cifras de valor de las ventas por grupos industriales y por grupos principales. Con algunas excepciones tal duplicación no es significativa al nivel de la industrial individual.

El valor de productos vendidos e ingresos por trabajo contratado (que se presenta en la tabla 4, capítulo II) es el valor de las ventas (según se define arriba) de productos fabricados utilizando materiales, piezas, etc. propiedad del establecimiento informante más el valor de los servicios manufactureros prestados a otros establecimientos. No se incluye el valor de las reventas, que representa el valor de los productos simplemente vendidos en la misma forma en que se compraron, sin elaboración alguna por parte del establecimiento informante, ni el valor de los ingresos producto de otras actividades no manufactureras.

**Productos**—En el ramo de la manufactura, alrededor de 1,100 clases de productos representan familias básicas de artículos o servicios manufactureros relacionados. Es posible hacer un desglose más detallado, esto es, al nivel de 7 dígitos. Sin embargo, el nivel que usamos aquí, el de 5 dígitos, representa un nivel intermedio de descripción de productos. Se codificaron los productos dentro de aquellas industrias que son principalmente responsables de su elaboración—los cuatro primeros dígitos del código de 5 dígitos indica la industria primaria.

A los establecimientos que recibieron el formulario largo (EC-PR-5) también se les envió una Lista de Referencia de Productos para ayudarlos en la codificación de los artículos que vendieron durante el 1963. El término "productos" incluye los servicios manufactureros prestados a otros establecimientos. Se anotó separadamente en el cuestionario cada producto manufacturado y vendido así como también su código de 5 dígitos que representa la clase de producto y el cual fué seleccionado de la lista de referencia. A los establecimientos con menos de 10 empleados se les pidió solamente que describieran cada uno de sus productos en el formulario corto (EC-PR-6) que se les envió. Los códigos que representan las clases de productos de estas plantas fueron anotados en el cuestionario por empleados de la oficina del Censo de Puerto Rico.

Se le pidió a los informantes que suministraran ambos, la cantidad y el valor de los productos manufacturados en el establecimiento. Sin embargo, la información sobre cantidad fué suministrada en una variedad de unidades de medida para un mismo producto, lo cual hizo imposible

Manufacturing establishments producing goods for transfer to other plants of the same company were asked to report the value of such goods at the nearest approximation to commercial values, f.o.b. plant, and not at cost of production.

As in cost of materials, summation of value of shipments data for individual industries to industry group totals results, in some cases, in large amounts of duplication because the products of some industries are used as materials by others. For this reason, value of shipments figures for industry groups and major industry groups should be interpreted with care. With some exceptions, the duplication is not significant at the industry level.

The value of products shipped and contract receipts (as shown in table 4, chapter II) is the value of shipments (as defined above) of products fabricated from materials, parts, etc., owned by the reporting establishment plus the value of receipts for manufacturing services performed for other establishments. Not included is the value of resales, which represents the value of shipments of products merely merchandised and not manufactured at the reporting establishment, or the value of receipts for other nonmanufacturing activities.

**Products**—Some 1,100 product classes (for the manufacturing area) represent basic families of products or of associated manufacturing services. It is possible to go to finer detail on products, that is, to the 7-digit level. However, the 5-digit level used represents an intermediate level of product description. Products were coded to industries primarily responsible for their output—the first four digits of the 5-digit code indicate the primary industry.

Establishments receiving the long census form (EC-PR-5) also were sent a Product Class Reference List to help them code their products shipped during 1963. "Products" include manufacturing services performed for other establishments. Each product was entered separately on the report form and an appropriate 5-digit product class code was selected from the reference list and entered on the form. Establishments with fewer than 10 employees were asked only to describe their products on the short report form (EC-PR-6) sent them. Product class codes for these plants were entered in the Office of the Census in Puerto Rico.

Respondents were asked to report both quantity and value of shipments for commodities or products manufactured at the establishment. However, establishments tended to report quantities in varying units of measure for the same product and it proved impossible to derive a

derivar una cifra aceptable de cantidad para todos los establecimientos que informaron el mismo producto.

Se asignaron también códigos de 5 dígitos a los servicios manufactureros, o a la labor por contrato o a comisión realizada para terceros. Generalmente tales códigos pertenecen a la industria de 4 dígitos en que se hubiesen clasificado los productos que se elaboraron si los mismos hubiesen sido producidos por cuenta del establecimiento con materiales de su propiedad y no por cuenta de terceros. En situaciones especiales, sin embargo, existen industrias que prestan servicios especializados por contrato, tales como galvanizado o enchape y otros trabajos en metales, que típicamente se realizan a base de contrato o comisión. Tales industrias tienen sus propios códigos de 5 dígitos.

El capítulo II (tabla 5) resume la información por productos e ingresos por labor contratada. Para algunos productos y servicios fué imposible clasificar más allá del nivel de industria de 4 dígitos. La tabla 5 distingue entre los productos fabricados por los establecimientos por su propia cuenta y aquéllos producidos por contrato o comisión por cuenta de terceros utilizando materiales suministrados por ellos. Se muestran en la tabla los códigos con su correspondiente descripción de productos.

En los capítulos IV y V (tabla 4) se resume la información por grupos de productos. Un grupo de productos representa la suma de los datos correspondientes a clases de productos de 5 dígitos al nivel de la industria, es decir, a 4 dígitos. Sin embargo, los datos en estas tablas no se rigen por la clasificación de los establecimientos que contribuyen al volumen total de producción en estos grupos de productos. Solo resumen, sin tomar en consideración su clasificación industrial, los datos correspondientes a todos los establecimientos que manufacturaron y vendieron artículos incluidos en los grupos de productos que se muestran en las tablas.

En el capítulo II (tablas 3 y 4) se presentan cifras de productos clasificados por país a que se hicieron las ventas o fuente de los ingresos y, dentro de Puerto Rico, por clase de cliente. Sin embargo, en estas tablas los datos, se basan en la clasificación de la industria primaria que hizo la venta, y se resumen a niveles de grupos industriales de 3 dígitos y de grupos principales de 2 dígitos. Además, el valor total de las ventas en la tabla 3 es mayor que el valor de los productos vendidos e ingresos por servicios. La diferencia entre estos totales es el resultado de los ingresos por concepto de actividades no manufactureras: Venta de desperdicios y rezagos; otros ingresos misceláneos tales como ingresos recibidos por trabajo de reparación o renovación; y la reventa de productos vendidos en la misma forma en que se compraron.

**Destino de los productos vendidos y fuentes de ingresos por contrato**—Se solicitó de los establecimientos que distribuyeran sus ventas de productos por país a que se hicieron dichas ventas. En el caso de ingresos por labor contratada el establecimiento informó la fuente de donde se recibió el pago por el trabajo realizado en materiales propiedad de terceros.

meaningful quantity figure for all establishments reporting the same product class.

Five-digit product codes were also assigned for manufacturing services, or for contract and commission work performed for others. Usually, such codes were in the 4-digit industry which would have been assigned to the product had it been produced by the establishment on its own account, from its own materials, and not for the account of others. In selected situations, however, industries exist for specialized contract services, such as electroplating and other work on metals, typically performed on contract or commission. Such industries have their own unique 5-digit codes.

Chapter II, table 5, summarizes product information and contract receipts. For some products or services it was impossible to code beyond the 4-digit industry level. Table 5 distinguishes between products fabricated by establishments as their own manufacture and those produced on contract or commission for others with materials supplied by them. Product codes are also shown with the corresponding product descriptions.

In chapters IV and V, table 4, information is summarized to the product group level. Product group represents an aggregation of data for 5-digit product classes to the 4-digit or industry level. However, data in these tables do not distinguish by classification of establishments contributing to the output of these product groups. They summarize information for all establishments, without regard to industry classification, which produced and shipped products within the product groups shown in the tables.

In chapter II, tables 3 and 4, product figures are given by country of destination of shipments or source of contract receipts and, within Puerto Rico, by class of customer. However, in these tables product information is by primary industry of shipment, also summarized to the 3-digit group and 2-digit major group levels. Also, in table 3, the total value of shipments exceeds the value of products and receipts for services. The difference between these totals results from receipts for nonmanufacturing activities: Sale of scrap and refuse; other miscellaneous receipts such as repair or renovation work; and the merchandising of products simply bought and resold.

**Destination of products shipped and source of contract receipts**—Establishments were requested to distribute their shipments of products by country of destination. For contract receipts, the establishments reported the origin of payment for work on materials owned by others. Establishments with 10 employees or

Las cifras de ventas a los Estados Unidos representan solo exportaciones directas de los establecimientos manufactureros. Estas no representan todas las exportaciones de Puerto Rico a los Estados Unidos durante el 1963.

**Valor agregado por la manufactura**—Obtenido sumando la diferencia neta entre el valor de los inventarios de productos terminados y productos en preparación al principio y al final del año y el total de las ventas, el cual incluye ingresos por labor contratada, ingresos por actividades no manufactureras e ingresos por concepto de la reventa de productos en la misma forma en que se compraron. Luego, del resultado de esta operación se resta el costo total de materiales, efectos, envases, productos comprados y vendidos sin elaboración adicional, combustibles, energía eléctrica consumida durante el año, y pagos por labor contratada. El valor agregado por la manufactura también toma en consideración cualquier valor agregado por las operaciones de compraventa (la diferencia entre el valor de venta y el costo de los artículos vendidos sin elaboración adicional, manufactura o montaje).

El "valor agregado" evita duplicación en el valor de las ventas, lo cual resulta cuando algunos establecimientos usan como materia prima los productos de otros establecimientos. En consecuencia éste se considera la mejor medida de valor para comparar la importancia económica relativa de la manufactura entre industrias y entre áreas geográficas.

En el 1954 y censos anteriores, el valor agregado por la manufactura se obtuvo restando el costo de materiales, efectos y envases, combustibles, energía eléctrica comprada, y pagos por labor contratada del valor total de las ventas e ingresos. Sin embargo, en el 1956 y censos posteriores se hizo un esfuerzo por medir, además el valor agregado que pasó a ser parte de los productos que se manufacturaron pero que no se vendieron y los que estaban en proceso al finalizar el año. Por lo tanto, los cambios en inventarios de productos terminados y de artículos en preparación fueron añadidos al valor de las ventas e ingresos para obtener el valor total de la producción durante el año.

Establecimientos con menos de 10 empleados informaron solamente el valor total de los inventarios a principios y al finalizar el año, sin diferenciar la etapa de fabricación. En estos casos se estimó el valor agregado por la manufactura sin tomar en consideración los cambios en inventarios. Sin embargo, la mayor parte de los inventarios de estos establecimientos pequeños constituyen existencias de materiales, efectos, etc. que no figuran en el cómputo del valor agregado.

**Inventarios**—El valor de las existencias en posesión de cada establecimiento manufacturero a principios y al finalizar el año, según se informó al Censo de 1963. Se

more were required to distribute their value of shipments within Puerto Rico by class of customer (for example, wholesalers, retailers, or household consumers).

Figures for shipments to the United States represent only direct exports by the manufacturing establishments. They do not represent all exports from Puerto Rico to the United States in 1963.

**Value added by manufacture**—Gained by adding the net difference in value between beginning and end-of-year finished products and work-in-process inventories to total value of shipments. This includes receipts for contract work, non-manufacturing receipts, and sales of products bought and resold in the same condition. Then, the total cost of materials, supplies, containers, products bought and resold in the same condition, fuels, and electric energy consumed during the year, and contract work are subtracted from the result. Value added by manufacture also takes into account any value added by merchandising operations (the difference between the sales value and the cost of goods sold without further manufacture, processing, or assembly).

"Value added" avoids duplication in the value of shipments figure which results from the use of products of some establishments as materials by others. Consequently, it is considered the best value measure for comparing the relative economic importance of manufacturing among industries and geographic areas.

In the 1954 and prior censuses, value added by manufacture was calculated by subtracting the cost of materials, supplies and containers, fuel, purchased electric energy, and contract work from the total value of shipments and receipts. However, in the 1956 and subsequent censuses an attempt was made to measure that part of value added by the output of finished products not sold by the end of the year or by work on products in process at the end of the year. Therefore, differences in the values of beginning and end-of-year inventories of finished products and work in process were added to value of shipments and receipts to obtain the value of production during the year.

Establishments having fewer than 10 employees reported only the total values of beginning and end-of-year inventories rather than detailed information by stage of fabrication. For these establishments, value added by manufacture was computed without taking into account inventory changes. However, most of the inventories of these small establishments are in the form of materials, supplies, etc., which do not enter into the computation of value added.

Se consideran locales los establecimientos que pertenecen a propietarios individuales, sociedades, asociaciones cooperativas, y aquellas corporaciones en que el 51 por ciento o más de las acciones

**Inventories**—The values of beginning-of-year and end-of-year inventories held by each manufacturing establishment as reported in the 1963 census. Establishments with 10 or more employees were requested to furnish separate inventory data for (1) finished products, (2) work in process, and (3) materials, supplies, fuels, etc. However, only the total value of inventories was obtained from establishments having fewer than 10 employees.

Respondents were asked to report the value of all inventories, wherever located, at the beginning and end of the year, on a comparable basis. If feasible, inventories were to be valued at current cost. However, since different methods of inventory valuation are used (LIFO, FIFO, etc.) the definition of the value of inventories aggregated for all establishments in an industry is not precise. The changes in inventory levels between the beginning and the end of the year are of considerably greater significance.

In using inventory data by stage of fabrication for all industries and at the major industry group level, the following should be noted. An item treated as a finished product by an establishment in one industry may be reported as a raw material by an establishment in a different industry. Such differences are present in the inventory figures by stage of fabrication shown for individual industries, industry groups, and all manufacturing which are merely aggregates of figures reported by establishments in specified industries. Further, the total finished goods inventory for "all manufacturing" includes items that are not finished manufactured products.

**Expenditures for plant and equipment**—Expenditures made during the year by manufacturing establishments with 10 employees or more for permanent additions and major alterations to plant, as well as for new and used machinery and equipment. These expenditures were chargeable to fixed-asset accounts and were a type for which depreciation accounts are ordinarily maintained. Expenditures for machinery and equipment were to include those made for replacement purposes, as well as for additions to plant capacity. Costs of maintenance and repairs charged as current operating expense were excluded. Expenditures for land and for leasing of equipment also were excluded. Establishments reporting on the short form were not asked to report this item.

**Ownership**—Statistics differentiate between locally owned and nonlocally owned establishments. Locally owned establishments consist of individual proprietorships, partnerships, cooperative associations, and corporations in which

Tanto los establecimientos Promovidos por EDA como los Ayudados por EDA pueden gozar de exención contributiva si se le concede la misma. El término “anteriormente exenta, exención expiró” se refiere a establecimientos a los cuales se les concedió exención contributiva por un número de años pero que ahora tienen que pagar contribuciones al Gobierno del Estado Libre Asociado.

51 percent or more of the voting stock in 1963 was owned by residents of Puerto Rico. Non-locally owned establishments are corporations in which less than 51 percent of the voting stock in 1963 was owned by residents of Puerto Rico.

**Tax-exempt establishments**—Manufacturing establishments not required to pay taxes to the Government of the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico during 1963 in accordance with Act No. 184 of May 18, 1948, as amended. An EDA-promoted establishment is one which has been established in Puerto Rico partly as a result of efforts by the Economic Development Administration or the Puerto Rico Industrial Development Company. An EDA-assisted establishment is one which was established in Puerto Rico without any prior effort of the Economic Development Administration or the Puerto Rico Industrial Development Company, but which subsequently received some form of assistance. Both EDA-assisted and EDA-promoted establishments enjoy tax-exempt status, if granted. The term “previously exempt, status expired” refers to establishments that were granted tax exemption for a certain number of years but are now required to pay Commonwealth taxes.

## Appendix B

### **AUTHORITY FOR CENSUS: TITLE 13, UNITED STATES CODE**

(Codification of August 1954 amended by Acts of August 1957, September 1960, and June and October 1962)

#### **Collection and publication: Five-year periods (131)**

The Secretary shall take, compile, and publish censuses of manufactures, of mineral industries, and of other businesses . . . in the year 1954 and every fifth year thereafter, and each such census shall relate to the year immediately preceding the taking thereof: **Provided**, That the censuses of manufactures, of mineral industries, and of other businesses, including the distributive trades and service establishments, directed to be taken in the year 1954 relating to the year 1953, shall be taken instead in the year 1955 relating to the year 1954.

#### **Geographic scope of censuses (191a)**

Each of the censuses authorized by this chapter (other than censuses of population) shall include each State, the District of Columbia, Alaska, Hawaii, the Virgin Islands, Guam, and the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, and as may be determined by the Secretary, such other possessions and areas over which the United States exercises jurisdiction, control, or sovereignty. Censuses of population shall include all geographic areas referred to in the preceding sentence. Inclusion of other areas over which the United States exercises jurisdiction or control shall be subject to the concurrence of the Secretary of State.

#### **Failure to answer questions affecting companies, businesses, religious bodies, and other organizations: False answers (224)**

Whoever, being the owner, official, agent, person in charge, or assistant to the person in charge, of any company, business, institution, establishment, religious body, or organization of any nature whatsoever, neglects or refuses, when requested by the Secretary or other authorized officer or employee of the Department of Commerce or bureau or agency thereof, whether such request be made by registered mail, by certified mail, by telegraph, by visiting representative, or

# Censo de Negocios de 1963— Puerto Rico

Este censo representa una actividad conjunta entre la Junta de Planificación de Puerto Rico y el Negociado del Censo de los EE. UU., la cual se llevó a cabo simultáneamente con el Censo de Manufacturas de 1963. Cubre los establecimientos dedicados al comercio por mayor, comercio por menor, y servicios seleccionados, según se definen en el Manual de Clasificación Industrial Uniforme (CIU). Los datos para este censo se publican en un informe separado. Las secciones principales de tal informe son las siguientes:

**COMERCIO POR MAYOR**—contiene datos sobre ventas, ingresos, establecimientos, inventarios, remuneraciones, comisiones recibidas y personal, para 10 clasificaciones de tipos de negocios en Puerto Rico. Los temas incluyen las ventas directas de mercancía, transacciones a comisión, ingresos por servicios prestados, ventas por clase de cliente, tipo de organización legal, y tamaño de los establecimientos según las ventas y el empleo. La mayoría de los datos se refieren a los AEMEs, con algunos datos por regiones.

**COMERCIO POR MENOR**—contiene datos sobre el número de establecimientos, ventas, remuneraciones y personal, para aproximadamente 40 clases de negocios. Las tablas incluyen datos sobre ventas de mercancía, ingresos por servicios prestados, tipo de organización legal, tamaño de los establecimientos según las ventas y el empleo, y ventas a crédito. La mayoría de los datos se refieren a los AEMES, con algunos datos por regiones.

**SERVICIOS SELECCIONADOS**—presenta datos estadísticos sobre el número de establecimientos, ingresos, remuneraciones y personal, para aproximadamente 35 clases de negocios. Los datos incluyen el total de ventas e ingresos, ingresos por servicios prestados, ingresos por concepto de ventas de mercaderías, tipo de organización legal, tamaño del establecimiento según los ingresos y el empleo. La mayoría de los datos se refieren a los AEMEs, con algunos datos por regiones.

**ESTADISTICAS PARA MUNICIPIOS SELECCIONADOS**—presenta datos sobre temas básicos de comercio por mayor, comercio por menor y servicios seleccionados en los municipios de Arecibo, Bayamón, Caguas, Mayaguez, Ponce y San Juan. Esta sección incluye tablas que presentan los datos clasificados según tamaño de empleo y según el tipo de organización legal de los establecimientos.

**ESTADISTICAS PARA MUNICIPIOS**—contiene datos sobre temas básicos para cada uno de los 76 municipios. Esta sección incluye datos comparativos, para 1963 y 1958, de comercio por mayor, comercio por menor y servicios seleccionados, mostrando separadamente datos sobre agencias de lotería y agencias hípicas. También presenta datos por clase de negocio.

**CENTROS PRINCIPALES DE COMERCIO POR MENOR Y DISTRITOS COMERCIALES**—contiene datos sobre comercio por menor para un número de Centros Principales de Comercio por Menor (CPCM) y Distritos Comerciales (DM).



# 1963 Census of Business— Puerto Rico

This census was conducted jointly by the Puerto Rico Planning Board and the U.S. Bureau of the Census at the same time the 1963 Census of Manufactures was undertaken. It covers establishments engaged in wholesale trade, retail trade, and selected services as defined in the Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) Manual. A report presenting data from this census is published separately. Major sections of this report are as follows:

**SUMMARY STATISTICS**—providing data on establishments, sales, receipts, payroll, and personnel for 1963 and 1958, by kind of business, for Puerto Rico and the standard metropolitan statistical areas (SMSA) of Mayaguez, Ponce, and San Juan.

**WHOLESALE TRADE**—containing data on sales, receipts, establishments, inventories, payroll, commissions, and personnel for 10 kinds of business in Puerto Rico. Data include direct sales of merchandise, commission transactions, receipts from services, sales by class of customer, legal form of organization, and sales size and employment size of establishment. Most of the data are for SMSA's with some data for regions.

**RETAIL TRADE**—containing data on establishments, sales, payroll, and personnel for approximately 40 kinds of business. Tables include data on sales of merchandise, receipts from services, legal form of organization, sales size and employment size of establishment, and credit sales. Most of the data are for SMSA's with some data for regions.

**SELECTED SERVICES**—presenting statistics on establishments, receipts, payroll, and personnel for approximately 35 kinds of business. Data include total sales and receipts, receipts from services, receipts from sales of merchandise, legal form of organization, receipts size and employment size of establishment. Most of the data are for SMSA's with some data for regions.

**SELECTED MUNICIPIO STATISTICS**—showing basic data items for wholesale trade, retail trade, and selected services for the municipios of Arecibo, Bayamon, Caguas, Mayaguez, Ponce, and San Juan. This section includes tables on sales and receipts size, employment size, and legal form of organization for establishments.

**MUNICIPIO STATISTICS**—containing basic data items for each of the 76 municipios. This section includes comparative data for 1963 and 1958 on wholesale trade, retail trade, and selected services, with a separate line for lottery and racing agencies, and data for kinds of business.

**MAJOR RETAIL CENTERS AND BUSINESS DISTRICTS**—containing retail trade data for a number of Major Retail Centers (MRC) and Business Districts (BD).

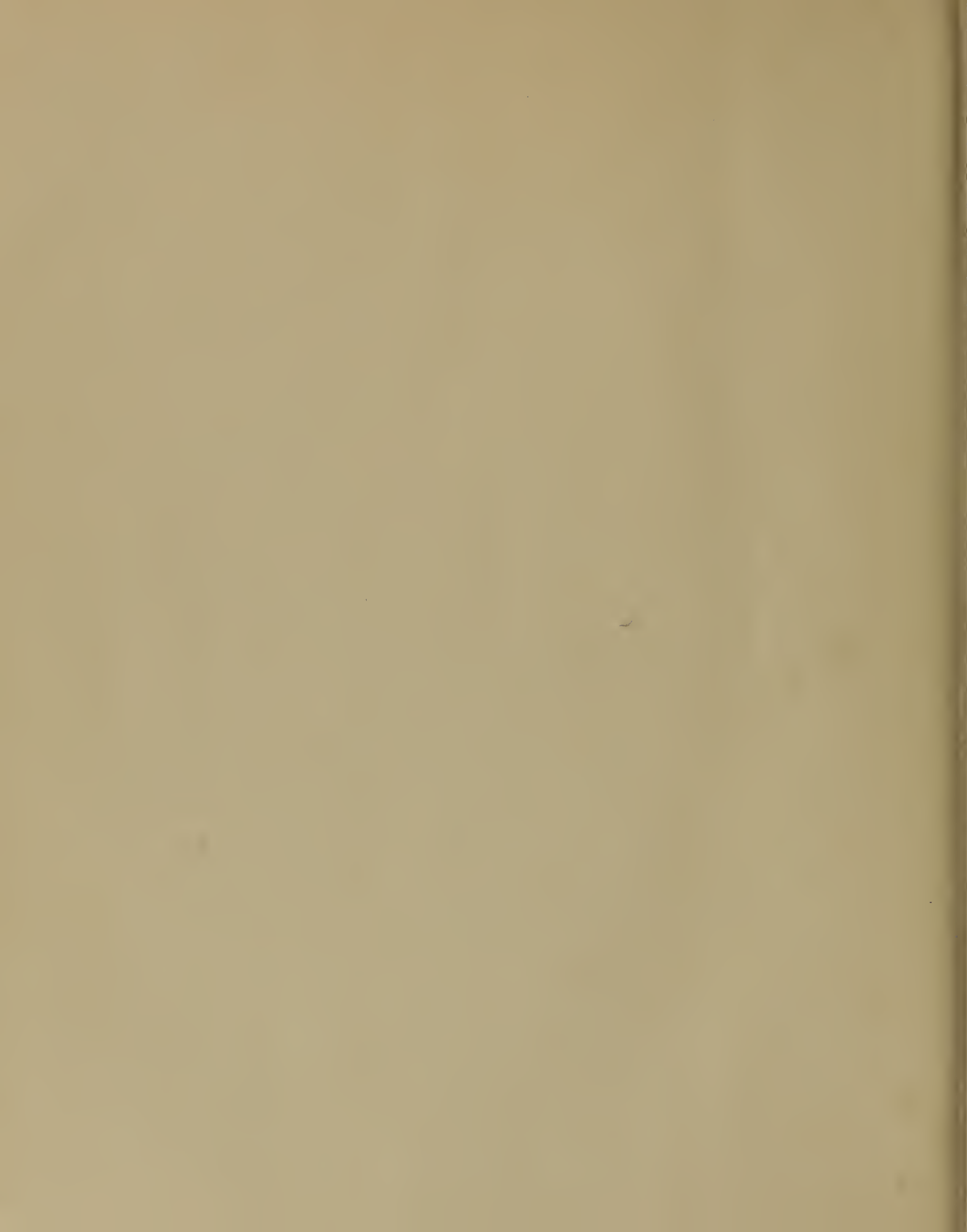
