Italian library catalogues and authority files

SBN – National Library Service [P396]

- Catalogue: <u>https://opac.sbn.it/opacsbn/opac/iccu/free.jsp</u>
- Authority file: https://opac.sbn.it/opacsbn/opac/iccu/authority.jsp
- <u>6521</u> libraries participating, out of <u>12606</u> existing libraries (51.7%); here a <u>detailed report</u>
 - public libraries (6632) are mostly in SBN
 - university libraries (1373) and ecclesiastical libraries (1146) are very often outside SBN
- SBN is a VIAF member (ICCU), so it sends its authority data to VIAF, but ...

Issues in SBN

- ... SBN shows to the public and sends to VIAF only the authority records considered to reach a high quality standard
 - out of about 4M (estimated) personal authority records, only 0.2M are accessible to the public and sent to VIAF
- There is an ongoing effort to obtain access to a higher number of authority records

BAV – Vatican Apostolic Library [P8034]



- BAV is a VIAF member (<u>BAV</u>) and sends its authority data to VIAF, about 0.3M personal authority records

Some recent collective catalogues ...

- BeWeB (<u>https://beweb.chiesacattolica.it/</u>) [**P7796**]: a collective catalogue of many ecclesiastical libraries, with few thousands personal authority records
- SHARE Catalogue (<u>https://catalogo.share-</u> <u>cat.unina.it/sharecat/clusters</u>) [**P3987**]: a collective catalogue of the libraries of 9 universities in southern Italy, with 0.6M personal authority records
- CoBiS LOD Portal (<u>https://dati.cobis.to.it/</u>) [**P7865**]: a collective catalogue of 12 libraries from around Turin, with 0.2M author records

... and a lot of one-library catalogues

- 11 library catalogues have had their authority file connected to Wikidata in the last few years
 - these catalogues help a lot in covering authors which are absent in foreign catalogues and are present in the non-accessible part of SBN
 - some of these middle-sized libraries proved to be more interested to Wikidata than SBN, so most Wikidata activities try to involve them

Purposes

- Wikidata page: <u>https://www.wikidata.org/wiki/WD:GWMAB</u>
- 1. involve people from Wikidata and from Italian cultural institutions
- 2. present Wikidata to in Italian to operators of the cultural institutions, with focus on LOD
- 3. organise courses and events regarding Wikidata in Italian
- 4. persuade Italian institutions both to contribute data to Wikidata and to use data from Wikidata in their websites

Activities

- Basic (online) courses about Wikidata in Italian for people from cultural institutions
- Presentations of projects already realised in Italy on Wikidata
- Conferences and meetings regarding Wikidata and cultural institutions
- Monthly editathons on Wikidata
 - The recordings of most activities are published on YouTube
 - GWMAB has a mailing list, social accounts (Facebook, Twitter, Instagram) and a group on Telegram

History and scope

- First edition in March 2021
- Seventh edition ... tomorrow!
- Periodicity: each month, second Tuesday
- Expected public: Wikidata users (both expert and not-so-expert), mainly from Italy; librarians from Italy
- Edited items: persons (P31=Q5) whose works are present in the catalogue of at least one Italian library

Structure

• Each editathon focuses on one library catalogue

Main parts of the page:

- Short instructions, with link to longer version
- Links to places where to discuss strange issues in items
- Lists of items to be edited

Some more details – new users

- The instructions
 - (<u>https://www.wikidata.org/wiki/Wikidata:Gruppo_Wikidata_per_Muse</u> <u>i, Archivi_e_Biblioteche/Editathon_mensile#Preparazione</u>) guide the user in the settings of Preferences and common.js and give advices about fundamental properties that persons (Q5) items should contain
- Users can ask questions: on Wikidata; on Telegram; in an online meeting at 17 CEST (this meeting has the main purpose of solving doubts of new users about some aspects of Wikidata)

Some more details – queries

- The queries, stored in a table using {{SPARQL Inline}}, can be opened directly showing their results (easier for new users)
- A few items are present in more than one query, so that the possibility of overlap are very low
- The queries focus on four aspects to be improved:
 - missing VIAF (and other identifiers)
 - missing birth/death dates
 - missing occupation
 - missing Italian label

Some more details – results

- Results are monitored in two ways:
 - through Outreach Dashboard (but many users forget to sign in; so metrics are not reliable)
 - through the decrease of the number of results for each query: this number is written down the evening before the editathon, the morning after the editathon and at the end of the month
- The queries decreased of 273 results on average (March-August) the day after editathons

Achievements – numbers

- 23 users took part in at least one of the 6 editions
 - 9 GWMAB core members
 - 7 librarians, 1 library scientist, 1 Wikidata user (me)
 - 3 Wikidata users
 - 11 librarians
 - 8 of them belonging to the libraries object of editathons
- decrease of 1640 results in the queries

Positive effects

- Focus attention on data quality as a central issue
- Involve librarians on Wikidata with the incentive of editing items which are crucial for their own library catalogue
- Write down queries which could well be used also after the editathon

To-do list

- Organise these editathons not only online, but also in person
- Involve also foreign libraries, focusing on intersections between their catalogues and Italian libraries' ones (see <u>tomorrow edition</u>)
- Re-involve librarians, after their library's edition, for next editions, preparing them queries for intersections with their library; encourage them to continue using queries also after editathons
- Try (again) to involve more Wikidata users, and Wikipedia users
- Introduce queries for fundamental statements (e.g. dates of birth/death, pseudonyms) completely lacking references or being referenced only from Wikipedia

Final thoughts about most difficult issues

- Libraries (not only in Italy) have few librarians, overworked and often not well educated about semantic web and LOD
- Libraries often say that they would be more interested in Wikidata and LOD if they had efficient ways to display data from Wikidata in their catalogues = ILS, especially not-open-source ones, still to be improved (but browser extensions as Entity Explosion are a good starting point)
