Teacher's Seed, Bulb and Shrub Catalog

Purpose of Catalogs Is to give every pupil in your school seeds, bulbs and shrubs at prices within their means, so that they may obtain a knowledge of how to grow flowers and vegetables.

Show the Catalog Will you show the catalog printed in black to your pupils and ask how many of them would like to receive a copy? If you have other teachers in your school, ask them to do the same. When You Receive the Catalogs Distribute them to the teachers and pupils who ask for them. (One to a family is generally about right.) Instruct the pupils to take them home so the parents can help select the seeds to be planted. Tell them to make up their orders on the order blank in the middle of the catalog, which can be removed easily, and that all pupils should bring their orders and the money to pay for the seeds to you on a certain day. This will complete the ordering at one time.

Send All Orders to Us Wrap all the orders together and send them, together with a Money Order or your check, to **The Children's Flower Mission, 5700 Detroit Ave., Cleveland, Ohio.** (Never send cash or stamps unless you register the envelope.) If the package of orders weighs over one pound, send it by **Express Collect.** If less than one pound, send by **First-Class Mail.** The writing on the orders makes these orders **First-Class Mail Matter, not Parcel Post.**

Absolutely No Expense to You We prepay all carrying charges on catalogs, seeds, bulbs and shrubs, so the teachers are put to no personal expense. If you pay for the goods with a money order, you may select free seeds to cover the cost of the money order **FEE.**

Free Seeds for Your School If your school has no fund for purchasing seeds to be used about the school building, you can select free seeds on the order blank in **this** catalog to the amount of 10% of the total orders of your pupils. That is, if your pupils should order \$10.00 worth of goods, you may select seeds worth \$1.00, etc. If the seeds are not needed for this, you can use the free seeds for any pupils who might not be able to buy seeds or for use in making germination tests in blotters or in sand boxes in the school room. This is valuable to you.

A Real Community Service Your entire community will benefit if you will give this opportunity to your pupils. Homes and school grounds will be improved and parents will thank you for having interested their children in so worth-while a project. Then the fall flower and vegetable shows and the county fairs will have entries from **your** room. This makes the children happy, too.

How and When Orders Are Filled Each child's order will be pasted to a large envelope and the seeds placed inside. Thus the original orders are returned so no copies of orders need be kept by you. Seed orders will be filled as soon as received. Bulb and shrub orders will be held here until planting time late in the spring. In both cases, all orders will be packed in one lot and shipped to **you** and you can easily distribute to the pupils.

TEACHER'S ORDER BLANK

Purpose of This Literature Is to provide high class, guaranteed Penny-Packet Seeds for school children to use in their studies or in their school or home gardens.

Two Kinds of Order Blanks This one, printed in red, is for the use of Teachers only. The one in black is for pupils. Each contains complete instructions.

Your Part as Teacher Will you show the Pupil's Order Blank (printed in black), to your pupils? Tell them that we will supply one like it for each pupil wishing to order seeds for either home or school gardens. (If other teachers in your school would like to join with you, give us the total number of teachers and pupils for the entire school instead of just for your own room.) Now fill in the enclosed post card and mail it to us so we can send the supply promptly.

When You Receive the Order Blanks Tell your boys and girls to take the order blanks home so that the parents may help in the selection of the seeds to be planted. Then have them bring their orders and the money to pay for them back to you on a certain day. You can then send all the orders from your room and a money order for the total amount the children have brought you, direct to The Children's Flower Mission, 5700 Detroit Ave., Cleveland, Ohio.

When You Send the Orders to Us Send all in one package. If the package weighs less than one pound, send it by FIRST-CLASS MAIL. (You cannot send anything with writing on by Parcel Post.) If the package weighs more than one pound, send it by EXPRESS COLLECT. If at all possible, send the money by POSTAL or EXPRESS MONEY ORDER as that is safest. If you cannot do so, send a check. Cash is too easily lost in the mails and stamps should not be used because we receive many more than we can use from people who do not know our wishes.

Do Not Keep Copies of the Orders We always return the original orders with the seeds, so it is not necessary for you to keep copies. These orders are each pasted to a large envelope in which we place all the packets for that particular order.

Absolutely No Expense to You We prepay all the carrying charges on the supply of order blanks as well as on all seeds ordered by the pupils. For the money order which you must purchase in sending in the money for the goods, you may select free seeds up to the cost of the money order fee.

Our Guarantee If, after careful planting, care and cultivation, any goods purchased from us do not prove satisfactory and you believe the failure due to the quality or condition of stock when received, we will adjust all claims by replacing, or if too late, by refunding to you the amount paid for such items. This amounts to a guarantee of absolute satisfaction or your money back.

In selecting the following list of Flower Seeds we have been careful to include varieties of easy culture that we believe will give general satisfaction. Usually each packet will contain a mixture of many varieties, types and colors, procured from a number of growers in Europe and America. Also note that we state approximately the number of seeds each packet contains.
