





**RESOLUTION NO. 343**  
**A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE CITY OF GLENDALE ORDERING CERTAIN STREET WORK TO BE DONE ON FRANKLIN COURT**

The Board of Trustees of the City of Glendale do hereby resolve as follows: That the street work herein described is required by the public interest and convenience and the Board of Trustees of the City of Glendale, State of California, hereby orders the same to be done according to the Specifications and Plans adopted for said work, and under the direction and to the satisfaction of the Superintendent of Streets of said city, to-wit:

First: That all that portion of Franklin Court from the South line of Fourth Street to the North line of Fifth Street, including all intersections of streets (excepting such portions of said street and intersections as are required by law to be kept in order or repair by any person or company having railroad tracks thereon), be graded, oiled and tamped in accordance with the plan and profile on file in the office of the City Engineer, and specifications for the construction of graded, tamped and oiled streets on file in the office of the City Clerk of the City of Glendale, said specifications being numbered 9, excepting that from the South line of Fourth Street to the Easterly prolongation across said Franklin Court of the South line of Lot 8, Block 20, of the Town of Glendale as per map recorded in Book 21, pages 89-90 of Miscellaneous Records of Los Angeles County, California, in addition to the regular treatment under specifications Number 9, there shall be incorporated into the roadway a layer of gravel 2 1/2 inches thick, of which the maximum pieces will pass through a 2 1/2-inch ring and the minimum pieces will not pass through a 1/2-inch ring; in the following manner: When the roadway is tamped to within 2 1/2 inches of the surface, the 2 1/2 inches of gravel of the sizes as above specified shall then be evenly spread over the entire surface and tamped into said roadway, and then completed as provided for in Specifications Number 9.

Second: That a cement curb be constructed along the Westerly side of the roadway of said Franklin Court from the South line of Fourth Street to the North line of Fifth Street, including returns at all street intersections (excepting along such portions of the line of said roadway upon which a cement curb has already been constructed to the official line and grade) in accordance with the specifications for the construction of cement curbs on file in the office of the City Clerk of the City of Glendale, said specifications being numbered 2, except that on the West side of said roadway from the South line of the Fourth Street to the Easterly prolongation across said Franklin Court of the South line of Lot 12 of aforesaid Town of Glendale, the curb shall be placed six feet from the property line instead of the distance as specified in said specifications number 2.

SECTION 2. That the Board of Trustees of the City of Glendale finds upon estimates directed to be furnished and furnished by the City Engineer that the total cost of said improvement will be greater than fifty cents per front foot along each line of said street, including the cost of intersections, and it is hereby determined in pursuance of an Act of the Legislature of the State of California, approved February 27, 1893, as amended by an Act of the Legislature amending said last named Act, which amending Act became a law March 2, 1899, that bonds shall be issued to represent the cost of said improvement. Said bonds shall be serial, extending over a period of ten years from their date, and an even annual proportion of the principal sum thereof shall be payable, by coupon, on the second day of January every year after their date, until the whole are paid, and said bonds shall bear interest at the rate of seven per cent per annum on all sums unpaid, payable semi-annually, by coupon, on the second days of January and July, respectively, of each year, until the whole of said principal and interest are paid.

Sec. 3. THE GLENDALE NEWS, a weekly newspaper of general circulation, published and circulated in said City of Glendale, is hereby designated as the newspaper in which this Resolution and notice of said street work inviting sealed proposals shall be published in the manner and form and by the persons required by law.

Sec. 4. The City Clerk of the City of Glendale is hereby directed to post conspicuously for five days on or near the Chamber door of the Board of Trustees, in the manner and form required by law, a notice with Specifications, inviting sealed proposals or bids for doing said work; and said City Clerk is hereby directed to publish for two days in said newspaper hereby designated for that purpose, as aforesaid, in the manner and in the form required by law, a notice of said work inviting sealed proposals or bids for doing said work and referring to the Specifications posted or on file.

Said notice shall require a certified check or bond, either, as prescribed by law, and for an amount not less than ten per cent of the aggregate of the proposal. Said City Clerk is also hereby directed to publish this Resolution for two days, in the manner required by law, in said newspaper designated for that purpose, as aforesaid.

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**NOTICE OF SALE OF PROPERTY DELINQUENT FOR NON-PAYMENT OF BOND ISSUED FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF THIRD STREET, FROM BRAND BOULEVARD TO EAST LINE OF CHILDS' TRACT.**

Default having been made in the payment of the installment of the principal and interest of that certain street improvement bond hereinafter described which became due on the second day of January, 1910:

the provisions of an Act of the Legislature of the State of California, entitled: "An Act to Provide a System of Street Improvement Bonds to represent certain Assessments for the Cost of Street Work, and Improvement within Municipalities, and also for the Payment of such Bonds," approved February 27, 1893, and amendments thereto.

That the said bond referred to in this notice is described as follows: Street Improvement Bond, Number 42, Series One, Assessment Number 60, in the City of Glendale, County of Los Angeles, State of California. For the sum of Thirty-nine 66-100 dollars (\$39.66) bearing interest at the rate of 7 per cent per annum, issued for the improvement of Third street, in the City of Glendale, from Brand Boulevard to East line of Childs' Tract; said bond is dated July 2, 1908, and is issued to represent the assessment upon the hereinafter described property mentioned in said bond for the street improvement above mentioned.

That the property mentioned in said bond, and to represent the assessment against which for said improvement said bond was issued, is that certain parcel of land situate in the City of Glendale, County of Los Angeles, State of California, more particularly described as follows, to-wit:
