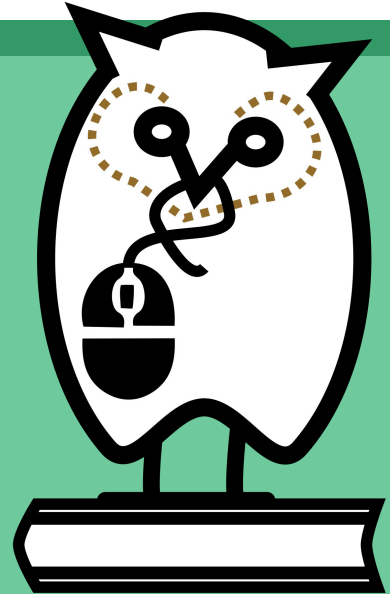

IFLA Wikidata Working Group

The IFLA Wikidata Working Group was formed in late 2019 to explore and advocate for the use of and contribution to Wikidata by library and information professionals, the integration of Wikidata and Wikibase library systems, and alignment of the Wikidata ontology with library metadata formats such as BIBFRAME, RDA, and MARC.

Background

The 2016 IFLA White Paper *"Opportunities for Academic and Research Libraries and Wikipedia"* states: "The potential of Wikidata to draw data and linked data authorities together across the world's languages many different ontologies and taxonomies has enormous potential support researchers around the world." Many libraries are increasingly taking advantage of the power of Wikidata, however, the lack of international coordination and communication is impeding this potential.

Thanks to a Wikimedia Foundation grant, the Wikidata Working Group developed [6 videos on Wikicite](#).

The aim of the project is to support the work of the IFLA Wikidata Working Group and create a public forum of discussion and project work.

The charge of the IFLA Wikidata Working Group is to aid the international library community in organizing around the Wikidata platform to leverage advocacy work and to encourage, support, and document best practices in the open sharing of bibliographic data.

The project more specifically serves to coordinate the following activities:

- engage in advocacy and policy work with library decision makers to increase the use of Wikidata in libraries.
- encourage best practices for the open sharing of bibliographic, authority and other metadata across platforms and systems through the creation of a discussion and documentation space
- organize events in collaboration and coordination with IFLA, including the annual IFLA World Library Conference.
- act as a bridge between IFLA Standing Committees and the Wikimedia community to develop and leverage relationships and relevant work

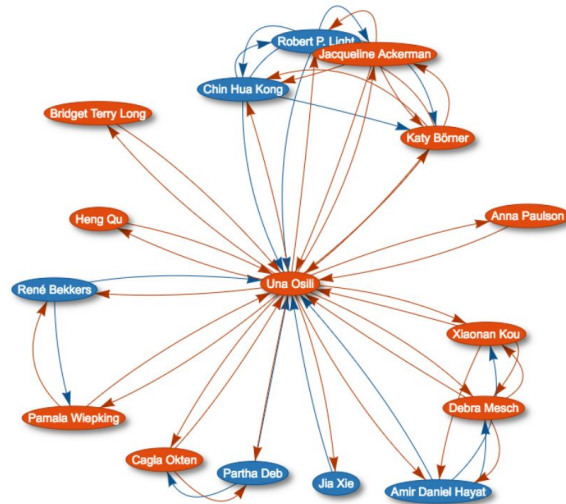

Logistics

- **Day and time (May 15 - June 5)**
Events may take place over hours or days. A live training establishes community, but please record and share it for those that can't attend.
- **Location**
Web conferencing platforms work great for short events. If the event is longer, consider a chat platform so participants can stay in touch, ask questions, and share their work.

If a budget is available, consider mailing participants a small item as a thank you for their participation (e.g. sticker, button, postcard).



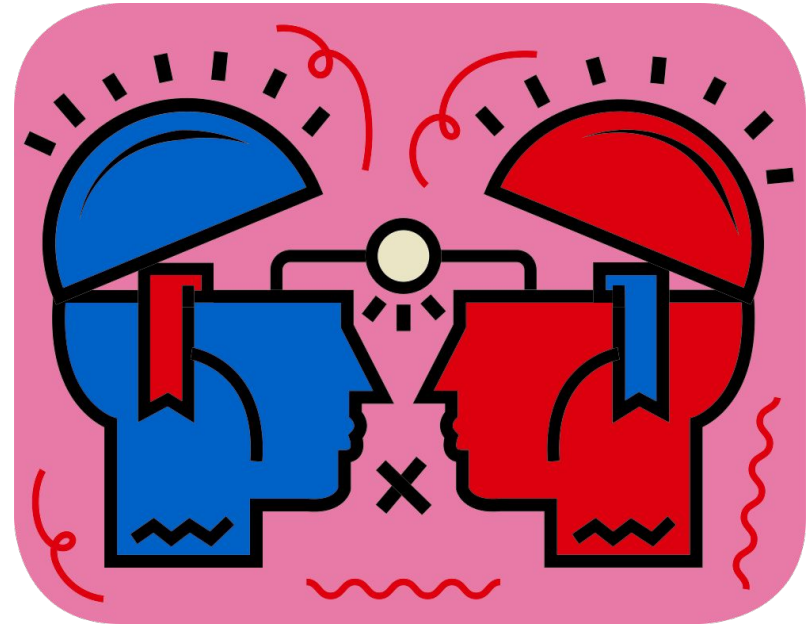

- Invite participants through local channels



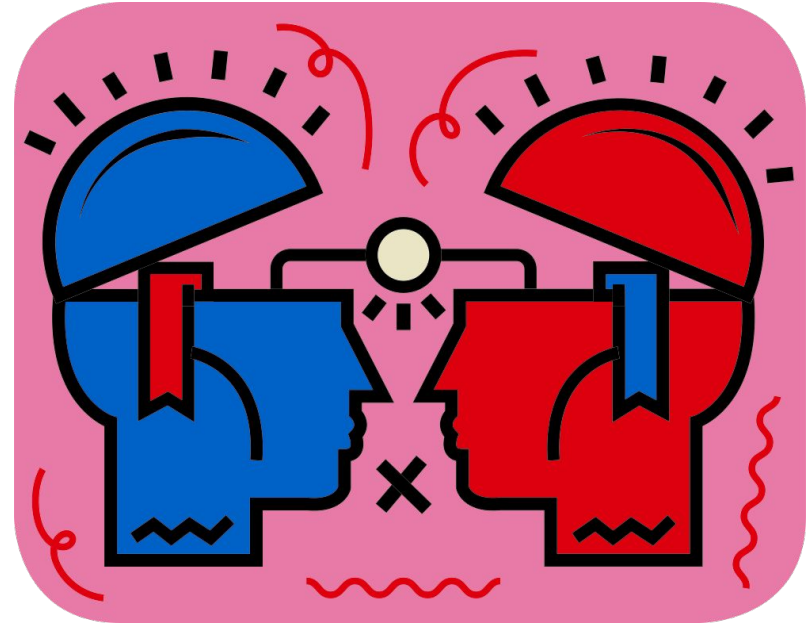
Identify a Trainer

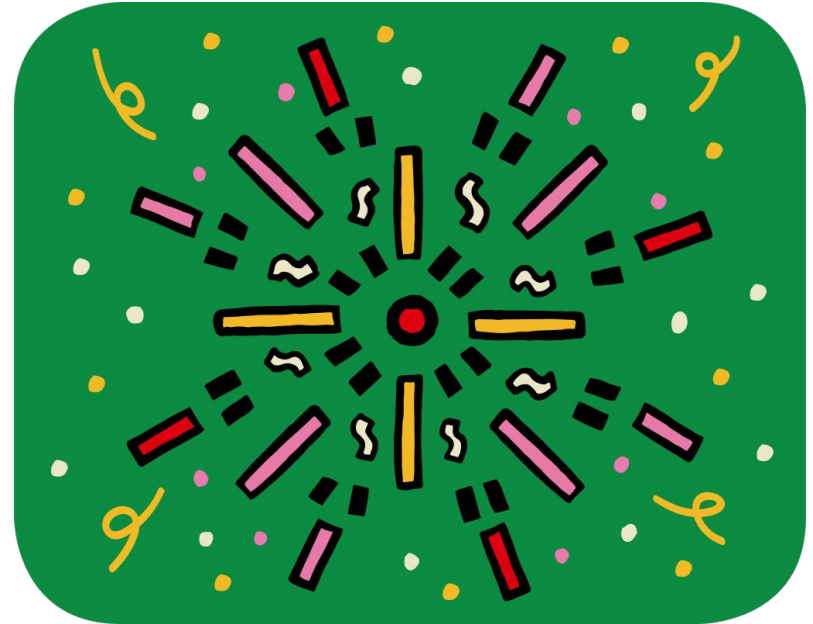

The Dashboard

- Supports the management of Wiki* programs and events
- Includes tracking functions so organizers can:
 - measure and report the outcome of a program
 - identify participants who may need additional support
 - maintain quality control
- Can track edits made as part of a program (a single editing event) or across multiple programs, called a campaign
- Multilingual
- Can track across multiple projects, including Wikidata!

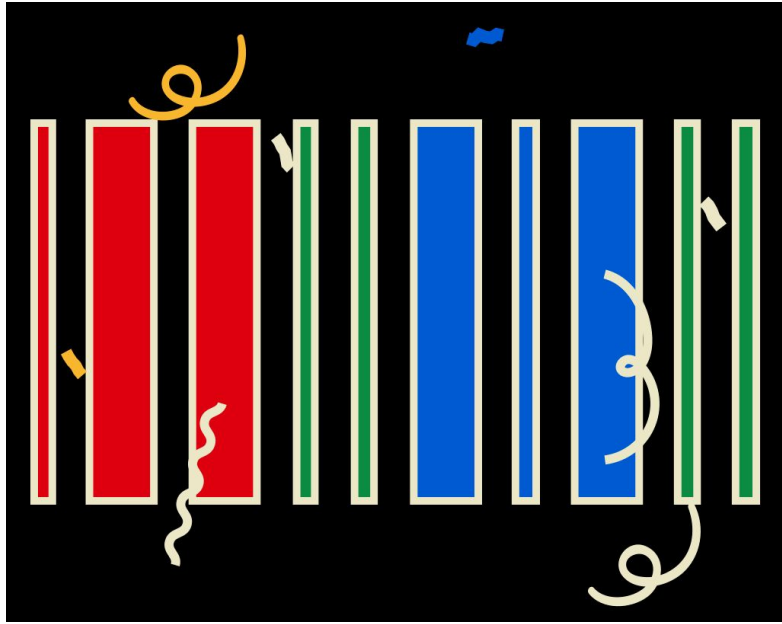
