


Figure 5. Una Osili's list of publications



IFLA releases 6 videos on Wikidata and Wikibase in Libraries

In February 2020, IFLA received a WikiCite grant from the Wikimedia Foundation to carry out a WLIC 2020 satellite event in Dublin. Due to developments related to COVID19, the project was transformed into 6 online discussions with professionals in order to discuss projects, issues, progress of Wikidata, Wikibase and bibliographic data in the field of libraries.








Goals and Outcomes



Identify a Trainer


- Ability to talk in front of a group of people






Metrics and Reporting




The Dashboard

- Supports the management of Wiki* programs and events
- Includes tracking functions so organizers can:
 - o measure and report the outcome of a program
 - o identify participants who may need additional support
 - maintain quality control
- Can track edits made as part of a program (a single editing event) or across multiple programs, called a campaign
- Multilingual
- Can track across multiple projects, including Wikidata!




1. Join the Campaign



- Click on the campaign link
- Click the Login button and and follow the on-screen popup wizard to login using your Wikipedia account.
- After you are logged in, click the Create Program + button.




2. Create Your Program



- Add the title of your event in *Program title*:
- Add the name of your institution in *Institution*:
- Change the Home Wiki to Wikidata. This will automatically update the Tracked Wikis
- Click Next





- Click Create my Program! to complete the creation process.





- All participants should follow the pop-ups to either create an account or log in.






- The participant will receive a welcome message at the top of the dashboard page upon joining the program.
- The dashboard will now collect all edits made by participants to Wikidata.
