GROUP HOSPITALIZATION INFORMATION

Persons changing jobs, whether they are entering private business or the Federal Government, may arrange to transfer their contracts from one group to another either to a group established in the new place of employment.

Persons who become employed where there is no group, or who are temporarily unemployed, or who plan to move to another locality, in most cases may arrange to continue their protection. Such subscribers should promptly notify Group Hospitalization, Inc. so that such may be advised on the arrangements to be made in connection with the contract.

All contract holders should be informed of the following change. A contract may be changed from one time to another if application is made by the subscriber within 90 days after change in his marital or family status. Or within 90 days of the anniversary date of the contract provided any family members to be added are eligible for participation. This change is effective as of 6/1/51.
