ABSTRACT OF FUR LAWS, 1939-40

Compiled by Frank G. Grines, Atministrative Assistant Division of Public Relations

The trupping, possession, and sale of fur animals and their polts or other parts are controlled entirely by State laws, except that interstate shipments are subject to the scrutiny of Federal officers charged with the enforcement of the Lacey Act (35 Stat. 1137, as emended June 15, 1935 and June 19, 1939).

The accompanying tabulation of the open seasons for 1939-40, in which opening and closing dates are given together with the summery of provisions of State and Provincial laws regarding possession, cale, shipment and export, has been prepared primarily as an aid to Fouriel officials in conducting investigations under the Lacey Act on enforcing its provisions, and to answer inquiries of State game departments, individual trappers, and others.

Every effort has been made to have the surmaries substantially correct, but since the trapping seasons in army States and Provinces are subject to change by orders of resulations of State or Provincial same authorities, it is well for trappers and others concerned to familiarize themselves with the provisions of State and Provincial laws and regulations.

Information as to licenses in the Canadian Provinces and Newfoundland is omitted, as these licenses are subject to change by Order-in-Council. Those desiring this information may obtain it by communicating with the Game commissioners or departments, whose addresses are given on page 37.

THE FEDERAL LACEY ACT

An Act of Congress of May 25, 1900 (31 Stat. 187) as amended, known as the Iacey Act, provides, among other things, that it shall be unlawful for any person, firm, corporation, or association to deliver or knowingly receive for shipment, transportation, or carriage, or to ship, transport, or carry by any means whatever, from any State, Territory, or the District of Columbia, to, into, or through any other State, Territory, or the District of Columbia, or to a foreign country, any wild animal * * * or the dead body or part thereof imported from a foreign country contrary to any law of the United States, or captured, killed, taken, purchased, sold, or possessed contrary to any such law, or captured, killed, taken, shipped, transported, carried, purchased, sold, or possessed contrary to the law of any State, Territory, or the District of Columbia, or foreign country or State, Province or other subdivision thereof in which it was captured, killed, taken, purchased, sold, or possessed, or in which it was delivered or knowingly received for shipment, transportation, or carriage, or from which it was shipped, transported, or carried; or to transport, bring, or convoy, by any means, from any foreign country into the United States, any wild animal, or the dead body or part thereof, captured, killed, taken, shipped, transported, or carried contrary to the law of the foreign country, or State, Province, or other subdivision thereof, in which it was captured, killed, or taken, or from which it was shipped, transported, or carried. The Act further provides that no person, firm, corporation, or association purchasing or receiving any wild animal; or the dead body or part thereof, imported from any foreign country, or shipped, transported, or carried in interstate commerce, shall make any false record or render any account that is false in reference thereto.

An Act of June 19, 1939 (Public No. 131, 76th Congress) emendatory of the above Act, provides that all packages or containers, except those from foreign countries, in which the furs, hides, or skins of wild mimals are shipped, transported, or carried shall be plainly and clearly marked or labeled on the outside thereof with the names and addresses of the shipper and the consignee.

An amendment of June 15, 1935 (49 Stat. 380), confers upon employees of the Department of Agriculture (see note) authorized to enforce the Act, power to arrest any person committing a violation of the Act in his presence or view, and also, under warrant, to search for and to seize any wild animals or the dead bodies or parts thereof shipped, transported, or carried in violation of the Act.

NOTE: Under the Reorganization Act of April 3, 1939 (Public No. 19, 76th Congress), the functions of the Secretary of Agriculture relating to wildlife, game, and migratory birds were, effective July 1, 1939, transferred to the Secretary of the Interior.

BAG LIMITS: Beaver, 10 a season

TRAPPING METHODS: Land fur bearing animals may not be taken by means of any set gun, shot gun, fire, jacklight, pit lamp, searchlight or other artificial light; trap or device known as "klips"; steel bear trap or trap having a greater spread of jaws than 9 inches; strychnine or other poison. Beaver traps must not be set within 25 feet of beaver house or dam, and beaver or muskrat houses or dens must not be injured or destroyed. Foxes must not be trapped within 100 feet of den.

POSSESSION AND SALE: No restrictions on possession and sale of prime skins legally taken, except that beaver skins must be presented to a wildlife agent or other officer of the Commission, with effidavit showing lawful taking, for sealing within 90 days. Skins of blue foxes taken from the wild must be tagged by U. S. Commissioner before being sold.

SHIPMENT AND EXPORT: No restrictions on shipment or expert of skins legally taken, but no person engaged in fur farming, or in the fur trade as a dealer or agent, shall passess or transport furs without a license. Packages containing furs must be marked to show contents and names and addresses of consignor and consignee, and shipper must deliver to freight agent or express agent, or postmaster, at shipping point a statement showing contents of package and that no illegal or unsealed skins are contained therein. Elue fox skins (other than those raised on farms having a registered brand and branded with such brand), whether acquired in Territory or imported, must be tagged (fee \$1.50) by U. S. Commissioner. Shipment of unsealed skins of beavers and martens prohibited.

LICENSES: Resident, \$2. Fur farm, \$2. Nonresident, general hunting and trapping, \$50. Alien, special, \$100. Fur dealers: (a) Resident, or association or copartnership of residents, \$10 for each individual; (b) Nonresident, citizen of United States, or corporation, association, or copartnership formed of citizens of United States, any member of which is a nonresident of Territory, \$100; (c) Alien individual, corporation, association, or copartnership, any member of which is an alien, \$500. Resident agent of (a), (b), or (c), \$10; nonresident citizen agent of (a), (b), or (c), \$100; alien agent of (a), (b), or (c), \$500. No license issued to an agent whose principal has not procured appropriate license.

LICENSES: Resident - license required, but no charge. Nonresident, \$25. Aliens not permitted to trap.

LICENSES: Resident, 12 or less traps, \$1.50; more than 12 traps, \$20; nonresident, \$50. Fur dealer: Resident, \$1; nonresident, \$25.

Beaver control work is handled by the State Game and Fish Commission except when the director deems it expedient to permit the taking of a specified number to protect property. Pelts taken under such permit must be delivered to the Commission, when permittee is paid if for each pelt in full of all his expenses.

POSSESSION AND SALE, SHIPMENT AND EXPORT: No restrictions on skins legally taken, except that green pelts may not be possessed after 30 days from close of open season except under permit. Shipments must bear trapper's name and license number and be tagged as may be required by Commission.

LICENSES: Resident, \$2; nonresident, \$25. Fur dealer: Resident, \$25; non-resident, \$50. Commission may require licensees to submit such reports as it deems necessary.

SHIPMENT AND EXPORT: Skins legally taken may be shipped and exported during open season and 30 days thereafter. Packages must show name and license number of trapper.

LICENSES: Resident (Statewide), \$25.50; county, \$3.25; county other than county of residence, \$10.50. License not required of resident Confederate veterans or other residents 65 years of age or over. Monresident, (Statewide), \$100.50; county, \$25.50. Applicants for licenses must report previous year's catch. Fur dealer: Resident, \$100 for each agent; nonresident, \$500, and \$100 for each resident or travelling agent. Dealers and buyers must report each two weeks the name of trapper from whom pelts are purchased, his license number, and number and kind of pelts purchased.

LICENSES: Resident, \$3; nonresident, \$25. Fur dealer: Resident, \$10 and \$5 for each agent; nonresident, \$200 and \$5 for each resident or travelling agent.

SHIPMENT AND EXPORT: No restrictions on skins legally taken.

No other restrictions on skins legally taken.

SHIPMENT AND EXPORT: No restrictions on skins legally taken, except shipments must be labeled to show contents and license must be exhibited to carrier.

LICENSES: Resident, \$1.50; nonresident, \$15.50. Fur buyer: Resident, \$10; nonresident, \$25; nonresident jobber to purchase from licensed buyers, \$10.

Licensed dealer may possess at any time hides lawfully acquired. Special permit required for sale of pelts to dealers outside of State. Green hides in process of manufacture may be possessed at any time. Dealers or buyers must, within 10 days after close of season, file with Conservation Commission sworn inventory showing number and kinds of skins purchased.

SHIPMENT AND EXPORT: See above. Skins of protected fur animals legally taken may be exported under permit during open season and first 10 days of close season.

LICENSES: Resident, 15 traps or less, \$1; more than 15, 15¢ per trap, including tag. Nonresident or alien, \$25, plus tag fee of 25¢ per trap. Fur dealers must be licensed - Communicate with Conservation Commission for information as to fees.

KANSAS

NOTE: State game warden is authorized, after investigation, to cause to be taken, under his supervision, as many beavers as he deems necessary for protection of property.

POSSESSION AND SALE: Skins legally taken may be possessed during first 10 days of close season. No other restrictions on possession and sale of skins legally taken.

SHIPMENT AND EXPORT: Skins may not be shipped except during open season and 10 days thereafter, but licensed dealers may make shipments out of season under permit.

LICHNSES: Resident, \$1. Nonresident not permitted to trap. Fur dealer: Resident, \$10. Nonresident, \$25.
