It has been demonstrated that market-garden crops of the best quality are those which are grown under conditions which permit of a continuous and rapid development. Any delay in the growth of a lettuce or radish causes that sharp and pungent flavor of the former and the bitterness and toughened fibre of the latter, beets become stringy, etc. Plant food of the right amount and kind controls the yield and quality of market-garden products more than

any other condition, and it is neither wise nor economical to depend upon the natural condition of the soil or the application of stable manure only for profitable crops.

### VAUGHAN'S LAWN AND GARDEN FERTILIZER

Formula 3-12-4, meaning 3 per cent ammonia, 12 per cent phosphoric acid, 4 per cent potash. A very desirable high grade all around fertilizer. There is sufficient ammonia to give the young plants a quick and vigorous start and maintain a healthy growth. Grass and early garden truck need lots of phosphoric acid, which this supplies. For lawns, make first application in the early spring when frost is out of the ground, distribute evenly 25 pounds of fertilizer to every 1,000 square feet of lawn. In seeding down a new lawn, scatter double the amount, 50 pounds of fertilizer in every 1,000 square feet; rake thoroughly, then sow seed.

Remove the lumps before using and break them up, which can be done by pounding. Use as a top-dressing at the rate of 100 lbs. per acre on the following vegetables, when plants are well established: Beets, Cabbage, Cauliflower, Cucumber, Celery, Egg Plant, Lettuce, Spinach; Onions.

For Asparagus, a top-dressing of 250 lbs. per acre just as soon as the first shoots make their appearance. For Strawberries, a top-dressing of about 100 lbs. per acre after the plants have blossomed.

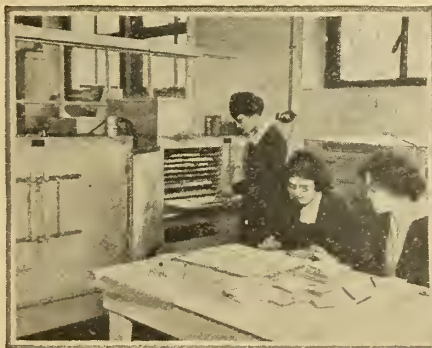

### Maintains Its Standards

While keeping up his supply of tried varieties, the seedsman must be ever on the lookout for new; and the house which values its reputation carefully avoids recommending novelties which have not been thoroughly proved. This requires extensive trial grounds. In Vaughan's seed farms in Michigan and Illinois, all novelties not proven on the grounds of the introducer are tested for one or more years before being catalogued, and here, also, seed of the old varieties are tried out year after year to make sure that our stocks are suffering no deterioration.

Here, also, we grow much of the seed we sell, of varieties for which the soil and climate are favorable. Peas, beans, melons, cucumbers, sweet corn and gladioli are grown on our Michigan farm.

At our greenhouses and nurseries at Western Springs, Ill., which supply our trade with indoor and outdoor flowering plants, the same expert care is exercised as in the seed departments.

## The Economical Seeder



A handy little tool which will be found useful and economical in sowing all fine seeds. It is made of zinc and measures 4 3/4 inches over all.

The instrument is small enough to be held in the palm of the hand and the amount of seed is controlled by a simple action of the thumb operating a slide regulating the flow of the seed. It has a capacity of one ounce of aster seed and more or less of other seed according to size. It is especially recommended for sowing finer flower seeds such as begonia, calceolaria, cineraria, by florists, and all the smaller vegetable and flower seeds in the garden.

### ANNUALS FOR FALL SOWING

Few know many of our prettiest and best known annuals may be sown in the fall, in fact some varieties, like the annual Larkspur, are much better, treated in this way. The principle is the one nature uses. Seed dropped from parent plants will lay dormant in the soil until early in the spring when it germinates and begins a root system long before one can get in the ground to sow seed. Consequently the flowering season is prolonged by the earlier blooming. Ground should be prepared and seed sown just previous to the late heavy frost—early in November.

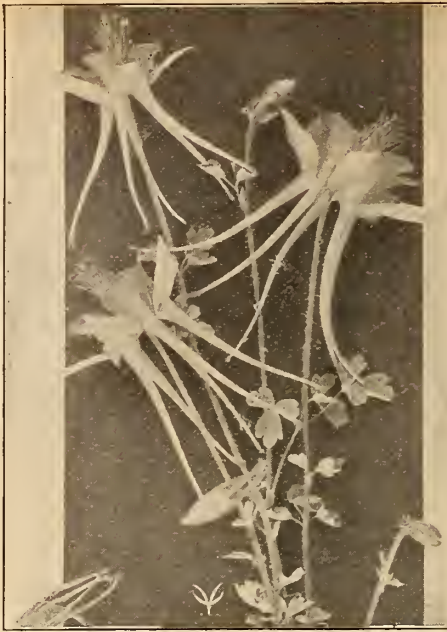

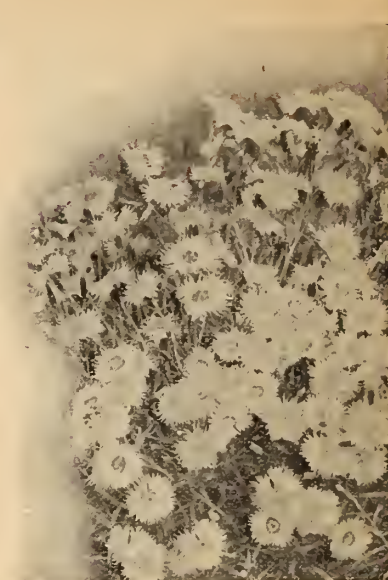




GYPSOPHILA—Paniculata Flore Pleno
