

FLOWERING BULBS

FOR FALL PLANTING.

They are not only certain to bloom abundantly, but are the easiest cared for of all flowers. The bulbs can be potted anytime from September to the middle of December, though the Earlier the Better. For the proper depth of planting and distance apart, follow the chart shown above. After planting, water well and place the pots or boxes in a cool, dark cellar, or similar place for four or five weeks. This treatment is to develop a strong growth of roots, which is very necessary to secure vigorous flower stalks, during this period, if the soil shows signs of dryness, it should be watered, when the shoots begin to show signs of life, bring into a light sunny window, water frequently and give plenty of fresh air. Only moderate heat is required, avoid a high and close temperate.

Please Bear In Mind. That all Bulbs offered in this catalogue must be secured and planted in the fall, they cannot be supplied in the spring.

HOW TO "HEEL IN" OVER WINTER.

To insure success, select a dry spot where no water will stand during Winter, having no grass near to invite mice. Dig a trench deep enough to admit one layer of roots, and sloping enough to permit the trees to lie at an angle of not more than 30 degrees with the ground. Having placed one layer of roots in this trench, cover them with mellow earth extending well upon the bodies, and see that this is firmly packed. Then add another layer of trees, over-lapping the first, continuing as at first until all are heeled in. As soon as this is done, cover tops so well with evergreen boughs that they will be thoroughly protected from winds. Roses and other small stock may will be thoroughly protected from winds. Roses and other small stock may be wholly covered with earth.

They are quite hardy and all the winter protection they need is a little brush or straw to keep the snow from pressing too heavily upon them. If you want Pansy blooms early in the spring. TRY THIS PLAN.
