CEE Region Highlights



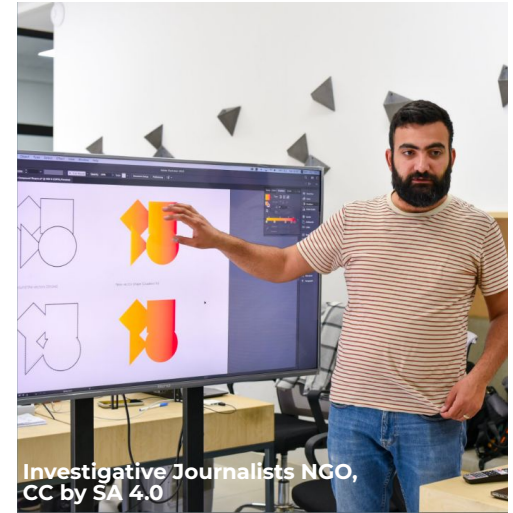
Opening of Senaki WikiClub, **Wikimedia Georgia User Group**

Senaki community was provided training skills and computing equipment for independent editing on Georgian Wikimedia projects. Fifth WikiClub supported in Georgia.



Senior WikiCity, **Wikimedia Czech Republic**

Older adults supported to document cultural and natural monuments in Olomouc. Connected to Seniors Write Wikipedia and Dny Evropského Dědictví (European Heritage Days)



Illustration/animation training, **Investigative Journalists NGO**

Students learning to design images and animations for Armenian Wikipedia that increase the overall quality and accessibility of the most viewed educational content.

But what is eligible? (A lot!)

- Some examples of activities:
 - Affiliate programmatic plans
 - Local events connected to campaigns
 - Conferences (local, regional, international)
 - Empirical research supporting Wikimedia projects or communities



But what is eligible? (A lot!)

- Examples of expenses:
 - Temporary working space, services, prizes, outreach, and other common costs for meetups, edit-a-thons, contests, photowalks, and campaigns.
 - Data costs to support access to online events
 - Travel for organizers and event participants
 - Some equipment/technology needs with a plan for maintenance and sharing with your community
 - Rent and utility costs for organizations with dedicated office space



But what is eligible? (A lot!)

- Examples of expenses:
 - Compensation for well-defined roles that do not replace volunteer activities in your Wikimedia community, such as:
 - project management
 - graphic design
 - software development time
 - training
 - childcare services
 - translation
 - speaker fees/honoraria
 - Wikimedian-in-Residence roles



We're open to funding beyond these examples.

It's important for us to understand your specific context and
situational needs.

The Alliances Fund, for mission-aligned organizations in underrepresented communities who want to collaborate and amplify our work.

Wikimedia Community Fund

Rapid Fund

Short-term, low-cost projects by individuals, groups, or organizations contributing to Wikimedia projects.

This program is comparable to the previous Rapid Grants program.

Conference & Event Fund

Funding and planning support to groups, individuals or organizations to organize local, regional, and thematic conferences that bring together Wikimedians for experience sharing, skill building, and networking. This program is comparable to the previous Conference & Events Grant program.

2 months processing time; average funding amount:
10,000 - 90,000 USD

General Support Fund

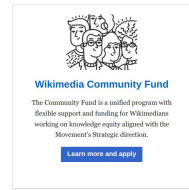
Flexible general operating support for individuals, groups, or affiliates that have developed larger projects or programs or a strategic plan that requires sustained investment over time to be able to achieve its goals. Multi-year grant funding is available if appropriate to the goals and objectives of the applicant. This program is comparable to the previous Simple Annual Plan Grant, Annual Plan Grant, and Project Grant programs.

2 months processing time; average funding amount:
10,000 - 300,000 USD

Wikimedia Community Fund



- **Who should apply?**
 - If you've received funds from the Foundation before (e.g. Rapid Grants, Project Grants, Annual Plan Grants)
 - If you are an affiliate, group of Wikimedia volunteers, or an individual Wikimedia organizer / contributor
 - Rapid Funds encouraged for first-time applicants.
- **Unrestricted funding:** Grantees have discretion in reallocating funding based on changing priorities or circumstances.



Wikimedia Alliances Fund



- **Who should apply?**

- Non-Wikimedia organizations that are aligned with movement values and principles
- Have some prior experience working with a Wikimedia affiliate or community.
- Organizations that work in communities that are underrepresented in the Wikimedia movement.



Wikimedia Alliances Fund



- Activities and expenses that can be funded through the Community Fund are also eligible here.
- Rapid Funds and General Support Funds are available.
 - Applications are similar to Wikimedia Community Fund.
- Unrestricted funding: Grantees have discretion in reallocating funding based on changing priorities or circumstances.


