No accession was made to the numbers of the Institution during the year 1776. On the 6th April, in that year, an order was issued by the Committee of Public Safety, directing the Treasurer to prepare the College buildings, within eight days, for the reception of the military. The students, in consequence, retired to their respective homes, and, the Library and apparatus having been deposited for safe keeping in the City Hall, the College edifice was converted into a Military Hospital. At the close of the Revolutionary war, by virtue of an act of the State Legislature, dated May 1st, 1784, certain persons, named therein, were appointed to superintend the general interests of Education throughout the State, under the title of *Regents of the University*: these acted also as Trustees of the College. On the 13th April, 1787, an act of the Legislature was passed, confirming the Royal Charter, altering the name of the Institution to *Columbia College*, and appointing a new Board of Trustees. The government of the College has been administered in conformity with the last mentioned act unto the present time.

The first public commencement after the re-organization of the College was held A. D. 1786.
