Referenced report of SA CLABURN T. WHITE contains information concerning crime conditions at Hot Springs, Ark.

The period shown in this report reflects dates of investigation and file reviews since receipt of Bureau airtel. The dates of previous interviews and investigation conducted are not included in period of this report.

Extensive investigation has been conducted at Hot Springs, Arkansas, concerning the gambling activity to determine if those individuals involved are in violation of the new Federal legislation regarding interstate gambling activities.

Cases have been opened on the three larger gambling clubs in relation to cashing of out-of-state checks at casinos and investigation instituted as the USA, Fort Smith, Ark., has advised this may be in violation of Federal law.

There was an influx of casino employees to Hot Springs from other states seeking employment in the casinos during the horse race meet at Hot Springs which commenced on 2/17/62. Numerous cases have been opened on these individuals traveling interstate. The USA has indicated this is possibly a violation.
