MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD:

SUBJECT: Status of Certain Eighth Army Requisitions at SFPE

1. By informal note, Eighth Army G-4 (Capt Amende) forwarded a copy of telecon items between 8th Army and SFPE (attached hereto). SFPE queried 8th Army as to the percentages of items currently on requisitions FM 308, 310, 311, 317, 323 thru 326 FJ 390, 393, 394 and 395 (all for automotive spare parts for BIG 5) which are required for issue to ROK forces, and in addition, queried as to whether foreign aid appropriations applied to reimbursement therefore. SFPE stated above requisitions would be suspended pending a reply.

2. Eighth Army requests CINCFE aid in straightening SFPE out (since items are required). It is the opinion of G-4 that the SFPE queries as outlined above, should be answered by Eighth Army by telecon, substantially as follows:

a. It should be pointed out that 100% of the items on above requisitions will support Korean effort (U. S. and ROK).

b. Impossible to give exact percentage of each item which will eventually be used in direct support of ROK forces, however, believed that approximately 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ % of the total of each line item requisitioned would be a good "across-the-board" estimate. Firm info as to amounts actually issued to ROK can be furnished when available here.

c. Understand here that Foreign Aid Appropriation (M D A P ?) does not apply to supplies and equipment being furnished ROK Forces under present emergency. It is belief of the 8th Army and CINCFE that the provisions of Part II, DA msg W 84654, 30 June 50 are applicable and contain the answers to the SFPE query in this regard.

d. In view of above, request suspension of supply action on subject requisitions be lifted immediately as items are required to support combat effort in Korea.

3. Eighth Army was informally advised CINCFE concurrence on above reply could be indicated in telecon to SFPE.

4. No further action by G-4 necessary. Initiated case.

- b. Proposed reply reference (a) submitted by Eighth Army 28 June 1950.
- c. Radio CG Eighth Army EX 43120 OV dated 5 July 1950.
- d. Radio CG Eighth Army EX 43124 OV dated 5 July 1950.

2. Reference (a) indicated the loss of confidence on the part of the D/A, particularly Office, Chief of Ordnance, due to what appeared to be excessive requisitioning for automotive parts in connection with vehicle rebuild program. Reference (b) attempted to restore this loss of confidence and indicated certain controls were being established in the automotive stock control field.

3. References (c) and (d) appear to indicate that emergency requisitions are being placed on the ZI which may again cause misunderstanding due to lack of information regarding FEC contemplated operations or full detail justification of requirements for items being requisitioned. This may create a situation similar to that referred to in reference (a):

- a. For example: Reference (c) requests shipment of 40 Army aircraft in anticipation of increased requirements. From records available, this office, there appears to be sufficient reserve of light aircraft to support contemplated operation in the immediate future. Suggest consideration be given to providing full clarification as to whether requisition is for routine replacement requirements to sustain in combat existing authorized allowance or is for a Class IV operational project requiring an increase in allowance to sustain a contemplated operational project.

Subj: Excessive Requisitioning on the zone of interior.

(b) Reference (d) requests 2000 each kit deep water fording Universal. There are on hand 430 such kits and in view of their limited use the number requested appears to be excessive. Again suggest clarification between routine requisitioning to sustain existing authorized allowance and requisition for Class IV operational projects to meet requirements for special contemplated projects or operations.

4. It is suggested that all requisitions be carefully scrutinized and based on firm operational plans and requirements. The priority requested should be carefully studied and reviewed, then clearly indicated in each requisition so as to avoid any misunderstanding. If the 40 Army aircraft, reference (c) are for routine resupply to sustain for combat the existing authorized allowance plus maintenance float and 60 day Depot Level of Supply, the requisition should so indicate. To assist the SFPOE in processing supply action it might well be downgraded in its security classification. On the other hand, if the U. S. Army aircraft are required for special project in connection with approved or contemplated operation the requisition should so indicate and not be down graded. Similar action is indicated for 2000 water proofing kits requisitioned in reference (d). This suggested refinement in requisition procedure is recommended in order to avoid unnecessary criticism by the Office, Chief of Ordnance or the D/A.

1. C/N 1 from G-2 is recommendation that authority be granted to CG RYCOM for requisitioning "AGGRESSOR" equipment. Reference is made to a letter Office Chief of Army Field Forces, file ATFAC-INT 400/74 (31 May 49) subj "Aggressor Uniform, Simulation Equipment and Ammunition", 31 May 1949 addressed to ZI installation; CINCFE was not an addressee to the above quoted letter and it is understood that the copies which are available locally were obtained informally by individual officers. This letter outlines methods for ZI installations to obtain aggressor uniforms, equipment and ammunition.

2. This type of training equipment is not obtained through normal supply channels but is requisitioned through the chiefs of the several tech services or the appropriate school and in some instances to the Ground General School Center, Fort Riley.

3. G-4 has no objection to RYCOM requisitioning for the desired aggressor equipment and suggests that G-2 inform CG RYCOM of this decision.

4. Instant C/N 2 to G-2 accomplishes above action. This action within established policy.

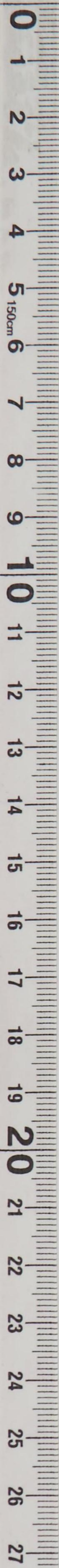



2. The purpose of this letter is to propose methods of implementing the subject publication within the Far East Command, to obtain the necessary changes of Far East Command Operations Instructions to conform thereto and to obtain authority for requisitioning maintenance parts and end items for "exchange and repair cycle stocks"

3. The subject publication and reference 1c operate to charge the Commanding General, Far East Air Forces, with an additional responsibility of depot maintenance of all Signal Corps equipment in possession of, or in use by, FEAF units which is for "repair and return to user". The responsibility for "repair and return to Signal Depot Stock" remains with the Army. Responsibilities for organizational and field maintenance are not altered by the subject publication nor are any changes in the supply sources for Air Force Bases dictated. As prescribed by par 1c, subject publication, all echelons of maintenance for meteorological and photographic equipment will be performed by the using service.

Letter AG 300.3 SUP-4-S, To CINCPAC, subj: "Implementation of Joint Army-Air Force Publication SR-750-405-5 and AFR 65-15, dated 1 April 1949"

4. Due to the distance of Air Force units in MARBO from Air Force depot facilities, the nominal amount of equipment involved, and the fact that Army units in the Philippine Islands will be supported by the 24th Air Depot Wing (PHILAIRCOM), it is believed to be in the best interests of the National Military Establishment to continue support of Air Force units in MARBO by the MARBO Signal Depot on a reciprocal basis. Accordingly, it is recommended that depot maintenance responsibility for Signal Corps equipment, except Meteorological and Photographic, within the Far East Command be assigned as follows:

a. Philippine Islands. All depot maintenance for both Army and Air Force Units to be accomplished by the 24th Air Depot Wing (PHILAIRCOM), Clark Air Force Base.

b. Marianas-Bonins. All depot maintenance for both Army and Air Force units to be accomplished by the MARBO Signal Depot.

c. Japan and Okinawa. Depot Maintenance for "repair and return to Air Force user" to be accomplished by 13th Air Depot Wing, FEAMCOM AFB. All other depot maintenance to be accomplished by Eighth Army or RYCOM as appropriate.

5. Reference par 1c, subject publication, recommend that meteorological and photographic equipment be supported with depot maintenance at such places and in accordance with procedures determined by your headquarters for FEC Army units and by the Commanding General, Far East Air Materiel Command, for FEAF units.

6. To enable fulfillment of the responsibility outlined in par 4c above, request authority be granted for the 13th Air Depot Wing to obtain and maintain a sixty (60) day level of maintenance parts from Eighth Army. In accordance with reference 1e and 1f above, the 24th Air Depot Wing (PHILAIRCOM) has adequate authority for obtaining maintenance parts from the San Francisco Port of Embarkation.

7. This headquarters proposes to obtain and items required for "exchange and repair cycle stocks" for the two (2) Air Depot Wings from the Air Force share of allocated items within the Far East Command, from excesses available at Far East Command Signal Depots, and the remainder from the ZI through Air Force channels (see reference 1d).

8. It is proposed that the depot maintenance responsibility be assumed by the 13th Air Depot Wing as rapidly as the personnel and maintenance parts buildup permits and, in any event, assumption to be com-

1. Concur generally in the proposed maintenance policy implementation as set forth in basic correspondence. However, it is pointed out that plans for the Signal Corps base maintenance shops at Marianas-Bonine Command are not firm and, dependent upon future developments, an alternate provision may have to be established in this area.

2. Present maintenance responsibilities in the Far East Command will remain in effect until notification is received that Air Force organizations are capable of assuming the responsibility for repair of Signal Corps equipment as outlined in SR 750-405-5 and AFR 65-15, 1 April 1949, or until 1 July 1950, whichever is earlier.

3. Upon assumption of responsibilities as outlined in Regulation cited in paragraph 2, Air Force depot maintenance organizations are authorized to maintain a sixty (60) day level of maintenance parts required. Authority for requisitioning maintenance parts, pending the assignment of these responsibilities, is set forth in radio ZX 29363, Commander-in-Chief, Far East, 18 November 1947.

4. Request that Eighth Army be forwarded at the earliest practicable date, information as to the maintenance parts levels to be established and repair cycle stock required.

MAINTENANCE OF SUPPLIES AND EQUIPMENT

SIGNAL CORPS EQUIPMENT PROCURED BY DEPARTMENT OF THE ARMY FOR DEPARTMENT
OF THE AIR FORCE

1. The following agreements, in accordance with provisions of paragraph 2, JAAFAR 4-11-1, are announced for the information and guidance of all concerned:

a. The Department of the Air Force will be responsible for the accomplishment of all Air Force echelons of maintenance of all Signal Corps procured equipment in possession of or in use by the Department of the Air Force for return to user and for maintenance of exchange and repair cycle stocks. The Department of the Air Force will budget for all personnel, facilities, supplies and equipment necessary to accomplish this maintenance function.

b. The Signal Corps, Department of the Army, will be responsible for the accomplishment of base maintenance for return to supply stocks of all Signal Corps equipment procured for the Department of the Air Force. The Department of the Army will budget for all personnel, facilities, supplies and equipment necessary to accomplish this maintenance function.

c. All echelons of maintenance for meteorological and photographic equipment will be performed and budgeted for by the using Department.

2. JAAFAR 4-45-1 will not be construed as amending or modifying JAAFAR 4-11-1, as changed, or the above agreements.

3. Both Departments immediately will initiate procedures designed to complete implementation of the above agreements not later than 1 July 1950.
