


Early Arrivals of 1920 Dutch Bulbs

S we go to press one-third of our Dutch Bulbs are rolling west from New York, the earliest arrival date of this stock for many years, if not a record. There is now competition in ocean freights and service from Holland equal to pre-war years. Dutch growers advanced their prices again this year, on many twenty per cent. While some concessions were made in grading and occasional discounts, the average cost to the American importer will be fully 12 per cent above 1919 for strictly best Florist Forcing Grades, and we use no others.

The prices we make for you here are, we believe, reasonable under present importing costs and freights. If, as may be possible, you find any of our prices out of line ask us for quality explanations or possible revision.

These bulbs were refused permits by the French Inspectors under the rules submitted to them by the Federal Horticulture Board under Quarantine 37 although there was no proof that these bulbs carried anything worse than Eelworms already well known and widely distributed in the United States.

This season a few cases have been admitted, presumably these lots did not contain the old and common eel worm.
