MERCURY will be *Evening Star* until June 25; it will then be *Morning Star* until April 1; after which it will be the *Evening Star* until Sep. 21; after that *Morning Star* until Nov. 16; it will then be *Evening Star* to the close of the year.

VENUS will be *Evening Star* from Sep. 25, 1863, to July 13; after which it will be *Morning Star* to the close of the year.

MARS will be *Evening Star* until April 21; after which it will be *Morning Star* until Nov. 29; it will then be *Evening Star* to the close of the year.

JUPITER will be *Morning Star* until May 13; after which it will be *Evening Star* until Nov. 26; after that it will be *Morning Star* to the close of the year.

SATURN will be *Morning Star* until April 6; after which it will be *Evening Star* until Oct. 10; and after that *Morning Star* to the close of the year.

ECLIPSES.

There will be two Eclipses this year—both of the Sun.

1. Thursday, May 5. A total Eclipse of the Sun, invisible in Nova Scotia; but will be seen in the North Pacific Ocean, California, and in the North Western part of North America.

II. Sunday, October 30. A total Eclipse of the Sun, invisible in all parts of British North America; but will be seen in the South Atlantic Ocean, and in all parts of South America. It will be partial at the Cape of Good Hope.

Eclipses take place every half year, and at each period, there may be one, two, or three; if only one it must be an eclipse of the Sun. When the earth becomes situated between the Sun and the Moon, the latter must be covered with darkness, and there will be an eclipse of the Moon, which will be total or partial, according as the Moon plunges wholly or in part into the cone of the shadow—it will be central, if the centre of the Moon coincides exactly with that of the terrestrial shadow. A total eclipse of the Moon never exceeds two hours, and may be shorter than that period.

When the Moon interposes herself between the Sun and the earth, the former may be eclipsed. The eclipse is partial when the Moon hides only a part of the Sun's disk; total, when she covers the whole of it; annular when the Sun, masked by the Moon, projects all round in the form of a luminous ring; lastly, it is central when the spectator's place is in the prolongation of the line joining the centres of the Sun and Moon.

The Moon being nearly of the same figure as the earth, her shadow and her penumbra are formed in the same manner; only as she is much smaller, her cone of shadow can never cover more than a portion of the earth's surface. A solar eclipse never takes place at the same time all over the earth, and the same eclipse of the Sun, which is total for one point on the earth, may be invisible at another. In most solar eclipses, the Moon's disk is clothed with a faint light, proceeding from the reflection caused by the illuminated part of the earth.

To produce either a solar or a lunar eclipse, the new or full moon must be in the act of crossing the sun's annual track. This point of crossing is called the *moon's node*, and became, therefore, an object of the deepest interest. Long and careful scrutiny revealed the fact of its movement around the ecliptic, in a period of 18 years and 11 days, during which time there occur 223 new moons, or 223 full moons. If, then, a new moon falls on the sun's track to produce a solar eclipse to-day, at the expiration of 223 lunations, again will the new moon fall on the ecliptic, and an eclipse will surely take place. Suppose, then, that all the eclipses which occur within this remarkable period of 223 lunations are carefully observed, and the days on which they fall recorded, on each and every one of these days, during the next period of 223 lunations, eclipses may be expected, and their coming foretold. This wonderful period of 18 years and 11 days, or 223 lunations, was known to the Chaldeans, and by its use eclipses were predicted, more than 3000 years ago. It is likewise found among the Hindoos, the Chinese, and the Egyptians, nations widely separated on the earth's surface, and suggesting the idea that it had its origin among a people even anterior to the Chaldeans. Let it not be supposed that the application of the Chaldean period or *Zares* to the prediction of eclipses, can in any way supersede modern methods. While antiquity contented itself with announcing the *day* on which the dark body of the moon should hide the sun, modern science points to the exact *second* on the dial, which shall mark the first delicate contact of the moon's edge with the brilliant disc of the sun.

EXPLANATION OF THE CALENDAR PAGES.

LEFT HAND PAGE.

Column

- 1 and 2—Days of the Month and of the Week.
- 3 “ 4—The rising and setting in *mean time* of the highest point, or of the *upper limb* of the Sun, corrected for refraction.
- 5—The Sun's declination for the same as the Equation, 6th column.
- 6—Equation of time, (or quantity by which the Sun is *slow* or *fast* of the clock at noon, apparent, not mean, time at Greenwich.) Equation of time is the difference between *mean* and *apparent* time. There are only four periods of the year when this difference is nothing, namely,—about April 15, June 15, September 1, and December 24, as may be seen by referring to this column.
- 7—Length of days in hours and minutes.
- 8—The rising of the Moon.
- 9—The setting of the Moon.
- 10—The time of the Moon's southing, or passing the meridian. This column also gives the time of high water at Parrsboro', Horton, Cornwallis, Hantsport, Windsor, Newport, Truro, &c.
- 11—The Moon's place in the Signs or Constellations of the Zodiac.

The top of the columns of each month gives the Moon's Phases, or times of New and Full Moon, and of the First and Last Quarters, or quadratures of the Sun.

The FARMER'S CALENDAR is placed at the foot of the columns of each month.

RIGHT HAND PAGE.

- 1—The days of the Month.
- 2—Sundays, Weather, Anniversaries, &c.
- 3—The time of High Water at Halifax, N. S.
- 4— “ “ Pietou, N.S. and Cape Tormentine, N. B.
- 5— “ “ Annapolis, N. S.; St. John, N. B., and Portland, Maine.
- 6— “ “ St. John's, Newfoundland, of that tide which immediately precedes the southing of the Moon. These four columns are computed on the supposition that the time of High Water on the days of the New and Full Moon—*L'establissement du port*—is at Halifax, 7h. 30m.; at Annapolis, St. John, N. B. and Portland, 11h. 14m.; at Pietou and Cape Tormentine, 10h.; and at St. John's, Newfoundland, 6h. 30m.

All the calculations are made to mean solar time.

Explanation of "Time and the Calendar," will be found at the top of the columns of each month.

 ○ New Moon, 9th d., 3h. 31m. morning, below the horizon.

A work-shop with tools is indispensable for every farm. The owner should supply himself with a complete list of all implements. A place should be provided for every one, and every one should be in its place; and on every rainy or stormy day, an examination should be made and repairs promptly performed. Tools should be kept constantly in order, as a standing rule, and not to be left broken till wanted for use. This is still more important, if they are to be sent to the village mechanic: for if taken in time the errand may cost much less than to wait till the moment required for actual use, and then to take a horse from the plough or from a hay-waggon, to send three or more miles for a trifling but necessary repair.

TIME AND THE CALENDAR.

THE reader who has been conversant only with the many fine sentimental things which the poets have written respecting Old time, will, perhaps find some difficulty in bringing down his mind to the calmer consideration of what time really is, and according to what different standards it is measured for different purposes. Anything, or any event which takes place at equal intervals, may become a measure of time. Thus, the pulsations of the wrist, the beating of a pendulum, and the revolution of a star, have been severally employed as measures of time. A *day* is the period of the revolution of the earth on its axis,

Kitchen toils and domestic cares are extremely oppressive on many excellent women, especially among farmers' wives, who are frequently worn down and bent under premature old age at middle life. There are many who are compelled to rise at dawn, and commence a routine, which only closes late in the evening—and even then rest does not come, when the care of young children, and possibly of sick ones, precludes in a great measure the wholesome and refreshing repose of sleep. It requires a stout constitution for a woman to wash, iron, mend, scour, bake, milk, churn, sweep, cook three meals daily, as often wash dishes, and go through other routines for supplying daily food, besides the care of young children, whose endless wants are a continued interruption to all other operations,—without soon being broken down by these ceaseless toils. Every farmer should therefore seek to relieve the condition of the women.

so a year is the period of the revolution of the earth around the sun. This time which constitutes the *astronomical year*, has been ascertained with great exactness, and found to be 365 days 5 hours 48 minutes and 51 seconds. Julius Caesar, who was distinguished alike for the variety and extent of his knowledge, and his skill in arms, first attempted to make the calendar conform to the motions of the sun. Aided by Sosigenes, an Egyptian astronomer, he made the first correction of the calendar, by introducing an additional day every fourth year, making February to consist of 29 instead of 28 days, and of course the whole year to consist of 366 days. This fourth year was called *Bissextile*, because the sixth day before the kalends of March was reckoned twice. It is also called Leap year. The Julian year was introduced into all the civilised nations that submitted to the Roman power, and continued in general use until the year 1582. The true correction was not 6 hours,

but 5 hours 49 minutes, hence the addition was too great by 11 minutes. This small fraction would amount in 100 years to three-fourths of a day, and in 1000 years to more than 7 days. From 325 to 1582, it had, in fact, amounted to more than 10 days; for in 325, the vernal equinox fell on the 21st of March, whereas, in 1582, it fell on the 11th. It was ordered by the Council of Nice, a celebrated ecclesiastical council, held in the year 325, that Easter should be celebrated upon the first Sunday after the first full moon next following the vernal equinox; and as certain other festivals were appointed at particular seasons of the year, confusion would result from such a want of constancy between any fixed date and a particular season of the year. Pope Gregory XIII., who was then at the head of the Roman See, was a man of science,

No fruit will more certainly grow under adverse treatment than the currant. Planted under the fence of a neglected and weedy garden, or enveloped in tall grass, and never pruned, currant bushes still continue to afford yearly crops. But these crops are very puny fruit—such as they are, how ever, they are better than the owners deserve, who ought to be willing to devote to them a small share of the cultivation which other crops receive. For no fruit is more improved under right management than the currant. Berries have been known to be increased at least 10 to 12 times in size by pruning, manuring and cultivation. The currant is propagated by cuttings. The bushes will grow in any good soil.

and undertook to reform the calendar, so that fixed days would always correspond to the same seasons of the year. He first decreed that the year should be first brought forward 10 days, by reckoning the 5th October the 15th; and in order to prevent the calendar from falling into confusion afterwards, he prescribed the following rule:—*Every year whose number is not divisible by four, without a remainder, consists of 365 days; every year which is so divisible, but is not divisible by 100, of 366; every year divisible by 100, but not by 400, again, of 365; and every year divisible by 400, of 366.* Thus the year 1850, not being divisible by 4, contains 365 days, while 1852 and 1856 are Leap years. Yet, to make every fourth year consist of 366 days would increase it too much, by about three-fourths of a day in a century; therefore every hundredth year has only 365 days. Thus

A well conducted farm is a beautiful machine. If well conducted every part will move on noiselessly but efficiently—all will be promptly done in its season, there will be no confusion, and a great deal will be accomplished. A badly managed farm, on the contrary if not wholly neglected, will be hurry and disorder, with everything out of joint, and very little will be done. The farmer must know at the start what he is going to do. His yearly operations must be distinctly before him. It will not be profitable for him to stop and consider, and plan, after a piece of work is partly executed. He must begin at the beginning—must have his fields well laid out, his rotation digested—and the extent of each crop prescribed.

In 1752 the *Gregorian calendar*, or the *new style*, was established in Great Britain by act of Parliament. By the same act the beginning of the year was changed from March 25 to January 1. At present none follow the Julian calendar in Europe, but the Russians and the Greek Church. In order, therefore, to make their dates correspond to ours, we must add to them 12 days. The week is another division of time, of the highest antiquity, which in almost all countries has been made to consist of 7 days,—a period supposed by some to have been traditionally derived from the creation of the world; while others imagine it to have

The common year begins and ends on the same day of the week; but leap year ends one day later than it began. 52 weeks contain 364 days; if, therefore, the year begins on Tuesday, for example, we should complete 52 weeks on Monday, leaving one day (Tuesday) to complete the year, and the following year would begin on Wednesday. Hence, any day of the month is one day later in the week than the corresponding day of the preceding year. Thus, if the 16th of November, 1838, falls on Friday, the 16th November, 1837, fell on Thursday, and will fall, in 1839, on Saturday. But if leap year begins on Sunday, it ends on Monday, and the following year begins on Tuesday; while any given day of the month is two days later in the week than the corresponding date of the preceding year.

Much as has been written on the advantages of draining, its importance is not yet fully appreciated. It is a strong argument for draining, that it relieves the ground of surplus water early in spring, and so enables the work of the farmer and gardener to commence earlier than it otherwise could. It also makes that easier and pleasanter. When the ground is undrained, it becomes dry except by evaporation, or by the oozing away of water, through a long reach of stiff soil into some natural drain. Meanwhile, the farmer must sit with folded hands in comparative idleness, knowing that by the time his land becomes dry, his soil will accumulate and press upon him with a burden he can hardly



this is an artificial period not marked off, like the sidereal day, by any natural event, it is necessary to know how much is to be added to, or subtracted from, the apparent solar time, in order to give the corresponding mean time. The interval, by which apparent time differs from mean time, is called the *equation of time*. If one clock is so constructed as to keep exactly with the sun, going faster or slower, according as the lengths of the solar days vary, and another clock is regulated to mean time, then the difference of the two clocks, at any period, would be the equation of time for that moment. If the apparent clock be *faster* than the mean, then the equation of time must be subtracted; but if the apparent clock be *slower* than the mean, then the equation of time must be added, to give the mean time. The two clocks would differ most about the 3rd of

The fact that the soil may be largely exhausted of its elements of fertility, and, in a measure, worn out, will scarcely be disputed while there are so many farms which have come, by long and provident culture, to give less and less return of crops, year by year. Nor will it be denied that our best land can be over-cultivated and mismanaged, for it is well known that much of this comparatively sterile land was once richly productive, giving for many years without manures or careful culture, very large and profitable crops. It has been found that the best soils, if long cultivated in grain, and not being in meadow or pasture at times, or receiving periodical dressings of manure, must thus wear out.

November, when the apparent time is 16 $\frac{1}{4}$ minutes greater than the mean. But since apparent time is sometimes greater and sometimes less than mean time, the two must obviously be sometimes equal to each other. This is the case four times in the year, viz.: April 15, June 15, September 1, and December 24. The time of the earth's revolution on its axis, is called a sidereal day, and is determined by the revolution of a star in the heavens. This interval is divided into 24 sidereal hours. Observation taken on numerous stars in different ages of the world, show that they all perform their diurnal revolution in the same time, and that their motion, during any part of the revolution, is always uniform. Here, then, we have an exact measure of time, probably more exact than anything which can be devised by art. *Solar time* is reck-

Experience has thousands of times demonstrated the fact, that if originally fertile soil is cropped year after year, and the produce annually removed, and no returns made to the land in the form of manure, the soil will, sooner or later, become nearly sterile. The reason of this is so obvious that all understand it. Experience has also thousands of times proved that the same impoverished field may be restored to its original fertility by a liberal and judicious use of farm yard or other manures.

oned by the apparent revolution of the sun from the meridian round to the meridian again. Were the sun stationary in the heavens, like a fixed star, the time of its apparent revolution would be equal to the revolution of the earth on its axis, and the *solar* and the *sidereal* days would be equal. But, since the sun passes from west to east, through 365 $\frac{1}{4}$ days, it moves eastward nearly one degree a day. While, therefore, the earth is turning round on its axis, the sun is moving in the same direction, so that, when we have come round under the same celestial meridian from which we started, we do not find the sun there, but it has moved eastward nearly a degree, and the earth must perform so much more than one complete revolution, before we come under the sun again. Now, since we move, in the diurnal revolution, 15 degrees in 60 minutes, we must pass over one degree in 4 minutes. It takes, therefore, 4 minutes

Few turkey-breeders are aware of the superior advantages of taining old birds for breeding purposes. The most of our farmers dispose of their old turkeys, as they call them, every fall, while in fact at least two years before they have reached their maturity and just so long before they have arrived at the best age for breeding purposes. Old hen turkeys do not lay as early in the season nor as many eggs as young birds, but the young chicks are so much stronger, hatched from the eggs of the old bird, that with ordinary care, more young as well as better, will be raised in a season than the old hens. Select the earliest hatched, largest and best for turkeys for breeding purposes.

for us to overtake the sun, after we have made one complete revolution. Hence, the solar day is about 4 minutes longer than the sidereal; and if we were to reckon the *sidereal* day 24 hours, we should reckon the *solar* day 24 hours 4 minutes. To suit the ordinary purposes of society, however, it is found more convenient to reckon the solar day 24 hours, and throw the fraction into the sidereal day. It may seem very remarkable that so much pains should have been bestowed upon this subject; but without a correct and uniform standard of time, the dates of deeds, commissions and all legal papers; of fasts and festivals, appointed by ecclesiastical authority; the returns of seasons, and the records of history—must fall into inextricable confusion. To change the observance of certain religious feasts, which have been long fixed to particular days,

Although the ancient Grecian calendar was extremely defective yet the common people were entirely averse to its reformation. Their superstitious adherence to these errors was satirised by Aristophanes, in his Comedy of the Clouds. An actor, who had just come from Athens, recounts that he met with Diana, or the Moon, and found her extremely incensed, that they did not regulate her course better. She complained that the order of nature was changed, and everything turned topsyturvy. The gods no longer knew what belonged to them; but, after paying their visits on certain feast days, and expecting to meet with good cheer, as

It is good economy to plough during the fall, clayey and other stiff soils. The furrow slices as left by the plough, are generally in a much better condition to be operated upon by the Winter's frost, than if they were harrowed fine and then rolled. Corn and other stubble ground intended for wheat, barley, or oats, the coming spring, according to the experience of some good farmers, should be well and deeply ploughed in the fall. Such land needs only the cultivator and harrow to prepare for sowing the grain, and the presumption is, a better crop of grain will be harvested than if the land was spring ploughed. A scarcity of heavy and wet backward springs sometimes puts the farmer so far in the back ground that he can scarcely "catch up" through the whole season.

usual, they were under the disagreeable necessity of returning back to the skies without their suppers! Among the Greeks and other nations, the length of the year was generally regulated by the course of the moon. But this disagreed with the annual revolution of the sun, which most evidently govern the seasons of the year, more than 11 days. The irregularities which such mode of reckoning would occasion, must have been too obvious not to have been observed. For, supposing it to have been settled, at any particular time, that the beginning of the year should be in the Spring; in about 16 years afterwards the beginning would have been in Autumn; and in 33 or 34 years it would have gone backwards through all the seasons to Spring again.

LIGHT HOUSES.

On the Coast of Nova Scotia; the Coast of New Brunswick in the Bay of Fundy; Cape Race, Nfld.; Gulf and River St. Lawrence; and Strait of Belle-Isle. West from Halifax.

MEAGHER'S BEACH—East side Halifax Harbour. *A fixed light.*

DEVIL'S ISLAND—An *Octagonal Light Beacon* on the S. W. point of the Devil's Island, at the entrance of the Eastern Passage to Halifax Harbour. Exhibits a *red light* on the seaward sides, to distinguish it from Sambro and Meagher's Beach lights; stands 45 feet above high water mark; rise and fall, 6 feet. The Tower painted dark brown, with a white Belt between the Balcony and Lantern, to distinguish it in day time.

SAMBRO ISLAND—Western entrance Halifax Harbour. *A fixed light.*

CROSS ISLAND—Entrance to Lunenburg Harbour. Two lights—*flash light above, fixed light below.*

IRON-BOUND-ISLAND LIGHT—Off the entrance to LaHave River. *A bright flash light*, of 29 seconds duration, followed by eclipses of thirty seconds. The lantern is placed on a square, wooden tower, painted *white*, on the Southern side of the Island, and is visible from all points of approach. Elevation 70 feet above sea level.

PORT MEDWAY—*Beacon Light* on Admiralty Head, west side of the entrance of the port. Building square, painted *white* with *black square* in the centre of the seaward sides,—a *white light*, 44 feet above sea level, and stands within 30 fathoms of the shore.

LIVERPOOL—South end of Collin's Island, off the entrance of the Harbour. *A plain revolving light*.

FORT POINT LIGHT, at the head of Liverpool Harbour. *A bright fixed light*, visible from all points of approach, and must be left on the larboard hand when entering the harbour.

GULL ROCK LIGHT, OFF THE ENTRANCE OF RAGGED ISLAND HARBOUR. Building square and painted *white*, exhibiting a *clear fixed light*, at an elevation of 51 feet above sea level, and is situated in lat. 43° 39' N., and long. 61° 66' W.

SHELburne—On McNutt's Island, off the entrance of the Harbour. *Two fixed lights*—one above the other.

BARRINGTON—On Baccaro Point, east side of the entrance to Barrington Harbour. *A flash light*, of thirty seconds.

CAPE SABLE ISLAND LIGHT—Building octagon, painted *white*. *A fixed red light*.

PUNICO HARBOUR LIGHT—*A Beacon light* on the S. E. side of the entrance to the Harbour, situated on the E. side of the entrance to the Bay of Fundy, about 13 miles northerly of Cape Sable. Building square, painted *white*. *A bright white light*, on the seaward side, 28 feet above high water level, (rise and fall 12 feet,) and stands fifty fathoms from low water mark. The point of each is bold.

FISH ISLAND LIGHT—At the entrance of Tusket River, S. W. coast of N. S. *Two clear fixed lights*, *horizontally*, seaward, (commencing Nov. 20, 1863.)

CAPE FORCHU LIGHT—On Cape Forchu, western side of the entrance to Yarmouth Harbour. *A plain revolving light*, visible one minute and a quarter, and invisible half a minute. Building painted *white*, elevated 135 feet above the level of the sea.

A Spar Buoy has been placed on the Budget Ledge, at the entrance of Cape Negro Harbour, on the N. E. side, half-way from the lower to the upper end of the Ledge, in six fathoms of water, and about 70 feet from the shoal water.

A FOG BELL has been erected on the E. Cape of Yarmouth Harbour, a few feet to the southward of the Light House, and about one and one-quarter miles from the extreme outer point of the Cape. Strikes *seven* times per minute.

BRIER ISLAND—*A plain white light*, situate about half a mile N. E. from the N. W. point of the Island.

WESTPORT—On Peter's Island, at the south entrance of the east side of the Bay of Fundy. *Two white lights*, placed horizontally, to distinguish it from Brier Island Light, at an elevation of 40 feet above high water mark.

DIGBY GUT LIGHT—On the west side of Digby Gut. This light is chiefly intended as a guide into Annapolis Basin. *A fixed white light*.

PORT WILLIAMS (late Marshall's Cove) BEACON LIGHT—Building square and painted *white*; exhibits at a distance of about 5 miles, a *white light*, and on nearer approach, a *green light*. Port Williams is distant from Digby Light House E. 25 miles, and from Black Rock Light House W. 28 miles.

MARGARETVILLE BEACON LIGHT—Building square and painted *white*;

exhibits at a distance of about 5 miles a *white light*, and on nearer approach a *red light*. Margaretville is distant E. 37 miles from Digby Light House, and W. 15 miles from Black Rock Light House.

The lights in the above two beacon lights distinguish them from other lights in their vicinity.

BLACK ROCK LIGHT—On the south shore of the Bay of Fundy. *A fixed white light*, 27 miles E. of Port Williams.

APPLE RIVER LIGHT—North side of the entrance to Apple River, in Chignecto Channel. *Two fixed lights*, placed horizontally.

PARTRIDGE ISLAND RIVER—An octagonal Light Beacon, on the west side of the entrance to Partridge Island River, Parrsboro', on the north side of the Basin of Minas, and exhibits a *plain, white light*, at an elevation of thirty feet above high-water; rise and fall about forty-five feet; the Tower is *white*, and stands close to high-water mark on the beach. Vessels can only enter the harbour at high-water, and must lie aground on soft bottom when the tide is low.

HORTON BLUFF LIGHT—In the Basin of Minas; 95 feet above sea level, high-water; rise and fall forty to forty-five feet. Building square, painted *white*; stands sixty feet from the Bluff, and shows a *white light*, which may be seen, in clear weather, over the greater part of the Basin of Minas, (after passing Cape Blownedon,) and above the Five Islands, and up Windsor River, until intercepted by the continuation of the Bluff to the southward of it.

BURNT COAT HEAD LIGHT—Basin of Minas. The lantern is erected on a square tower attached to the main building, and shows a *plain white light*, about 75 feet above high-water level, and visible from all points of approach. Tower and buildings painted *white*. Bearings and distances: Cape Blownedon, N. 70, W. 26 5, 10 miles; Brick Kiln Ledges, N. 52, W. 7 5, 10 miles; Economy Point, N. 36, W. 3 9, 10 m.

SEAL ISLAND LIGHT, off Cape Sable.—The first light on approaching the Bay of Fundy is on the South point of Seal Island. *A white light*, elevated about 80 feet above high water mark, and may be seen, on approaching the Island, from any point of the compass. A very dangerous rock, under water, but upon which the sea always breaks, called Blonde Rock, lies about three and one-third miles S. by W., by compass, from the Light House. Between this rock and the Island there are some dangers—the ground is rocky throughout, and large vessels, therefore, ought not to attempt passing between them.

GANNET ROCK LIGHT.—This light is intended to warn vessels of their approach to a very dangerous range of shoals and ledges, which extend from the Old Proprietor to the Seal Islands, off Machias, a distance of about twenty miles. *A white flash light*, twenty seconds dark and forty seconds light in each minute. Building painted in stripes, vertical, black and white. Between the northernmost and southernmost of the Murr Ledges there is a range of dangerous rocks and shoals, many of them always above water, and extend westward from the Light House about four miles. From this range further westerly, about six miles from the Gannet Light, lies a dangerous breaker called the Bull. This may be avoided by keeping three remarkable headlands near the S. W. end of Grand Mannan, open.

MACHIAS SEAL ISLAND LIGHTS—*Two fixed white lights*, upon the Machias Seal Islands, 45 feet above high water, and bear from each other E. S. E. and W. N. W., distant about 200 feet, by which circumstance, of two Light Houses at the same station, they will be immediately dis-

distinguished from all other lights upon the coast (British or American.) Both buildings painted *white*. Vessels standing to the northward between these lights and the Gannet Rock should tack or haul off the moment they bring these lights into one, as they will be, then, not more than $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile from the Murr Ledges, if more than 5 miles to the E. of the lights.

WEST QUODDY LIGHT.—This is an American Light, placed on the west side of the entrance into the St. Croix, by Lubec and Eastport.

HEAD HARBOUR LIGHT.—Next in order after passing Grand Manan and the plain *white light* (American) on West Quoddy Point, is Head Harbour Light, placed on the N. E. extremity of Campo Bello, and is a guide to vessels entering the main channel to West Isles, Moose Island, and the inner bay of Passamaquoddy; it enables vessels, also, at all times, to enter Head Harbour. *A fixed white light*: Building painted *white*, with a *red* cross on it.

POINT LE PRAIR LIGHTS.—Upon this projecting headland two lights are placed, one above the other, in the same house, and distant 28 feet. Both lights can be seen from every point of the compass where they may be useful. Both are *fixed* and *white*. Building painted *red* and *white*, in stripes, 5 feet broad each, horizontally.

PARTRIDGE ISLAND LIGHT.—At the entrance of the river and harbour of St. John, N. B. *A fixed white light*. Building painted *red* and *white*, in vertical stripes.

BEACON LIGHT.—Within Partridge Island, and upon a spit or bar which extends about half a mile S. S. E. off Sand Point, and which dries at two thirds ebb, stands the Beacon Tower. *A fixed white light*. Building painted *white* and *black*, in stripes, vertically.

QUACO LIGHT.—*A revolving white light*, placed on a small rock off Quaco Head, showing twice full and twice dark in a minute. The light can be seen from any quarter where a vessel can approach. Building painted *white* and *red*, in horizontal stripes.

CAPE ENNAGE LIGHT.—On the point of that name in Westmorland, nearly opposite Apple River Harbour, N. S. Building painted *white*, about 120 feet above the tide mark. *A plain white light*.

A light is placed in a window in a building at Spencer's Point, on the northern shore of Cobequid Bay, near the head of Minas Basin, exhibits a *clear fixed light*.

East from Halifax.

BEAVER HARBOUR LIGHT.—On Williams' Island. *A revolving light*.

WHITE HEAD ISLAND LIGHT.—On the S. W. point of White Head Island. The tower is square, painted *white*, standing seventy-five fathoms from the water's edge, with an octagonal Iron Lantern, sixty feet above sea level at high water; rise and fall six feet. The light is distinguished by *bright flashes*, of 20 seconds duration, followed by eclipses of ten seconds, displaying alternately three flashes and three eclipses in a minute. The light will not be totally obscured during the eclipse.

CANSEAU, CRANBERRY ISLAND.—*Two fixed lights*, one above the other.

GUYSBOROUGH HARBOUR-BEACON.—On the west side of the entrance to the harbour, head of Chedabucto Bay. *A fixed light*.

EDDY, OR SAND POINT LIGHT.—On Eddy or Sand Point, on the west side of the south entrance to the Strait of Canseau, distinguished by *two white lights*, placed horizontally, 25 feet above sea level. Building square, painted *white*, with a black diamond on the seaward side.

WEST SIDE OF THE GUT OF CANSEAU, NORTHERN ENTRANCE.—*A fixed light.*

CAPE ST. GEORGE LIGHT, ANTIGONISH COUNTY.—Building square and painted *white*. *A revolving white light* at intervals of 30 seconds.

PICTOU ISLAND LIGHT—On the S. E. point of the Island. Building square and painted *white*. *A fixed light*, 52 feet above high water mark.

PICTOU HARBOUR LIGHT—On the S. E. side of the entrance to the harbour. Two *fixed* vertical lights—the lower one *red*.

ARICHAU BEACON—A light on Point Marache, on the east side of the southern entrance to the harbour. Building square, painted *white*. *A white light*, 31 feet above the sea level.

LOUISBURG—On the east side of the entrance to the harbour. *A fixed light.*

SCATARI ISLAND—*A revolving light*, on the east point of the Island.

FLINT ISLAND LIGHT—On Flint Island, eastern coast of Cape Breton, between Cape Granby and Point Gage, entrance of Cow Bay. Lat. $40^{\circ} 11' 5''$ N., and Long. $59^{\circ} 45'$ to $50'$ W., and exhibits a *bright flash light* every fifteen seconds, visible from all points of the compass. The light is 65 feet above sea level, and can be seen at the distance of 12 miles.

LOW POINT LIGHT—East side of Sydney, (Cape Breton) harbour. *A fixed light.*

ST. PAUL'S ISLAND.—*A fixed light* on the N. E. end, and a *revolving light* on the S. W. end.

MARGARIE ISLAND LIGHT—Situated on the N. W. side of the Island of Cape Breton, nearly mid-way between Mabou and Cheticamp harbours, and distant from the mainland of Cape Breton two and a half miles. *A plain white light*. The lantern is placed on a square wooden tower, painted *white*, near the centre and summit of the Island. The lantern is 298 feet above sea level; visible from all points of approach. There is a landing near the S. W. end, in shore, where a few fishing stages and boats are kept in use during the fishing season.

PORT HOOD LIGHT.—When seen from the S. W. shows a *white light*, and from the N. shows a *red light*—both fixed.

OUTER BIRD ISLAND LIGHT—Between the entrance of the Great Bras d'Or and St. Ann's, east coast of Cape Breton Island, exhibits alternate *flashes of red and white* at intervals of 60 seconds (commencing Oct. 20, 1863.)

CAPE RACE, NEWFOUNDLAND, Light House, exhibits a *fixed white light* from sunset to sunrise. Visible to seaward from N. E. by E. round by the S. E. and S. W., and is elevated 180 feet above mean water level of the sea, and may be seen in clear weather 17 miles from a ship's deck. The tower is striped *red and white* vertically. It stands close to the old beacon, which has been cut down. The Light House is in Lat. $46^{\circ} 39' 12''$ N., Long. $53^{\circ} 2' 38''$ W. Bearings magnetic. Var. 24 deg. W.

In the River and Gulf of St. Lawrence and Strait of Belle-Isle.

BELLE-ISLE LIGHT. An island at the eastern entrance of the Strait of Belle-Isle, separating Labrador from Newfoundland, situated at the extreme south-west point of the island. *A single fixed white light*. Building—a circular stone tower, faced externally with fire brick of light colour. Lat. N. $51^{\circ} 53' 00''$; Long. W. $55^{\circ} 26' 00''$. Whole horizon lighted, and seen in fair weather $28\frac{1}{2}$ nautical or $32\frac{1}{2}$ statute miles.

POINT AMOUR LIGHT. Labrador Coast, Strait of Belle-Isle, at the south east point of Forteau Bay, Lat. N. $67^{\circ} 27' 30''$; Long. W. $56^{\circ} 3'$

ANTICOSTI LIGHT, at the extreme point west end of the island of Anticosti—Lat. N. 49° 52' 3" Long. W. 64° 35' 00". A single fixed white light—two-thirds of the horizon illuminated, and seen in fair weather 15 nautical or 18 statute miles. Building—a circular stone tower, faced externally with fire brick of a light colour.

CAPE ROZIER LIGHT. East coast of Gaspe, at the extreme point of the Cape. Lat. N. 48° 51' 00", Long. W. 64° 15' 00". A single fixed white light—two-thirds of the horizon illuminated, and seen in fair weather 16½ nautical or 19½ statute miles. Building—a circular stone tower, faced externally with fire brick of a light colour.

Signals will be given at, or near, each of the above 4 light houses by means of an air or fog whistle, sounded at short intervals during foggy weather and snow storms, or by a nine-pounder gun, fired every hour, in case of the whistle being out of order.

The Mails for the UNITED KINGDOM, by Steamer leaving Boston every alternate *Wednesday*, are closed finally every alternate *Thursday* at 8 P. M. Letters, &c., dropped into the box after the hour of closing and up to the arrival of the Steamer, are forwarded loose in a bag. All too late Letters and *Telegrams* will be received on board the Steamer by the Mail Officer, who is alone authorised to receive them. Letters 12½ cents—*must be prepaid*. Newspapers *free*. Unpaid Letters forwarded with a fine of 12½ cents each. Letters to the Imperial Public Departments are exempt from prepayment.

The charge on Books, Pamphlets, Maps, Printed Letters, Parliamentary Papers, &c., to the United Kingdom, Newfoundland, Bermuda, and British West Indies, by Book-Post, is for a package not exceeding 4 oz., 7 cents; above 4 oz. and not exceeding ½ lb., 12½ cents; and 12½ cents for every additional ¼ pound or fraction of a ¼ pound. Package not to exceed 2 feet in length, width or depth. *Must be prepaid*.

Closed Mails for the United Kingdom *via* the United States are made up to meet the Steamers leaving New York for Liverpool. Letters to be specially addressed "*via New York*." Letters 20 cents; Newspapers 2 cents. *Must be prepaid*.

The Mails for NEWFOUNDLAND are made up *once a month* in December, January, February, and March; and *fortnightly* in the other

months, including Cape Breton, closing *finally* on the *Thursday evening* of the week the Steamer is due from Boston. Letters 10 cents; if posted in the interior, 13½ cents. Newspapers 2 cents. *All must be prepaid.*

The Mails for ST. PIERRE and MIQUELON are forwarded to Newfoundland by Steamer. Letters 8½ cents; if posted in the interior, 13½ cents. Newspapers 2 cents. *All must be prepaid.*

The Mails for BERMUDA and the BRITISH WEST INDIA ISLANDS are made up *finally* on the *Thursday evening* of the week the Steamer is due from Boston, at 8 o'clock, once a month the year round. Letters 10 cents; if posted in the interior, 13½ cents—*must be prepaid.* Newspapers 2 cents—*must also be prepaid.* Mails are also made up at the same time for Cuba, Honduras, Laguyra, Mexico, Venezuela, and the Foreign West India Islands. The rates of postage vary to these places. The postage on letters and newspapers must be prepaid. A Mail is also forwarded *via* Bermuda, Chagres, and Panama, to places on the Western Coast of America. Letters 33½ cents; Newspapers 8½ cents—*must be prepaid.* In all cases the inland postage to Halifax (5 cents) must be paid in addition to the above rates.

The Mails for the UNITED STATES by Mail Steamers to Boston, are made up on the *Tuesday evening* of the week the Steamer is due from Liverpool, G.B., at 8 o'clock. Should the Steamer not arrive by 6 o'clock the following morning *Supplementary Mails* will be made up. Should the Steamer arrive *previous* to Tuesday evening, the Mails will then close *immediately* upon her arrival. Letters 10 cents; if posted in the interior, 13½ cents. Newspapers 2 cents. *All must be prepaid.*

Mails for CANADA are made up and forwarded at the same time. Letters to be specially addressed, "*Closed Mail for Canada.*" Letters 12½ cents—*prepayment optional.*

British reprints of copyright Works from the United States, *by steamer*, are charged letter postage.

LAND MAILS.

Letters posted in Nova Scotia, addressed to any place within the Province, *if prepaid* 5 cents, *if not prepaid* 7 cents. Letters mailed at any office in the Province for delivery within the County in which the office is situated, 2 cents; *if not prepaid*, 7 cents. Letters pre-paid may be sent from one Way Office to another without passing through a Post Office. If mailed unpaid such letters will be sent to the nearest Post Office, and there taxed 7 cents, and forwarded to their destination. On letters to CANADA and NEW BRUNSWICK the rate is 5 cents—*prepayment optional.* Letters to and from PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND *must be prepaid*; if posted wholly or in part unpaid, they will be forwarded to their desti-

nation, with a fine of 5 cents in addition to the postage. On letters to the UNITED STATES (except Oregon and California) 10 cents; to Oregon and California, 15 cents—*must be prepaid*. Provincial, British and Colonial Newspapers forwarded through the Post Office in this Province, *Free*; all other Newspapers, when posted or re-posted at any office in the Province must be prepaid by stamp, 1 cent each, otherwise they will not be forwarded.

Exchange Papers to a newspaper publisher, *free*. Newspapers posted in the United States or other Foreign country for delivery in Nova Scotia, are taxed *one cent* each, whether they have been prepaid or not, when posted.

Parliamentary papers pass *free* throughout Nova Scotia.

Handbills, Lithographed Letters, Circulars and other printed matter of a like description, posted in the Province and addressed to any place in or out of the same are charged one cent per oz. up to 48 oz's.—*must be prepaid*.

All letters are charged by weight, and a uniform rate of postage has been established throughout British North America. A single letter must not exceed $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. The rates of postage mentioned all refer to a *single letter*. If a letter exceeds the $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. it is charged double, treble, &c., according to weight.

Letters for registry must be mailed *half an hour* previous to the closing of the Mail by which they are to be sent. The registration of a letter addressed to any place in Nova Scotia or British North America and the United States is 10 cents; to the United Kingdom, 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents; to Australia and all other places, when passing through the United Kingdom, 25 cents. *Must be prepaid* as well as the postage. No registered letters will be forwarded between two Way Offices.

Books, Pamphlets, and other printed matter of a like description, mailed in the Province for delivery in the Province, are charged one cent per oz.: *must be prepaid*. Small religious periodicals (such as the "Child's Paper," &c.) whether British or Foreign, posted within or without the Province are transmitted *free* from Nova Scotia postage. All other periodicals whether religious or secular, passing through any office in the Province, if posted without the Province, are liable, in addition to any charge prepaid on posting, to an additional charge on delivery of 2 cents each. No. If posted within the Province for delivery *within or without* the same, they are taxed 2 cents each. *Must be prepaid*.

Letters posted in any city or town in the Province for delivery in the same city or town, are charged 2 cents; if unpaid they are taxed 4 cents.

Letters dropped in the letter box during the night, *prepaid* by stamps, will be forwarded with the Mails despatched the next morning.

A mail to and from Dartmouth *daily*, postage 2 cts. If unpaid 4 cts.

Official letters addressed to the Provincial and Military Departments are exempt from prepayment.

The word "Newspaper" means any publication issued not less frequently than once a week, and containing notices of passing events. The word "Periodical" means any publication issued at regular intervals, but less frequently than once a week.

Masters of vessels arriving in the Province are entitled to receive for each letter they may deliver to the Postmaster at the first Office

The Postmaster General has the exclusive privilege of conveying letters throughout the Province. Persons receiving and conveying letters incur a penalty of \$1 for every letter so conveyed, except—1. Letters sent to be mailed in the nearest Post or Way Office. 2. Letters to a place out of the Province, and sent by sea, and by a private vessel, not being a Packet. 3. Letters sent by a Messenger purposely, on the private affairs of the sender or receiver. 4. Letters lawfully brought into the Province and immediately posted in the nearest Office. 5. Letters of Merchants, Ship-owners, or of cargo sent by Merchant vessels, and delivered to the party to whom addressed without charge or fee.

PARCEL POST.

Parcels by Mail can be sent through a Post or Way Office to any part of Nova Scotia. For a parcel not over 1 lb., 25 cents; more than 1 lb. and not exceeding 2 lbs., 50 cents; more than 2 lbs. and not exceeding 3 lbs. (beyond which weight they cannot be sent,) 75 cents; 10 cents additional if registered—*both must be prepaid*. No parcel must exceed 1 foot in length or breadth, or six inches in thickness.

A Mail waggon leaves Truro for Tatamagouche, Wallace and Pugwash on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday, returning on the intervening days.

A Stage runs to and from the Waverly Gold Diggings and Scott's Road, on the Railway line (10½ miles from the Richmond Depot), to meet the Trains to and from Halifax.
