In order to simplify the whole procedure, the separate procedure referred to in para 9 (c) will provide for the termination of lire drawings in favor of: first, purchase of lire on hand for future use as pay and allowances and such procurement as becomes U.S. obligation; second, local procurement as set forth in A above will be by requisition on the Italian Government or paid for with lire furnished by Italian Government. Procedures for such procurement will be clearly indicated in a separate financial agreement and implementation thereof will be based on procedures to be furnished by Office Chief of Finance.

"Any separate financial agreement with the Italians will be predicated upon agreement by them to repurchase for dollars any lire deemed excess to the needs of the U.S. Armed Forces at the same rate at which acquired.

"Due to the political implications not only in Italy but also in the Balkans it is not considered advisable to include your proposed additional subparagraph to paragraph 12."

It is requested that the foregoing message be transmitted to the Commanding General, Mediterranean Theater of Operations, in reply to CM-IN-3323 dated 15 July 1946 provided the Joint Chiefs of Staff have no objection from a military point of view.

Subject: Military Implications in Internationalization of Trieste.


In response to a request from the Acting State Member of 15 July 1946 on the above subject, the Joint Chiefs of Staff have advised the State-War-Navy Coordinating Committee as follows:

"In accordance with the request contained in State-War-Navy Coordinating Committee memorandum of 16 July 1946, subject: 'Security of the Proposed Free Territory of Trieste', the following views of the Joint Chiefs of Staff regarding the military features of arrangement to insure the integrity and independence of the proposed Free Territory of Trieste are submitted:

"The development of the military situation in the proposed Free Territory of Trieste will depend largely on the political development of the area, the nature of which is yet to be determined. At this time it would appear that the transition of the subject area from its present status to that of a free territory will occur in three stages as follows:

"a. An initial period from the present time until United States and British forces evacuate Italy (within 90 days after ratification of the Italian peace treaty).

"b. An interim period from withdrawal of British and United States forces from Italy until arrangements for establishment of a provisional government come into effect. If the political situation permits, it would be preferable to eliminate this period or to reduce its duration to a minimum by obtaining early agreement on the nature

of the provisional government to be established and the time it comes into existence. Should rapid progress be made in this respect while delays are encountered in ratification of the Italian peace treaty (thus delaying evacuation of British and United States troops from Italy), this interim period will in fact be reduced and may even be completely eliminated.

"g. A final period beginning with the establishment of the provisional government and lasting until the permanent government of the Free Territory of Trieste becomes firmly established and is able to take over full responsibility to the United Nations for maintenance of internal order and frontier protection. This period may last for some time after establishment of the permanent government.

"It is considered that the following general principles should apply in the solution of the military problem presented:

"a. United States and British forces should remain in the area in sufficient strength to prevent either Italy or Yugoslavia from interfering with the establishment of the government of the Free Territory and to maintain internal order and frontier protection until the local government is capable of taking over these responsibilities. The troops should remain in the Free Territory as long as necessary to insure establishment of a firm local government free from Italian or Yugoslav compulsion or influence.

"b. During the transition from the present until the final establishment of the Free Territory of Trieste, the strength and composition of the internal security forces (police and border guards) should

be such as to provide only for internal security and frontier control. They should in no sense be designed to withstand aggression by neighboring states since the Free Territory must rely on the United Nations for protection from such acts.

"g. Yugoslav forces should be withdrawn at the earliest possible date from those areas included in the Free Territory, and under no circumstances should they be permitted to remain in the area later than the date the provisional government comes into existence. In view of the conduct of the members of the Yugoslav detachment in Zone 'A' of Venezia Giulia since the conclusion of the Morgan-Jovanovic Agreement, and the current Italian and Yugoslav antagonism toward the decision of the Council of Foreign Ministers to create a Free Territory, the presence of either Yugoslav or Italian troops in any part of the area comprising the Free Territory would be a constant source of trouble and a great handicap to the successful functioning of the provisional government, which will be faced with a most difficult task in the early stages of its existence.

"d. Russian military participation should be avoided during all stages, since their participation might delay final military settlement through the raising of many additional problems, including those of command and staff organization of combined forces. Furthermore, employment of Russian troops in the Trieste area would greatly extend their lines of communication in Europe and would thereby provide grounds for increasing the strength of Soviet occupational forces under the guise of protecting lines of communication.

"During the initial period (from the present until British and United States forces evacuate Italy) maintenance of the status quo is believed to be the most desirable and practical solution. While it would be highly desirable to have Yugoslav forces withdrawn during this period from all areas included in the Free

Territory, such action should not be pressed at the expense of admitting Russian forces under a new agreement. During this period agreements must be reached and arrangements completed for adequate British and United States forces to remain in the Free Territory after the evacuation of Allied forces from Italy. In view of the impasse which Russia has produced in the Military Staff Committee with regard to United Nations military forces, completion of these arrangements would be expedited if they were covered by the statute establishing the Free Territory instead of by submitting them to the United Nations for resolution. It is essential that arrangements which provide for the evacuation of British and United States forces from Italy (within 90 days after the ratification of the Italian peace treaty), should also provide for the simultaneous evacuation of the Yugoslav Detachment now located in Zone 'A' of Venezia Giulia in accordance with the terms of the Morgan-Jovanovic Agreement.

"During the interim period (between the evacuation of Allied forces from Italy and the establishment of the provisional government) continued maintenance of the status quo and retention of sufficient British and United States forces to maintain internal order and guard frontiers will be the best practical solution. It is estimated that there will be required a British-United States force of approximately one composite Allied division with an integrated Allied staff and comprising one British brigade group and a U.S. regimental combat team. Early evacuation of Yugoslav forces from areas to be included in the Free Territory would be desirable but may not be politically attainable until the provisional government comes into existence. During this interim period military government of the area and the command of the military forces should continue under present Allied arrangements. In the event that the area passes to the United Nations control before the provisional government is established there should be as little alteration of existing arrangements as possible.

The final period (from the establishment of the provisional government until evacuation of British and United States military forces) should see the immediate withdrawal of Yugoslav forces from those areas included in the Free Territory, and the termination of Allied military government, if such have not been accomplished

previously. During this period it will be to United States military interest to facilitate rapid and efficient progress toward conditions under which the new state is able to take over its own internal security, thus permitting the earliest possible withdrawal of our military forces.

"From the military point of view it would facilitate the orderly transfer of areas concerned, or eliminate likely sources of irritation and unrest after establishment of the provisional government, if early agreement could be reached with the Yugoslav Government to revise the Morgan-Jovanovic Agreement with a view to eliminating the Yugoslav detachment now in Zone 'A' and permitting readjustment of British-United States and Yugoslav forces along the French ethnic line (which is to be the basis for establishing the final Italo-Yugoslav frontier and the boundaries of the Free State) instead of along the present Morgan line. Such action would permit the early establishment of Allied military government in the large area south of Trieste which is now under Yugoslav control but which will ultimately be included in the Free Territory. This would place the entire area comprising the Free State under a common government at an early date and would greatly simplify the turnover of control to the provisional government at the proper time. The advantages of eliminating the Yugoslav detachment now in Zone 'A' are obvious. Notwithstanding the military advantages to such a course of action, which greatly outweigh any disadvantages, it is recognized that there may be strong Allied political or Yugoslav objections to any attempt to revise present arrangements or commitments in the area.

"Other preliminary actions which would facilitate the orderly military transition of the area are:

"a. To mark clearly and unmistakably the various established boundaries through early action by a boundary commission.

"b. To provide maximum assistance to all persons, particularly Italians and Yugoslavs living in the areas who elect to be transferred, to dispose of their holdings and move to the country of their selection. This is especially important in the case of Italians living in the Pola enclave.

*g. To encourage the provisional government, while Allied military government is in control, to have its officials work alongside of Allied military government officials as long as possible before the transfer from the military to the provisional government takes place.

*It is apparently the intention of the Council of Foreign Ministers that the status of the Free Territory of Trieste will be that of a demilitarized free port with its integrity and independence guaranteed by the Security Council of the United Nations. Accordingly the requirement for internal security will demand a constabulary or police force, a coast guard, an immigration organization, and a frontier guard comparable to the frontier guards maintained by Italy and Yugoslavia at the border of the Free Territory.

*The size, composition, and character of these agencies will be determined by the local situation, particularly as it is affected by the attitude of the neighboring states of Italy and Yugoslavia. The police force and other security agencies of the Free State could well be built around the existing Venezia Giulia police force, which is soon to be increased to a strength of 6,000. This organization has had considerable success under Allied direction and its personnel has been especially selected to deal with the local situation. If the attitude is one of peaceful acceptance of the decision to establish the Free Territory, the requirement will be a diminishing one until a normal level is reached. If, on the other hand, either Italy or Yugoslavia, or both, continue their active opposition to the decision and seek by propaganda and other subversive means to incite the local population, the need to retain British and United States troops in the area may be prolonged. Under these circumstances there will be a greater requirement for maintaining substantial internal security forces. Such increases in requirements are unlikely to be met satisfactorily by recruiting solely local Italian and Yugoslav personnel. Hence, greater dependence must be placed on enlisting disinterested nationals into these agencies.

"Until more is known regarding the political details which establish the Free Territory it is not practicable to state what the proper command channels will be for the British and United States forces remaining in the area when the Territory comes under United Nations' control. These forces, however, will be present and available to support the new government as required but should not participate in routine internal security activities. The Joint Chiefs of Staff understand that this question is now under study within the State-War-Navy Coordinating Committee. It is also under study by the Joint Chiefs of Staff, who assume that their views will be requested before a policy is determined. It seems clear, in view of the functions and nonmilitary character of the internal security agencies visualized as ultimately required for the permanent government of the Free Territory, that upon withdrawal of the military forces from the area, the governor thereof will be responsible to the Security Council for all matters, including internal security, pertaining to the Free Territory."

MEETING CLEARANCESProposed Negotiations with the USSR over Korea on
 a Governmental Level (SWNCC 176/20)

The Committee approved the proposed draft message
 for transmission to CINCPACFAS stating in substance:

For tactical reasons it is not desirable at
 this time to approach the Soviets on a governmental
 level relative to Korean Section of Moscow Agree-
 ment. An approach now would indicate U.S. impatience
 and would be interpreted by the Soviets as an
 indication of the weakness of our position in
 Korea. It is desirable to indicate to Soviets in
 every possible way that U.S. is determined to
 remain in Korea until U.S. objectives are achieved.
 A new directive based on political policy previously
 outlined, is in the process of being approved by
 SWNCC. By energetic implementation of this directive
 it is hoped that broad Korean support will be
 obtained for U.S. objectives and active Korean
 participation in administration of Southern Korea
 will strengthen U.S. position in Korea and Far East.
 Only when results of this new policy are apparent
 can a decision be made as to time and manner of
 approaching the USSR. Should Soviets indicate,
 locally, a desire to resume negotiations you should
 do so at once.

U.S. member of the Far Eastern Commission for information and guidance, who will present the policy to the Commission for approval.

The U.S. member of the Far Eastern Commission is authorized to deviate from the assured capacity levels by a reduction not exceeding 20% and an increase not exceeding 10% except there should be no increase in the machine tool and shipbuilding industry.

The State Department is directed to draft for submittal to SWCC an additional program of assured capacity levels for other Japanese industries.

Conversion of Japanese Currency Held by Other Governments and Forces (SWCC 289/8)

The Committee approved the transmission of the following message to CINCPAC in substance as follows:

U.S. position relative to conversion of yen will be submitted to FPC for policy decision on which to base directive to you. The U.S. is opposed to conversion of yen held by: other governments and forces; Japanese banks for U.S. Military Government in Korea; and private individuals holding currency in question outside of Japan. The U.S. proposes conversion of yen be considered in connection with reparations and Japanese external assets.

INFORMAL CLEARANCES

United States Requirements for Military Rights in the Republic of Panama (SWCC 38/42 - 38/44)

The Committee approved the recommendation of the Joint Chiefs of Staff that the Secretary of State be informed of United States requirements for military rights in the Republic of Panama, as listed in Appendix "A" of SWCC 38/42. In addition to the sites listed, the long-term rights of naval anchorage in the territorial waters of the Republic of Panama, including the Perlas Islands, are required. The rights requested in SWCC 38/42 are in addition to any rights now held by the United States in the Republic of Panama (SWCC 38/44)

Publicity Aspects of Proposed Instructions by SCAP
Authorizing Japanese Research in Technological
Subjects (SWNSG 82/30)

The Committee approved the following policy for submission to the U.S. member of the Far Eastern Commission for his guidance in the preparation, by the Commission, of a policy on this question:

(1) Basic research and academic instruction in Japan in nuclear physics should be permitted subject to close surveillance to prevent adaptation to war purposes.

(2) All research and development of fissionable atomic species in more than minute quantities for research should be prohibited.

(3) The separation or concentration of fissionable species of atomic isotopes from the naturally occurring isotope mixture of a chemical element should be prohibited except in minute quantities for research.

(4) All research and development for the purpose of utilization of atomic nuclear energy for weapons of war should be prohibited.

(5) The mining of radioactive material in Japan is to be under the strict control of SCAP to prevent stockpiling for war purposes.

Trial of Certain Japanese Criminals (SWNSG 81/30)

The Committee approved the recommendation that those Japanese criminals be tried by a U.S. Naval Commission as the crimes were committed in an area under the jurisdiction of CINCPAC. This paper is to be transmitted to the Navy Department for implementation and the State Department is requested to notify the French and Swiss Governments of the trials as the crimes were committed against their nationals.

Military and Civil Affairs Agreement Between the United States and Italy (SWNSG 87/9)

The Committee approved the proposed message to CG, AFCEA stating that the Commanding General, in his negotiations with the Italian Government, may make editorial changes provided they do not alter the meaning of the original text.

~~TOP SECRET~~Policy on Repatriation from the Ryukyus of Persons Claiming U.S. and other Foreign Citizenship (SMSG 300/1)

The Committee approved the following policy and its forwarding to the State, War, and Navy Departments for guidance and implementation where appropriate:

(a) Persons with bonafide documentary proof of U.S. citizenship desiring repatriation at their own expense, should be repatriated to U.S. or its possessions, but persons not having necessary documentary proof of U.S. citizenship should be investigated thoroughly by the State Department.

(b) The Military Government authorities should furnish the State Department information concerning persons claiming foreign citizenship (other than U.S. and Japanese) in order that State Department may inform the interested governments of the number and status of these persons in the Ryukyus and request their intended action. Cost of repatriation to be borne by respective governments or the individual.

(c) Any incurred expense by U.S. Military Government in connection with repatriation should be charged to occupation cost.

Measures to Restore Financial Stability in Germany (SMSG 303)

The Committee approved the draft message to COMUS in substance as follows:

(a) Principles of first step designed to eliminate monetary overhang is approved. Approved in principle are measures designed to prevent gain or advantage from the financial reform and to reduce disparity of loss between the owners of monetary claims and owners of other assets. Germany should have a system to take care of the most needy war victims and to eliminate excessive war gains.

(b) We do not approve at this time extension of the proposal to cover all types of war losses nor do we approve the mortgage method outlined in Step 2 of plan. You are authorized to discuss these subjects with the other members of the Allied Control Council and place before them the related proposals envisaged in Steps 2 and 3 of the plan.

(c) Forward at the proper time your recommendations as to types of war losses which should be recognized, your estimate of the ability of the German economy to provide partial compensation for such losses and ability of available administrative machinery to implement the program and your comments on the concentration of economic authority.

(d) As regards mortgage procedure of Step 2, we believe alternative methods such as special property tax and capital gains tax should be explored in the course of quadripartite discussions. Your views on this aspect of the program at the proper time are requested.

Military, Naval and Air Clauses for the Treaty of Peace with Austria (SWNCG 307, 307/1, 307/2)

The Committee approved the draft military and air clauses in Appendix "C" of SWNCG 307, and agreed that they be communicated to the appropriate negotiating officers to serve as background information when the negotiations concerning this paper take place.

Use of the Italian Army in the Event of Hostilities in Northern Italy (SWNCG 313/3)

The Committee approved the following information be furnished the Joint Chiefs of Staff for a proposed reply to CGO:

From the political standpoint it does not appear sound to interpose at this time any obstacles in the way of SACMED's planning for use of force in the unlikely event of general Yugoslav attack. SACMED's plans for such an unlikely attack should be on the basis that all forces in Italy, including Poles and such Italians as he estimates can be utilized, will be available for operations in any area. Prior to development of such a general attack SACMED is authorized to use Italians and Poles in any area of Italy except Zone A and portion of Udine claimed by Soviets for Yugoslavs but use Poles in forward areas as sparingly as possible.

Situation in Venezia Giulia (SWNCG 313/E)

The Committee approved the proposed draft message to the COMSOUTH, Allied Commander, Mediterranean, in substance as

The issuance of a statement, that before sovereign rights over territory in Venezia Giulia are assumed by either Italy or Yugoslavia, all guarantees will be given for fair treatment for residents therein, would only aggravate the situation and focus Yugoslav attention on it. If Pola is awarded to Yugoslavia, Italian residents will lose such property that they have been unable to move. You should abide rather rigidly by the letter of the Morgan-Jovanovic Agreement and permit transfer of plant and machinery except out of Zone A but do nothing to encourage such activities.

Subject: Proposed Negotiations with the USSR over Korea on a governmental level.

At its 43rd Meeting on 31 July 1946 the State-War-Navy Coordinating Committee approved the following message to CINCPAC:

"State, War and Navy Depts agree that it may eventually become necessary to approach Soviets on governmental level relative to Korean Section of Moscow Agreement. For tactical reasons it is not desirable to do so at this time. It is felt that such an approach now would indicate U.S. impatience which would be interpreted by the Soviets as an indication of weakness of our position in Korea. It is felt desirable to indicate to Soviets in every way possible that U.S. is determined to remain in Korea until U.S. objectives have been achieved. To this end a new directive is in process of being approved by SWNCC, which is based on political policy outlined in WAR 20716, and it is hoped that through energetic implementation of this directive, broad Korean support will be obtained for U.S. objectives, and active Korean participation in the administration of Southern Korea will strengthen U.S. position in Korea and Far East as a whole.

"Only when the results of this new policy are apparent can a decision be made as to a propitious time and manner for approaching the USSR. It is hoped that the new policy for Korea will be so effective as to cause the Soviets to make the first step towards a resumption of negotiations. Should they do so locally you will of course resume negotiations at once."

It is requested that the foregoing message be transmitted to CINCPAC in reply to WAR C-63168 (CM-IN 3629) dated 17 July 1946 provided the Joint Chiefs of Staff have no objection from a military point of view.

TOP SECRETMemorandum by the United States Chiefs of Staff

1. The United States Chiefs of Staff note that the British Chiefs of Staff find it necessary, in consonance with the demobilization policy of His Majesty's Government, to proceed with plans to reduce the Royal Air Force strength in north Italy to three squadrons, supported by three more British squadrons in Germany as reinforcements to be utilized in the event of an emergency. Further, the United States Chiefs of Staff have noted SACMED's comments set forth in RAF 1241 and the memorandum by the Representatives of the British Chiefs of Staff dated 10 December 1946.

2. While the United States Chiefs of Staff have made no firm commitment for furnishing American reinforcements from Germany to SACMED in the event of an emergency, they have directed the Commanding General, U.S. Forces, European Theater (CG, USFET) to plan to furnish such air reinforcements, as practicable, to SACMED in such an event. While the latest capability for reinforcement from Germany, as announced by CG, USFET to the Commanding General, U.S. Army Forces, Mediterranean Theater of Operations, on 10 October 1946, is one hundred and ten fighters in seventy-two hours of which seventy-two would be operational, it will be appreciated that the capability of United States forces in Germany to reinforce SACMED with fighters depends on conditions which may exist at the time of the requirement. In the event of a reduction of occupation forces in Germany, this capability to reinforce SACMED is likely to be reduced materially.

The Allied Council met in a short session on 23 December under the chairmanship of the Soviet element, with Colonel General Victor V Kourasov presiding. The meeting was characterized by cordial relations similar to those which were in evidence at the last previous meeting on 13 December.

The Council approved, with certain amendments, a constitutional law in the purge of Nazi literature which paralleled the decision of the Council taken in January 1946, and agreed the texts of 3 simple laws; namely, a law providing for the punishment of Nazis guilty of falsifying questionnaires, a law providing for the trial by the summary court of black market operators and a law relating to the collection of through freight charges in stable foreign currency.

The text of a letter to the Federal Minister of Justice, in which was set forth the procedure for the detention, arrest and handing over of war criminals by the Austrian Government, was approved.

Procedure for the establishment of limited trade between Austria and Germany was discussed but no decision was reached and the matter was referred back to the Economic Division for further study. Disagreement was based on question of whether such deals should be implemented only after unanimous approval or should be implemented unless there was unanimous disapproval by the Allied Commission. The Soviets and French supported the first position and the US and British the second.

The Council, on the insistence of the Soviet element, discussed the matter of the closed session of the Austrian Parliament held on 30 October. No action was taken and the question was dropped.

1. The invitation of the British members, Combined Chiefs of Staff, dated 24 November 1945 for an American representative to sit on the London Coordinating Committee on Guided and Propelled Missiles and Projectiles and referred to JRDB by SWNCC in Reference (a) has been considered by the Board.

2. It is presumed by the Board that the invitation has been proffered to provide for expeditious exchange of technical information. The JRDB, however, functions with respect to certain matters involving allocation of responsibilities and resolution of differences between the War and Navy Departments. It is, therefore, inappropriate that a representative of Great Britain sit with the Board or its agencies. As a consequence, the Board has determined that the invitation of the British Representatives of the Combined Chiefs of Staff should be declined on the ground that a reciprocal invitation cannot be extended to sit with the Board or its agencies during consideration of policy matters of sole interest to the United States Army or Navy.

3. The Board does, however, consider that the interchange of technical information as permitted in SWNCC 206/29 of 13 November 1946 is essential to the best interest of the armed forces and further considers it desirable that agencies of the Army and the Navy enter freely into such relations with representatives of the United Kingdom or Canada as may be necessary to effectuate this interchange.

4. The Board notes that in paragraphs VI and VII of SWNCC 206/29, matters of collaboration with foreign nations on classified research and development projects, or participation by the War and Navy Departments with foreign governments in administrative agencies or administrative procedures concerning research and development, are subject to referral to SWNCC (NIC) for consideration and decision. The Board interprets the provisions of these paragraphs which require review and decision by SWNCC (NIC), to refer to arrangements for joint administration of research or development projects with a foreign nation, and to the formal participation of

Representatives of the Army or Navy or their agencies on committees, boards, or other agencies with representatives of foreign governments dealing with classified research and development projects.

8. The Board further interprets these provisions to have no relation to the interchange of technical information through the exchange of documents or liaison officers at a working level. Recommendations are, therefore, being initiated by the Board to the Secretaries of War and the Navy to establish a joint policy encouraging the interchange of technical information at a working level through the exchange of documents and liaison officers between the Army and Navy and the United Kingdom and Canada under the provisions of paragraph III of SWNCC 206/29.

Subject: Summary of SWNCC Activity.

During the period 11 December - 20 December 1946, the State-War-Navy Coordinating Committee cleared informally nine papers. One paper was cleared at the 51st Meeting.

MEETING CLEARANCE:

Reestablishment of Remittance Facilities Between the United States and Japan through Commercial Banking Channels (SWNCC 236/4)

The Committee approved the proposed technical procedure to establish commercial remittance facilities U.S. - Japan, using the National City Bank, Tokyo. The JCS would direct CINCASFPAC to install the procedure and a copy of the cable would be transmitted to the U.S. member of the FRC for the information of the Commission.

INFORMAL CLEARANCES:

Policy Toward Announcement of the Provisions for the Review of a New Japanese Constitution (SWNCC 235/12)

The Committee approved the statement of the U.S. position that "The U.S. Government will not agree to the publication of the Policy Decision contained in FRC 631/41 (regarding authority of FRC to review the Constitution) until, after consultation with General MacArthur, the U.S. Government concludes that such publication is consistent with U.S. foreign policy and the accomplishment of Allied objectives in Japan."

The State Department would forward this statement to the U.S. member on the FRC for presentation to the Commission.

Treatment of Property of Foreign Nationals in Japan (SWNCC 235/15)

The Committee approved the dispatch of a cable by the JCS

to GINCAFFAG agreeing with his recommendations that repatriates be permitted to carry a limited amount of personal property and funds in U.S. dollars.

Withdrawal from the Philippines (SUNCG 340/1)

In consideration of U.S. military requirements and responsibilities in the Philippines in the light of the decision approved by the President on 4 December 1946 to effect substantial withdrawal of U.S. forces from the Philippines, the Committee concluded that:

a. The decision to effect substantial withdrawal of U.S. forces from the Philippines is based upon a re-appraisal of strategic requirements in the light of facilities currently available to meet such requirements and does not represent any basic change in U.S. policy toward the Philippines. This fact should be emphasized to President Roxas.

b. The draft base agreement already substantially approved by U.S. and Philippine negotiators as amended in appendix "C" is adequate and appropriate in the light of the new situation.

c. The sudden and uncoordinated dissolution of the Philippine Scouts would represent a potential threat to the Philippine Government. Since the Scouts are a responsibility of the U.S. Government the War Department should be requested to make a detailed study, for presentation to SUNCG, of the problem of their future.

d. No substantial change is indicated in the presently agreed assistance to the Philippine Army for the fiscal year 1947. The Joint Chiefs of Staff should, however, be asked if they feel that the new situation requires a reconsideration of their views as set forth in the enclosure to SUNCG 276.

e. Publicity in regard to withdrawal should be calculated to prevent an impression of decreased U.S. interest in the Far East which might prejudice the U.S. position in China, Japan and Korea, or an impression that the U.S. Government was deserting the Philippine people.

f. The U.S. Government has title to certain Navy base property and possibly other military property in the Philippines. The Subcommittee for the Far East should

be instructed to study and report on steps which should be taken to transfer to the Philippine Government title to such of this property as the U.S. does not intend to use.

Review of Policies and Procedures Governing Disclosure of Classified Military Information to other Nations (NNDO 208/34)

The Committee approved the Draft Memorandum to the JCS informing them that the U.S. accepts the proposal of the British Chiefs of Staff in paragraph 2 of OCS 963/1 that information regarding military materiel jointly shared by the U.S. and the British will not be disclosed without mutual consent to a third nation if that information is classified "Confidential" or higher.

Restitution from Germany to Bulgaria and Albania (NNDO 204/21)

The Committee approved the further amending of the original directive regarding restitution to United Nations and certain former enemy countries, by adding Bulgaria and Albania to the list of those countries entitled to restitution of looted goods. The JCS would transmit the information to the Commander-in-Chief, U.S. Zone of Occupation in Germany.

Restitution of Securities from Germany (NNDO 204/22)

The Committee approved the proposed Directive to the Commander-in-Chief, U.S. Zone of Occupation, Germany, on restitution from Germany of securities looted from countries occupied or effectively controlled at one time by Germany. JCS would forward the directive to General McHarney.

Restitution of Certain Danube River Craft (NNDO 204/24)

The Committee approved the dispatch of the directive by the JCS to the Commander-in-Chief, U.S. Zone of Occupation in Germany and Austria, clarifying directives concerning restitution of Hungarian and Yugoslav auxiliary naval craft, patrol crafts and gun boats on the Danube.

Division of German Naval Vessels (NNDO 208/20)

The Committee approved on behalf of the U.S. Government the Special U.S.A.-U.K. Supplement to the Report of the Tripartite Naval Commission which provided for the disposition of floating docks, pontoon lifting docks, and pontoons in the American and British zones in Germany and in Denmark and Norway, and equally divided them between the U.S. and the U.K.

Recommendations on Reparations Removals of Industrial
Facilities and Merchant Shipping from Japan (UNRRA 218/20)

The Committee approved the report of the Subcommittee for the Far East which stated that within the limits of overall policy established by the Potsdam Declaration, it is believed that existing and pending UNRRA papers adequately cover all points in the Report on Reparations Policy made by Ambassador Edwin Pauley to the President.

Reference is your WX 84802 (Appendix to SWNCG 204/18). We have assumed that the restitution of Danubian craft ordered in this radio applies to the Danubian craft owned by the Danubian countries and that Rhine river and other craft belonging to the Western European nations moved to the Danube by the Germans has not become Danubian craft in the sense of your radio. Our reason for this is that our policy for the restitution of transport equipment to the western nations has been that such transport equipment should not be returned to the western countries until the total transportation needs of Germany have been determined, except that we remain prepared to return to these western countries any excess of their craft held in Germany over German craft which they hold. It is most important that we adhere to this policy as it is our belief that the western nations actually hold more German craft and transport equipment than Germany holds belonging to these countries. Transfer of transport to the western countries under any other conditions would create a serious condition in German transport.
