Advertising in Theatre Programs

That the problems of advertising are still undergoing a process of evolution is illustrated by the development of the theatre program.

Until recently experienced advertising men have been inclined to look askance upon the theatre program, and it had come to be a commonly accepted dictum that the pages of the theatre program were of little value in securing the actual sale of goods.

To a certain extent the theatre program has suffered from the opposition of experienced advertising men to the use of the occasional program for entertainments and philanthropic enterprises. It has been realized that these were of too ephemeral a nature to offer any real basis of value.

Advertising must be continuous and systematic, and a disconnected media can never produce the desired results. The theatre program has suffered from the supposed relationship to this undesirable class, and it has taken a lot of effort and hard work to educate the advertising public to the essential difference.

The publishers of theatre programs seriously object to the classification sometimes made by inexperienced advertising men in speaking of souvenirs published for charitable entertainments as program advertising. Where it is necessary to contribute in order to retain the good will of some of the patrons who are interested in an enterprise of this kind, it should be charged to good will or charity, but not to program advertising. The regular price for program advertising is about \$1.00 a page a performance, whereas these charitable entertainments ask anything from \$10.00 to \$25.00 a page, or even more, and there is no comparison of value whatever.

There is still a lot of skepticism among general advertisers as to the value of the theatre program, but it is interesting to note some very decided examples of profitable advertising in this medium.—From October issue of "Judicious Advertising."
