
## **2021 Atlantic Hurricane Season**





- The 2021 Atlantic hurricane season (officially ended on 30 November) was characterized by 21 named storms (tropical storm or higher), including 7 hurricanes (of which 4 major hurricanes), which is higher than the long-term average (14 named storms and 7 hurricanes).
- The season was the third most active on <u>record</u> in terms of named storms (since 1998) and it marks the sixth consecutive above-average season. This season also started earlier than the official start date (1 June), with a named storm (ANA) formed in late May.
- During 2021 GDACS timely issued RED alerts for the most destructive events of the season: <u>GRACE</u> and <u>IDA</u>. The latter is considered as the fifth strongest event to ever make landfall in the United States, hitting Louisiana as a major hurricane.
