A Careful Reading of the Following Is Absolutely Essential to an Intelligent Understanding of This Pamphlet.

The enclosed does not attempt to be a complete list of all the roll calls. It merely includes such as the compiler deemed important. There are, in the course of a session of Congress, a great many roll calls which deal merely with parliamentary situations and others which in the judgment of the compiler are relatively unimportant; it is also true that some of the roll calls omitted by the present compiler might be deemed important by others. The point which it is desired to make clear is that this does not purport to be a complete record of all the roll calls, and those who make use of it should do so with that understanding. It is also a fact that many important bills pass without roll calls.

We would suggest, if it is proposed to reprint or otherwise duplicate the records which we send out, that care should be taken to verify them by comparison with the original records in the bound volumes of the Congressional Record. While we have sent out millions of statements as to how members voted on individual roll calls and no charge of inaccuracy has yet been made, still it is obvious that there is a certain amount of clerical work involved and, therefore, there is some risk of error. Also a certain amount of judgment must be used by the compiler in making the condensed statements of the subjects of the roll call, with which judgment others may occasionally differ. For these reasons, persons who reprint or otherwise duplicate these records must do so wholly on their own responsibility. Collier's uses the greatest possible care in compiling the records but further than this does not guarantee them. By the use of the paging as an index, the records can readily be compared with the originals in the official Congressional Record.

The official Congressional Record can be consulted in almost any public library or else copies for the dates given can be obtained from the Superintendent of Documents, Government Printing Office, Washington, D. C., for a few cents, the price depending upon the number of pages. The paging in the permanent, bound Congressional Record and the temporary, or daily, Record is slightly different; the dates of the roll calls, of course, are the same.

We are frequently asked for a list of the bills and resolutions introduced by a Senator or a Representative. These can be found in the indexes to the Congressional Record, under the name of the person in question, together with the page references to his speeches. Anyone who will use Collier's record of roll calls as an index can, by spending a day with the bound volumes of the Congressional Record, provide himself with an adequate summary of any Senator's or Representative's speeches and other activities.

PAIRS.

We have paid no attention to pairs unless the Congressional Record shows specifically just how the Member would have voted. For a further explanation, see "Members Recorded as Not Voting."

MEMBERS RECORDED AS NOT VOTING.

When a Member is recorded as not voting it does not necessarily mean that he is absent. He may be paired with some absent Member. However,

in compiling the roll calls sent out by this office we have not attempted to give the pairs, for reasons which we will attempt to explain.

In a speech in the House of Representatives on February 14, 1913, Congressman Gardner of Massachusetts said the following:

"Then, again, in this Congress I introduced a resolution looking to a change in our absurd system of pairs, under which the attitude of Members on pending legislation is concealed rather than revealed."

It is a fact that in many instances it is impossible to tell from the official record whether a Member is paired in favor of or against a measure. On partisan measures, the inference is that the Member would have voted for his party, but when there is a roll call on such non-partisan measures as the establishment of a children's bureau, the bill to prohibit the shipment of liquor into prohibition states, and measures on immigration, it is generally impossible to tell from the Congressional Record whether the Member was in favor of or opposed to the bill. As Congress has it in its power to remedy this state of affairs, we leave individual Members to explain the record. However, we wish to make it plain that there are often legitimate reasons for not voting. For instance, Members serving on important committees are compelled to be present at hearings while the House is in session; or they may be sent out of the city on important public business. Occasionally Members are given leave of absence by formal action of the House because of illness or for other reasons. Before making any inferences from the fact that a Congressman is recorded as not voting, he should be given an opportunity to explain the reason for his failure to vote. It is also true that the fact of a Member's failure to vote constitutes in itself a fact which should be explained to his constituents.

No record of attendance is kept in either the Senate or House of Representatives, and undoubtedly the matter of pairing is sometimes abused. During the Sixty-second Congress, there were at least two Congressmen who refrained from voting on fully 90 per cent of the roll calls. There were three sessions during the Sixty-second Congress, so these gentlemen must have had some motive other than temporary absence for this continuous pairing.

Under the rules of the House of Representatives, the Speaker is not required or expected to vote except to decide a tie, although he may vote if he so desires, and he sometimes does on great political measures.

THE CONGRESSIONAL RECORD

Many candidates for Congress ask Collier's Washington Bureau to provide them with the records of their opponents now in Congress. Collier's can only give these candidates the same record of roll calls which it furnishes to the general public. And while the ayes and nays of any member constitute the fundamental part of his official record, and are enough to enable a voter to pass on his member's claim to reelection, yet an opposition candidate needs more amplified material to make a campaign. Any candidate who will use Collier's record of roll calls as an index, can, by spending a day with the bound volumes of the Congressional Record (they are to be found in almost every library), provide himself with an adequate summary of his opponent's speeches and other activities. The method of indexing the Record is as follows:

The Congressional Record is published daily during the sessions of Congress and contains, verbatim, the debates and speeches in the Senate and House of Representatives and the business transacted in both branches, including roll calls. Every Senator is allowed eighty-eight copies of the daily Congressional Record, and every Representative sixty copies for free distribution to such persons as he may select. This allowance is generally exhausted by each Congressman in supplying the libraries and newspapers of

his district. The only other way to get the Record is to subscribe for it at fixed rates: \$1.50 per month; \$4 for a short session, and \$8 for a long session; single copies, 24 pages or less, 3 cents; each additional 8 pages, 1 cent extra. Payment must be made in advance by money order payable to the Public Printer, Government Printing Office, Washington, D. C.

CONGRESSIONAL DIRECTORY.

An edition of the Congressional Directory is gotten out with the beginning of each session of Congress and may be bought from the Superintendent of Documents, Government Printing Office, Washington, D. C., for sixty cents.

It contains the names of Senators and Representatives, both alphabetically and under the heading of the States, their home and Washington addresses, the committees of which they are members and their rank therein, brief biographies (including biographies of the President, Vice-President and Members of the Cabinet and the Justices of the Supreme Court); information about the different branches of the Departments, together with the names and addresses of their respective heads; the names of clerks to committees; the American consuls and ambassadors in foreign countries; the foreign representatives in the United States; maps of the Congressional Districts of the States and a plan of the Capitol.

One should always ask for the latest edition when writing to the Superintendent of Documents.

NATIONAL DEFENSE (H. R. 12766). March 23, 1916, pages 5432-3.

The roll call here given was on the passage of the bill. As the bill passed the House it provided for a regular army of 140,000 men, an increase of 20,000 over the present authorized strength.

A federalized militia of 425,000 men under the control of the Federal Government.

A system of reserves recruited from retiring members of both the regular army and the militia.

A reserve officer's corps of 50,000, recruited from graduates of military schools under Federal supervision.

Federal pay for officers and enlisted men of the National Guard.

Authority for the President and Secretary of War to make plans for the mobilization of the industrial resources of the country in time of war.

The House Committee on Military Affairs estimated that the grand total of the cost of the Regular Army, based on estimates submitted for the fiscal year of 1917, together with the cost of proposed increase based on the proposed bill, including pay for the Organized Militia, would be \$116,319,271.40 for the first year, and \$137,494,954.77 for the fifth year and thereafter including Organized Militia.

NATIONAL DEFENSE (H. R. 12766). May 8, 1916, page 8591.

SEC. 56. The volunteer army: The President is hereby authorized, at any time, to organize, maintain, and train, under the provisions of sections 3 to 12, both inclusive, of an act entitled "An act to provide for raising the volunteer forces of the United States in time of actual or threatened war," approved April 25, 1914, volunteer forces, not exceeding an average of 600 officers and enlisted men for each congressional district. The term of enlistment, which shall in no event be greater than that of the Regular Army, the period of service with the colors and with the reserve, and the period of training shall be as the President may prescribe, those passing to the reserve to have the status and obligations prescribed for reserves of the Regular Army: *Provided*, That as reserves no compensation shall be paid except for actual services. Officers and enlisted men of the volunteer forces raised under the provisions of this section shall be entitled to the pay and allowances of officers and enlisted men of corresponding grades in the Regular Army during periods of training only: *Provided further*, That without the consent of Congress such volunteer forces shall not be called out for field service for more than a total period exceeding 30 days in any one year.

Temporary appointments and promotions of officers of the Regular Army arising from the operation of this section may be terminated at the discretion of the President.

Officers of the Regular Army who receive commissions in the volunteer

army herein authorized shall in time of peace receive the pay and allowances of their respective grades in the Regular Army, and no more.

NATIONAL DEFENSE (H. R. 12766. Government-owned nitrogen plant).

May 8, 1916. page 8603.

The roll call here given was on the Lenroot amendment which read as follows:

Amendment offered by Mr. Lenroot: Amend Senate amendment to H. R. 12766 by striking out of said amendment lines 14 to 25, inclusive, on page 206, and lines 1 and 2, on page 207, and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

"That the Secretary of War is authorized and directed to investigate and to recommend for designation or withdrawal such dam sites and water-power sites as in his opinion will be necessary for carrying out the purposes of this act.

"That the Secretary of War, the Secretary of the Interior, and the Secretary of Agriculture are constituted a commission whose duty it shall be to ascertain the most practicable means and comparative costs of producing within the United States nitrogen compounds by the fixation of atmospheric nitrogen or otherwise needed for munitions of war and useful in the manufacture of fertilizers and other useful products. In making such investigation the commission may utilize the various agencies of the Government and may cooperate with States or other agencies in the performance of its duties.

"It shall as early as practicable, not later than December 1, 1916, report the facts ascertained together with its recommendations to the President, which recommendations shall include the designation of a site or sites for the construction of a plant or plants for the purposes aforesaid.

"If the commission shall recommend the production of such nitrogen compounds through the utilization of water-power sites, then the Secretary of War is hereby authorized to construct, maintain, and operate at or on any water-power site designated or withdrawn by the President and recommended by the commission as herein provided dams, locks, power houses, and other plants and equipment necessary or convenient for the generation of electrical or other power and for the production of nitrates or other products needed for munitions of war and nitrogen compounds useful as or in the manufacture of fertilizers.

"If such commission shall recommend the production of such nitrogen compounds by means other than the utilization of water-power sites, the Secretary of War is likewise authorized to construct, maintain, and operate at any point recommended by such commission as aforesaid plants and equipments of such character as may have been recommended by such commission as herein provided: *Provided*, That no expenditure shall be made or contracts entered into by the Secretary of War requiring an expenditure for the construction of said plant or plants of a greater amount than the appropriation hereinafter made: *Provided further*, That no expenditure shall be made or contracts entered into for the construction of any dam or plant herein authorized until such processes, patented or otherwise, necessary for the operation of such plants and for the manufacture of such products are first secured."

Further amended by striking out lines 11 to 15, inclusive, on page 207, and insert in lieu thereof the following:

"That the products of such plants shall be used by the Secretary of War and Secretary of the Navy for military and naval purposes to the extent that they may deem necessary, and any surplus which they shall determine is not so required shall be sold and disposed of by the Secretary of Agriculture under such regulations as he may prescribe."

Strike out all of section 122, after the word "That," on the first line of the section, and insert the following: "the Secretary of War, the Secretary of the Navy, the Secretary of the Interior, and the Secretary of Agriculture are constituted a commission whose duty it shall be to ascertain the practicability and best means of producing within the United States nitrogen compounds by the fixation of atmospheric nitrogen or otherwise for use in the manufacture of munitions of war and fertilizers.

"The commission may utilize the various agencies of the Government and may cooperate with States and with private persons or agencies in carrying out its purposes and shall report to Congress as early as practicable, not later than the first day of the next regular session of this Congress, the facts ascertained, together with recommendations for action by Congress and the draft of a bill to carry out such recommendations.

"The commission may elect a chairman, and the funds appropriated for its use shall be paid out on warrants signed by him, or by an acting chairman designated by him, drawn on the Secretary of the Treasury.

"There is hereby appropriated, out of any moneys in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, available until expended, the sum of \$50,000, to enable the commission to carry out its purposes, including the hire of experts, clerks, and other employees, and payment of rent, traveling and other expenses within and outside the District of Columbia."

And if the United States owns no suitable site, or sites, authority is hereby given to acquire by purchase, condemnation, or gift such site or sites as may be necessary. The expenditures for drafting, technical, expert, and clerical assistance necessary shall be paid from the appropriation herein made.

"The Secretary of the Navy shall keep accurate and itemized account of the cost per ton of the product of such factory or factories and report the same to Congress in his annual report."

The roll call here given was on the passage of the bill prohibiting the shipment in interstate commerce the product of any mine or quarry situated in the United States which has been produced in whole or in part, by the labor of children under the age of sixteen years, or the product of any mill, cannery, workshop, factory, or manufacturing establishment situated in the United States which has been produced, in whole or in part, by the labor of children under the age of fourteen years or by the labor of children between the ages of fourteen years and sixteen years who work more than eight hours in any one day, or more than six days in any one week, or after the hour of seven o'clock postmeridian, or before the hour of seven o'clock

antemeridian. The act was scheduled to take effect from and after one year from the date of its passage.

EIGHT-HOUR DAY ON RAILROADS (H. R. 17700). September 1, 1916, page 15879.

The roll call here given was on the passage of the bill which read as follows:

Be it enacted, etc., That beginning December 1, 1916, eight hours shall, in contracts for labor and service, be deemed a day's work and the measure or standard of a day's work for the purpose of reckoning the compensation for services of all employees who are now or may hereafter be employed by any common carrier by railroad which is subject to the provisions of the act of February 1, 1887, entitled "An Act to regulate commerce," as amended, and who are now or may hereafter be actually engaged in any capacity in the operation of trains used for the transportation of persons or property on railroads, from any State or Territory of the United States or the District of Columbia to any other State or Territory of the United States or the District of Columbia, or from one place in a Territory to another place in the same Territory, or from any place in the United States to an adjacent foreign country, or from any place in the United States through a foreign country to any other place in the United States.

SEC. 2. That the President shall appoint a commission of three, which shall observe the operation and effects of the institution of the eight-hour standard workday as above defined and the facts and conditions affecting the relations between such common carriers and employees during a period of not less than 6 months nor more than 9 months, in the discretion of the commission, and within 30 days thereafter such commission shall report its findings to the President and Congress; that each member of the commission created under the provisions of this act shall receive such compensation as may be fixed by the President. That the sum of \$25,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, be, and hereby is, appropriated, out of any money in the United States Treasury not otherwise appropriated, for the necessary and proper expenses incurred in connection with the work of such commission, including salaries, per diem, traveling expenses of members and employees, and rent, furniture, office fixtures and supplies, books, salaries, and other necessary expenses, the same to be approved by the chairman of said commission and audited by the proper accounting officers of the Treasury.

SEC. 3. That pending the report of the commission herein provided for and for a period of 30 days thereafter the compensation of railway employees subject to this act for a standard eight-hour workday shall not be reduced below the present standard day's wage, and for all necessary time in excess of eight hours such employees shall be paid at a rate not less than the pro rata rate for such standard eight-hour workday.

SEC. 4. That any person violating any provision of this act shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be fined not less than \$100 and not more than \$1,000, or imprisoned not to exceed one year, or both.

GOOD ROADS (H. R. 7617). January 25, 1916, pages 1688-9.

The bill further provided that after deducting the sum necessary to defray the expenses of the administration of the act, the money should be divided among the States as follows: \$65,000 to each State and one half of the remainder in the ratio which the population of each State bears to the population of all the States as shown by the census, and the other half of such remainder in the ratio which the mileage of rural free delivery and star mail routes in such State bears to the mileage of rural free delivery and star mail routes of all the States.

IMMIGRATION, THE LITERACY TEST (H. R. 10384). March 30, 1916, page 5954.

The roll call here given was on striking out the literacy test section of the bill. This section read as follows:

Mr. Sabath moves to recommit the bill H. R. 10384 to the Committee on Immigration and Naturalization, with instructions to strike out the following and report forthwith:

"That after three months from the passage of this act, in addition to the aliens who are by law now excluded from admission into the United States, the following persons shall also be excluded from admission thereto, to wit:

"All aliens over 16 years of age, physically capable of reading, who can not read the English language, or some other language or dialect, including Hebrew or Yiddish: *Provided*, That any admissible alien, or any alien heretofore or hereafter legally admitted, or any citizen of the United States, may bring in or send for his father or grandfather over 55 years of age, his wife, his mother, his grandmother, or his unmarried or widowed daughter, if otherwise admissible, whether such relative can read or not; and such relative shall be permitted to enter. That for the purpose of ascertaining whether aliens can read the immigrant inspectors shall be furnished with slips of uniform size, prepared under the direction of the Secretary of Labor, each containing not less than 30 nor more than 40 words in ordinary use, printed in plainly legible type in some one of the various languages or dialects of immigrants. Each alien may designate the particular language or dialect in which he desires examination to be made, and shall be required to read the words printed on the slip in such language or dialect. That the following classes of persons shall be exempt from the operation of the illiteracy test, to wit: All aliens who shall prove to the satisfaction of the proper immigration officer or to the Secretary of Labor that they are seeking admission to the United States to avoid religious persecution in the country of their last permanent residence, whether such persecution be evidenced by overt acts or by laws or governmental regulations that discriminate against the alien or the race to which he belongs because of his religious faith; all aliens who have been lawfully admitted to the United States and who have resided therein continuously for five years, and who have in accordance with the law declared their intentions of becoming citizens of the United States and who return to the United States within six months from the date of their departure therefrom; all aliens in transit through the United States; all aliens who have been lawfully admitted to the United States and who later shall go in transit from one part of the United States to another through foreign contiguous territory."

SHIPPING BILL (H. R. 15455). May 20, 1916, page 9484.

The roll call here given was on the passage of the bill. The bill contained provisions for the creation of a United States Shipping Board to be composed of the Secretary of the Navy, the Secretary of Commerce and five commissioners to be appointed by the President. This Board was authorized to have constructed and equipped in American shipyards and navy yards or elsewhere, giving preference, other things being equal, to domestic yards, or to purchase, lease, or charter vessels suitable, as far as the commercial requirements of the marine trade of the United States may permit, for use as naval auxiliaries or army transports, or for other naval or military purposes. It was further provided that the Board might form corporations for the purchase, construction, equipment, lease, charter, maintenance, and operation of merchant vessels in the commerce of the United States. The total capital stock of these corporations was not to exceed \$50,000,000. The Board was authorized to purchase and vote not

less than a majority of the capital stock of such corporations. At the expiration of five years from the conclusion of the present European war the operation of vessels on the part of any corporation in which the United States was a stockholder was to cease and the corporation be dissolved. The Board was also empowered to investigate the relative cost of building merchant vessels in the United States and in foreign countries, and the relative cost, advantages, and disadvantages of operation in the foreign trade vessels under United States registry and under foreign registry.

RURAL CREDITS (Senate 2986). June 27, 1916, pages 11612-13.

As finally passed, the bill established twelve Federal farm lands banks to be operated under supervision of a Federal farm loan board of five members, including the Secretary of the Treasury. Each bank will have a minimum capital stock of \$750,000, of which the government may subscribe a part if necessary to complete subscriptions. The minimum amount of mortgage loans is \$100. Mortgages may run from 5 to 40 years. Loans may not exceed 50 per cent of the value of the land.

EXPORT TRADE (H. R. 17350). September 2, 1916, pages 16013-14.

The roll call here given was on the passage of the bill providing that nothing in the Sherman Anti-Trust law and the laws supplemental thereto should be construed as declaring illegal an association entered into for the sole purpose of engaging in export trade and actually engaged solely in such trade, or an agreement made or act done in the course of export trade by such association, provided such association, agreement, or act be not in restraint of trade within the United States, nor shall such corporation be forbidden to acquire or own the whole or part of the stock of any other corporation organized solely for the purpose of engaging in export trade, unless the effect of such acquisition or ownership may be to restrain trade or substantially lessen competition within the United States in articles of the kind exported by the association whose stock is acquired or controlled.

A YEA vote is a vote *in favor* of this bill.

A NAY vote is a vote *against* this bill.

IMPORTANT LAWS PASSED.

Most important legislative enactments of the session, exclusive of laws for national defense, included the following:

Government ship law—Appropriating \$50,000,000 to operate ships in foreign and coastwise trade when unable to lease them to individuals or private corporations.

Child labor law—Denying interstate commerce to products of mines and quarries employing children under 16 years of age, and factories, mills, canneries and other establishments employing children under 14 years.

Rural credits law—Establishing a farm loan board in control of a system of farm loan mortgage banks.

Workmen's compensation law—Providing uniform sick and accident benefits for employees of the Federal Government, and benefits to dependants in case of death.

Emergency revenue law—Providing for double the normal income tax on the lowest class; making an additional surtax ranging from 1 per cent on that portion of incomes exceeding \$20,000 to 13 per cent on amount of incomes in excess of \$2,000,000; levying a graduated tax of 1 to 10 per cent on inheritances ranging from \$50,000 to \$5,000,000; a 12½ per cent net profit tax on manufacturers of munitions; a license tax on actually invested capital stock of corporations capitalized at more than \$99,000; wine, beer and liquor excise taxes, and miscellaneous stamp taxes.

Good roads law—Providing for co-operative Federal aid to the States for construction of highways, and appropriating \$75,000,000 to be spent in five years.

Postal savings law—Amendment increasing the amount which individuals may deposit from \$500 to \$1,000 with interest, and an additional \$1,000 without interest.

Federal reserve—Amendments, including amendment to the Clayton anti-trust law permitting officers and directors of member banks to become officers and directors of not more than two other noncompeting banks; amendments permitting national banks to establish foreign branches, liberalizing regulations for discounting commercial paper, and permitting member banks in towns of 5,000 or less population to act as agents for insurance companies.

Railroad legislation—Creation of a joint subcommittee of Senate and House interstate commerce committees to investigate necessity for further legislation for railroads and the Interstate Commerce Commission, question of government ownership of public utilities, and comparative worth of government ownership as against government regulation.

Tariff: Creation of a nonpartisan tariff commission of five members to investigate and advise Congress on tariff revision; repeal of the free sugar provision of existing tariff law; amendments increasing duties on dyestuffs to encourage manufacturing dyestuffs in the United States; enactment of an antidumping provision to prevent dumping of foreign-made goods at less than foreign market prices; authorization for the President to retaliate against foreign nations prohibiting importation of goods from the United States by laying an embargo against imports from offending nations.

Cotton futures act: Providing a prohibitive tax on cotton futures for future delivery in fictitious or wash sales.

Philippines: Law to provide for a more autonomous government of the islands, enlarging self-government, reorganizing election laws, establishing an elective Senate and promising independence whenever, in the judgment of the United States, the Philippine people demonstrate capability for it.

Railroad eight-hour day law: Establishing eight hours as the standard for reckoning the compensation of railroad employees operating trains in interstate commerce after January 1, 1917, and providing for a commission of three to investigate the effects of the eight-hour standard, present wages not to be reduced during the investigation, nor for 30 days thereafter, and work in excess of eight hours to be paid for at a pro rata rate.

EXPENDITURES IN THE FUTURE.

In addition to the total there were authorizations for expenditures in future years including naval, good roads, tariff commission and other expenditures to bring the total to approximately \$2,000,000,000, but these amounts do not properly apply to the appropriations for the fiscal year.

In addition Congress enacted an unusually large amount of miscellaneous legislation, including reorganization of the patent office; provision for trial of space system in place of weight system for payment for railroad mail service and leaving to the Interstate Commerce Commission determination of the method and rate of pay; creation of a national park bureau in the Department of the Interior; establishing warehouse regulations for cotton and grains and providing a new grain grading law; extension for a year of the government war risk insurance bureau; uniform law making bills of lading negotiable.

THREE TREATIES RATIFIED.

Three treaties were ratified by the Senate. The most important was the long pending Nicaraguan convention providing for the acquisition of a canal route and naval station rights in the Bay of Fonseca for \$3,000,000, and that ratified in the closing hour for the purchase of the West India Islands for \$25,000,000. Another was the treaty with the republic of Haiti providing for an American financial protectorate.

The much-disputed pending treaty with Colombia after several years of consideration was favorably reported from the foreign relations committee with an amendment reducing from \$25,000,000 to \$15,000,000 the proposed amount to be paid for the partition of Panama.

The treaty, however, was never taken up in the Senate because of unrelenting opposition to it on the part on many senators.

The second session of the Sixty-fourth Congress will probably consider the following bills:

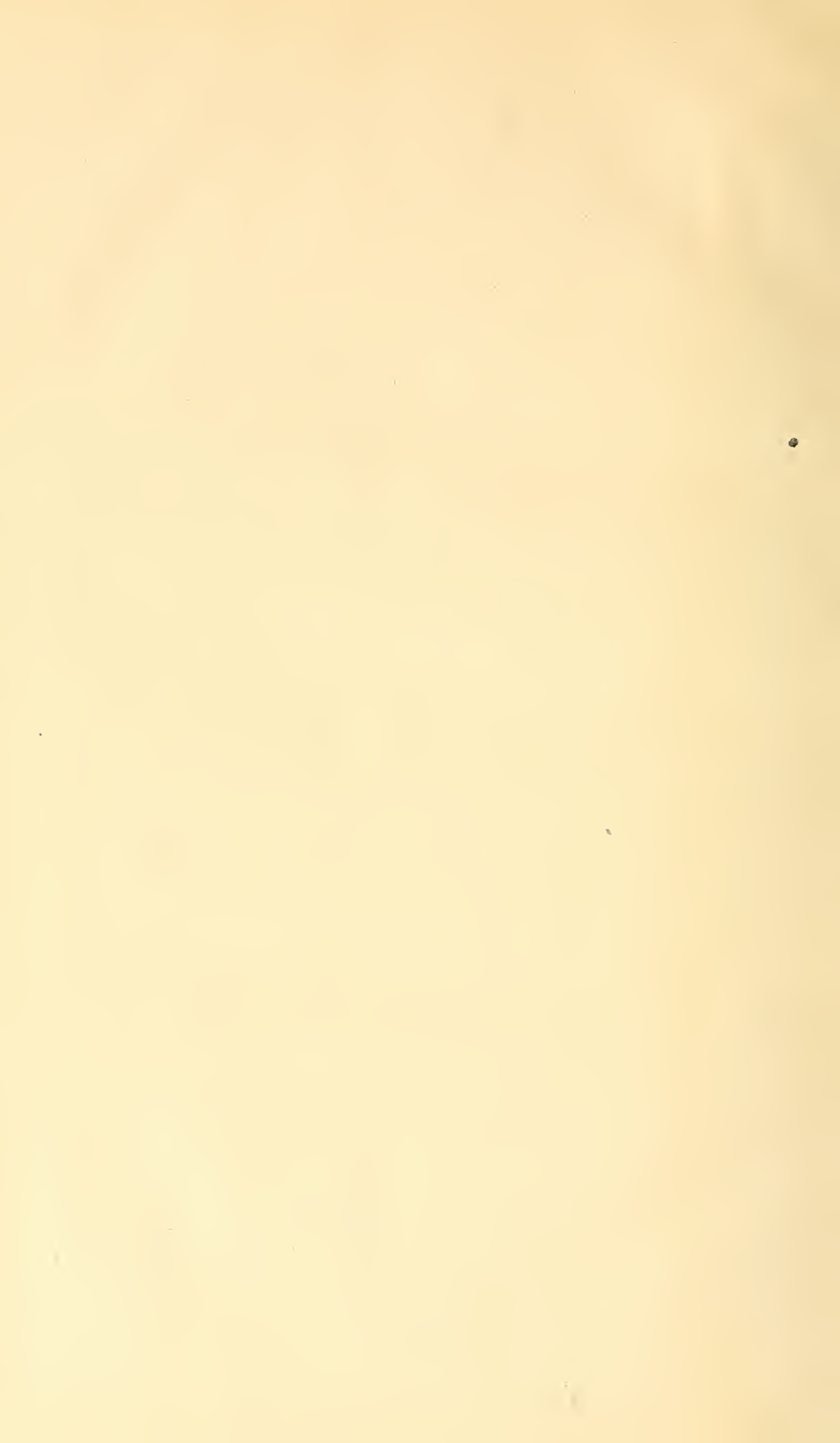
Immigration bill.

For the winter session Democratic leaders look to the railroad legislation as the dominating feature. Before the strike emergency arose Congress, aroused to the necessity for transportation legislation, had created a joint subcommittee of the Senate and House, headed by Senator Newlands, to undertake a study of all transportation problems, including the advisability of government ownership of public utilities, and to recommend legislation at the next session. The committee already has set November 20 for the beginning of hearings on a wide range of subjects.
