ADDRESS OF THE FOREIGN MINISTER, ADMIRAL TEIJIRO TOYOSA,
AT THE LUNCHEON IN COMMEMORATION OF THE FIRST ANNIVERSARY
OF THE CONCLUSION OF THE THREE POWER PACT.

September 27, 1941

Fxcollangies and Gantlemen.

As the first anniversary of the conclusion of the Three Power Pact falls on today, I invited you to join me in colebrating this auspicious Occasion. I feel greatly honoured to have the presence of Their Excellencies, the Ambassaders of Germany and Italy, the Minister of Fumania and Charge'd' Affaires of Hungary.

During the year following the conclusion of the Three Power Pact the situation of the whole world has undergone a great chango. Wher we rocall the mission performed by the Pact in this period, we think it is of great significance that the Pact has been further strengthened through the succosive participation of those countries which, sharing the same ideals with Japan, Germany and Italy, are willing to co-operate for the construction of the new order, such as Hungary and Pumania.

The next point is that Japan, Germany and Italy are stoadily making great strides toward the construction of the new world order respecitively in Europe and Fast Asia. The constructive offorts of Germany and Italy in Europe and those of Japan in Past Asia will still be confrented by many difficulties, and, therefore, increased offorts will be required. However, I am firmly convinced that the accomplishment which the three Powers. making the Pact the basis of their respective diplemacies, have

DFF. DCC. #312 made in co-operation in the brief poried since the conclusion of the Pact will play a great role in the history of the world. Thirdly, the Three Power Pact has a lofty mission of preventing the extension of the dispute as will as the spread of hostilities as far as possible. I have no doubt that in the past year the Pact has also accomplished a great deal in this repect. The ideal as enunciated by the Three Power Pact is the accomplishment of the noble mission of mankind and needless to say, the mutual co-operation, trust and patience as well as complete preparations to cope with the emergency are essential in order to achieve this ideal. On this day of commemorating the first anniversary of the conclusion of the Pact, each signatery Power should renew its attitude with regard to this point and its determination to surmount whatever defficulties there many be in its path. Let us rise and drink to the health of Their "xcellencies.
