the owner agreed to give about five tons of serpentine free of charge as trial mining.

3. Land Adjacent to Serpentine mine.

This lot of paddy-field in possession of Chokichi Ishii is quite necessary for the operation of company's work. A negotiation was made by the company to purchase the land which is actually 3 se 15 bu though it is registered as 2 se 13 bu in the land-ledger, and the claim for yen 50,000 was rejected by the company. Thereafter, the said owner approached with the Agricultural-land Commission in joint with the said company to exchange the land which is 6 se and had ever been turned to an experimental farm of the primary school as no labor was available for its cultivation due to the enlistment. It still remains unsettled because the principal of school does not consent.

This is no fact that the lease problem of land is not disturbed with the communist movement and it is deadlocked with the financial problem of the company. The fact that the land exchange is impossible due to the disagreement of primary school is also another cause for the deadlock.

STATEMENT

As I have been told by the adopted son of Goro Saito of Kanto Mining Company, Lt., Kawagoe City, Saitama Prefecture and Motonari Shindo, director of same company, in the middle of December, 1949, to the effect that they are much harassed with the objection of land-owners in connection with the mining operation in Ogose-machi, I understood that I must not leave it overlooked because it is an industry for the benefit of the country, and I have visited the chief of the Natural Resources Division of Kanto Civil Affairs Region to get assistance for the settlement of the case.

In that opportunity, I told him that I suspect some communist movements hinder the project. I told it because very often such thing happened in other place.

I apologize for my misreport which was made by myself even though I had no exact knowledge of such fact with regard to the mine under operation of Mr. Saito.

I have a chrome mine operated since 1944 in Ryoi, Ogose-machi, Iruma-gun, Saitama Prefecture. In connection with the continuation of work in 1950, the work is ceased due to the failure of negotiation with the land-owner.

Besides, it is planned to take out the serpentine in Nishiwada of same town and intend to close a contract with a certain fertilizer company for supplying the raw material for phosphoric fertilizer.

In regard to this new project, the negotiation with the land-owner does not yet bring us an agreement. However, we recognize no fact that this project is distrubed with any activity of communists at present and in the past.
