SUBJECT: Security of Minoshima Tank Farm.

TO : Commanding General, 25th Infantry Division, APO 25.
 Commanding Officer, Wakayama Military Government Team APO 660.

1. 25th Infantry Division guard detachment presently furnishing security for the Gasoline Storage Tank Farm at Minoshima (1010-1220) will be relieved by Japanese Police at 0800I, 10 January 1947. A minimum of one non-commissioned officer from the detachment will remain at the farm until 17 January 1947 for the purpose of assisting in orientation and supervision of the Japanese police.

2. Effective 10 January 1947, the Commanding Officer, Wakayama Military Government Team, will be responsible for supervising Japanese police to insure their effective functioning.

3. Arrangements have been made with Commanding General, Kobe Base (G-2) whereby he will furnish overlays, guard orders, etc, for the Japanese police guards.

4. Commanding General, 25th Infantry Division, will be responsible for emergency defense of the installation. Copies of the plan will be sent to this headquarters and to Commanding General, Kobe Base (G-2).

5. Direct communication is authorized.



Col Partridge:

1. The attached letter from G-1 arrived at about 2 p.m. this date. I asked Sgt Foster to come down and prepare a report.

2. Sgt Foster had previously given me this information (1) over the phone last Sunday and (2) in a memorandum the next day. I had instructed him to do this in case some such criticism came about and I did not want him to forget the details.

3. I have complete confidence in Sgt Foster and am positive that everything he says is true. He has called my attention to the matters with which he is concerned in his work with such regularity as to make me have complete confidence in him.

4. I know for a fact that the Shiga report did not arrive at my desk until 18 Sept 1946.

5. Both Sgt Foster and Miss Kobayashi spend virtually their entire day on the telephone calling the attention of units to such reports as these and if the report is demanded quickly they go to a great deal of trouble to explain to and help the units. Often we have prepared reports in this section for subordinate units in order to meet deadlines

6. Sgt Foster devised a memorandum system, a mimeographed form in which he fills the name of the report, which was another effort to get our units to comply promptly and properly. (See inclosure.) These memoranda augmented the telephone calls. The original directives which call for the reports in many cases seem to be ignored or forgotten by the units.

7. The G-1 directive calling for the report was dated 8 Sept. It would have been a miracle if all our units had received it by the 11 or 12 of Sept. This gave them very little time to prepare and get the reports back. Perhaps G-1 does not understand the communications difficulties which we have tried to overcome by the expenditure of a great deal of effort over the telephone.

8. In no way is Kinki to blame. We went completely out our way to protect our units. It is they who should be called to account--Nara, Wakayama, Shiga especially.

In compliance with your request concerning report on "Return of Enlisted personnel to receive Terminal Leave", the following is submitted:

"1. Reference is made to Messageform, Hq I Corps, file 220.711, subject as above, dated 8 September 1946, requesting above report to reach G-1 Sec, not later than 1000 hours, 14 Sep 46.

2. On my return to work from TDY in Kyushu on 11 Sep 46, my attention was called to this report and a memorandum was sent to the units under Kinki calling attention, and strict compliance. Phone calls to all units were made by myself and Miss Kobayashi on an average of one a day, sometimes directing special courier to bring report immediately. No results.

3. Reports I had on hand for compilation were from Kinki, Kyoto, Osaka, and Hyogo. Delinquent units were Fukui, Shiga, Nara, and Wakayama.

"a. In the case of Fukui, telephone conversation with Lt. Kalmyer and myself, I was informed that their report was on the way up but was never received by me. Unit was fully aware that the report was due 1000, 14 Sep 46.

b. In the case of Shiga, report was dated 12 Sep 46 but also was not received by "date-due".

c. In the case of Nara MG, which was the most delinquent unit. They were instructed several times to pay close attention to the report and insure prompt arrival. One occasion I instructed the 1st Sgt to hand-carry the report on his trip to pick up the replacements but did not comply.

d. In the case of Wakayama, poor communications prevented calling several times but they were notified at least twice. Report was dated 12 Sep but was not received by me until after "date-due".

4. At approximately 1400, 14 Sep 46, Cpl Smith, G-1 Sec, came to me for this report which was required to be consolidated by the Kinki Region. At that time reports on hand were Kinki, Kyoto, Osaka, and Hyogo. The matter was referred to Major Crandall immediately and we decided to compile a report from the material on hand and what I could get the last minute by phone, and minimum guess work. I told Captain Fitzgerald, AG, that confirming and rectifying report would be submitted by writing.

TO: CG, I Corps, APO 301

1. Reference Operational Instructions No. 1, Hq I Corps, Military Government, Industry, par 5a(1), which states as follows:

"Establish a 24-hour Japanese civilian guard at the establishment. It will be the responsibility of the company to furnish guards. No one may be hired as a guard if he is in the category listed in the SCAP directives as being ineligible for hire. Particular care will be taken to avoid hiring any demobilized Japanese Army or Navy officer personnel."

2. Because of the above instructions this headquarters feels that the following information which was given this headquarters, should be forwarded to higher authorities.

a. The Finance Ministry of the Imperial Japanese Government is charged with the responsibility of maintaining adequate guards, maintenance, and upkeep of all machinery and equipment belonging to former Japanese Army and Navy arsenals, laboratories etc. It has been reported to this headquarters that Mr. Ikeuchi, the local head of the Finance Ministry which is in charge of the arsenals and laboratories in this area, is a former Japanese army colonel, and that many of his staff members working in this section are also former members of the Japanese army.

b. It has also been reported to this headquarters that a company has been formed, name Sanwa Company Ltd., No. 15 4-chome Imabashi, Higashi-ku-, Osaka, consisting of many former Japanese army officers. The president, Mr. Yuasa, formerly supplied large amounts of materials to the arsenals, and the subject company is now trying to secure a part of the Kori arsenal for its own use. This headquarters has been informed that an application was put through by the Finance Ministry to Tokyo direct. This headquarters knows nothing of this application.

c. It has also been reported to this headquarters that should Mr. Ikeuchi of the local Finance Ministry lose his present assignment, Sanwa Company has already an opening for him. It has also been learned that some large stocks of raw materials have been turned over to the Sanwa Company.

3. This information is forwarded to higher authorities for whatever action is deemed necessary.

1. You are directed to cause an investigation be made to determine whether or not Mr. IKEUCHI, Head of the Osaka Finance Ministry, is a former Japanese Army officer. In this respect it may be pointed out that the provisions of SCAPIN 550 apply only to civil service officials with the rank of "Chokunin" and above (paragraph 3a) although it is contemplated that ultimately this directive will be extended to lower ranking officials. If, however, it appears that the retention in public office of Mr. IKEUCHI is prejudicial to the objectives of the occupation, this headquarters will forward the results of your investigation to higher headquarters. If the report from your headquarters favors the removal of Mr. IKEUCHI from office, it is directed that your report be accompanied by a positive recommendation to that effect supported by the information on which it is based.

2. In regard to paragraph 2d of the basic communication, this headquarters knows of no directive which prohibits the Sanwa Company Ltd., from applying for purchase of military installations. This company is apparently following the correct channel in applying through the Finance Ministry to Tokyo. The Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, in approving or disapproving this application, will give proper consideration to the characters of the individuals who file the application.
