SUBJECT:

Disposition of Vessels Abandoned on the Japanese Coast

1. References:

a. Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers memorandum to the Japanese Government, file AG 091.31 (4 Jun 46) USS/PC, (SCAPIN 996), subject: Illegal Import and Export Trade.

- b. Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers memorandum to the Japanese Government, file AG 000.5 (10 Dec 46)GC, (SCAPIN 1391), dated 10 December 1946, subject: Suppression of Illegal Entry into Japan.
- c. Central Liaison Office letter number 1413 (CM) dated 4 March 1947, subject as above.
- 2. After 2 September 1945 but prior to the issuance of references a and b, a large number of small vessels (less than 100 gross tons) arrived illegally in Japan from other areas; and, having been abandoned by their owners, are at present neither properly supervised nor profitably employed.
- 3. The Japanese Government is directed to take custody of such vessals in order that they may be effectively put to use in the transportation and fishing industries.
- 4. A report on the measures to be taken in compliance with this directive will be submitted by the Japanese Government within thirty (30) days of the receipt of this memorandum.
