THE 1896 NORTH ADAMS CITY DIRECTORY is herewith presented, enlarged and improved in many ways. Especial attention being paid to the city government, city officers, ward lines, city charter, deaths, etc. There has been added 24 new streets and avenues and 40 pages more names than last year. Briggsville has more than doubled. Blackinton and Greylock have held their own, while to the body of the book has been added over 3,500 new names, making total number of names in the Directory 10,608. An unusually large number of erasures and changes have also been made.

It would be a good thing if many of the streets and avenues in the city were properly renumbered.

CTY WARD LINES.

Ward 1.—Includes the villages of Blackinton and Greylock east to the point where the old Williamstown road crosses the Hoosac river near the Fitchburg railroad crossing in Braytonville. The line

then runs north to Clarksburg town boundary. From the railroad crossing the line follows the Hoosac river eastward past the fair grounds to Brown street, passing southward along that street and along the east boundary of the cemetery, thence due south to the

Adams line.

Ward 2.—The western boundary of Ward 2 begins at Clarksburg and runs south to the junction of the old Williamstown highway and the Hoosac river, with the river from that point to Brooklyn street for its southern boundary. Thence the line runs northerly to Liberty, easterly on Liberty to Phillips street and northerly along Phillips street across the hospital grounds due north to the Clarksburg line.

Ward 3.—The easterly boundary of Ward 3 starts at the Clarksburg line and follows Franklin street to Eagle down Eagle to the Hoosac river, thence westerly along the river to Brooklyn street, up Brooklyn to Liberty, to Phillips thence due north to the Clarksburg line.

Ward 4.—The easterly boundary of Ward 4 is the line between Florida and North Adams south to a point opposite the Five Roads thence due west to the East Mountain school, thence north-westerly to East Main street down East Main through Willow Dell to the Hoosac river, thence along the river to Eagle street up Eagle and Franklin streets to the Clarksburg line.

Ward 5.—Bounded on the east by the Florida town line, on the south by Adams as far west as the south branch of the Hoosac river, thence northerly along the river to a point opposite J. H. Flagg's property on State street. The boundary line then runs due east to Ashland street and north-westerly along Ashland street to Washing. ton avenue to Church down Church to the juuction of Main, thence in a general easterly direction along East Main to the East Mountain school and thence due east to Florida line.

Ward 6.—Starting at the Holden street bridge the lines of Ward 6 run alongside the north branch of the Hoosac river to and through Willow Dell to East Main, thence to the junction of East Main and Church, and down Church to Washington avenue; thence along Washington avenue to Ashland street; thence northerly along Ashland street to Quincy, westerly through Quincy to its termination; thence northerly across Summer street to and through Holden street to the bridge.

Ward 7 runs along the north branch of the Hoosac river to Holden street thence through Holden across Main to the western terminus of Quincy street; thence through Quincy to Ashland southeasterly through Ashland to the point opposite J. H. Flagg's property on State street thence southerly along the south branch of the Hoosac river to the Adams line; thence westerly to a point equi-distant from the Adams turnpike to the Notch road; thence due north through the Tinney and Witherell properties to the easterly boundary of the cemetery; thence along Brown street to the bridge, the point of beginning.

City of NORTH ADAMS.

Etxract from Ordinance Concerning Licenses, Amusements, Theatres, Etc.

SEC. 5. Every person licensed to set up, maintain or carry on any theatrical exhibition, public show, public amusement or exhibition, mentioned in Section 115 of Chapter 102 of the Public Statutes, shall pay the following rates:

For theatrical exhibitions or shows, for each day and evening, five dollars.

For theatrical exhibitions or shows given in the Columbia Opera house and Bijou Theatre for one year, fifty dollars for each place.

For skating rinks or parks, for one year, twenty-five dollars. For public racing or trial of speed of horses, for each day, five dollars.

For travelling circuses or travelling shows, exhibiting in tents, for each day and evening, from twenty-five dollars to one hundred dollars.

For all other shows, amusements and exhibitions embraced within the provisions of said section, such sums as the said license committee or majority thereof shall determine at the time of the application for the license.

Provided, however, that no such license shall permit entertainment for gain and reward upon the Lord's day, or exhibitions of wrestling or sparring upon any day, unless the particular exhibition or entertainment shall be petitioned for, and the license therefor granted by a two-thirds vote of the members of the City Council present at a meeting thereof.

Every license granted under this section shall, (if required by the Committee on Licenses) be upon condition that one or more police officers, to be paid by the licensee, be assigned to duty at the place of such exhibition, for the keeping of order thereat.

The Mayor, President of the City Council, City Clerk, Committee on Licenses and Chief of Police or his deputies, shall have the right to visit at all times such places of amusements as are licensed under the provisions of this ordinance.

Extract from Ordinance concerning Licenses, Dealers in Junk and Second-hand Articles.

The License Committee may license suitable persons to be dealers in and keepers of shops for the purchase, sale or barter of junk, old metals or second-hand articles, at such places within the city as may be designated in such licenses, under such conditions and restrictions as are hereinafter prescribed, which shall be incorporated in every such license. The licensee shall pay for the license two dollars. Every keeper of a sliop licensed as aforesaid shall keep a book in which shall be written at the time of every purchase, a description of the junk, old metal or second-hand articles so purchased, the name, age and residence of the person from whom, and the day and hour when such purchase was made. Such book shall at all times be open for inspection of the Chief of Police, and of any member of the City Council. Every keeper of such shop shall put in some suitable and conspicuous place on his shop a sign having his name and occupation legibly inscribed thereon in large letters. Such shops and all articles of merchandise therein, may at all times be examined by the Chief of Police or any member of the City Council. No keeper of such shop shall directly or indirectly either purchase or receive by way of barter or exchange any of the articles aforesaid of a minor or apprentice, knowing or having reason to believe him to be such and no article purchased or received shall be sold until a period of at least one week from the date of its purchase or receipt has elapsed, unless the name and address of the person whom such article has been sold, with other facts as may be necessary to facilitate the tracing of such article, having been entered on the book mentioned in this section. No wagon shall be used for the collection of junk, metal, rags or secondhand articles, unless licensed by the City Council. Every such wagon shall bear conspicuously the owner's name and the number of the license on the outside and on each side. be the duty of the City Clerk to keep a record of the name and residence of every peddler licensed by the city, together with the number of the vehicle used in his business, and of the particular business for which his license is granted; a list of dealers in articles mentioned in this Ordinance, and of the places wherein the business is to be carried on; and also a list of all persons employed by any such peddler or dealer in the peddling or collecting of any such articles. Whoever, not being licensed, keeps such shop, or any licensed dealer who keeps such shop in any place or manner other than that designated in his license, or after notice to him that his license has been revoked, and whoever violates any rule, regulation or restriction contained in his license shall forfeit a sum not exceeding twenty dollars for each offense.

Extracts from Ordinance Concerning Licenses.

GUNPOWDER AND EXPLOSIVE COMPOUNDS:

SEC. 10. No person shall keep or deposit any gunpowder within the city unless it is well secured in tight casks or canisters; or keep or deposit more than fifty pounds of gunpowder in any shop, store or other building which is within the distance of twenty-five rods from any other building; or keep or deposit more than twenty-five pounds of gunpowder in any shop, store, or other building, which is within the distance of ten rods from any other building; or keep or deposit more than one pound of gunpowder in any shop, store or other building which is within ten rods of any other building, unless it is well secured in copper, tin or brass canisters, holding not exceeding five pounds each, and closely covered with copper, brass or tin covers. But the foregoing provisions shall not apply to magazines for the storage of powder at quarries. The License Committee may license persons to sell gunpowder. Every such license shall set forth the name of the person licensed, and the building or place in the city where the business may be carried on, and shall have the provisions of this ordinance relating thereto printed thereon, and there shall be paid therefor a licence fee of the sum of two dollars. The place of business named in such license shall not be changed without the consent of the License Committee.

No person shall keep for sale or sell any gunpowder within the

city without a license from the License Committee.

Every person so licensed to sell gunpowder shall keep a sign over the outside of the principal entrance from the street of the building in which the powder is kept, on which shall be printed in capitals the words "Licensed to keep and sell Gunpowder;" and every person owning or keeping gunpowder above the quantity of five pounds within the city shall forthwith notify the Chief Engineer of the Fire Department where the same is kept, and shall comply with any directions of said Engineer respecting the part of the building assigned by him for its future keeping or storage.

No person, except he be on military duty in the public service of the United States or of this Commonwealth, shall keep, have or possess, in any building, place or vehicle, within one rod of a dwelling house, any explosive coumpound other than gunpowder in quantity exceeding one-fifth of a pound, and in larger quantities dynamite, nitro-glycerine, guncotton and other high explosives, must be stored in magazines located in such places as the Board of Health may direct. But for use in quarries and for blasting purposes dynamite and other high explosives may be removed in necessary quantities day by day from the storage magazines.

The License Committee may license any suitable person to keep, store and sell such high explosive compounds other than gunpowder in accordance with the foregoing provisions. Any member of the Police or Fire Department may enter the building or premises of any person licensed to sell explosive compounds, and examine and ascertain if the laws, rules and regulations relating thereto are strictly observed, and an alarm of fire may cause the explosives compounds there deposited to be removed or destroyed, as the case may require. The License committee may license any suitable person to keep for sale and sell any of the fireworks called rockets, bombs, Roman candles, crackers, squibs or serpents and colored fire. Such licensee shall pay for the license the sum of two dollars. No person shall within the city, sell or offer for sale, or have in his possession with intent to sell, any toy pistol or toy cannon in which explosive compounds are used, or of which such compounds form a part, without a license. The License Committee may license any suitable person to keep for sale and sell such toy pistols and cannons as aforesaid. Such licensee shall pay for the license the sum of two dollars. No person shall keep for sale or sell in any building within the city any camphene, naphtha, burning fluid, or other similar explosive or inflammable fluid without a license from the License Committee who may grant such licenses. Such licensee shall pay for the license the sum of two dollars. Any person violating any of the provisions of this section shall forfeit and pay for each offence a sum not exceeding twenty dollars.



First Class Matter.

This class includes Letters, Postal Cards Sealed Matter and any written communications. Rates 2c. per ounce or fraction thereof.

Second Class.

For Publishers and News Dealers only. Rate 1c. per pound.

Third Class.

Books, Circulars, Photographs, etc., when unsealed. Rate 1c. for two ounces or fraction thereof.

Fourth Class.

Embraces merchandise and all matter not included in the First, Second or Third Class, which is not, in its nature or form, liable to injure other mail matter, and is not above the limit of weight, four pounds. Rate 1c. for each ounce or fraction thereof.

Local or Drop Letters are always 2c. for each ounce at Letter Carrier Office. Special Delivery Stamp, in addition to regular postage, insures immediate delivery at any Post Office in the U.S.

POSTAL LAWS OF 1896.

RULINGS AND INFORMATION UPON POSTAL SUBJECTS.

CLASSIFICATION OF MAIL MATTER.

Classification of Domestic Mail Matter.—Domestic mail matter,—that is, mail matter sent in the mails from some postoffice within the United States to some other postoffice within the same,—is divided into four classes, as follows:

First-Class.—Written matter, namely, letters, postal cards, and all matter wholly or partly in writing, whether sealed, or unsealed, (except manuscript copy accompanying proof-sheets or corrected proof-sheets of the same). All matter sealed or otherwise closed

against inspection is also of the first-class.

The Following Articles are Among Those Subject to First-Class Rates of Postage: - Autograph albums containing writing; bank books, with written entries; bank checks filled out in writing, whether cancelled or not; written visiting cards; "old letters," whether sent singly or in bulk; stenographic or shorthand notes; diplomas, marriage, insurance, or other certificates, filled out in writing; manuscript copy, when not accompanied with printed proof-sheets; type-written matter, and manifold copies of the same; drawings and plans, containing written words, letters, or figures indicating size, price, dimensions, etc.; envelopes bearing written addresses; re-mailed postal cards wholly or partly in writing; printed assessment notices with amount due written or stamped in; printed price-lists, containing written figures; printed receipts with written signature; printed blank forms, filled out in writing; printed cards, bearing a written date, where the date is not the date of the card. but gives information as to when the sender will call, or will deliver something mentioned in the printed part of the card, or is the date upon which something is acknowledged to have been received; indented or perforated sheets of paper, containing characters which can be read by the blind, when they contain actual, personal, correspondence.

Second-Class.—Periodical publications, namely, all newspapers, and other periodical publications which are issued at stated intervals, and as frequently as four times a year, which bear a date of issue, and are numbered consecutively, are issued from a known office of publication, are formed of printed paper sheets, without board, cloth, leather or other substantial binding. To be entitled to entry in this class, such publications must be originated and published for the dissemination of information of a public character, or devoted to literature, the sciences, art, or some special industry, and must have a legitimate list of subscribers, and must not be

designed primarily for advertising purposes, or for free circulation at nominal rates.

Third-Class.—Books, circulars, pamphlets and other matter wholly in print (not included in second-class matter), proof-sheets, corrected proof-sheets, and manuscript copy accompanying the same.

"Printed matter" is defined by statute to be "the reproduction upon paper, by any process, except that of handwriting, of any words, letters, characters, figures, or images, or of any combination thereof, not having the character of an actual and personal correspondence."

A "circular" is defined by statute to be "a printed letter, which, according to internal evidence, is being sent in identical terms to several persons," and does not lose its character as such by writing therein the date, name of addressee or of the sender, or the cor-

rection of mere typographical errors.

The Following Articles, when Printed upon Paper, and Containing no Writing, are Third-Class Matter: - Almanacs, printed legal and insurance blanks; blue prints; printed books; canvassing and prospectus books with printed sample chapters; blank check books and receipt books; printed cards, circulars, catalogues, and assessment notices wholly in print; Christmas and Easter cards; school copy books with printed lines and instructions for use; matter reproduced by the cyclostyle, hectograph, mimeagraph, electric pen, or other similar process easy of recognition; engravings and wood cuts; printed labels; lithographs; printed maps (on paper); music books, and sheets of music: printed blank notes; photographs; printed plans and architectural designs; postage stamps, cancelled ar uncancelled; postal cards, bearing printed advertisements, mailed singly or in bulk; price-lists wholly in print; printed proof-sheets. with or without manuscript; printed tags; printed calendars; U. S. Treasury notes; printed valentines; press clipping, with name and date of paper stamped or written in; indented or perforated sheets of paper, containing characters which can be read by the blind, when not in the nature of personal correspondence.

Seeds, bulbs, roots, scions and plants are, by the Act of July 24, 1888, also mailable at the third-class rate of postage. Under this head are included samples of wheat or other grain in its natural condition; seeding potatoes, beans, peas, chestnuts and acorns Not, however, samples of flour, rolled oats, pearled barley, or other cereals which can only be used as articles of food; or cut flowers, dried plants, and botanical specimens; or foreign nuts and seeds (such as the coffee bean) used exclusively as articles of food, all of

which are subject to postage at the fourth-class rate.

Fourth-class.—Merchandise, namely all matter not embraced in the first, second or third-class which is not in its form or nature liable to destroy, deface or otherwise damage the contents of the mail bag, or harm the person of any one engaged in the postal service, and not above the weight provided by law.

Under the Head of Fourth-class Matter are Included the Following Articles:—Artificial flowers; photograph albums; blank autograph albums; blank books with printed headings; bill-heads and letterheads; blank books; blotters, printed or unprinted; coin; blank cards; printed playing cards; Christmas and Easter cards, printed on other material than paper; samples of cloth; cut flowers; dried plants; botanical and geological specimens; blank diaries; envelopes, printed or unprinted; samples of flour, or other manufactured grain for food purposes; blank address tags or labels; dissected maps and pictures; proprietary medicines in original packages; metals; minerals; paper bags or wrapping paper, printed or unprinted; crayon pictures, oil or water-color paintings, pen or pencil plans or drawings, if they contain no written words, letters, or figures giving size, dimension, distance, price, &c.; blank postal cards in bulk packages; printed dress charts, and printed patterns; stationery; samples of merchandise; wooden rulers, containing printed advertisements; wall paper; queen bees, when properly packed; dried fruit; framed engravings, drawings, or paintings; map printed upon cloth; calendars or other matter printed upon celluloid; paper napkins; photographs retouched with India ink or water colors; tin types; dauguerrotypes; electrotype plates; and, in general, all articles not included in the other three classes of mail matter.

Limit of Weight of Mail Matter.—No package weighing more than four pounds shall be received for conveyance by mail except single books weighing in excess of that amount, and except books and documents published or circulated by order of Congress, or official matter emanating from any of the Departments of the Government or from the Smithsonian Institution.

Second-class matter is not subject to the four-pound limitation. The above limit of weight does not apply to matter in foreign mails regulated by postal convention.

Don't mail your letter or valuable package without having your own address written or printed upon the upper left-hand corner.

This will insure its return to you if not delivered, and will prevent its being sent to and opened at the Dead Letter office.

To the Public: How to Send Money Without Danger of Loss.—
If you wish to send money to a distance in payment of taxes or other debts, for a newspaper subscription, for merchandise, or for any other purpose. Do not put it in a letter, buy a postal money-order; absolute safety guaranteed by the United States Government.

If a return receipt for registered matter addressed to a foreign country be desired by the sender, a demand for the same must be written across the face of the envelope of the registered article. Postmasters should so inform all persons who send registered matter to foreign countries.

A postal money-order is perfectly safe. In case of its loss, the owner can procure a duplicate by making application to the issuing

or the paying Postmaster.

Postmaster-General Wilson announces in the following amendment to the postoffice law, designating legal holidays January 1, February 22, May 30, July 4, the first Monday in September, known as Labor Day, and December 25, and such other days as the President of the United States or the Governors of their respective States may designate as Fast or Thanksgiving Day, or proclaim specially as holidays. On other occasions their offices can be closed only after permission obtained therefor from the department. Upon holidays postoffices must be opened sufficiently to meet fairly the public convenience. Mails must be made up and dispatched as on other days. When a legal holiday falls upon a Sunday the following Monday may be observed, unless otherwise specially provided by State authority.

Instructions as to Registration, etc.—All valuable matter to be sent by mail should be registered. It will thus receive protection which it is not always possible to give it if sent in the ordinary

mails.

Every postmaster is obliged to register mail matter that is prop-

erly prepared and offered at the postoffice for registration.

The cost of registering mail matter is eight cents for registry fee, in addition to postage, both of which must invariably be fully prepaid by stamps affixed to the matter.

Postmasters are forbidden to address mail matter for the patrons of their postoffice, to enclose it in the envelope, seal it, or affix the

stamps.

Articles of correspondence addressed under initial, or which bear an address written in pencil, or any matter that is unmailable in the domestic mails, cannot be sent by registered mail to foreign countries, and will not be received for registration. Nor can any article excluded from the domestic mails be admitted in the registered mails for foreign countries.

Letters for Canada should bear the names of the county and province, and those for Mexico the name of the Mexican State,

where the office of delivery is located.

North Adams City Charter.

WOTED APRIL 8, 1895.

IN FORCE, 1896.

AN ACT

TO

Incorporate the City of North Adams.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

TITLE 1. MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT.

Section 1. The inhabitants of the town of North Adams, shall, in case of the acceptance of this act by the voters of the said town as hereinafter provided, continue to be a body politic and corporate, under the name of the City of North Adams; and as such shall have, exercise and enjoy all the rights, immunities, powers and privileges, and shall be subject to all the duties and obligations, now pertaining to and incumbent upon the said town as a municipal corporation.

Section 2. The administration of all the fiscal, prudential and municipal affairs of said city, with the government thereof, shall except the affairs of public schools, be vested in an executive department, which shall consist of one officer, to be called the mayor, and in a legislative department which shall consist of a single body, to be called the city council, the members whereof shall be called councilmen. The executive department shall never exercise any legislative power, and the legislative department shall never exercise any executive power, except as herein otherwise provided.

Section 3. The territory of said city shall first be divided into seven wards, as hereinafter provided, but said number, upon any subsequent division of said city into new wards, may be increased by an affirmative vote of a majority of the members of the city council, passed previous to and in the year of such division.

TITLE 2. ELECTIONS AND MEETINGS.

Section 4. The municipal election shall take place annually on the third Tuesday of December, and the municipal year shall begin on the first Monday of January following. All meetings of the citizens for municipal purposes shall be called by warrants issued by order of the city council, which shall be in such form, and be served and returned in such manner and at such times, as the city council may by ordinance direct.

Section 5. At such municipal election the qualified voters shall give in their votes by ballot in the several wards for mayor and councilmen, and for the members of the board of assessors, board of trustees of the public library, and of the school committee then to be elected, and the person receiving the highest number of votes for any office shall be deemed and declared to be elected to such office; and whenever two or more persons are to be elected to the same office the several persons, up to the number required to be chosen, receiving the highest number of votes shall be deemed and declared to be elected. If it shall appear that there is no choice of mayor, or if the person elected mayor shall refuse to accept the office, or shall die before qualifying, or if a vacancy in said office shall occur subsequently and more than three months previous to the expiration of the municipal year, the city council shall forthwith cause warrants to be issued for a new election, and the same proceedings shall be had in all respects as hereinbefore provided for the election of mayor, and shall be repeated until the election of a mayor is completed. If the full number of members of the city council has not been elected, or if a vacancy in the office of councilman shall occur subsequently and more than six months previous to the expiration of the municipal year, the council may forthwith elect some person or persons to fill the vacancy or vacancies until the next annual municipal election. The board of assessors shall consist of three persons, who shall be elected in a manner provided in section fortyone for the election of trustees of the public library.

Section 6. All meetings for the election of national, state, county and district officers shall be called by order of the city council, in the same manner as meetings for municipal elections are called.

Section 7. The city council may, when no convenient wardroom for holding the meetings of the citizens of any ward can be had within the territorial limits of such ward, appoint and direct, in the warrant for calling any meeting of the citizens of such ward that the meeting be held in some convenient place within the limits of any adjacent ward of the city; and for such purpose the place so assigned shall be deemed and taken to be a part of the ward for which the election is held.

Section 8. General meetings of the citizens qualified to vote may from time to time be held according to the right secured to the people by the constitution of this Commonwealth, and all such meetings may, and upon the request in writing of fifty qualified voters setting forth the purposes thereof, shall be duly called by the city council.

TITLE 3. LEGISLATIVE DEPARTMENT.

Section 9. The members of the city council shall consist of twenty-one councilmen at large, who shall be elected by the inhabitants of the city as follows: At the first municipal election held under this act twenty-one members at large of the council shall be elected by the qualified voters of the entire city, seven to serve for the term of three years, seven for the term of two years and seven for the term of one year, beginning with the first Monday in January then next ensuing; and thereafter seven members at large of said city council shall be elected in like manner at each annual municipal election, to serve for the term of three years beginning with the first Monday in January next ensuing, in place of the members at large whose term then expires. At the first municipal election no voter shall vote for more than five of the councilmen to be elected for each term, that is to say, not more than fifteen in the aggregate on one ballot, and the seven having the highest number of votes for each term shall be declared elected. At all municipal elections subsequent to the first election no voter shall vote for more than five of the seven councilmen to be elected at an annual election on one ballot, and the seven having the highest number of votes shall be declared elected. The councilmen shall hold office for three years, except as herein otherwise provided, beginning with the first Monday in January next succeeding their election, and until their successors shall be elected and qualified. A majority of the board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. an election is held to fill a vacancy or vacancies in the council a voter may vote for the councilman necessary to fill such vacancies in addition to the number above provided.

Section 10. The mayor and the councilmen elect shall annually, on the first Monday in January, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, meet

and be sworn to the faithful discharge of their duties. The oath shall be administered at their first meeting after the acceptance of this act, by the town clerk, and in subsequent years by the city clerk, or, in his absence, by any justice of the peace, and shall be duly certified on the journal of the city council. In case of the absence of the mayor elect on the first Monday in January, or if a mayor shall not then have been elected, the oath of office may at any time thereafter be administered to him, and at any time thereafter, in like manner, the oath of office may be administered to any member of the council who has been previously absent or has been subsequently elected; and every such oath shall be duly certified as aforesaid.

Section 11. After the oath has been administered to the councilmen present they shall be called to order, at their first organization by the town clerk, and in subsequent years by the city clerk, or in case of the absence of the city clerk, by the oldest senior member The council shall then proceed to elect one of their own number president of the council by ballot. If no quorum is present an adjournment shall be taken to a later hour or to the next day, and thereafter the same proceedings shall be had from day to day until a quorum shall be present. If any person receive the votes of a majority of all the members of the council, such person shall be declared chosen president thereof. If on the first day on which a quorum is present no person receives the votes of such majority, they shall proceed to ballot until some person receives the votes of such majority, or an adjournment to the succeeding day is taken, and on such succeeding day a plurality of those voting shall be sufficient for an election. No other business shall be in order until a president is The president shall be sworn by the town or city clerk, as the case may be, or in case of the absence of the clerk, by any justice of the peace. The council shall then proceed to the choice of a city clerk, in the same manner as above provided for the choice of president. The president may be removed from the presidency of the council and the clerk may be removed from office by the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all the members of the council, taken by The president of the council shall have the same right to vote as any other member thereof.

Section 12. The mayor may at any time call a special meeting of the city council, by causing written notification thereof, together with a statement of the subjects to be considered thereat, to be deposited in the post office, postpaid, and addressed to the persons to be notified, or left at the usual place of residence of each member of the council, at least twenty-four hours before the time appointed for such meeting.

Section 13. The city council shall determine the rules of its own proceedings and shall be judge of the election returns and qualifications of its own members. In case of the absence of the president the council shall choose a president pro tempore, and a plurality of votes cast shall be sufficient for a choice. The conneil shall sit with open doors, whether in session as a council or as a committee of the whole, and shall cause a journal of its proceedings to be open to public inspection. The vote of the council upon any question shall be taken by roll call when the same is requested by at least three members. A majority of the members of the council shall be required to constitute a quorum, but a smaller number may adjourn from day to day. The council shall, so far as is not inconsistent with this act, have and exercise all the legislative powers of towns, and have all the powers and be subject to all the liabilities of city councils, and of either branch thereof, under the general laws of the Commonwealth, and it may by ordinance prescribe the manner in which powers shall be exercised. They shall receive no compensation for their services as members of the city council or any committee thereof.

Section 14. Neither the city council nor any member or committee thereof shall directly or indirectly take part in the employment of labor, the making of contracts, the purchase of materials or supplies, the construction, alteration or repair of any public works, buildings or other property, or the care, custody or management of the same, or in the conduct of any of the executive or administrative business of the city, or in the expenditure of public money, except such as may be necessary for the contingent and incidental expenses of the city council, nor in the appointment or removal of any officers, except as herein otherwise provided; but nothing in this section contained shall affect the powers or duties of the council in ralation to state aid to disabled soldiers and sailors and to the families of those killed in the civil war.

Section 15. The city council shall in the month of January choose an auditor of accounts, who shall hold office for the term of one year beginning with the first Monday in February next ensuing, and until his successor is chosen and qualified. A majority of the votes of all the members of the council taken by roll call shall be necessary for the choice of the auditor of accounts and he may be removed by the council.

SECTION 16. The city council shall appropriate annually in the months of March and April the amount necessary to meet the expenditures of the city for the current municipal year. It shall take care that no money is paid from the treasury unless granted or appro-

priated, and shall secure a just and proper accountability by requiring bonds with sufficient penalties and sureties from all persons entrusted with the receipt, custody or disbursement of money. shall as often as once in each year, ten days at least prior to the annual election, cause to be published for the use of the inhabitants a particular account of the receipts and expenditures of said city and a schedule of all city property and of the city debt. propriation made by the city council for the erection of a city hall, or for land for a location of such building, shall be subjected to ratification by the legal voters of the city voting in their respective precincts at an annual municipal election. The city council may appropriate money from time to time in aid of the North Adams Hospital, and in return for such appropriations the said hospital shall receive persons for the reception of whom the city may erect, establish and maintain a hospital; but such appropriations shall not exceed in any one year a sum amounting to one-tenth of one per cent. of the valuation of the city for the preceeding year.

Section 17. The city council shall have the power within said city to make and establish ordinances and by-laws, and to affix penalties as herein and by general law provided, without the sanction of any court or justice thereof: provided, however, that all laws and regulations now in force in the town of North Adams shall, until they shall expire by their limitation or be revised or repealed by the council, remain in force. Complaint for the breach of any ordinance or by-law may be made by the mayor or any head of a department or any resident of the city.

Section 18. No vote of the city council granting or bestowing an exclusive franchise of any description to any person or corporation shall be valid unless the same shall be approved by a vote of the qualified voters of the city, voting at large in their respective precincts at the annual municipal election.

Section 19. The city council shall not authorize the erection of a school-house, or of any addition thereto, nor pass any appropriation for such purpose, until plans for the same has been approved by vote of the school committee, and such approval has been certified in writing to the council by the chairman of said committee.

Section 20. The city council shall establish a fire department for said city, to consist of a chief and of such officers and members as the city council by ordinance shall from time to time prescribe; and said council shall have authority to define their ranks and duties and in general to make such regulations concerning the conductand government of such department, the management of fires and the con-

duct of persons attending fires, as they may deem expedient, and may fix such penalties for any violation of such regulations or any of them as are provided for breach of the ordinance of said city. The appointment of all the officers and members of such department shall be vested by the mayor exclusively, who shall have authority to remove from office any officer or member for cause. The chief and the officers shall be the firewards of the city.

Section 21. The city council shall have power to establish fire limits within the city, and from to time change or enlarge the same, and by ordinance they may regulate the construction of all buildings erected within said fire limits, stipulating their location, size and the material of which they shall be constructed, together with such other rules and regulations as shall tend to prevent damage by fire; *Provided*, that such rules and regulations shall not be inconsistent with the laws of this Commonwealth.

SECTION 22. The city council shall establish by ordinance a police department, to consist of a chief of police and such officers and men as it may prescribe, and make regulations for the government of the department. The appointment of all the members of such department shall be vested in the mayor exclusively, who shall have power to remove any member for cause.

Section 23. The city council shall, with the approval of the mayor, have exclusive authority and power to order the laying out, locating anew or discontinuing of all streets and ways and highways within the limits of said city, and to assess the damages sustained by any person thereby, and further, except as herein orherwise provided, to act in all matters relating to such laying out, locating anew, altering or discounting. Any person aggrieved by the assessment of his damages, or other action of the council under this section, shall have the rights and privileges now allowed by law in such cases in appeals from decisions of the selectmen of towns.

Section 24. In case any ordinance, order, resolution or vote involves the appropriation or expenditure of money to an amount which may exceed two hundred dollars, the laying of an assessment or the granting to a person or corporation of any right in, over or under any street or other public ground of said city, the affirmative votes of a majority of all the members of the city council shall be necessary for its passage. Every such ordinance, order, resolution or vote shall be read twice, with an interval of at least three days between the two readings before being finally passed, and the vote upon its final passage shall be taken by roll call; provided, however, that upon and after the written recommendation of the mayor, the city council may pass such ordinance, resolution or vote upon the same day, by a two-thirds yea and nay vote.

Section 25. At any meeting of the city council it shall be in order for any member thereof to give written notice, seconded in writing by a majority at least of all the members of the council, of his intention to move at the next meeting thereof, occurring within not less than ten days, a resolution that the mayor be removed for official misconduct or neglect of duty. Such notice shall specify as particularly as possible the acts of misconduct or the instances of neglect of duty complained of, shall be entered at large by the clerk in the minutes of the council, and the clerk shall within two days serve a copy upon the mayor and mail a copy to each of the members of the council at his residence. At such next meeting of the council the mayor shall have the right to speak in his own defence and to be heard by counsel. The vote on the resolution shall be by roll call. If the resolution fails to receive the affirmative votes of three-fourths of all the members of the council it shall have no effect and shall not be re-introduced during that meeting of the council. If it receive the affirmative votes of three-fourths of all the members of the council it shall, upon the recording of such vote, take effect, and the office of the mayor shall thereupon become vacant. The council shall thereupon order a warrant for a new election for mayor to be issued, and such further proceedings shall be had as are provided in section five of this act in case of a failure to elect a mayor.

Section 26. No member of the city council shall, during the term for which he is elected, hold any other office in or under the city government, have the expenditure of any money appropriated by the council, or act as counsel in any matter before the council or any committee thereof; and no person shall be eligible for appointment to any municipal office established by the council during any municipal year within which he was councilman, until the expiration of the succeeding municipal year.

Section 27. Every ordinance, order, resolution or vote of the city council, except such as relates to its own internal affairs, to its own officers or employees, to the election or duties of the auditor of accounts and any city clerk, to the removal of the mayor or to the declaration of a vacancy in the office of mayor, shall be presented to the mayor for his approval, and like proceedings shall be had thereon as are in such case provided by the general laws relating to cities.

TITLE 4. EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT.

Section 28. The executive powers of the city shall be vested solely in the mayor, and may be exercised by him either personally or through the several officers and boards of the city in their depart-

ments, under his general supervision and control. In case of a vacancy in any office to which appointment is made by the mayor, he may personally perform the duties thereof, but he shall not be entitled to receive any salary or pay attached thereto. The mayor shall hold office for the municipal year beginning with the first Monday in January following his election unless sooner removed, and until his successor is elected and qualified.

Section 29. The mayor shall have the sole power of appointment to all the municipal offices established by or under this act, unless herein otherwise provided; and he may, except as herein otherwise provided, remove from office by written order any officer so appointed hereunder, for any cause which he shall in his official discretion deem sufficient, which cause he shall assign in his order of removal. Such office shall become and be vancant upon the filing with the city clerk of such order of removal and the service of a copy thereof upon the officer so removed either personally or by leaving the same at his last or usual place of residence. The city clerk shall keep such order of removal on file, where it shall be open to public inspection.

Section 30. Whenever by reason of sickness or other cause the mayor shall be disabled from performing the duties of his office he may designate by a writing filed in the office of the city clerk, either the city treasurer, the city clerk, or the city solicitor, to act as mayor or in case of the failure of the mayor to make such designation, the above mentioned officers in the order above named, then performing the duties of his office, shall act as mayor. Such officer shall during the continuance of such disability have all the rights and powers of mayor, except that he shall not when so acting have the power of removal, unless thereto in any instance authorized by vote of the city council, nor any power of appointment unless such disability of the mayor has continued for a period of thirty days, and then subject to the approval of the city council, nor power to approve or disapprove any ordinance, order, resolution or vote until within twenty-four hours of the time when it would take effect without the approval of the mayor. In case such disability of the mayor continues for a period exceeding sixty days the city council may at any time after the expiration of that period declare a vacancy to exist in the office of mayor.

SECTION 31. Whenever there shall be a vacancy in the office of mayor the president of the city council shall act as mayor and possess all the rights and powers of mayor during such vacancy, except that when so acting as mayor he shall not have the power of appointment or removal unless thereto in any instance authorized by vote of the council.

TITLE 5. SCHOOL DEPARTMENT.

Section 32. The management and control of schools of said city shall be vested solely in a school committee, consisting of six members at large, who shall be elected by the inhabitants of the city as follows: At the first municipal election held under this act six members of the school committee shall be elected by the qualified voters of the entire city, two to serve for the term of three years, two for the term of two years and two for the term of one year, beginning with the first Monday in January then next ensuing; and and thereafter two members at large of the school committee shall be elected in like manner at each annual municipal election, to serve for the term of three years beginning with the first Monday in January next ensuing, in place of the members at large whose term then expires. The school committee shall at its first meeting in each municipal year, or as soon thereafter as may be, choose a chairman from among its members by ballot, and the votes of a majority of all the members of the board shall be required in order to elect.

Section 33. The school committee shall on the first Monday in June, or as soon thereafter as may be, choose by vote of a majority of its members, but not from their number, a superintendent of schools, who shall be under its direction and control. Such superintendent shall hold office until the first Monday in June next ensuing unless sooner removed, and until his successor is chosen and qualified, and he may be removed at any time by the school committee by a majority of its members. The school committee shall in case of a vacancy in their number, forthwith notify the city council, and the council shall call a joint convention of the members thereof and of the school committee, and at such convention the vacancy shall, by vote of a majority of all the members of the two bodies, be filled until the end of the municipal year in which the warrant for the next ensuing annual municipal election is issued, and at such election the vacancy shall be filled for the remainder, if any, of the unexpired term, in the same manner as the member whose office is vacant was elected. The school committee shall fix and establish the compensation of all persons employed by them.

TITLE 6. ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICERS.

Section 34. There shall be the following administrative officers, who shall be appointed by the mayor and who shall perform the duties by law and hereinafter prescribed by them, respectively, and such further duties not inconsistent with the nature of their respective offices as the city council may prescribe. I. A board of public works, consisting of three persons, who shall also be overseers of the poor and commissioners of public burial places. II. A city

treasurer, who shall also be the collector of taxes. III. A city solicitor. IV. A chief of police. V. A chief of the fire depart-VI. A board of health, consisting of three persons. A city engineer, who shall also be inspector of buildings. city bookkeeper, who shall also be clerk of the board of public works, and shall keep the accounts of all the depertments except as herein otherwise provided. The above-named board and officers shall be appointed on or before the first Monday in February and shall hold their respective offices for the term of one year beginning with the first Monday in February, unless sooner removed, and until their respective successors, or in case of boards, until a majority of the members thereof, are appointed and qualified: provided, however, that the appointment of the chief of police shall not be for any specified time, but shall hold good until his death, resignation or removal by the mayor, who shall have power to remove him for incompetency or cause. They shall be sworn or affirmed to the faithful discharge of the duties of their respective offices, which oath or affirmation, or a certified copy thereof, shall be filed in the office of the city clerk. IX. A board of license commissioners, as prescribed in chapter four hundred and twenty-eight of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and ninety-four. The board of assessors shall be entitled to choose a clerk, who shall not be one of their own number. The board of public works shall appoint a superintendent of outdoor work who shall hold no other municipal office, and a superintendent of the water works, neither of whom shall be of their own number, and who shall severally hold their offices for one year unless sooner removed by said board, and until their respective successors are appointed and qualified.

TITLE 7. POWERS AND DUTIES OF OFFICERS.

Section 35. The city clerk shall have charge of all journals, records, papers and documents of the city, attest all warrants, and do such other acts in his said capacity as the city council may require of him. He shall be the clerk of the council and shall keep a journal of all votes and proceedings. He shall engross all the ordinances passed by the city council, in a book provided for that purpose, and shall add proper indexes, which book shall be deemed a public record of such ordinances. He shall perform such other duties as are required by law or shall be prescribed by the council. In case of the temporary absence of the city clerk the president of the council may appoint a clerk pro tempore, who shall be duly qualified.

Section 36. The auditor shall have charge of all revenue and expenditure accounts of the city and shall keep a set of books showing

in detail the revenues and expenditures of the city. He shall examine all pay rolls, bills or demands rendered against the city, and all orders or votes of the city council for the payment of money, shall see that they have been incurred with due authority, that they are properly approved by some person authorized thereto, and that the clerical computations are correct. He shall see that vouchers are prepared in proper form, and that the same are duly recorded and distributed to their proper account. If he approves of a bill, pay roll or demand, he shall endorse it with his certificate of approval and shall cause an abstract of the same to be entered on a book kept for that purpose, and shall pass it to the treasurer for payment. He shall perform such other duties as from time to time shall be assigned him by the city council. In case of the disability or absence of the auditor the president of the council shall appoint an auditor, pro tempore, who shall be duly qualified.

The board of public works shall exercise the powers Section 37. and be subject to the duties prescribed for boards of overseers of the poor by the laws of the Commonwealth. The board of public works shall have cognizance, direction and control:—(a) Of the construction, alteration, repair, care and lighting of streets, ways and sidewalks. (b) Of the construction, alteration, repair and care of public buildings; except that the care, construction, alteration and repair of all school buildings shall remain under the control of the school committee. (c) Of the construction, alteration, repair and care of public sewers and drains. (d) Of the construction, alteration, repair, care and maintenance of public bridges. (e) Of the laying out and caring for public burial places and public parks, and of all work in or upon the same. (f) Of the construction, extension, alteration and repair of the public water works. (g) Of the care, superintendence and management of the public grounds belonging to said city, except such grounds as are under the control of the school committee, and of the shade and ornamental trees standing and growing therein. (h) Of the supervision of fire alarm, electric light, power, telephone, telegraph and trolley wires, and electric light, telegraph and telephone poles and gas pipes. The said board may require that no person or corporation authorized by the city council to dig up any public street or sidewalk in said city shall begin such digging before furnishing to such board of public works security satisfactory to them to restore such street or sidewalk to its former condition. The said board shall also, except as herein otherwise provided, have, exclusively, the powers and be subject to the duties, liabilities and penalties which may be by law given to or imposed upon road commissioners of towns. They shall as overseers of the poor appoint a city physician.

Section 38. The city treasurer shall collect all the water rents and charges and all moneys due the city, and shall receive, have the

custody of, and pay out all moneys. upon the certificate of the auditor, and cause an accurate account of the same to be kept in proper bookkeeping form, or such form as the city council may prescribe. He shall make to the council, annually or oftener, at such time or times in each year as it shall prescribe, a full and detailed statement of the receipts and expenditures of the city during such portion of the financial year as it may direct, and of the cash balance or surplus; and in every such statement the different sources of the city revenue and the amount received from e h, the several appropriations made, the object for which they were made and the amount of moneys expended under each, the money borrowed on the credit of the city, the authority under each loan was made, and the terms on which the same was obtained, shall be clearly and particularly specified. He shall cause to be reported weekly to the auditor a statement of all the receipts and disbursements in order that the proper entries may be made in the books kept by the auditor. who is a bank official or employee shall be eligible to the office of treasurer.

Section 39. The city solicitor shall for the salary herein provided perform all legal services in matters in which the city is interested, and attend to all proceedings at law or in equity in which the city is a party, and all claims made to the council. For these purposes he shall have sole charge of all such matters and proceedings. He shall give in writing his legal opinion upon any of the municipal affairs of the city upon the request of the mayor or council, and in addition give his opinion upon the law relating to the municipal affairs in any department upon request made by the head department.

Section 40. The city engineer shall give his whole time to the city and shall have sole charge and control of and shall attend to all the engineering work of the city. He shall, at the request of the board of public works, prepare plans and estimates of any proposed alterations in or construction of public sewers and drains and conduits, streets, sidewalks, water works and other public works. He shall assist the city solicitor as far as possible in defending the city against suits and claims brought against it for damages sustained by reason of any defect or want of repair in any public way, or for any cause whatever. He shall perform such other duties as the city council shall prescribe, not inconsistent herewith. As inspector of public buildings he shall have the control of the enforcement of the regulations regarding plumbing and shall perform such other duties as shall be from time to time prescribed by law and the ordinances of the city council.

Section 41. The trustees of the public library shall consist of three members at large, who shall be elected by the inhabitants of the city as follows: At the first municipal election held under this act one trustee shall be elected to serve for the term of three years, one for the term of two years and one for the term of one year, beginning with the first Monday in January then next ensuing, and thereafter one trustee at large shall be elected in like manner at each annual municipal election, to serve for the term of three years beginning with the first Monday in January next ensuing, in place of the trustee at large whose term then expires. The trustees of the public library shall have the care and management of the public library.

Section 42. The auditors shall also be the city almoner, shall keep a record of the settlements of all paupers or persons who are or may become a city charge, and shall, under the rection of and by the authority of the overseers of the poor, relieve the wants of such paupers outside of the almshouse as may be necessary and proper. He shall, as aforesaid, see that the paupers who are chargeable to other cities and towns are maintained by such cities and towns at their own expense, and that the city shall be reimbursed for outlays made for the paupers chargeable to the Commonwealth or other cities or towns. shall, under the direction of the overseers of the poor, report all cases needing legal attention to the city solicitor, and shall furnish him with all the information possible in controversies arising over pauper settlement or otherwise. He shall perform such other duties as the overseers of the poor may from time to time direct.

Section 43. All city officers not hereinbefore mentioned shall perform such duties as are or may be from time to time prescribed by law, and such other duties, not inconsistent herewith or with general laws, as the council may from time to time prescribe.

Section 44. The administrative officers and boards above named in this title, and all administrative officers and boards hereafter established by the city council and not coming within the department of any officer or board so above named, shall have the power, except as herein otherwise provided, to appoint or employ, and to remove or discharge, all officers, clerks and employees in their respective departments. Such appointment shall not be for any specified term, but shall hold good until removal or discharge. Orders of removal shall state the reason thereof and shall be entered upon the records of the officer or board making the same, and removals shall take effect upon the filing of a copy of such order with the city clerk in a book provided for the purpose and open to

public inspection. The above named administrative officers and boards shall, in their respective departments, make all necessary contracts for work and for the furnishing of materials and supplies for the city, and for the construction, alteration, repair and care of public works, institutions, buildings and other property; except such property as shall be under the control of the school committee, and shall have, subject to the mayor, the direction and control of all the executive and administrative business of the city. They shall at all times be accountable to the mayor, as the chief executive officer, for the discharge of their duties.

Section 45. Every board, and every officer above named, not a member of a board, shall keep a record of all official transactions and such record shall be open to public inspection.

TITLE 8. GENERAL PROVISIONS.

Section 46. The following salaries shall be paid, viz: -Mayor, one thousand dollars each year. City clerk, thirteen hundred dollars each year. Tax collector and treasurer, two thousand dollars each year. City solicitor, nine hundred dollars each year. Members of the school committee, seventy-five dollars each, each year. Members of the board of assessors, four hundred dollars each, each year. Clerk of board of assessors, one hundred and fifty dollars each year. City physician, two hundred and fifty dollars each year. Members of the board of health, one hundred dollars each, each year. Chief of the fire department, three hundred dollars each year. Assistant chiefs of the fire department, one hundred dollars each, each year. Superintendent of the water works, twelve hundred dollars each year. City engineer and inspector of plumbing, eighteen hundred dollars each year. Chief of police and keeper of lockup, three dollars and half each day. Captain of police, three dollars each day. Keeper of the almshouse, seven hundred and fifty dollars each year. Members of the board of public works, five hundred dollars each, each year. Clerk of the board of public works, nine hundred dollars each year. Superintendent of outdoor work, twelve hundred dollars each year. Auditor, one thousand dollars each year. Members of the police force, two dollars and a half each day. Firemen, hose and hook-and-ladder meu, sixty-five dollars each, each year. The compensation of all persons not employed by boards or heads of departments and not herein provided for shall be established by the city council, but no new salaried office shall be established except those required by law, nor any increase of salaries made unless approved by a vote of the citizens at large in their respective precincts at an annual election.

Section 47. No person shall be eligible to any of the offices of the city government, except superintendent of schools, chief of

police, chief of the fire department, or city engineer, unless he is a citizen and has been a resident of the city for at least two years.

Section 48. Any office established under or by this act shall become vacant if the incumbent ceases to be a resident of the city. The conviction of the incumbent of any such office of a crime punishable by imprisonment shall operate to create a vacancy in the office held by him.

Section 49. The provisions of chapter three hundred and twelve of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and eighty-five and acts in amendment thereof and in addition thereto shall not apply to the city of North Adams until the first day of January in the year nineteen hundred.

Section 50. The administrative officers and boards above-named shall, annually on or before the first Monday of January, furnish to the mayor an itemized and detailed estimate of the moneys required for their respective departments or offices during the ensuing financial year. The mayor, president of the council and chairman of the board of assessors, shall examine such estimates and shall submit the same to the city council on or before the first day of March, with their itemized and detailed apportionment, which shall be the appropriations which the several departments and officers may expend during the current municipal year, but said city council at any time prior to May first, of each year, may, subject to the approval of the mayor as provided by law, strike out or decrease, but not increase any item in said report.

Section 51. Every officer of the city shall, at the request of the city council, give it such information in writing as it may require in relation to any matter, act or thing connected with his office or employment or the discharge of the duties thereof.

Section 52. No sum appropriated for a specific purpose shall be expended for any other purpose, and no expenditure shall be made, nor liability incurred, by or in behalf of the city, until an appropriation has been duly voted by the city council sufficient to meet such expenditure or liability, together with all prior unpaid liabilities which are payable out of such appropriation. except in accordance with the written recommendation of the mayor to the city council, approved by the yea and nay vote of two-thirds of the council; provided, however, that, after the expiration of the financial year and until the passage of the annual appropriations, liabilities payable out of a regular appropriation to be contained therein may be incurred to an amount not exceeding one-third of the total of such appropriation for the preceeding year. Every bill, pay roll or other

voucher covering an expenditure of money shall be approved by the signatures, on the back of such bill or voucher, of the majority of the board or committee having control of, or incurring such expenditure, and after such approval such bills, pay rolls or vouchers shall be turned over to the auditor. The financial year shall begin with the first day of December in each year.

Section 53. Nothing herein contained shall affect the enforcement of the provisions of chapter three hundred and twenty of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and eighty-four, being "An act to improve the civil service of the Commonwealth and the cities thereof," and acts in amendment thereof and in addition thereto, or of the rules made by the commissioners appointed thereunder; and the city council shall make sufficient and proper appropriations for the carrying out and enforcement of said act and such rules in said city.

Section 54. Whenever mechanical or other work is required to be done, or supplies are required for the city, at a cost amounting to five hundred dollars or more, the board or committee having the matter in charge shall invite proposals therefor by advertisements in not more than two newspapers published in said city, such advertisements to state the time and place for opening the proposals in answer to said advertisements, and reserving the rights to said board or committee to reject any or all proposals. Every proposal for doing such work or making such sale shall be accompanied by a suitable bond, or certificate of deposit, for the faithful performance of such proposal, and all such proposals shall be kept by the officer or board inviting the same, and shall be open to public inspection after said proposals have been accepted or rejected.

Section 55. All contracts made by any department of the city shall, when the amount involved is five hundred dollars or more, be in writing, and no such contract shall be deemed to have been made or executed until the approval of the mayor is affixed thereto. All such contracts shall be accompanied by a bond with securities satisfactory to the board or committee having the matter in charge, or a deposit of money or other security for the faithful performance of such contracts; and such bonds or other security shall be deposited with the city auditor until the contract has been carried out in all respects; and no such contract shall be altered except by a written agreement of the contractor; the sureties on his of their bond, and the officer or board making the contract, with the approval of the mayor affixed thereto.

Section 56. No loan except such as may be incurred in anticipa-

tion of taxes shall be made except upon and after the written recommendation of the mayor, made to the conneil and passed by a two-thirds yea and nay vote. All bonds and notes issued by the city shall be signed by the treasurer and countersigned by the mayor, and any coupons attached thereto shall bear the signature of the treasurer either in the original or a fac simile.

Section 57. The board of public works shall fix and establish the prices or rents for the use of water, which shall not be made less in any instance than the prices and rents now established by the prudential committee of the North Adams Fire District, until the bonded indebtedness now or hereafter created by said district or city for the purpose of supplying the inhabitants of said district or city with pure water shall have been paid; and the income received therefrom, in each year, after deducting all expenses and charges of distribution of such year, shall be applied as follows: First, to the payment of the interest on the debts and loans now or hereafter incurred by the said city and by the North Adams Fire District for the purpose of supplying said city and said district and the inhabitants thereof with water, and of such part of the principal sum thereof as shall become due in such year; second, after paying such interest and principal sums the residue of such income shall be used to supply the city and inhabitants thereof with pure water in the discretion of said board and any balance of such residue not so used shall be paid into the treasury of the city for general city pur-As long as there shall be any debts of the city that shall have been incurred in supplying said district or said city or the inhabitants of either with water there shall be raised each year by taxation a sum which, together with the said income, shall be sufficient to pay the interest on all such debts and such part of the principal sum as shall become due in such year.

Section 58. Upon an acceptance of this act, as herein provided, the selectmen of said town shall forthwith divided the territory thereof into seven wards, so that the wards shall contain as nearly as may be consistent with well defined limits to each, an equal number of voters, and they shall designate the wards by numbers. They shall, for the purpose of the first municipal election to be held thereunder, which shall take place on the third Tuesday of December next succeeding such acceptance, provide suitable polling places in the several wards, and give notice thereof, and shall at least ten days previous to such third Tuesday in December appoint all proper election officers therefor, and they shall in general have the powers and perform the duties of the mayor and board of aldermen of cities, under chapter four hundred and seventeen of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and ninety-three and acts in amendment thereof and in addition thereto, the provisions of which shall so far as appli-

cable apply to said election; and the town clerk shall perform the duties therein assigned to city clerks. The registrars shall cause to be prepared and published according to law lists of qualified voters in each of the wards established by the selectmen.

Section 59. All laws relating to the town of North Adams when this act shall be accepted as herein provided, shall, until altered, amended or repealed, continue in force in the city of North Adams, so far as the same are not inconsistent herewith.

Section 60. All special laws heretofore passed concerning the fire district in the town of North Adams, shall be in force in said fire district when this act shall be accepted, as herein provided, shall, so far as the same are not inconsistent herewith, be extended to and continue in force in the city of North Adams until altered, amended or repealed.

Section 61. Upon the first day of January next after the acceptance of this act, as herein provided, the North Adams Fire District in said town shall cease to exist, and all the property, powers and privileges of the said district shall vest in the city of North Adams, and all the debts, duties and liabilities of the said fire district shall become the debts, duties and liabilities of the said city.

Section 62. The passage of this act shall not affect any right accruing or accrued, or any suit, prosecution or other legal proceeding pending at the time when this act shall go into operation, and no penalty for forfeiture previously incurred shall be affected thereby. All persons holding office in said town or in the fire district in said town at the time this act shall take effect shall continue to hold the same, notwithstanding the passage thereof, until the organization of the city government hereby authorized shall be effected, and until the successors of such officers shall be respectively elected or appointed and qualified.

Section 63. The selectmen shall notify the persons elected at such first election, and shall provide and appoint a place for the first meeting of the mayor and city council on the first Monday in January next ensuing; and shall by written notices left at their respective places of residence at least twenty-four hours prior to such meeting notify thereof the mayor-elect and councilmemen elect, who shall immediately proceed to organize and carry into effect the provisions of this act, which shall then have full force and effect. The selectmen shall, in like manner, appoint a place and time for the first meeting of the school committee and notify the members thereof. Nothing herein shall affect the annual meeting in said town for the

election of national, state, district and county officers, which may be held next after the acceptance thereof.

The question of the acceptance of this act may be submitted to the legal voters of said town at any time within two vears after the passage thereof at an annual meeting or any meeting called for that purpose, except in the months of November and At such meeting the polls shall be open not less than eight hours, and the vote shall be taken by ballot in accordance with the provisions of chapter four hundred and seventeen of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and ninety-three and acts in amendment thereof and in addition hereto, so far as the same shall be applicable, in answer to the question: - "Shall an act passed by the general court in the year eighteen hundred and ninety-five, entitied 'an act to incorporate the city of North Adams,' be accepted?" and the affirmative votes of a majority of the voters present and voting thereon shall be required for its acceptance. meeting so held this act shall fail to be thus accepted, it may, at the expiration of three months from any such previous meeting, be again thus submitted, but not after the period of two years from the passage thereof.

Section 65. So much of this act as authorizes the submission of the question of its acceptance to the legal voters of said town shall take effect upon its passage, but it shall not take further effect unless accepted by the legal votes of said town as herein provided. [Approved March 22, 1895.




