glorious face of the mosque itself—only a roofed quarter of the whole space, a mere seven pillars across, each branching to right and left, to front and back, with eight-pointed, blue-leaved arches. Along the entablature above runs a Persian inscription in mosaic of black marble; on the roof, over each pillar of the front row, is a cupola with four columns, and at each corner a cupola with four columns. Three domes fold their broad white wings behind and above all. Three steps for the mullah to preach from, and that is all the catalogue. No altar or shrine or image; there is no god but God. No crucifix or lattice work, but the simple pillars and arches, the few cupolas and domes, are yet the richest of ornamentation. No palat or gems—only the clear, harmonious veining of the marble. Only space and proportion, form and whippers of color—and it is so beautiful that you can hardly breathe for its purity. The carpet marble rippled from ivory white—snow-white, pearl-white, lily-white—till it may be half alive. The bells and pinnacles are so light that they seem to float in the air. It cannot be a building; you whisper; it is enchantment. A mosque is a palace. It has been battered and sacked; the Jata of Bharpur carried away the precious stones from the walls; but through the restorations you can dream of some of its delights when it stood aside in the gallery, where, when it is all of enchantment; you have come at last—at last, after so many years, after so many leagues—to the dream country of your earliest dreams, and the Arabian Nights are come to life.

WATCHING THE QUEEN. Precautions for Her Majesty's Safety During Her Stay in the South of France. William Le Queux, writing in the London Daily Mail, says: The arrangements made for the Queen's personal safety during her stay on the Riviera are this year far more elaborate than formerly. The tragic death of the Empress of Austria, the continual spread of anarchy in France, and the marked hostility towards the English have combined to arouse the authorities to an increased sense of duty. The hissing of a representation of Her Majesty at a Nice music hall—formed, after all the denials given to the press, the mayor, at the order of the city council of Nice, called upon Sir E. Monson, the British ambassador, and apologized—may have been but a slight incident, but it served to show the home-land feeling abroad, and the eyes of the those responsible for the Queen's safety. CONAN DOYLE OUTDONE. Professor's Evidence in a Murder Trial. The trial of James Malone, the Edinburgh medical student charged with the murder of Miss Jane Duncan at her home, Rose Hill, Kilmbridge, Dumfries, a charge afterwards reduced to one of culpable homicide, has resulted in a verdict of "Not proven." The medical evidence for the prosecution had agreed that the woman's injuries were caused by a terrible blow—a knockdown blow which would have rendered her unconscious, according to the Meir. A fall by the woman would not have been sufficient to have caused the injury, he maintained. But the jury were greatly influenced by the evidence for the defence of Professor Glanville, professor of forensic medicine in Glasgow University, in spite of the Advocate-Depute's comment that the professor's theory "rather out-distanced Conan Doyle." That theory was as follows: "My distinct impression is that the wound on the woman's forehead was produced by forcible contact against the wooden facing of the window. I came to the conclusion that a fall on this window facing was the cause of the wound, chiefly because there was only one wound found on the body of the deceased which would account for this amount of haemorrhage; secondly, because of the particular form of the blood-mark found in the window facing. This indicated the forcible ejection of the blood from a newly-formed breach of the surface.
