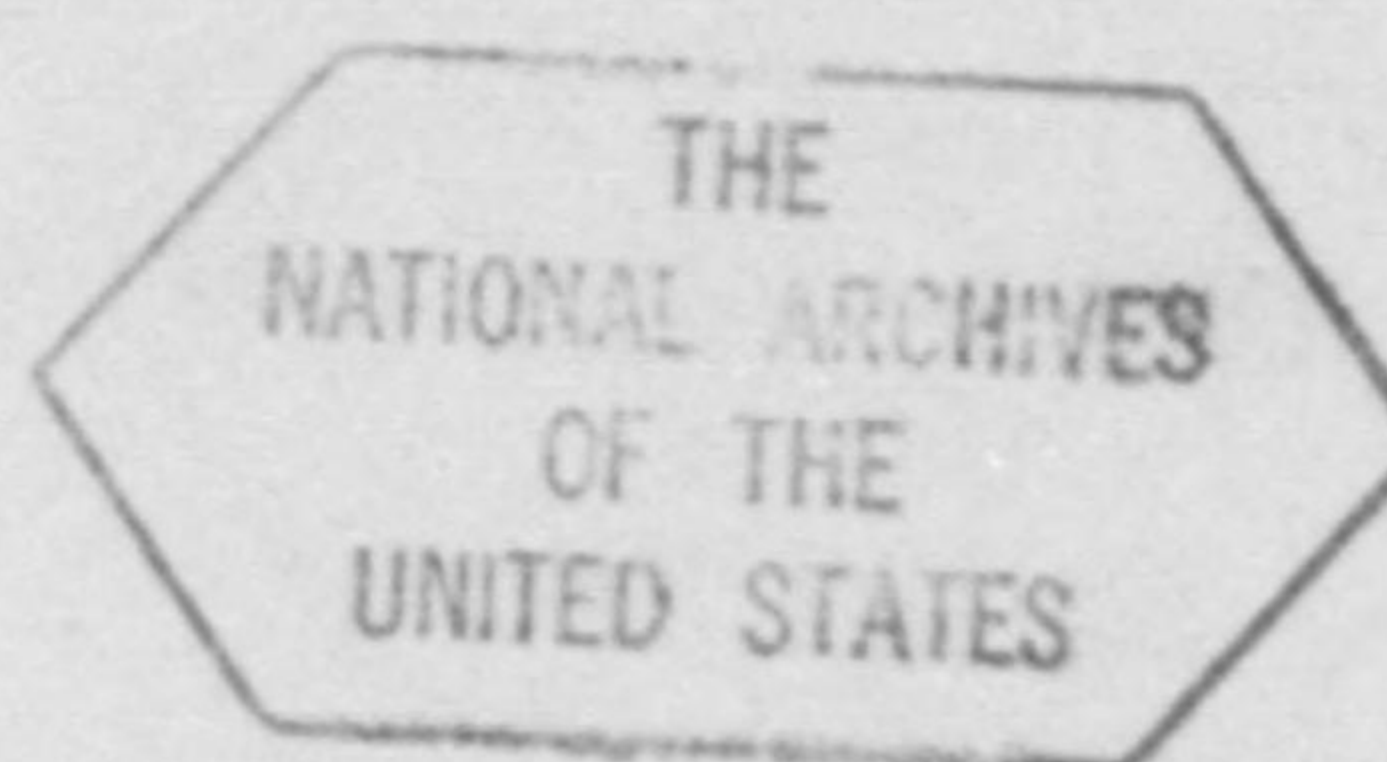

The Yokosuka Harbour Administration Office of Kanto Maritime Bureau has requested this office through Yokosuka Property Custodian Branch of Kanto Finance Bureau to ask your approval for the deletion of two tug-boats mentioned below from the list of reparation tug-boats and releasing them for disposition as scrap as follows:

1. Inv. No. of the subject tugboats:

19N-32B-392
19N-32B-394

2. Reason of application:

The subject two tug-boats were approved to be used temporarily by the ComFltAct ltr File DU-RJB Serial 4263 dated Dec. 1, 1947, however we could not use them at all because of their heavy damage as mentioned hereunder and of the shortage of repairing expenses. Therefore we asked Ex-Navy Ship Section of 3rd Maritime Safety Headquarters for supervision. They have been moored alongside the pier as described in the attached map and bilge water bailed out once a week.

However, in January of this year a target ship moored at the side of the tug-boat (19N-32B-392) happened to be sunk at about 22.00 o'clock because of being worn out too much, and the tug-boat (19N-32-B-392) was also submerged owing to the leak caused by this accident soon after that time. And it is considered that this submersion might have been due to its poor condition. We must, then, salvage this sunken tug-boat immediately, although the said boat is considered not usable even after its salvage.

Such being the case, it is requested that the subject tug-boats, including another moored boat (19N-32B-394) which is damaged heavily as much as that of the boat submerged in engine and hull, would be deleted from the list of reparation tug-boat and released for disposition as scrap.

3. Condition of damage:

Hull and equipment:

- a). Unequipped with anchor and chain.
- b). Board-side protectors are heavily damaged.
- c). The outer side of the bottom of those boats are severely corroded and plastered with sea-weeds and in need of such repair.

Navigation equipment:

- a). pontoons are heavily damaged.
- b). The compass and speedometer are not fully equipped.

Communication equipment: Not equipped with.

Engine:

- a). Boiler tube and other tube are heavily corroded and are not usable.
- b). Engines are severely damaged and corroded and are not usable.

Your kind consideration on this application will be highly appreciated.

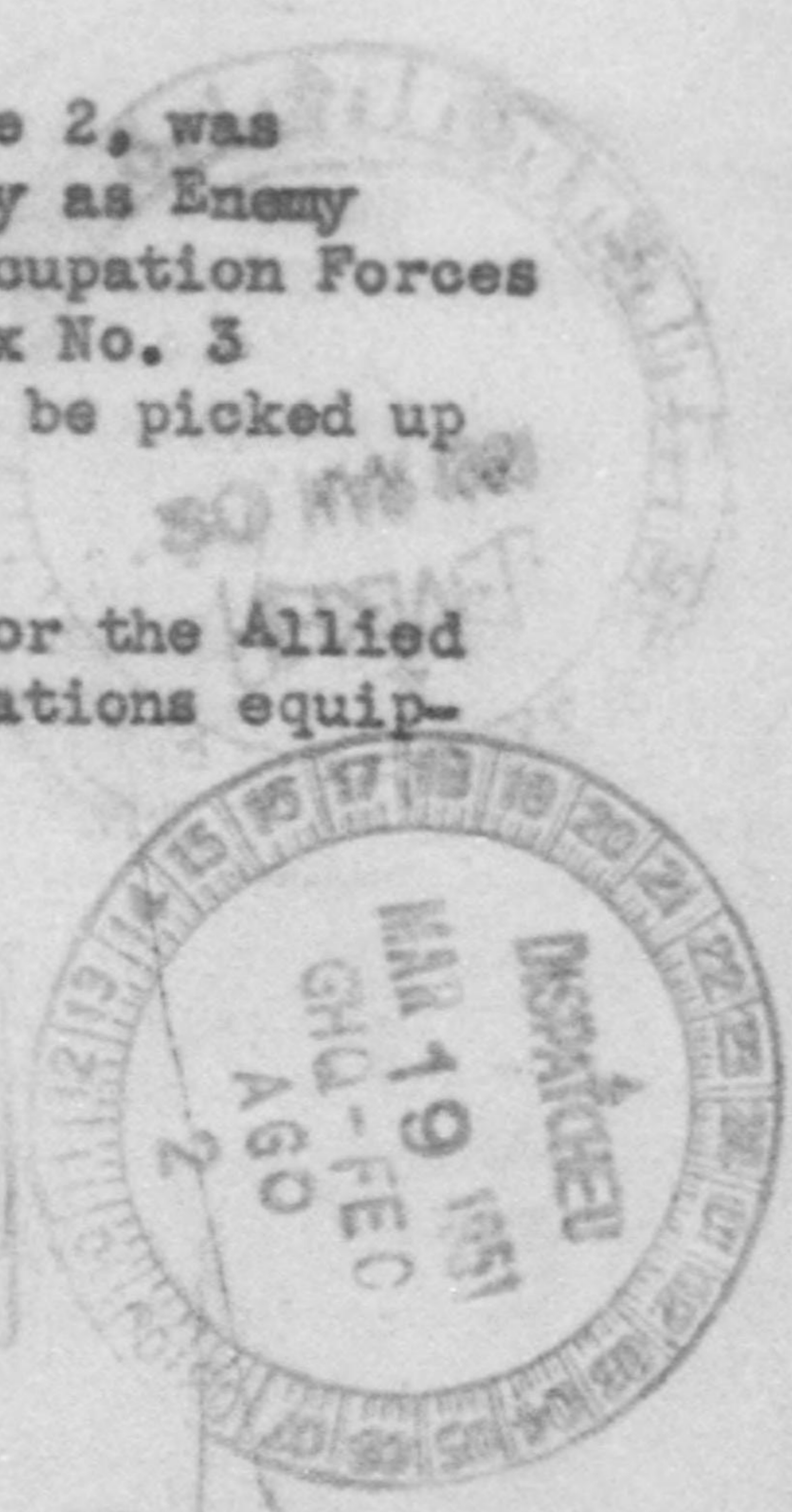

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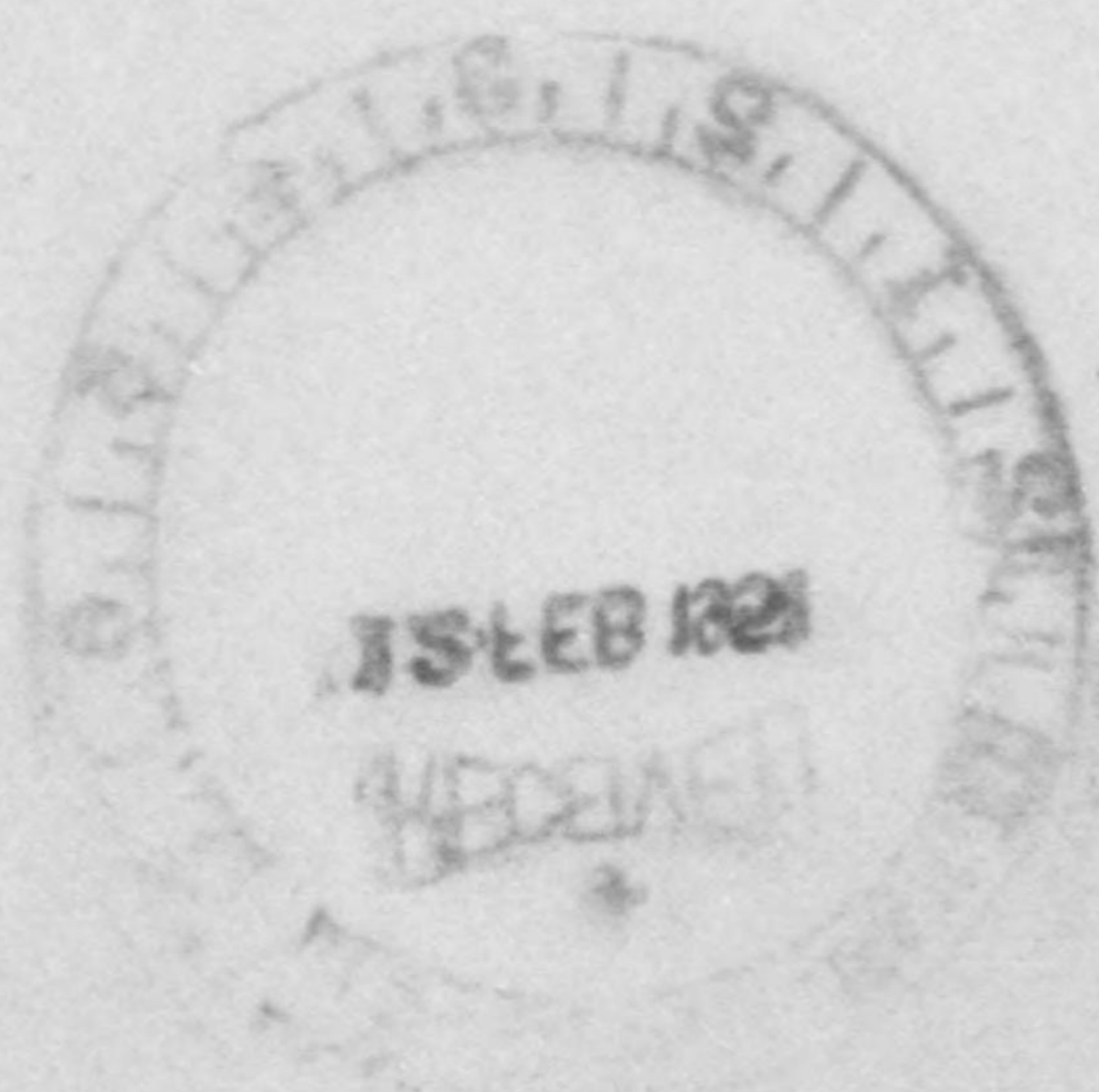
