In order to dissolve this problem, the universities intend to employ some lecturers who graduated from the old system universities and learned the pedagogy or necessary special subjects, while the prefectural governments have the intention to petition to the Mombusho, demanding to decrease the hours of a unit to less than 30 hours a unit.

In fact, professors are too small in number and also facilities are too poor for it. That is the vital difficulty in the law.

Difficult Points of Teachers' Licence Law1 February 1950
by M. Wada

According to the Licence Law. There are three kinds of licence

A. Ordinal licence

1st class ——— 15 — (450 hours) 3 months (5 hours a day)

2nd class ——— 10 — (300 hours) 2 months "

B. Temporary licence — 10 — (300 hours) 2 months "

C. Extra licence

A licence is effective for life.

B licence is effective for five years

(After five years licence shall be given only once after examination, and no more.)

C licence is effective for only one year.

A and B licences are effective throughout Japan, but C licence shall be effective only in the prefecture where it was given.

Difficulties

1. There is a big difference for the future position between the 1st class licence and the 2nd class licence of A Licence. If people who have B licence want to get A Licence and also people who have old licence want to get new licence, they must get the proper units after the recognition training course. The standard of this training course is extremely high, especially, for the actual teachers, it seems too high.

2. The recognition shall be given by the Education Faculty or Liberal Arts Faculty of new system university. The professors of the university have the right of recognition. The professors must give training course to all the teachers and principals more than several thousand, to make them get more than twenty units (1 units is 30 hours), while keeping their regular instructions at the universities. The universities have not enough professors for it, but for 300 or 600 at the least for instance, at the Kagawa University.

3. Furthermore, the sooner they get the recognition the better. The teachers must get the licence as soon as possible. Every prefecture seems to be in difficulties on account of the inconsistency of No. 2 and No. 3
