By oral arrangement between Capt Horseman of 441, Capt Calvert, Korean Desk, CI Opns Control, and Maj Morrison and Capt Whitworth of CCD, these films were sent to the Pictorial and Broadcast Div of Civil Censorship Det for refurbishing, spooling, and analysis.
